- 4.4 No email or facsimile responses will be considered, unless otherwise stated herein.
- 4.5 The responses to this RFQ will be opened as soon as possible after the closing date and time.
  - Transnet shall not, at the opening of responses, disclose to any other company any confidential details pertaining to the Quotations / information received, i.e. pricing, delivery, etc. The names and locations of the Respondents will be divulged to other Respondents upon request.
- 4.6 Envelopes must not contain documents relating to any RFO other than that shown on the envelope.

#### 5 BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OBLIGATIONS

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's objective of Bload-Based Black Economic Empowerment and it is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past.

Transnet would therefore prefer to do business with enterprises with share these same values and who are prepared to contribute to meaningful B-BBEE initiatives [including, but not limited to subcontracting and Joint Ventures] as part of their tendered responses. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

#### 5.1 **B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating**

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that the following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and
- the 90, 0 system for requirements with a Rand value above R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFQ must be cancelled. Similarly, if the 90/10 preference point system is stipulated in this RFQ and all Bids received are equal to or below R1 000 000.00, the RFQ must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to be above R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and therefore the **90/10** system shall be applicable.

When Transnet invites prospective Service Providers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 11 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After the first year of the implementation of the Revised Codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in terms of

the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sector-specific Codes will be measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transnet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transnet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transnet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Respondents are required to complete Section 14 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate of a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

#### 5.2 **B-BBEE Joint Ventures or Consortiums**

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFQ as a long Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFD submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If such a JV or consortium agreement is unavailable, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFQ process. This written confirmation must charly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. It such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium greement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondents are to in terms requirements for B-BBEE compliance of JVs or consortiums as required by Section 14 [New B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status

Not railure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate for the JV or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

#### 5.3 Scontracting

Transnet fully endorses Government's transformation and empowerment objectives and when contemplating subcontracting Respondents are requested to give preference to companies which are Black Owned, Black Women Owned, Black Youth Owned, owned by Black People with Disabilities, EMEs and QSEs including any companies designated as B-BBEE Facilitators<sup>1</sup>.

If contemplating subcontracting, please note that a Respondent will not be awarded points for B-BBEE if it is indicated in its Proposal that such Respondent intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to an entity/entities that do not qualify

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Minister of the Department of Trade and Industry has the power to designate certain Organs of State or Public Entities as B-BBEE Facilitators. For example, the South African National Military Veterans' Association (SANMVA) has been designated as a B-BBEE Facilitator. As such they will be treated as having rights of ownership held 100% by Black People, 40% by Black Women and 20% by Black designated groups.

for at least the same points that the Respondent qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME with the capability to execute the contract.

A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.

In terms of Section 14 of this RFQ [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] Respondents are required to indicate the percentage of the contract that will be sub-contracted as well as the B-BBEE status of the sub-contractor/s.

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business emerprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

#### **Section 2: SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS**

#### 1. SCOPE OF REQUIREMENT

#### 1.1 SCOPE OF WORK

- 1.1.1 This agreement covers the supply, installation and maintenance of all sanitizer units, the deep cleaning and sanitizing of toilet and shower facilities at various places under the jurisdiction of Real Estate Management for a period of twenty four (24) months, as decided by Transnet
  - These units are to be maintained on a regular basis as per clause 1.
- 1.1.2 The essence of the agreement is that Transnet Freight Rail Freight Rail Freight that the services that are to be rendered, ensure clean and hygiene rest rooms.
- 1.1.3 The way and means by which the above mentioned result are obtained are the responsibility of the Respondent. Transnet, however, shall have the right to monitor the materials and activities of the respondent to ascertain that all procedures are in a cordance with the agreement
- 1.1.4 The Respondent must obtain his own information egarding the extend of the service to be rendered and determine the best method of achieving the results and must be clearly stated in a accompanied letter.

#### 1.2 SUFFICIENCY OF RFQ

The agreement will only as awarded to a tenderer who has a proven record of wide experience in the sanitation services he is tendering for.

#### 1.3 SITE MELTINGS

A REQ by efine information certificate (section 15) that will be signed by the Transnet Freight Rail representative at the compulsory briefing session, must be submitted with the RFQ and the submission the reol will be seemed to indicate the Respondent acquaintance with the vicinities requiring the service.

#### 1.4 SHEDULE OF QUANTITIES AND PRICES

- 1.4.1 The respondent shall submit with his RFQ a complete and detailed price schedule for all works to be performed as indicated on the "Schedule of Quantities and Prices"
- 1.4.2 All respondents shall submit with his/her RFQ document full details of how Transnet depots outside the main Towns, will be serviced.

#### 1.5 STANDARD OF WORKMENSHIP

1.5.1 The essence of the agreement is that Transnet requires clean and hygienic toilets and shower facilities.

1.5.2 For this agreement, the respondent shall timeously familiarize himself/herself with the existing conditions of the sites and ensure that his/her RFQ prices include all work necessary to achieve the required service.

#### 1.6 PROGRAMME OF WORK

- 1.6.1 The respondent is to supply and install all sanitizer units, auto flashes on urinals and automatic air-freshener units, etc. within 2 weeks of notification of being awarded the contract. These units shall be installed on places as indicated by the Manager or his deputy.
- 1.6.2 The respondent is to do a sanitizer and automatic air-freshener service and check auto flashes on a monthly basis for the whole of the agreement period.
- 1.6.3 The respondent is to perform a deep cleaning service treatment once clmonth (deep clean).

  Reaching and cleaning those often neglected places in urinals shower drains, toilet pans and rims, cleaning of kitchen drains and hand basins as well as course evention.
- 1.6.4 Sanitary disposal service to take place on a weekly basis.
- 1.6.5 The respondent shall undertake the planning and programming of the service to be rendered and submit to the Manager (or his deputy) within one week after notification, for approval.
- 1.6.6 Soap dispensers to be refilled on a weekly (as)

#### 1.7 PERFORMANCE MONITORING NEVALUATION

- 1.7.1 The respondent shall at all times be responsible for supervision of work and for follow up inspections to monitor the successful service rendered. He/she shall immediately take appropriate remedial action is great where the specified standards of control are not achieved.



Accreditation System [SANAS] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA] or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act [CCA] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-TBEE States Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- 1.3 Transnet reserves the right to require of a Bidus, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by Transnet.

## 2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 "all applicable taxes" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and stills evelopment levies;

- 2.6 **"comparative price"** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 **"EME"** means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue

- of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 **"functionality"** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability vability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue between 27 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Code of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2018 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.14 "person" includes reference to a juristic person;
- 2.15 "**rand value**" means the total estimated wise of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;

#### CAMPS

- 1.1 Prior to the erection of any camp, the Respondent shall submit to the Technical Officer, for his approval, details of his Quotations as to the site, water stepp, sanitation, and size and type of buildings. Where the site is on private land, the Responsent chall submit the written approval for the use of the site of the relevant statutory authority and of the owner and occupier of the land (as applicable).
- 1.2 Camps must not be erected on land infested with field rodents.
- 1.3 Adequate drainage shall be provided to carry off storm and waste water.
- 1.4 Buildings shall be built to a neat and orderly pattern.
- 1.5 All buildings shall have smooth, han timpervious floors, graded to provide effective drainage and to permit washing.
- 1.6 Camps shall be maintained by the Respondent at his own expense in a clean and tidy condition.

  The Respondent shall take such steps as the Technical Officer and landowner/occupier may demand to prevent the reation of a nuisance.
- 1.7 When so instructed by the Technical Officer, the Respondent shall, at his own expense, erect spitable streens between the camp and any public road, thoroughfare or railway line.
- 1.8 Cer removal of a camp, the Respondent shall, at his own expense, restore the site to its original condition to the satisfaction of the Technical Officer and of the landowner and occupier where the site is on private land.

## 2. HOUSING

- 2.1 Every living room shall have cross ventilation, both constant and occasional. Where only one window is provided, it shall not be in the same wall as the door.
- 2.2 Dimensions of living rooms shall be sufficient to allow 3.5 square metres of floor area and 11 cubic metres of air space for each person over the age of 10 years. The floor area of any living room shall not be less than 7,8 square metres.
- 2.3 Flat-roofed quarters shall have a minimum roof height of 3 metres above floor level. For quarters with pitched roofs, the wall height shall be not less than 2,6 metres above the floor with a minimum height above floor of 3 metres at the top of the pitch.
- 2.4 Doors shall not be less than 2m x 0,75m and must be halved.

- 2.5 Windows of each living room shall have an area not less than one twelfth of the floor area and shall be capable of opening to at least half their full area.
- 2.6 In areas where malaria is prevalent, doors and windows must be fitted with gauze screens.
- 2.7 Cooking shelters shall comprise roofed structures, three sides of which shall be enclosed by a weatherproof material, approved by the Technical Officer to a height of at least 1m above ground level.
  - 2.7.1 Sleeping guarters shall not accommodate more than 8 persons per room.
  - 2.7.2 Pegboards shall be carried on metal or concrete supports and shall be separated by partitions not less than 0,4 metres high extending to within 150 nm of the end of the bunk. Pegboards shall be removable for cleaning.

#### 3. WATER SUPPLY AND ABLUTION FACILITIES

- 3.1 The Respondent shall ensure that an adequate and conveniently situated supply of potable water is provided.
- 3.2 Separate buildings for ablution facilities shall be provided. Where approval has been obtained for the housing of both males and females, eparate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportion shall be 1 cubicle for 20 passon.
- 3.3 Waste water shall be hygienically lisposed of.

#### 4. **SANITATION**

- 4.1 Separate building follatione facilities shall be provided. Where housing are provided for both males and females, secarate racilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportions shall be at least one squatting shall be at least one less in the case of pit latrines, or one for every 10 persons or less in case of pail latrines.
  - Latines shall be fly proof and sited at least 10 metres from any other building, and shall not face on any ublic road, thoroughfare, railway line or residential property. Pits shall not be less than 2,5 metres deep and sited not less than 120 metres from nearest underground water source.
  - Latrines shall be so constructed, situated and maintained, and night soil so disposed of as to prevent access by animals, breeding of flies, pollution of streams and domestic water supplies, and other nuisances. Where a night soil removal service is operated by a competent authority, use of such service shall be obligatory, and the use of pit latrines and atria pits will not be permitted.
- 4.3 At least one refuse bin of adequate size with close fitting lid shall be provided for each building. Refuse bins shall be emptied and cleaned out daily.
- 4.4 Labour shall be employed on camp sanitation duties on the following basis:-
  - 4.4.1 Where the number of persons living at the camp is 20 or less one unit.
  - 4.4.2 For additional numbers over 20 living at the camp one unit per 100 or part thereof.

- 4.5 Unless refuse is removed by a competent authority, it shall be disposed of in pits and covered over daily with a layer of earth or ash of sufficient thickness to prevent depredations by rodents and the breeding of flies.
- 4.6 Adequate measures shall be taken against all vermin and insects responsible for the spread of disease. Any instructions of a competent health authority shall be carried out promptly and implicitly.
- 4.7 Buildings and bedboards shall be treated whenever necessary with an approved insecticide.
- 4.8 The Respondent shall permit and facilitate inspection of the camp and structures on the site by the staff of Transnet or any other competent authority, and shall comply with any reasonable request by such staff or any other competent authority to eliminate any unsanitary bandition.
- 4.9 Any outbreak of infectious disease shall immediately be reported tell phonically and confirmed in writing to the Technical Officer.
- 4.10 The keeping of animals of any sort is not permitted.

# Section 19: E4E – SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

#### 1. General

- 1.1 The Respondent and Transnet Limited (hereinafter referred to as "Transnet") are individual employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and obligations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Respondent accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Agreement and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his employ of the persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the agreement work, compay with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Sefety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Agreement.
- 1.3 The Respondent accepts his obligation to solvelying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the omission of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 Transnet accepts, in terms of the Alt, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the Respondent and Technical Officer or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and recedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any or repancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

### 2. Definitio s

- 2.1 In his Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -
- 2.2 The work included in this Agreement shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "Construction Work", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with: -
  - (a) the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
  - (b) the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;
  - (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or
  - (d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work:

- 2.3 **"competent person"** in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed: Provided that where appropriate qualifications and training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;
- 2.4 "respondent" means principal respondent as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **"fall protection plan"** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 **"health and safety file"** means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations.
- 2.7 **"Health and Safety Plan"** means a documented plan which addresses the lazards identified and include safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 "Risk Assessment" means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be attract a randove, reduce or control such hazard;
- 2.9 "the Act" means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993.

## 3. Procedural Compliance

- 3.1 The Respondent who intends to carry cut any construction work shall, before carrying out such work, notify the Provincial Director in writing if the construction work:-
  - (a) includes the demolition of a tructure exceeding a height of 3 metres; or
  - (b) includes the use of explosives to perform construction work; or
  - (c) includes the discenting of fixed plant at a height greater than 3m,

and shall also notify the Privicial Director in writing when the construction work exceeds 30 days or will involve more than 300 person days of instruction work and if the construction work:-

- (a) ircludes e cavation work deeper than 1m; or
- (b) Mudes working at a height greater than 3 metres above ground or a landing.
- 3.2 The not fication to the Provincial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of the Construction Re ulations, 2003, also shown in Annexure 1 of this Specification. The Respondent shall ensure that a copy of the completed notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer or employee.
- 3.3 The Respondent shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety file.
- 3.4 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Respondent shall deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer.
- 3.5 In the case of a self-employed Respondent or any subcontractors who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Respondent shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.

- 3.6 The Respondent shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Respondent and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.7 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Respondent shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Transnet's safety requirements and procedures.

# 4. Special Permits

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hotwork, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Respondent shall apply to the Technical Officer or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Respondent shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

# 5. Health and Safety Programme

  - (iii) ensuring, as for as is reasonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subsolutrators of the Respondent does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the respondent to do or omit to do.
- The Respondent's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the nations to health and safety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with directly affected by the Respondent's activities in performing the agreement work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.3 The Respondent shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:
  - (a) The identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
  - (b) the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
  - a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
  - (d) a monitoring and review plan.

- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -
  - (a) The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Respondent's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
  - (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
  - (c) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Respondent to his employees:
  - (d) the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be in plemented;
  - the arrangements in respect of communication of health and safety plated matters and incidents between the Respondent, his employees, subcontractors and the Technical Officer with particular reference to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Administrative Regulation 8 of the Act and with the pertinent classe on the General Conditions of Agreement forming part of the Agreement and
  - (f) the introduction of control measures for consuring that the Safety Plan is maintained and monitored for the duration of the Agreement.
- 5.4.1 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Technical Officer's approval and he may, in consultation with the Respondent, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Respondent or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety slowes be issued which, in the Technical Officer's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Respondent with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Technical Officer or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Respondent's safety committee as an observer.
- The Respondent shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken, shall include periodic audits a intervals mutually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.
- 5.6 The Rispondent shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in a cordance with the Respondent's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.
- 5.7 The Respondent shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer, agent, subcontractor, employee, registered employee organisation, health and safety representative or any member of the health and safety committee.
- 5.8 The Respondent shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.9 The Respondent shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.

- 5.10 The Respondent shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.11 The Respondent shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

#### 6. Fall Protection Plan

- In the event of the risk and hazard identification, as required in terms of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the respondent shall clause the designation of a competent person, responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.2 The Respondent shall implement, maintain and monitor the fall protection plan for the duration of Agreement.

- 8.3 The Respondent shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Technical Officer upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.

GENERAL BID CONDITIONS - SERVICES
[March 2012]

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#### 1 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in this Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 1.1 Bid or Bid Document(s) shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- 1.2 **Respondent(s)** shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Transnet Bid;
- 1.3 RFP shall mean Request for Proposal;
- 1.4 **RFQ** shall mean Request for Quotation;
- 1.5 **RFX** shall mean RFP and/or RFQ, as the case may be;
- 1.6 Services shall mean the services required by Transnet as specified in its Bir Document;
- 1.7 **Service Provider** shall mean the successful Respondent;
- 1.8 **Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as required by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- 1.9 **Transnet** shall mean Transnet SOC Ltd, a State and Company; and
- 1.10 **VAT** shall mean Value-Added Tax charge ble in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time

#### 2 GENERAL

All Bid Documents and subsequent contracts and orders shall be subject to the following procedures as laid down by Transnet and are to be strictly adhered to by any person or enterprise or company responding to this RFX.

# 3 LODGING OF BIL DOCUMENTS

- 3.1 A Bid which shall hereinafter include reference to an RFP or RFQ, shall be lodged with Transnet no later than the closing date and time specified for the receipt thereof, in accordance with the directions issued at the Bid Documents.
- Bids shall be transmitted in a sealed envelope and placed in the tender box at a venue stipulated in the Bid Documents with the Bid number and subject endorsed on the left hand bottom corner of the envelope.
- 3.3 The Respondent's return address must be stated on the reverse side of the sealed envelope.

### 4 USE OF BID FORMS

- 4.1 Where special forms are issued by Transnet for the submission of Bids, Respondents are required to submit their Bids by completion of the appropriate sections on such official forms and not on office stationery bearing their own terms and conditions of contract; non-compliance with this conditions may result in the rejection of a Bid.
- 4.2 Respondents must note that the original Bid forms must be completed for submission and not a reprocessed facsimile thereof. Only if insufficient space has been allocated to a particular response

may a Respondent submit additional information under separate cover using the Company's letterhead and duly cross-referenced in the RFX.

#### 5 RAISING OF A CHARGE FOR PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS AND BID FORMS

- 5.1 A non-refundable charge may be raised for Bid Documents, depending on the administrative cost of preparing and issuing the Bid Document.
- 5.2 If any of the drawings or specifications referred to in Bid Documents are the official publications of recognised standardising bodies, copies of such drawings and specifications shall be acquired by Respondents at their own expense.

#### 6 DEFAULTS BY RESPONDENTS

- 6.1 If the Respondent, after it has been notified of the acceptance of the acceptance of fails to:
  - a) enter into a formal contract when called upon to d so in terms of clause 14 [Contract Documents], within such period as Transnet may specif, or
  - b) accept an order in terms of the Bid; or
  - c) when called upon to do so, furnith sa isfactory security of the fulfilment of the contract in terms of clause 15 *[Securities]*

Transnet may, in any such case, we hout rejudice to any other legal remedy which it may have, proceed to accept any other Etd or, if it is necessary to do so, call for Bids afresh, and may recover from the defaulting Respondent any additional expense incurred by it in calling for new offers or in accepting a higher offer.

- 6.2 If any Respondent, who has submitted a Bid and/or concluded a contract with Transnet [hereinafter referred to as the **Service Provider**], or in the capacity of agent or subcontractor who has been associated with such Bid or contract:
  - a) has githdrawn such Bid after the advertised date and hour for the receipt of Bids; or
  - by has, after having been notified of the acceptance of its Bid, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the Bid Documents; or
  - has carried out any contract resulting from such Bid in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of such contract; or
  - d) has offered, promised or given a bribe in relation to the obtaining or the execution of such contract; or
  - e) has acted in a fraudulent or improper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any government department or towards any public body, company or person; or
  - f) has made any incorrect statement in the affidavit or certificate referred to in clause 12 [Formal Notification Regarding Name of Successful Respondent] and is unable to prove to the satisfaction of Transnet that
    - (i) it made the statement in good faith honestly believing it to be correct; and

- (ii) before making such statement, it took all reasonable steps to satisfy itself of its correctness; or
- g) caused Transnet damage, or to incur costs in order to meet the Service Provider's requirements which could not be recovered from the Service Provider;

then a Bid from any such Respondent shall be disqualified and the person, enterprise or company [including any directors] shall, subject to clause 6.3 below, be disqualified from bidding for any Transnet business through its "blacklisting" process.

- Any person or enterprise or company against whom a decision has been given under the provisions of clauses 6.2b), 6.2d) or 6.2e) above, may make representations to the thief Operating Officer of Transnet Group, whose decision shall be final.
- 6.4 Any disqualification [Blacklisting] imposed upon any person contentrist or company, may also apply to any other enterprise under the same or different names or disqualified persons or enterprise or company [or associates thereof] and shall for avoidance of doubt also be applied to any agent or employee of the person or enterprise or company concerned.

#### 7 CURRENCY

Prices or fees must be quoted in the currency of the Republic of South Africa [ZAR] in respect of local Services. Prices or fees in any other currency may be rejected by Transnet save where such price is quoted by a foreign Respondent.

# 8 EXCHANGE AND REMITTANCE

The Respondent should note that where the whole or a portion of the contract or order value is to be remitted overseas, happinet shall, if requested to do so by the Service Provider, effect payment overseas directly to the foreign principal or manufacturer of such percentage of the contract or order value as may be stipulated by the Respondent in its Bid Documents and any variation in the amount to be so paid, which may arise as a result of fluctuations in the rate of exchange involved, will be for the account of the Service Provider.

- Time Respondent who desires to avail itself of the aforementioned facility must at the time of bidding furnish the information called for in the clause "*Exchange and Remittance*" of the Bid Documents and also furnish full details of the principals or service providers to whom payment is to be made.
- 8.2 The Service Provider shall at its own cost obtain forward exchange cover on foreign currency to protect itself against any currency rate fluctuation risks for the duration of any resulting contract or order. Transnet will NOT accept any fluctuations in the rate of exchange at the time when payments are made.

Transnet will not recognise any claim for adjustment of the order and/or contract price under clause 8.2 above, if the increase in price arises after the date on which the Services were to be completed, as set out in the order and/or contract, or any subsequent agreement between the parties.

# 9 ACCEPTANCE OF BID

9.1 Transnet does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any Bid.

- 9.2 Transnet reserves the right to accept any Bid in whole or in part.
- 9.3 Upon the acceptance of a Bid by Transnet, the parties shall be bound by these General Bid Conditions and the Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract [Form ST&C Services] and any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents,
- 9.4 Where the Respondent has been informed by Transnet per facsimile message or email of the acceptance of its Bid, the acknowledgement of the receipt transmitted shall be regarded as proof of delivery to the Respondent.

# 10 LAW GOVERNING CONTRACT

The law of the Republic of South Africa shall govern the contract created by the acceptance of a Bid. The domicilium citandi et executandi shall be a place in the Republic of South Africa to be specified by the Respondent in its Bid at which all legal documents may be served in the Respondent who shall agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa. A foreign Respondent shall, therefore, state in its Bid the name of its authorised representative in the Republic of South Africa who is empowered to sign any contract which may be entered into in the event of its Bid being accepted and to act on its behalf in all matters relating to the contract.

#### 11 IDENTIFICATION

If the Respondent is a company, the full names of the directors shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a close corporation, the full names of the members shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a partnership or an individual trading under a trade name, the full names of the partners or of such individual, as the case may be, shall be furnished.

# 12 FORMAL NOTIFICAN ON DEGARDING NAME OF SUCCESSFUL RESPONDENT

In the case of Bids submitted to the Secretary of an Acquisition Council, unsuccessful Respondents will be formally notine to the names of successful Respondent(s) as soon as possible after the closing date for receipt of the Bid in question.

# 13 NO THORISED COMMUNICATION ABOUT BIDS

where Bids are submitted to the Secretary of an Acquisition Council, Respondents may at any time communicate with the Secretary on any matter relating to its Bid but, in the absence of written authority from the Secretary, no communication on a question affecting the subject of a Bid shall take place between Respondents or other potential suppliers or any member of the Acquisition Council or official of Transnet during the period between the closing date for the receipt of the Bid and the date of the notification of the successful Respondent(s). A Bid, in respect of which any such unauthorised communication has occurred, may be disqualified.

# 14 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

14.1 The contract documents will comprise these General Bid Conditions and the Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract [Form ST&C – Services] and any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.

14.2 These contract documents will constitute the contract between the parties upon receipt by the Respondent of Transnet's letter of acceptance / intent, subject to all additional amendments and/or special conditions thereto as agreed to by the parties.

# 15 SECURITIES

- 15.1 The successful Respondent, when called upon to do so, shall provide security to the satisfaction of Transnet for the due fulfilment of a contract or order. Such security shall be in the form of a deed of suretyship [**Deed of Suretyship**] furnished by an approved bank, building society, insurance or guarantee corporation carrying on business in South Africa.
- 15.2 The security may be applied in whole or part at the discretion of Transnet to make good any loss or damage which Transnet may incur in consequence of a breach of the contract or any part thereof.
- 15.3 Such security, if required, shall be an amount which will be stip placed the Bid Documents.
- 15.4 For the purpose of clause 15.1 above, Transnet will supply a Deed of Suretyship form to the successful Respondent for completion and no guarantee and yo other form will be accepted. A copy of such form will be supplied to Respondents are request. For this purpose a Deed of Suretyship form will be provided which shall be completed and returned to Transnet or a designated official by the successful Respondent within 30 [thicky] lays from the date of the letter of acceptance. No payment will be made until the form, dulyscomplete, is delivered to Transnet. Failure to return the Deed of Suretyship within the prescribed time shall, save where prior extension has been granted, entitles Transnet without notice to the Service Provider to cancel the contract with immediate effect.
- 15.5 Additional costs incur at b. Transnet necessitated by reason of default on the part of the Service Provider in relation to the conditions of this clause 15 will be for the account of the Service Provider.

# 16 PRICES SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION

- 16.1 A Bid with price, which are subject to confirmation will not be considered.
- 16.2 dids where firm prices are quoted for the duration of any resulting order and or contract will receive precedence over prices which are subject to adjustment.

#### 17 DELEXION OF SERVICES EXCLUDED FROM BID

Respondent must delete Services for which it has not tendered or for which the price or fee has been included elsewhere in its Bid.

#### 18 ALTERATIONS MADE BY THE RESPONDENT TO BID PRICES

All alterations made by the Respondent to its Bid price(s) prior to the submission of its Bid Documents must be done by deleting the incorrect figures and words where required and by inserting the correct figures and words against the items/Services concerned. All such alterations must be initialled by the person who signs the Bid Documents. Failure to observe this requirement may result in the particular item(s) or Services concerned being excluded in the matter of the award of the business.

#### 19 VALUE-ADDED TAX

- 19.1 In respect of local Services, i.e. Services to be provided by a South African company, the prices or fees quoted by the Respondent are to be exclusive of VAT which must be shown separately at the standard rate on the Service Provider's Tax Invoice.
- 19.2 In respect of Services to be provided by a foreign principal:
  - a) the invoicing by the Service Provider on behalf of its foreign principal represents a service rendered by the principal;
  - b) the Service Provider's Tax Invoice(s) for the local portion only [i.e the "commission" for the services rendered locally] must show the VAT separately

#### 20 TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF BID

- 20.1 The Service Provider shall adhere to the Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract as set out in Form ST&C Services, a copy of which is issued with the Bid Documents, together with any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the bid Documents.
- 20.2 Should the Respondent find any conditions unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer alternatives by Neitzen submission on a company letterhead. Any such submission shall be subject to review by transmet's Legal Counsel who shall determine whether the proposed alternative(s) are acceptable or otherwise, as the case may be.

# 21 IMPORTANT NOTICE TO RESPONDENTS REGARDING PAYMENT

# 21.1 Method of Payment

- a) The attention of the Respondent is directed to clause 10 [Invoices and Payment] of Form ST84 ervices, which sets out the conditions of payment on which Bid price(s) shall be based.
- by hower, in addition to the aforegoing the Respondent is invited to submit offers based on alternative methods of payment and/or financing proposals.
- The Respondent is required to give full particulars of the terms that will be applicable to its alternative offer(s) and the financial merits thereof will be evaluated and taken into consideration when the Bid is adjudicated.
- d) The Respondent must, therefore, in the first instance, tender strictly in accordance with clause 21.1a) above. Failure to comply with clause 21.1a) above may preclude a Bid from further consideration.

NOTE: The successful Respondent [the **Service Provider**] shall, where applicable, be required to furnish a guarantee covering any advance payments.

# 21.2 Conditional Discount

Respondents offering prices which are subject to a conditional discount applicable for payment within a specific period are to note that the conditional period will be calculated as from the date of receipt by Transnet of the Service Provider's month-end statement reflecting the relevant Tax Invoice(s) for payment purposes, provided the conditions of the order or contract have been fulfilled and the Tax

Invoice is correct in all respects as referred to in the contract or order. Incomplete and/or incorrect Tax Invoices shall be returned and the conditional period will be recalculated from the date of receipt of the correct documentation.

# 22 PLANS, DRAWINGS, DIAGRAMS, SPECIFICATIONS AND DOCUMEN

Copyright in plans, drawings, diagrams, specifications and documents compiled by the Service Provider for the purpose of contract work shall be governed by the terms and conditions detailed in clause 12 of Form ST&T - Services (Intellectual Property Rights).

# 23 VISITS TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES

- 23.1 Respondents must furnish details in a covering letter if it is considered necessary that employees of Transnet should carry out inspection and/or review any optication. Services at the premises of the preferred Respondent or its subcontractors overseas or the purpose of a product demonstration and/or final acceptance or for any other reason.
- 23.2 If the Respondent considers overseas visits to be necessary it must provide the following information in a covering letter in respect of each proposal visit.
  - a) countries and places to be visited
  - b) number of employees and disciplines involved;
  - c) number of man-days in olved; and
  - d) motivation for the isit.
- 23.3 Transnet will make at a rangements with regard to booking of air journeys, hotel reservations, transport to any from all orts, places of inspection or demonstration, etc. and all expenses will be for the account of transport.
- 23.4 Before a visit is undertaken, such as envisage in this clause 23, Transnet and the Respondent will acree in waiting on the number of employees of Transnet that should undertake the visit and the number of man-days involved in the visit.

# 24 BY OR ON BEHALF OF FOREIGN RESPONDENTS

- 4.1 Bids submitted by foreign principals may be forwarded direct by the principals to the Secretary of the Acquisition Council or to a designated official of Transnet according to whichever officer is specified in the Bid Documents, or may be so forwarded on the principal's behalf by its South African representative or agent provided that written proof is submitted that such representative or agent has been duly authorised to act in that capacity by the principal. Failure to submit such authorisation by the representative or agent shall disqualify the Bid.
- 24.2 When legally authorised to prepare and submit Bids on behalf of their principals not domiciled in the Republic of South Africa, representatives or agents must compile the Bids in the names of such principals and sign them on behalf of the latter.

the latter. In every such case a legal Power of Attorney from their principals must be furnished to Transnet by the South African representative or agents authorising them to enter into and sign such contract.

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#### 1 INTRODUCTION

When an Agreement is entered into between Transnet SOC Ltd [Transnet] and the appointed supplier of Services to Transnet [the Service Provider], these Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract, the technical specifications for the Services, the General Bid Conditions, a Schedule of Requirements or Work Order including such special conditions as may be applicable, and any terms in the associated Bid Documents, exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet.

#### 2 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in the Agreement, such word or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 2.1 **AFSA** means the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa;
- 2.2 **Agreement** means the Agreement and its associate schedules and/or annexures and/or appendices, including the Work Order(s), specifications for the Services and such special conditions as shall apply to the Agreement, together with the General Tender Conditions and any additional provisions in the associated bid doctments tendered by the Service Provider [as agreed in writing between the Parties], which collectives and exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet;
- 2.3 **Background Intellectual Property** hears all Intellectual Property introduced and required by either Party to give effect to their bligations under the Agreement owned in whole or in part by or licensed to either Party of their affiliates prior to the Commencement Date or developed after the Commencement Date otherwise pursuant to the Agreement;
- 2.4 **Business Day** (s) means Mondays to Fridays between 07:30 and 16:00, excluding public holidays as proclaimed in South Africa;
- 2.5 Complete email Date means [•], notwithstanding the signature date of the Agreement;
- 2.6 **Co. fidential Information** means any information or other data, whether in written, oral, papers or in any other form such as in documents, papers, memoranda, correspondence, hypothesis, drawings, diagrams, discs, articles, samples, test results, prototypes, designs, plans, formulae, patents, or inventor's certificates, which a Party discloses or provides to the other Party [intentionally or unintentionally, or as a result of one Party permitting the representative of the other Party to visit any of its premises], or which otherwise becomes known to a Party, and which is not in the public domain and includes, without limiting the generality of the term:
  - a) information relating to methods of operation, data and plans of the disclosing Party;
  - b) the contents of the Agreement;
  - private and personal details of employees or clients of the disclosing Party or any other person where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
  - d) any information disclosed by either Party and which is clearly marked as being confidential or secret;
  - e) information relating to the strategic objectives and planning of the disclosing Party relating to its existing and planned future business activities;

- f) information relating to the past, present and future research and development of the disclosing Party;
- information relating to the business activities, business relationships, products, services, customers, clients and Subcontractors of the disclosing Party where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
- h) information contained in the software and associated material and documentation belonging to the disclosing Party;
- i) technical and scientific information, Know-How and trade secrets of a disclosing Party including inventions, applications and processes;
- j) Copyright works;
- k) commercial, financial and marketing information;
- data concerning architecture, demonstrations, took and tech iques, processes, machinery and equipment of the disclosing Party;
- m) plans, designs, concepts, drawings, functiona and technical requirements and specifications of the disclosing Party;
- n) information concerning faults or defects a goods, equipment, hardware or software or the incidence of such faults or defect and
- information concerning the charges, Fees and / or costs of the disclosing Party or its authorised Subcont actors, their methods, practices or service performance levels actually achieved;
- 2.7 Copyright means the light in expressions, procedures, methods of operations or mathematical concepts, completer program codes, compilations of data or other material, literary works, musical works, artific works, sound recordings, broadcasts, program carrying signals, published editions, photographic works, or cinematographic works of the copyright owner to do or to authorise the doing of certain acts specified in respect of the different categories of works;
- 2.8 **Defaure** means any breach of the obligations of either Party [including but not limited to fundamental breach or breach of a fundamental term] or any Default, act, omission, negligence or tatement of either Party, its employees, agents or Subcontractors in connection with or in relation to the subject of the Agreement and in respect of which such Party is liable to the other;
- 2.9 Deliverable(s) means any and all works of authorship, products and materials developed, written, prepared, assembled, integrated, modified or provided by the Service Provider in relation to the Services;
- 2.10 Designs mean registered Designs and/or Design applications and will include the monopoly right granted for the protection of an independently created industrial design including designs dictated essentially by technical or functional considerations as well as topographies of integrated circuits and integrated circuits;
- 2.11 **Fee(s)** shall mean the agreed Fees for the Services to be purchased from the Service Provider by Transnet, as detailed in the Work Order(s), issued in accordance with the Agreement, as amended by mutual agreement between the Parties and in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement from time to time;

- 2.12 Foreground Intellectual Property means all Intellectual Property developed by either Party pursuant to the Agreement;
- 2.13 Intellectual Property means Patents, Designs, Know-How, Copyright and Trade Marks and all rights having equivalent or similar effect which may exist anywhere in the world and includes all future additions and improvements to the Intellectual Property;
- 2.14 **Know-How** means all Confidential Information of whatever nature relating to the Intellectual Property and its exploitation as well as all other Confidential Information generally relating to Transnet's field of technology, including technical information, processing or manufacturing techniques, Designs, specifications, formulae, systems, processes, information concerning materials and marketing and business information in general;
- 2.15 Materials means the Deliverables, the Service Provider Materials and the Third Party Materials;
- 2.16 **Parties** mean the Parties to the Agreement together with their ub diaries, divisions, business units, successors-in-title and their assigns;
- 2.17 **Party** means either one of these Parties;
- 2.18 Patents mean registered Patents and Patent a plications, once the latter have proceeded to grant, and includes a right granted for any inventions, products or processes in all fields of technology;
- 2.19 **Permitted Purpose** means any activity of process to be undertaken or supervised by Personnel or employees of one Party during the term of the Agreement, for which purpose authorised disclosure of the other Party's Confidential Information or Intellectual Property is a prerequisite in order to enable such activity or process to be accomplished;
- 2.20 Personnel means are partner, employee, agent, consultant, independent associate or supplier, Subcontractor, and the saff of such Subcontractor, or other authorised representative of either Party;
- 2.21 **Purchase O'der(s)** means official orders issued by an operating division of Transnet to the Service Provider for the provision of Services;
- 2.22 **Service(s)** means [•], the Service(s) provided to Transnet by the Service Provider, pursuant to he Work Order(s) in terms of the Agreement;
- Service Level Agreement or SLA means the processes, deliverables, key performance indicators and performance standards relating to the Services to be provided by the Service Provider;
- 2.24 Subcontract means any contract or agreement or proposed contract or agreement between the Service Provider and any third party whereby that third party agrees to provide to the Service Provider the Services or any part thereof;
- 2.25 **Subcontractor** means the third party with whom the Service Provider enters into a Subcontract;
- 2.26 Service Provider Materials means all works of authorship, products and materials [including, but not limited to, data, diagrams, charts, reports, specifications, studies, inventions, software, software development tools, methodologies, ideas, methods, processes, concepts and techniques] owned by, or licensed to, the Service Provider prior to the Commencement Date or independently developed by the Service Provider outside the scope of the Agreement at no expense to Transnet, and used by the Service Provider in the performance of the Services;

- 2.27 **Tax Invoice** means the document as required by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- 2.28 Third Party Material means software, software development tools, methodologies, ideas, methods, processes, concepts and techniques owned by, or licensed to a third party and used by the Service Provider in the performance of the Services;
- 2.29 Trade Marks mean registered Trade Marks and trade mark applications and includes any sign or logo, or combination of signs and/or logos capable of distinguishing the goods or services of one undertaking from those of another undertaking;
- 2.30 **VAT** means Value-Added Tax chargeable in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time; and
- 2.31 **Work Order(s)** means a detailed scope of work for a Service required by Transnet, including timeframes, Deliverable, Fees and costs for the supply of the Service to Transnet, which may be appended to the Agreement from time to time.

# 3 INTERPRETATION

- 3.1 Clause headings in the Agreement are included for ease of reference only and do not form part of the Agreement for the purposes of interpretation or for any other purpose. No provision shall be construed against or interpreted to the assadvantage of either Party hereto by reason of such Party having or being deemed to have a ructured or drafted such provision.
- 3.2 Any term, word, acronym or phrase used in the Agreement, other than those defined under the clause heading "Definitions shall be given its plain English meaning, and those terms, words, acronyms, and phrases used in the Agreement will be interpreted in accordance with the generally accepted meanings, accorded thereto.
- 3.3 A reference to the singular incorporates a reference to the plural and vice versa.
- 3.4 A reference to legal persons incorporates a reference to legal persons and vice versa.
- 3.5 A ference to a particular gender incorporates a reference to the other gender.

# 4 NTU E ND SCOPE

- The Agreement is an agreement under the terms and conditions of which the Service Provider will arrange for the provision to Transnet of the Services which meet the requirements of Transnet, the delivery of which Services is controlled by means of Purchase Orders to be issued by Transnet and executed by the Service Provider, in accordance with the Agreement.
- 4.2 Such Purchase Orders shall be agreed between the Parties from time to time, subject to the terms of the relevant Work Order(s).
- 4.3 Each properly executed Purchase Order forms an inseparable part of the Agreement as if it were fully incorporated into the body of the Agreement.
- During the period of the Agreement, both Parties can make written suggestions for amendments to the Work Order(s), in accordance with procedures set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control] below. A Party will advise the other Party within 14 [fourteen] Business Days, or such other period as mutually agreed, whether the amendment is acceptable.
- 4.5 Insofar as any term, provision or condition in the Work Order(s) conflicts with a like term, provision or condition in the Agreement and/or a Purchase Order, or where the Agreement is

- silent on the matter, the term, provision or condition in this Master Agreement shall prevail, unless such term or provision or condition in this Master Agreement has been specifically revoked or amended by mutual written agreement between the Parties.
- 4.6 Time will be of the essence and the Service Provider will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the timeframe(s) [if any] set out in the relevant schedule, save that the Service Provider will not be liable under this clause if it is unable to meet such obligation within the time required as a direct result of any act or omission by Transnet and it has used its best endeavours to advise Transnet of such act or omission. In the event of such delay, any time deadlines detailed in the relevant schedule shall be extended by a period equal to the period of that delay.

#### **5 AUTHORITY OF PARTIES**

- Nothing in the Agreement will constitute or be deemed a constitute a partnership between the Parties, or constitute or be deemed to constitute one Parties as agents or employees of one another for any purpose or in any form whatsoever.
- 5.2 Neither Party shall be entitled to, or have the lower or authority to enter into an agreement in the name of the other; or give any warrants representation or undertaking on the other's behalf; or create any liability against the other's hind the other's credit in any way or for any purpose whatsoever.

# **6 WARRANTIES**

- 6.1 The Service Provider Parrants to Transnet that:
  - a) it has full capacity and authority to enter into and to perform the Agreement and that the Agreement is vecuted by a duly authorised representatives of the Service Provider;
  - b) will discharge its obligations under the Agreement and any annexure, appendix or schedule hereto with all due skill, care and diligence;
  - any, of its Personnel and for withholding and remitting income tax for its Personnel in conformance with any applicable laws and regulations;
  - d) it will procure licences for Transnet in respect of all Third Party Material detailed in the Work Order(s), and will procure the right for Transnet to take such copies [in whole or in part] of such Third Party Materials as it may reasonably require for the purposes of backup for archiving and disaster recovery; and
  - e) the use or possession by Transnet of any Materials will not subject Transnet to any claim for infringement of any Intellectual Property Rights of any third party.
- 6.2 The Service Provider warrants that it will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the Service Levels as defined in the relevant schedule. Transnet may at its discretion audit compliance with the Service Levels, provided that any such audit is carried out with reasonable prior notice and in a reasonable way so as not to have an adverse effect on the performance of the Services. Without prejudice to clause 6.3 below, in the event that the Service Provider fails to meet the Service Levels, Transnet may claim appropriate service credits or invoke a retention of Fees as detailed in the relevant schedule and/or Work Order.

- 6.3 The Service Provider warrants that for a period of 90 [ninety] days from Acceptance of the Deliverables they will, if properly used, conform in all material respects with the requirements set out in the relevant schedule. The Service Provider will at its expense remedy any such non-conformance as soon as possible but in any event within 30 [thirty] days of notification by Transnet. In the event that the Service Provider fails or is unable to remedy such non-conformance within such time-scale, Transnet will be entitled to employ a third party to do so in place of the Service Provider and any excess charges or costs incurred by Transnet as a result shall be paid by the Service Provider.
- 6.4 The Service Provider will remedy any defect within 30 [thirty] days of both, notified of that defect by Transnet in writing.
- 6.5 The Service Provider will not be liable to remedy any problem arising from or caused by any modification made by Transnet to the Deliverables, or any part in greof without the prior approval of the Service Provider.
- The Service Provider shall advise Transnet of the effects of any steps proposed by Transnet pursuant to clause 6.5 above, including but not limited to any cost implications or any disruption or delay in the performance of the Services. The Parties agree that any changes to the Services, including the charges for the Services of any time tables for delivery of the Services, will be agreed in accordance with the change control procedure, as set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control].
- 6.7 The Service Provider warrants that.
  - a) it has, using the most up to-date software available, tested for [and deleted] all commonly known virgles in the Materials and for all viruses known by the Service Provider at the date of the ferval t Work Order; and
  - b) at the time of delivery to Transnet, the Materials do not contain any trojan horse, worm, logic bound, time bomb, back door, trap door, keys or other harmful components.
  - The Service Provider agrees that, in the event that a virus is found, it will at its own expense use best endeavours to assist Transnet in reducing the effect of the virus and, particularly in the event that a virus causes loss of operational efficiency or loss of data, to assist Transnet to the same extent to mitigate such losses and to restore Transnet to its original operating efficiency.
- The Service Provider undertakes to comply with South Africa's general privacy protection in terms of the Bill of Rights [Section 14] in connection with the Agreement and shall procure that its Personnel shall observe the provisions of Section 14 [as applicable] or any amendments and reenactments thereof and any regulations made pursuant thereto.
- 6.9 The Service Provider warrants that it has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure that, in the event of a disaster, the impact of such disaster on the ability of the Service Provider to comply with its obligations under the Agreement will be reduced to the greatest extent possible, and that the Service Provider shall ensure that it has appropriate, tested and documented recovery arrangements in place.
- 6.10 In compliance with the National Railway Safety Regulator Act, 16 of 2002, the Service Provider shall ensure that the Services, to be supplied to Transnet under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, comply fully with the specifications as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto, and shall thereby adhere [as applicable] to railway safety requirements and/or regulations. Permission for

the engagement of a Subcontractor by the Service Provider [as applicable] shall be subject to a review of the capability of the proposed Subcontractor to comply with the specified railway safety requirements and/or regulations. The Service Provider and/or its Subcontractor shall grant Transnet access, during the term of the Agreement, to review any safety-related activities, including the coordination of such activities across all parts of its organisation.

#### 7 TRANSNET'S OBLIGATIONS

- 7.1 Transnet undertakes to promptly comply with any reasonable request by the Service Provider for information, including information concerning Transnet's operations and activities, that relates to the Services as may be necessary for the Service Provider to perform the Services, but for no other purpose. However, Transnet's compliance with any request for information is subject to any internal security rules and requirements and subject to the observance by the Service Provider of its confidentiality obligations under the Agreement.
- 7.2 The Service Provider shall give Transnet reasonable once of any information it requires in accordance with clause 7.1 above.
- 7.3 Subject to clause 13 [Service Provider's Personnel], Transnet agrees to provide the Service Provider or its Personnel such access to and use of its facilities as is necessary to allow the Service Provider to perform its obligations under the Agreement.

# 8 GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

- 8.1 The Service Provider shall:
  - respond promp by to all complaints and enquiries from Transnet;
  - b) inform Transpect mediately of any dispute or complaint arising in relation to the provision of the Service
  - c) conduct its business in a professional manner that will reflect positively upon the Service Provider and the Service Provider's Services;
  - d) ep full records clearly indicating all transactions concluded by the Service Provider relating to the performance of the Services and keep such records for at least 5 [five] years from the date of each such transaction;
  - obtain, and at all times maintain in full force and effect, any and all licences, permits and the like required under applicable laws for the provision of the Services and the conduct of the business and activities of the Service Provider;
  - observe and ensure compliance with all requirements and obligations as set out in the labour and related legislation of South Africa, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 85 of 1993;
  - g) comply with all applicable environmental legislation and regulations, and demonstrate sound environmental policies, management and performance; and
  - h) ensure the validity of all renewable certifications, including but not limited to its Tax Clearance Certificate and B-BBEE Accreditation Certificate, for the duration of the Agreement. Should the Service Provider fail to present Transnet with such renewals as they become due, Transnet shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any

liability and without prejudice to any claims which Transnet may have for damages against the Service Provider.

- 8.2 The Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it shall at all times:
  - a) render the Services and perform all its duties with honesty and integrity;
  - communicate openly and honestly with Transnet and demonstrate a commitment to performing the Services timeously, efficiently and to the required standards;
  - c) endeavour to provide the highest possible standards of service and professionalism, with a reasonable degree of care and diligence;
  - d) use its best endeavours and make every diligent effort to meet agreed deadlines;
  - e) treat its own Personnel, as well as all Transnet's officers, employees, agents and consultants, with fairness and courtesy and respect for their human rights;
  - f) practice and promote its own internal policies aid at prombiting and preventing unfair discrimination [as further referred to in clause 22 Equality and Diversity];
  - g) treat all enquiries from Transnet in connection with the Services with courtesy and respond to all enquiries promptly and efficients. Where the Service Provider is unable to comply with the provisions of this clauser the Service Provider will advise Transnet of the delay and the reasons therefor and will have Transnet informed of progress made regarding the enquiry;
  - h) when requested by transies provide clear and accurate information regarding the Service Provider's own policies and procedures, excluding Know-How and other Confidential Information, except where a non-disclosure undertaking has been entered into between the Parties:
  - i) not allow a conflict of interest to develop between its own interests [or the interests of any costs to be customers] and the interests of Transnet;
  - pot accept or offer, nor allow, induce or promote the acceptance or offering of any statuity, enticement, incentive or gift that could reasonably be regarded as bribery or an attempt to otherwise exert undue influence over the recipient;
  - not mislead Transnet or its officers, employees and stakeholders, whether by act or omission;
  - not otherwise act in an unethical manner or do anything which could reasonably be expected to damage or tarnish Transnet's reputation or business image; and
  - m) immediately report to Transnet any unethical, fraudulent or otherwise unlawful conduct of which it becomes aware in connection with Transnet or the provision of Services.

# 9 FEES AND EXPENSES

- 9.1 In consideration of the provision of the Services, Transnet will pay to the Service Provider the Fees detailed in the relevant schedule or Work Order.
- 9.2 Transnet will not be invoiced for materials used in the provision of the Services save for those materials [if any] set out in the Work Order and accepted by Transnet or in any relevant Work Order [which will be invoiced to Transnet at cost].

- 9.3 Unless otherwise agreed in a schedule or Work Order, Transnet will reimburse to the Service Provider all reasonable and proper expenses incurred directly and solely in connection with the provision of the Services, provided that all such expenses:
  - a) are agreed by Transnet in advance;
  - b) are incurred in accordance with Transnet's standard travel and expenses policies;
  - c) are passed on to Transnet at cost with no administration fee; and
  - d) will only be reimbursed if supported by relevant receipts.
- 9.4 All Tax Invoices relating to Fees, out of pocket expenses and, if applicable, travel and accommodation costs, will provide the detail for each of the Personn Cearrying out the Services and incurring the expenses, and the Tax Invoice will, where appropriate, include VAT as a separate item.

#### 10 INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- 10.1 Transnet shall pay the Service Provider the amounts stipp ated in the relevant schedule or Work Order, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- Transnet shall pay such amounts to the Scale Provider, upon receipt of a correct and undisputed Tax Invoice together with the supporting occumentation as specified in the Work Order appended hereto, once the undisputed Tax a voices, or such portion of the Tax Invoices which are undisputed become due and parable to the Service Provider for the provision of the Services, in terms of clause 10.4 below
- 10.3 All Fees and other sums payable under the Agreement are exclusive of VAT, which will be payable at the applicable rue.
- 10.4 Unless otherwise provided for in the Work Order(s) appended to the Agreement, Tax Invoices shall be stimilted together with a month-end statement. Payment against such month-end statement shall be made by Transnet within 30 [thirty] days after date of receipt by Transnet of the statement together with all undisputed Tax Invoices and supporting documentation.
- 10.3 Where the payment of any Tax Invoice, or any part thereof which is not in dispute, is not made in a cordance with this clause 10, the Service Provider shall be entitled to charge interest on the outstanding amount, at The Standard Bank of South Africa's prime rate of interest in force, for the period from the due date of payment until the outstanding amount is paid.

# 11 FEE ADJUSTMENTS

- 11.1 Fees for Services rendered in terms of the Agreement shall be subject to review as indicated in the Work Order(s) annexed hereto from time to time.
- 11.2 No less than 2 [two] months prior to any proposed Fee adjustment, the Parties shall commence negotiations for Fees for the next period or as otherwise indicated and appended hereto.
- 11.3 Should Transnet and the Service Provider fail to reach an agreement on Fees for the successive period, either Party shall be entitled to submit this matter to dispute resolution in accordance with clause 25 of this Master Agreement [Dispute Resolution].

# 12 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

#### 12.1 Title to Confidential Information

- a) Transnet will retain all right, title and interest in and to its Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property that is proprietary to Transnet. For the avoidance of doubt, all the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property shall remain vested in the Service Provider.
- b) Transnet shall grant to the Service Provider an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property only for the Permitted Purpose. This license shall not permit the Service Provider to sub-license to other parties.
- c) The Service Provider shall grant to Transnet an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property for the Permitted Purpose. This licence shall not permit Transnet to a ballocal et o other parties.
- d) The Service Provider shall grant Transnet access to the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property on terms which shall be a profide negotiated between the Parties for the purpose of commercially explotting the Foreground Intellectual Property, to the extent that such access is required.

#### 12.2 Title to Intellectual Property

- a) All right, title and interest in any to Foreground Intellectual Property prepared, conceived or developed by the Service Provider, its researchers, agents and employees shall vest in Transnet and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Foreincunt Intellectual Property. The Service Provider shall not at any time during or after the termination or cancellation of the Agreement dispute the validity or anison eability of such Foreground Intellectual Property, or cause to be done any act or anything contesting or in any way impairing or tending to impair any part of that right, title and interest to any of the Foreground Intellectual Property and shall not counsel or assist any person to do so.
- Transnet shall be entitled to seek protection in respect of the Foreground Intellectual Property anywhere in the world as it shall decide in its own absolute discretion and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining and maintaining protection of the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- c) Where the Foreground Intellectual Property was created by the Service Provider or its researchers, agents and employees and where Transnet elects not to exercise its option to seek protection or decides to discontinue the financial support of the prosecution or maintenance of any such protection, Transnet shall notify the Service Provider who shall have the right of first refusal to file or continue prosecution or maintain any such applications and to maintain any protection issuing on the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- d) No consideration shall be paid by Transnet to the Service Provider for the assignment of any Foreground Intellectual Property from the Service Provider to Transnet, over and above the sums payable in terms of the Agreement. The Service Provider undertakes to

- sign all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of the Foreground Intellectual Property to Transnet.
- e) Subject to anything contrary contained in the Agreement and/or the prior written consent of Transnet [which consent shall not be unreasonably be withheld or delayed], the Service Provider shall under no circumstances be entitled as of right, or to claim the right, to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Foreground Intellectual Property.

#### 12.3 Title to Improvements

Any improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications to the Foreground Intellectual Property, and any and all new inventions or discoveries, based on or lessilting from the use of Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Confidential Information shall be exclusively owned by Transnet. The Service Provider shall disclose promptly to Transnet all such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries. The Service Provider hereby undertakes to sign all document and to all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries to Transnet and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining, maint lining or documenting ownership and/or protection of the improved Foreground Intellectual Property.

# 12.4 Unauthorised Use of Confidential Information

The Service Provider shall not authorist any party to act on or use in any way any Confidential Information belonging to transmit whether or not such party is aware of such Confidential Information, and shall providely totify Transmet of the information if it becomes aware of any party so acting, and shall provide Transmet the information with such assistance as Transmet reasonably requires at Tansmet's cost and expense, to prevent such third party from so acting.

# 12.5 Unautho sed Use of Intellectual Property

- a) The Service Provider agrees to notify Transnet in writing of any conflicting uses of, and applications of registrations of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks or any act of Defining ment, unfair competition or passing off involving the Intellectual Property of Transnet of which the Service Provider acquires knowledge and Transnet shall have the right, as its own option, to proceed against any party infringing its Intellectual Property.
- b) It shall be within the sole and absolute discretion of Transnet to determine what steps shall be taken against the infringer and the Service Provider shall co-operate fully with Transnet, at Transnet's cost, in whatever measure including legal action to bring any infringement of illegal use to an end.
- c) The Service Provider shall cooperate to provide Transnet promptly with all relevant ascertainable facts.
- d) If proceedings are commenced by Transnet alone, Transnet shall be responsible for all expenses but shall be entitled to all damages or other award arising out of such proceedings. If proceedings are commenced by both Parties, both Parties will be responsible for the expenses and both Parties shall be entitled to damages or other award arising out of proceedings.

#### 13 SERVICE PROVIDER'S PERSONNEL

- 13.1 The Service Provider's Personnel shall be regarded at all times as employees, agents or Subcontractors of the Service Provider and no relationship of employer and employee shall arise between Transnet and any Service Provider Personnel under any circumstances regardless of the degree of supervision that may be exercised over the Personnel by Transnet.
- 13.2 The Service Provider warrants that all its Personnel will be entitled to work in South Africa or any other country in which the Services are to be performed.
- 13.3 The Service Provider will ensure that its Personnel comply with all reasonable requirements made known to the Service Provider by Transnet concerning conduct at any transnet premises or any other premises upon which the Services are to be performed [including but not limited to security regulations, policy standards and codes of practice and health and salety requirements]. The Service Provider will ensure that such Personnel at all times act has lawful and proper manner in accordance with these requirements.
- 13.4 Transnet reserves the right to refuse to admit or to remove from any premises occupied by or on behalf of it, any Service Provider Personnel whose admission or presence would, in the reasonable opinion of Transnet, be undesirable or who represents a threat to confidentiality or security or whose presence would be in breach of any rules and regulations governing Transnet's Personnel, provided that Transnet notifies the Service Provider of any such refusal [with reasons why]. The reasonable exclusion of any such individual from such premises shall not relieve the Service Provider from the performance of its origations under the Agreement.
- 13.5 The Service Provider agrees to use all reasonable endeavours to ensure the continuity of its Personnel assigned to perform the Services. If any re-assignment by the Service Provider of those Personnel is peoussary, or if Transnet advises that any such Personnel assigned are in any respect unsatisfactory including where any such Personnel are, or are expected to be or have been absent to any period, then the Service Provider will promptly supply a replacement of equivalent calibre and experience, and any such replacement shall be approved by Transnet prior to commissing provision of the Services, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

# 14 LIMITA ION OF LIABILITY

- Neither Party excludes or limits liability to the other Party for:
  - a) death or personal injury due to negligence; or
  - b) fraud.
- 14.2 The Service Provider shall indemnify and keep Transnet indemnified from and against liability for damage to any Transnet property [whether tangible or intangible] or any other loss, costs or damage suffered by Transnet to the extent that it results from any act of or omission by the Service Provider or its Personnel in connection with the Agreement. The Service Provider's liability arising out of this clause 14.2 shall be limited to a maximum amount payable in respect of any one occurrence or a series of related occurrences in a single calendar year, such amount to be agreed in writing by the Parties.
- 14.3 Subject always to clauses 14.1 and 14.2 above, the liability of either the Service Provider or Transnet under or in connection with the Agreement, whether for negligence, misrepresentation, breach of contract or otherwise, for direct loss or damage arising out of each Default or series of

- related Defaults shall not exceed 100% [one hundred per cent] of the Fees paid under the schedule or Work Order to which the Default(s) relates.
- 14.4 Subject to clause 14.1 above, and except as provided in clauses 14.2 and 14.3 above, in no event shall either Party be liable to the other for indirect or consequential loss or damage or including indirect or consequential loss of profits, business, revenue, goodwill or anticipated savings of an indirect nature or loss or damage incurred by the other Party as a result of third party claims.
- 14.5 If for any reason the exclusion of liability in clause 14.4 above is void or unenforceable, either Party's total liability for all loss or damage under the Agreement shall be as provided in clause 14.3 above.
- 14.6 Nothing in this clause 14 shall be taken as limiting the liability of the Se vice Provider in respect of clause 12 [Intellectual Property Rights] or clause 16 [Confidentiality].

# 15 INSURANCES

- 15.1 Without limiting the liability of the Service Provider under the Agreement, the Service Provider shall take out insurance in respect of all risks for which it is prudent for the Service Provider to insure against, including any liability it may have as a result of its activities under the Agreement for theft, destruction, death or injury a any operson and damage to property. The level of insurance will be kept under review by Transnet, on an annual basis, to ensure its adequacy, provided that any variation to the level of such insurance shall be entirely at the discretion of the Service Provider.
- 15.2 The Service Provider shall alreange insurance with reputable insurers and will produce to Transnet evidence of the existence of the policies on an annual basis within 30 [thirty] days after date of policy renewals.

# 16 CONFIDENTIALI

- 16.1 The Parties bereby undertake the following, with regard to Confidential Information:
  - either directly or indirectly, any Confidential Information of the other, without the prior written consent of such other Party, other than when called upon to do so in accordance with a statute, or by a court having jurisdiction, or by any other duly authorised and empowered authority or official, in which event the Party concerned shall do what is reasonably possible to inform the other of such a demand and each shall assist the other in seeking appropriate relief or the instituting of a defensive action to protect the Confidential Information concerned;
  - b) not to use, exploit, permit the use of, directly or indirectly, or in any other manner whatsoever apply the Confidential Information, disclosed to it as a result of the Agreement, for any purpose whatsoever other than for the purpose for which it is disclosed or otherwise than in strict compliance with the provisions in the Agreement;
  - c) not to make any notes, sketches, drawings, photographs or copies of any kind of any part of the disclosed Confidential Information, without the prior written consent of such other Party, except when reasonably necessary for the purpose of the Agreement, in which case such copies shall be regarded as Confidential Information;

- d) not to de-compile, disassemble or reverse engineer any composition, compilation, concept application, item, component de-compilation, including software or hardware disclosed and shall not analyse any sample provided by Transnet, or otherwise determine the composition or structure or cause to permit these tasks to be carried out except in the performance of its obligations pursuant to the Agreement;
- e) not to exercise less care to safeguard Transnet Confidential Information than the Party exercises in safeguarding its own competitive, sensitive or Confidential Information;
- f) Confidential Information disclosed by either Party to the other or by either Party to any other party used by such Party in the performance of the Agreement, shall be dealt with as "restricted" or shall be dealt with according to any other appropriate level of confidentiality relevant to the nature of the information concerned, agreed between the Parties concerned and stipulated in writing for such information in such tage.
- g) the Parties shall not make or permit to be made by so other person subject to their control, any public statements or issue prescrete releases or disclose Confidential Information with regard to any matter related to the Agreement, unless written authorisation to do so has first been obtained from the Party first disclosing such information;
- h) each Party shall be entitled to discuse such aspects of Confidential Information as may be relevant to one or more technical qualified employees or consultants of the Party who are required in the course of their duties to receive the Confidential Information for the Permitted Purpose provided that the employee or consultant concerned has a legitimate interest therein, and then only to the extent necessary for the Permitted Purpose, and is informed by the Party of the confidential nature of the Confidential Information and the obligations of the confidentiality to which such disclosure is subject and the Party shall enable such exployees or consultants honour such obligations;
- i) each Party shall notify the other Party of the name of each person or entity to whom any Confidential Information has been disclosed as soon as practicable after such disclosure;
- Information shall ensure that any person or entity to which it discloses Confidential Information shall observe and perform all of the covenants the Party has accepted in the Agreement as if such person or entity has signed the Agreement. The Party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be responsible for any breach of the provisions of the Agreement by the person or entity; and
- each Party may by written notice to the other Party specify which of the Party's employees,
   officers or agents are required to sign a non-disclosure undertaking.
- 16.2 The duties and obligations with regard to Confidential Information in this clause 16 shall not apply where:
  - a Party can demonstrate that such information is already in the public domain or becomes available to the public through no breach of the Agreement by that Party, or its Personnel;
     or
  - was rightfully in a Party's possession prior to receipt from the other Party, as proven by the first-mentioned Party's written records, without an infringement of an obligation or duty of confidentiality; or

- c) can be proved to have been rightfully received by a Party from a third party without a breach of a duty or obligation of confidentiality; or
- d) is independently developed by a Party as proven by its written records.
- 16.3 This clause 16 shall survive termination for any reason of the Agreement and shall remain in force and effect from the Commencement Date of the Agreement and 5 [five] years after the termination of the Agreement. Upon termination of the Agreement, all documentation furnished to the Service Provider by Transnet pursuant to the Agreement shall be returned to Transnet including, without limitation all corporate identity equipment including dies, blocks, labels, advertising matter, printing matter and the like.

# 17 TOTAL OR PARTIAL FAILURE TO PERFORM THE SCOPE OF SERVICES

Should the Service Provider fail or neglect to execute the work or to deliver any portion of the Service, as required by the terms of the Agreement or Work Order, Transpet may exacel the Agreement or Work Order in so far as it relates to the unexecuted work or rejected roman of the Service, and, in such event, the provision of any remaining commitment shall remain subject in all respects to these conditions.

# 18 TERM AND TERMINATION

- 18.1 Notwithstanding the date of signature hereof, the Commencement Date if the Agreement is [●] and the duration shall be for a 1. [twelve] nonth period, expiring on [●], unless:
  - a) the Agreement is to minated by either Party in accordance with the provisions incorporated herein or in any schedules or annexures appended hereto, or otherwise in accordance with law or equity;

- 18.2 Either Party may ferminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party where the other Party has committed a material Default and, where such Default is capable of remedy, has failed to remedy such Default within 30 [thirty] days of receiving notice specifying the Default and Sequiring its remedy.
- the other Party may terminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party when the other Party is unable to pay its debts as they fall due or commits any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time], or if any action, application or proceeding is made with regard to it for:
  - a) a voluntary arrangement or composition or reconstruction of its debts;
  - b) its winding-up or dissolution;
  - c) the appointment of a liquidator, trustee, receiver, administrative receiver or similar officer; or
  - d) any similar action, application or proceeding in any jurisdiction to which it is subject.
- 18.4 Transnet may terminate the Agreement at any time within 2 [two] months of becoming aware of a change of control of the Service Provider by notice in writing to the Service Provider. For the purposes of this clause, "control" means the right to direct the affairs of a company whether by ownership of shares, membership of the board of directors, agreement or otherwise.

- 18.5 Transnet may cancel any schedule or Work Order hereto at any time on giving the Service Provider 30 [thirty] days' written notice.
- 18.6 Notwithstanding this clause 18, either Party may cancel the Agreement without cause by giving 30 [thirty] days prior written notice thereof to the other Party.

# 19 CONSEQUENCE OF TERMINATION

- 19.1 Termination in accordance with clause 18 [Term and Termination] shall not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which shall have accrued or shall thereafter accrue to either Party and all provisions which are to survive the Agreement or impliedly do so shall emain in force and in effect.
- 19.2 On termination of the Agreement or a Work Order, the Service Provide will immediately deliver up, and procure that its Personnel will immediately deliver up to Transnet, all Deliverables and property belonging to Transnet [or, in the event of termination of a Work Order, such as is relevant to that Work Order] which may be in the possession of, or under the control of the Service Provider, and certify to Transnet in writing that this has been done.
- 19.3 To the extent that any of the Deliverables and property referred to in clause 19.2 above are in electronic form and contained on non-deschable storage devices, the Service Provider will provide Transnet with unencrypted copies of the same on magnetic media and will irretrievably destroy and delete copies so held.
- 19.4 In the event that the Agreement is to minated by the Service Provider under clause 18.2 [Term and Termination], or in the event that a Work Order is terminated by Transnet under clause 18.5 [Term and Termination], Transnet will pay to the Service Provider all outstanding Fees [apportioned on a Aro to a basis] relating to the work undertaken by the Service Provider up until the date of such termination. Transnet will also pay the costs of any goods and materials ordered by the Service Provider in relation to the such work for which the Service Provider has paid or is legall) obliged to pay, in which case, on delivery of such goods or materials, the Service Provider will a supptly deliver such goods and materials to Transnet or as it may direct.
- 19.5 The provisions of clauses 0 [Definitions], 6 [Warranties], 12 [Intellectual Property Rights], 14 [Limitation of Liability], 16 [Confidentiality], 19 [Consequence of Termination], 25 [Dispute Resolution] and 29 [Governing Law] shall survive termination or expiry of the Agreement.
- 19.6 If either Party [the Defaulting Party] commits a material breach of the Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within 30 [thirty] Business Days of written notice thereof, the other Party [hereinafter the Aggrieved Party], shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which the Aggrieved Party may have for damages against the Defaulting Party.

# 19.7 Should:

- the Service Provider effect or attempt to effect a compromise or composition with its creditors; or
- b) either Party be provisionally or finally liquidated or placed under judicial management, whether provisionally or finally; or

 either Party cease or threaten to cease to carry on its normal line of business or default or threaten to default in the payment of its liabilities generally, or commit any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time];

then the other Party shall be entitled, but not obliged, to terminate the Agreement on written notice, in which event such termination shall be without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which either Party may have for damages against the other.

#### 20 ASSIGNMENT

Neither Party may assign the benefit of the Agreement or any interest herevnder except with the prior written consent of the other. Further, in the event that Transnet wiches to assign or novate the Agreement to any third party, the Service Provider agrees that it shall not unreasonably withhold or delay its consent to such assignment or novation and that it shall only be entitled to recover from Transnet any reasonable legal costs incurred by it as a direct result of such assignment or novation.

# 21 FORCE MAJEURE

- 21.1 Neither Party shall have any claim against the other Party arising from any failure or delay in the performance of any obligation of either party order the Agreement caused by an act of *force majeure* such as acts of God, fire floor, war, strike, lockout, industrial dispute, government action, laws or regulations, riots terron m or civil disturbance, defaults, delays or discontinuance on the part of independent contractors, suppliers, or other circumstances or factors beyond the reasonable control of either Party, and to the extent that the performance of obligations of either Party hereunder is delayed by virtue of the aforegoing, any period stipulated for any such performance shall be reasonably extended.
- 21.2 Each Party will take an reasonable steps by whatever lawful means that are available, to resume full performance as soon as practicable and will seek agreement to modification of the relevant provisions on the Agreement in order to accommodate the new circumstances caused by the act of force revieure. If a Party fails to agree to such modifications proposed by the other Party within 90 [pinety] days of the act of force majeure first occurring, either Party may thereafter terminate the Agreement with immediate notice.

# 22 EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY

- 22.1 The Service Provider will not victimise, harass or discriminate against any employee of either Party to the Agreement or any applicant for employment with either Party to the Agreement due to their gender, race, disability, age, religious belief, sexual orientation or part-time status. This provision applies, but is not limited to employment, upgrading, work environment, demotion, transfer, recruitment, recruitment advertising, termination of employment, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training.
- 22.2 Both Parties to the Agreement undertake that they will not, and shall procure that its employees, agents and Subcontractors will not breach any applicable discrimination legislation and any amendments and re-enactments thereof.

# 23 NON-WAIVER

- 23.1 Failure or neglect by either Party, at any time, to enforce any of the provisions of the Agreement, shall not, in any manner, be construed to be a waiver of any of that Party's rights in that regard and in terms of the Agreement.
- 23.2 Such failure or neglect shall not, in any manner, affect the continued, unaltered validity of the Agreement, or prejudice the right of that Party to institute subsequent action.

# 24 PARTIAL INVALIDITY

If any provision of the Agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, or shall be required to be modified, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected thereby.

#### 25 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 25.1 Should any dispute of whatsoever nature arise between the Parties concerning the Agreement, the Parties shall try to resolve the dispute by neglitiation within 10 [ten] Business Days of such dispute arising.
- 25.2 If the dispute has not been resolved by succordingly, either of the Parties may refer the dispute to AFSA and notify the other Party accordingly, which proceedings shall be held in Johannesburg.
- 25.3 Such dispute shall be finally restricted accordance with the rules of AFSA by an arbitrator or arbitrators appointed by AF A.
- 25.4 This clause constitutes an irrevocable consent by the Parties to any proceedings in terms hereof, and neither of the Parties shall be entitled to withdraw from the provisions of this clause or claim at any such proceedings that it is not bound by this clause 25.
- 25.5 This clare 25 is reverable from the rest of the Agreement and shall remain in effect even if the Agreement is terminated for any reason.
- 25.6 This cause 25 shall not preclude either Party from seeking urgent relief in a court of appropriate surjection, where grounds for urgency exist.

#### 29 GOVERNING LAW

The Agreement is exclusively governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa and is subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa.

# 29.1 Change of Law

In the Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires, references to a statutory provision include references to that statutory provision as from time to time amended, extended or reenacted and any regulations made under it, provided that in the event that the amendment, extension or re-enactment of any statutory provision or introduction of any new statutory provision has a material impact on the obligations of either Party, the Parties will negotiate in good faith to agree such amendments to the Agreement as may be appropriate in the circumstances. If, within a reasonable period of time, the Service Provider and Transnet cannot reach agreement on the nature of the changes required or to modification of Fees, Deliverables, warranties, or other terms and conditions, either Party may stake a have the matter determined in accordance with clause 25 [Dispute Resolution] above.

# **WHEREAS**

Transnet and the Company wish to exchange Information [as tefined below] and it is envisaged that each party may from time to time receive Information relating to the other in respect thereof. In consideration of each party making available to the other such information, the parties jointly agree that any dealings between them shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement which themselves will be subject to the parameters of the Bid Document.

#### IT IS HEREBY AGREED

# 1 INTERPRETATION

In this Agreement:

- 1.1 **Agents** mean directions, officers, employees, agents, professional advisers, contractors or subcontractors, clany Group member;
- 1.2 **Bid** or **Sid accument** means Transnet's Request for Information [**RFI**] Request for Proposal [**RFP**] request for Quotation [**RFQ**], as the case may be;
  - **Confidential Information** means any information or other data relating to one party (the **Disclosing Party**) and/or the business carried on or proposed or intended to be carried on by that party and which is made available for the purposes of the Bid to the other party (the **Receiving Party**) or its Agents by the Disclosing Party or its Agents or recorded in agreed minutes following oral disclosure and any other information otherwise made available by the Disclosing Party or its Agents to the Receiving Party or its Agents, whether before, on or after the date of this Agreement, and whether in writing or otherwise, including any information, analysis or specifications derived from, containing or reflecting such information but excluding information which:
    - is publicly available at the time of its disclosure or becomes publicly available (other than
      as a result of disclosure by the Receiving Party or any of its Agents contrary to the terms of
      this Agreement); or

- b) was lawfully in the possession of the Receiving Party or its Agents (as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence) free of any restriction as to its use or disclosure prior to its being so disclosed; or
- c) following such disclosure, becomes available to the Receiving Party or its Agents (as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence) from a source other than the Disclosing Party or its Agents, which source is not bound by any duty of confidentiality owed, directly or indirectly, to the Disclosing Party in relation to such information;

- 2.1 All Confidential Information given by the party to this Agreement (the **Disclosing Party**) to the other party (the **Receiving Party**) which be treated by the Receiving Party as secret and confidential and will not, particularly Disclosing Party's written consent, directly or indirectly communicate or disclose (whether in writing or orally or in any other manner) Confidential Information to any other person other than in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 2.2 The Receiving Party winconly use the Confidential Information for the sole purpose of technical and comme cial discussions between the parties in relation to the Bid or for the subsequent performance of any contract between the parties in relation to the Bid.
- 2.3 Newith and g clause 2.1 above, the Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information:
  - to those of its Agents who strictly need to know the Confidential Information for the sole purpose set out in clause 2.2 above, provided that the Receiving Party shall ensure that such Agents are made aware prior to the disclosure of any part of the Confidential Information that the same is confidential and that they owe a duty of confidence to the Disclosing Party. # 4 ANNOUNCEMENT

# 5 DURATION

# E7/1 - SPECIFICATION FOR DENERAL WORK AND WORKS ON, OVER, UNDER OR ADJACENT TO RAILWAY LINES AND NEAR HIGH WOLTAGE EQUIPMENT

(This specification shall be used in network operator contracts)

Circulation Not Restricted

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#### 1.0 SCOPE

1.1 This specification covers the network operator's requirements for general work and works on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines and near high voltage equipment.

#### 2.0 DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply:

"Authorised Person" - A person whether an employee of the network operator or not, who has been specially authorised to undertake specific duties in terms of Transnet' publication Electrical Safety Instructions, and who holds a certificate or letter of authority to that effect.

"Barrier" Any device designed to restrict access to "live" high-voltage electrical equipment

"Bond" - A short conductor installed to provide electrical continuity,

"Contractor" - Any person or organisation appointed by the network operator to carry at work on its behalf.

"Contract Supervisor" - The person or juristic person appointed by the network operator from time to time as the Contract Supervisor, to administer the Contractor's performance and executor of the Works according to the powers and rights held by and obligations placed upon the Contract.

"Dead" - Isolated and earthed.

"Electrical Officer (Contracts)" - The person appointed in vriting by the Project Manager in terms of this specification as the person who shall be consulted by the contractor in all electrical matters to ensure that adequate safety precautions are taken by the Contractor.

"Executive Officer" - The person appointed by the activork operator from time to time as the Executive Officer to act according to the rights and por ers held by and obligations placed upon him in terms of the Contract.

"High-Voltage" - A voltage normally exceeding 1000 volts.

"Live" - A conductor is said to be "ive" when it is at a potential different from that of the earth or any other conductor of the system of which it forms a part.

"Near" - To be in such a position that a person's body or the tools he is using or any equipment he is handling may come within 3 metric of "live" exposed high-voltage electrical equipment.

"Occupation" - An authorisation granted by the network operator for work to be carried out under specified conditions on, over under or adjacent to railway lines.

"Occupation stated Trains" - An occupation during an interval between successive trains.

"Optical Forecable" Buried or suspended composite cable containing optical fibres used in:

- traccommonication networks for transmission of digital information and
  - spile v sensitive train operations systems.

rect Manager" — As defined in the special conditions of the contract. The person or juristic person appointed by the network operator from time to time as the Project Manager, to administer the Contract according to the powers and rights held by and obligations placed upon him in terms of the Contract.

"Responsible Representative" - The responsible person in charge, appointed by a contractor, who has undergone specific training (and holds a certificate) to supervise (general or direct) staff under his control who perform general work or to work on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines and in the vicinity of high-voltage electrical equipment.

"Total Occupation" - An occupation for a period when trains are not to traverse the section of line covered by the occupation.

"Work on" - Work undertaken on or so close to the equipment that the specified working clearances to the "live" equipment cannot be maintained.

"Work Permit" - A combined written application and authority to proceed with work on or near dead electrical equipment.

"Works" - The contractual intent for the work to be done as defined in the contract at a defined work site.

## PART A - GENERAL SPECIFICATION

#### 3.0 AUTHORITY OF OFFICERS OF TRANSNET

- 3.1 The Contractor shall co-operate with the officers of the network operator and shall comply with all instructions issued and restrictions imposed with respect to the Works which bear on the existence and operation of the network operator's railway lines and high-voltage equipment.
- 3.2 Without limiting the generality of the provisions of clause 3.1, any duly authorised representative of the network operator, having identified himself, may stop the work if, in his opinion, the safe passage of trains or the safety of the network operator's assets or any person is affected. CONSIDERATIONS OF SAFETY SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER ALL OTHER CONSIDERATIONS.

## 4.0 CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIVES AND STAFF

- 4.1 The Contractor shall nominate Responsible Representatives of whom at least on shall be available at any hour for call-out in cases of emergency. The Contractor shall provide the Contract Supervisor with the names, addresses and telephone numbers of the representatives.
- 4.2 The Contractor guarantees that he has satisfied himself that the sucreouslibe Representative is fully conversant with this specification and that he shall comply with all birmship ations in respect thereof.
- 4.3 The Contractor shall ensure that all contractor staff receives releast awareness, educational and competence training regarding safety as prescribed.

## 5.0 OCCUPATIONS AND WORK PERMITS

- 5.1 Work to be done during total occupation or during an occupation between trains or under a work permit shall be done in a manner decided by the Contract Supervisor and at times to suit the network operator requirements.
- 5.2 The Contractor shall organise the Works in a marker which will minimise the number and duration of occupations and work permits required.
- 5.3 The network operator will not be liable for any financial or other loss suffered by the Contractor arising from his failure to complete any work sche luled during the period of an occupation or work permit.
- The Contractor shall subport to the Contract Supervisor, in writing, requests for occupations or work permits together with details of the work to be undertaken, at least 21 days before they are required. The network operator does not up tertaile to grant an occupation or work permit for any particular date, time or duration.
- The network opera or reserves the right to cancel any occupation or work permit at any time before or during the period of occupation or work permit. If, due to cancellation or change in date or time, the Contractor is not permitted to start work under conditions of total occupation or work permit at the time arranged, all costs caused by the cancellation shall be born by the Contractor except as provided for in clauses 3 6 to 5%.
- 5.6 Contractor is notified less than 2 hours before the scheduled starting time that the occupation or permit is cancelled, he may claim reimbursement of his direct financial losses caused by the loss of working time up to the time his labour and plant are employed on other work, but not exceeding the period of the cancelled occupation or work permit.
- 5.7 When the Contractor is notified less than 2 hours before the scheduled starting time, or during an occupation or work permit, that the duration of the occupation or work permit is reduced, he may claim reimbursement of his direct financial losses caused by the loss of working time due to the reduced duration of the occupation or work permit.
- 5.8 Reimbursement of the Contractor for any loss of working time in terms of clause 5.6 and 5.7, shall be subject to his claims being submitted within 14 days of the event with full details of labour and plant involved, and provided that the Contract Supervisor certifies that no other work on which the labour and plant could be employed was immediately available.
- 5.9 Before starting any work for which an occupation has been arranged, the Contractor shall obtain from the Contract Supervisor written confirmation of the date, time and duration of the occupation.
- 5.10 Before starting any work for which a work permit has been arranged, the Responsible Representative shall read and sign portion C of the Work Permit, signifying that he is aware of the work boundaries within which work may be undertaken. After the work for which the permit was granted has been completed, or when the

work permit is due to be terminated, or if the permit is cancelled after the start, the same person who signed portion C shall sign portion D of the Work Permit, thereby acknowledging that he is aware that the electrical equipment is to be made "live". The Contractor shall advise all his workmen accordingly.

#### 6.0 SPEED RESTRICTIONS AND PROTECTION

- 6.1 When speed restrictions are imposed by the network operator because of the Contractor's activities, the Contractor shall organise and carry out his work so as to permit the removal of the restrictions as soon as possible.
- When the Contract Supervisor considers protection to be necessary the Contractor shall, unless otherwise agreed, provide all protection including flagmen, other personnel and all equipment for the protection of the network operator's and the Contractor's personnel and assets, the public and including pains.
- 6.2.1 The network operator will provide training free of charge of the Contractor's flagmen and other personnel performing protection duties. The Contractor shall consult with the Contract Supervisor, whenever he considers that protection will be necessary, taking into account the minimum permissible clearances set out in the Manual for Track Maintenance (Document no. BBB0481):
  - Drawing no. BE-97 Sheet 1: Horizontal Clearances: 1065mm gaug (April vir. 1 sheet 1)
  - Drawing no. BE-97 Sheet 2: Vertical Clearances: 1065mm garge (x on xure 1 sheet 2)
  - Drawing no. BE-97 Sheet 3: Clearances: Platform (Annexure sheet 3)
  - Drawing no. BE-97 Sheet 5: Clearances: 610mm Gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 5)
- 6.3 The Contractor shall appoint a Responsible Representative receive and transmit any instruction which may be given by the network operator personnel providing protection.

# 7.0 ROADS AND ROADS ON THE NETWORK (PERATOR'S PROPERTY

- 7.1 The Contractor shall take every reasonable presention to prevent damage to any roads or bridges used to obtain access to the site, and shall select routes, use vehicles, and restrict loads so that any extraordinary traffic as may arise from the moving of plant or material to or from the site shall be limited as far as is reasonably possible.
- 7.2 The Contractor shall not cosup) of terfere in any way with the free use of any public or private road, right-of-way, path or sivest unless the Contract Supervisor has obtained the approval of the road authority concerned.

# 8.0 CLEARANCES


- 8.1 No temporary works shall encroach on the appropriate minimum clearances set out in the Manual for Track Maintenance (Document no. BBB0481):
  - Dr. Tog N. PZ-97 Sheet 1: Horizontal Clearances: 1065mm gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 1)
  - Praying No. BE-97 Sheet 2: Vertical Clearances: 1065mm gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 2)
  - rawing no. BE-97 Sheet 3: Clearances: Platform (Annexure 1 sheet 3)
  - Drawing no. BE-97 Sheet 5: Clearances: 610mm Gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 5)

# 9.0 STACKING OF MATERIAL

9.1 The Contractor shall not stack any material closer than 3m from the centre line of any railway line without prior approval of the Contract Supervisor.

# 10.0 EXCAVATION, SHORING, DEWATERING AND DRAINAGE

10.1 Unless otherwise approved by the Contract Supervisor any excavation adjacent to a railway line shall not encroach on the hatched area shown in Figure 1.



- 10.2 The Contractor shall provide, at his own cost any shoring, dewatering or drainage of any excavation unless otherwise stipulated elsewhere in the Contract.
- Where required by the Contract Supervisor, drawings of shoring for any excavation under or adjacent to a railway line shall be submitted and permission to proceed, obtained before the excavation is commenced.
- 10.4 The Contractor shall prevent ingress of water to the excavation but where water does enter, he shall dispose of it as directed by the Contract Supervisor.
- 10.5 The Contractor shall not block, obstruct or damage any existing drains either above or below ground level unless he has made adequate prior arrangements to deal with drainage.

#### 11.0 FALSEWORK FOR STRUCTURES

- Drawings of falsework for the construction of any structure over, under or adjacent to any railway line shall be submitted to the Contract Supervisor and his permission to proceed obtained before the falsework is erected. Each drawing shall be given a title and a distinguishing number and shall be igned by a registered professional engineer certifying that he has checked the design of the false tork and that the drawings are correct and in accordance with the design.
- After the falsework has been erected and before any load is applied, the Contractor shall submit to the Contract Supervisor a certificate signed by a registered professional environer certifying that he has checked the falsework and that it has been erected in accordance with the dr wings. Titles and numbers of the drawings shall be stated in the certificate. Notwithstanding permission given by the Contract Supervisor to proceed, the Contractor shall be entirely responsible for the safety and adequacy of the falsework.

#### 12.0 PILING

12.1 The Contract Supervisor will specify the conditions inder which piles may be installed on the network operator's property.

# 13.0 UNDERGROUND SERVICES

- 13.1 No pegs or stakes shall be driven or any excaption made before the Contractor has established that there are no underground services which may be damaged thereby.
- Any damage shall be reported time liately to the Contract Supervisor, or to the official in charge at the nearest station, or to the traffic solutroller in the case of centralised traffic control.

## 14.0 BLASTING AND USE OF EXPLOSIVES

- 14.1 When blasting within 300m of a railway line, the Contractor shall observe the requirements stipulated in this specification.
- 14.2 No blasting shall be carried out except with the prior written permission of the Contract Supervisor and under such anditions as he may impose.
- On each field lines the Contractor shall also obtain the permission of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) before biasing, and shall give at least 21 days notice of his intention to blast. No blasting shall be done in the virily of electrified lines unless a member of the network operator's electrical personnel is present.
- 14.4 The contractor shall arrange for the supply, transport storage and use of explosives.
- 14.5 The Contractor shall have labour, tools and plant, to the satisfaction of the Contract Supervisor, available on the site to clear immediately any stones or debris deposited on the track or formation by blasting, and to repair any damage to the track or formation immediately after blasting. Repairs to the track shall be carried out only under the supervision of a duly authorised representative of the network operator.
- 14.6 The Contractor shall notify the Contract Supervisor of his intention to blast at least 21 days before the commencement of any blasting operations.
- 14.7 Before any blasting is undertaken, the Contractor and the Contract Supervisor shall jointly examine and measure up any buildings, houses or structures in the vicinity of the proposed blasting to establish the extent of any existing cracking or damage to such structures, etc. The Contractor, shall, subject to the provisions stipulated in the Contract Insurance Policy, make good any deterioration of such buildings, houses, or structures, which, in the opinion of the Contract Supervisor, was directly caused by the blasting.
- 14.8 After completion of the blasting the Contractor shall obtain a written clearance from each landowner in

- the vicinity of the blasting operations to the effect that all claims for compensation in respect of damage caused by the blasting operations to their respective properties, have been settled.
- 14.9 The Contractor shall provide proof that he has complied with the provisions of clauses 10.17.1 to 10.17.4 of the Explosives Regulations (Act 26 of 1956 as amended).
- 14.10 Blasting within 500m of a railway line will only be permitted during intervals between trains. A person appointed by the Contract Supervisor, assisted by flagmen with the necessary protective equipment, will be in communication with the controlling railway station.
  - Only this person will be authorised to give the Contractor permission to blast, and the Contractor shall obey his instructions implicitly regarding the time during which blasting may take place.
- 14.11 The flagmen described in clause14.10, where provided by the network operator, at for the protection of trains and the network operator's property only, and their presence does not relieve the Contractor in any manner of his responsibilities in terms of Explosives Act or Regulations, or any objection in terms of this Contract.
- 14.12 The person described in clause 14.10 will record in a book provided and retained by the network operator, the dates and times:-
  - (i) when each request is made by him to the controlling station for perhass in to blast;
  - (ii) when blasting may take place;
  - (iii) when blasting actually takes place; and
  - (iv) when he advises the controlling station that the her safe for the passage of trains.
- 14.13 Before each blast the Contractor shall record in the same book, the details of the blast to be carried out. The person appointed by the Contract Supervisor and be person who will do the blasting shall both sign the book whenever an entry described in clause 11.12 is made.

#### 15.0 RAIL TROLLEYS

- The use of rail trolleys or trestle tolleys on a railway line for working on high voltage equipment will be permitted only if approved by the Contract Supervisor and under the conditions stipulated by him.
- 15.2 All costs in connection with the working and any train protection services requested by the Contractor shall, be borne by the Contractor, unless otherwise agreed.

# 16.0 SIGNAL TRACK CIR SUIT

- Where signal track incuits are installed, the Contractor shall ensure that no material capable of conducting an electrical current takes contact between rails of railway line/lines.
- 16.2 No signal connections on track-circuited tracks shall be severed without the Contract Supervisor's knowledge and consent.

# 17.0 PENALTY FOR DELAYS TO TRAINS

17.1 If my trains are delayed by the Contractor and the Contract Supervisor is satisfied that the delay was avoidable, a penalty will be imposed on the Contractor as stipulated in the contract, for the period and number of trains delayed.

## 18.0 SURVEY BEACONS AND PEGS

- 18.1 The Contractor shall not on any account move or damage any beacon, bench mark, reference mark, signal or trigonometrical station in the execution of the Works without the written approval of the Contract Supervisor.
  - Should the Contractor be responsible for any such occurrence, he shall report the circumstances to the Contract Supervisor who will arrange with the Director-General of Surveys for replacement of the beacon or mark at the cost of the Contractor.
- 18.2 The Contractor shall not move or damage any cadastral or mining beacon without the written approval of the Contract Supervisor and before it has been referenced by a registered land surveyor. Any old boundary beacon, which becomes an internal beacon on creation of new boundaries, shall not be moved without the written approval of the Contract Supervisor.

- Should the Contractor move or damage any cadastral or mining beacon without authority, he shall be responsible for having it replaced, at his cost, by a land surveyor.
- 18.3 The Contractor shall preserve all pegs and bench marks. Such survey points shall not be removed without the written approval of the Contract Supervisor. Should any peg or benchmark be removed without authority, the Contract Supervisor will arrange for its replacement and the cost will be recovered from the Contractor. No claim will be considered for delay in replacing any such peg or bench mark. Each peg replaced shall be checked by the Contractor.
- Where a new boundary has been established, beacons on the fence line shall not be disturbed, and fence posts or anchors may not be placed or excavations made within 0,6 m of any beacon without the prior written approval of the Contract Supervisor.

#### 19.0 TEMPORARY LEVEL CROSSINGS

- 19.1 The Contract Supervisor may, on request of the Contractor, and if necessary for the purpose of execution of the Works, permit the construction of a temporary level crossing over a railway, a line at a position approved by the Contract Supervisor and at the Contractor's cost. The period for which the temporary level crossing is permitted will be at the discretion of the Contract Supervisor.
- 19.2 The Contractor will provide protection and supervise the construction of the road over the track(s) and within the railway servitude at the level crossing, as well as the enotion of all road signs and height gauges. All cost to be borne by the applicant.
  - The Contractor shall exercise extreme caution in carrying out this work, especially in respect of damage to tracks, services, overhead power and communications, utes and prevent contact with "live" overhead electrical equipment.
  - Unless otherwise agreed, the Contractor will are ide the service deviations or alterations to the network operator's track-, structure-, drainage-, electrical-, electrical-, electrical-, electrical-, and train authorisation systems to accommodate the level crossing.
- 19.3 The Contractor shall take all necessary steps including the provision of gates, locks and, where necessary, watchmen to restrict the use of the temporary level crossing to himself and his employees, his subcontractors and their employees, the staff of the network operator and to such other persons as the Contract Supervisor may permit and of whose identity the Contractor will be advised. If so ordered by the Contract Supervisor, the Contract or shall provide persons to control road traffic using the temporary level crossing. Such person, shall stop all road traffic when any approaching train is within seven hundred and fifty (750) metres of the temporary level crossing, and shall not allow road traffic to proceed over it until the lines are clear.
- 19.4 The Contractor shall maintain the temporary level crossing within the railway servitude in good condition for the particular use. A temporary agreement with the road authority to be concluded for the maintenant of the level crossing outside the railway servitude.
- 19.5 When the temporary level crossing is no longer required by the Contractor, or permitted by the network perates the Contractor shall at his own cost remove it and restore the site and the network operator's acceptable, shucture-, drainage-, electrical-, telecommunications- and train authorisation systems to its original condition. Work over the tracks and within the railway servitude will be supervised by the network operator.

#### 20.0 COMPLETION OF THE WORKS

20.1 On completion of the works, the Contractor shall remove all the remaining construction plant and material from the site, other than material which is the property of the network operator, and leave the site in a clean, neat and tidy condition. If material and plant is required for the liability and maintenance period the Contract supervisor must authorise it's retention on site.

## 21.0 PROTECTION OF PERSONS AND PROPERTY

21.1 The Contractor shall provide and maintain all lights, guards, barriers, fencing and watchmen when and where necessary or as required by the Contract Supervisor or by any statutory authority, for the protection of the Works and for the safety and convenience of the public.

Red, yellow, green or blue lights may not be used by the Contractor as they can be mistaken for signals. Red, yellow, green or white flags shall only be used for protection by the Contractor. Within the precincts of a port the Contractor shall obtain the permission of the Port Captain before installing any light.

- 21.2 The Contractor shall take all the requisite measures and precautions during the course of the Works to:
  - (i) protect the public and property of the public.
  - (ii) protect the property and workmen of both the network operator and the Contractor,
  - (iii) avoid damage to and prevent trespass on adjoining properties, and
  - (iv) ensure compliance with any instruction issued by the Contract Supervisor or other authorised person, and with any stipulation embodied in the contract documents which affects the safety of any person or thing.
- 21.3 The network operator will provide, at its own cost, protection for the safe working of trains during such operations as the Contract Supervisor may consider necessary. Protection by the retwork operator for any purpose whatsoever, does not absolve the Contractor of his responsibilities in terms of the Contract.
- 21.4 The Contractor shall take all precautions and appoint guards, watchmen and compound managers for prevention of disorder among and misconduct by the persons employed on the Works and by any other persons, whether employees or not, on the work site and for the preservation of the peace and protection of persons and property in the direct neighbourhood. Any relocation of campa by cause of disorder shall be at the Contractor's expense.
- All operations necessary for the execution of the Works, including the provision of any temporary work and camping sites, shall be carried out so as not to cause veldt tres, gound and environmental pollution, soil erosion or restriction of or interference with streams, forows, and water supplies.
  - If the original surface of the ground is disturbed in contraction with the Works, it shall be made good by the Contractor to the satisfaction of the land owner occupier or responsible authority.
- 21.6 The Contractor shall take all reasonable steps from mise noise and disturbance when carrying out the Works, including work permitted outside nor fall working hours.
- Dumping of waste or excess materials by the Contractor shall, in urban areas, be done under the direction and control of, and at sites made available by the local authority. Dumping outside local authority boundaries shall be done only with the express permission and under the direction and control of the Contract Supervisor.
- 21.8 The Contractor shall comply with emponmental protection measures and specifications stipulated by the Contract Supervisor and or local and environmental authorities.

# 22.0 INTERFERENCE WITH ME WITWORK OPERATOR'S ASSETS AND WORK ON OPEN LINES

- 22.1 The Contractor shall not oterfere in any manner whatsoever with an open line, nor shall he carry out any work or perform any act which affects the security, use or safety of an open line except with the authority of the Contract Supervisor and in the presence of a duly authorised representative of the network operator.
- 22.2 The Sopractor shall not carry out any work or operate any plant, or place any material whatsoever team in three metres from the centre line of any open line except with the written permission of the operact Supervisor and subject to such conditions as he may impose.
- 22.3 Care must be taken not to interfere with or damage any services such as overhead wire routes, cables or pipes and optical fibre cable, except as provided for the work specified. The Contractor will be held responsible for any damage to or interruption of such services arising from any act or omission on his part or of any of his employees, or persons engaged by him on the Works. The cost of repairing, replacing or restoring the services, as well as all other costs arising from any damage to services, shall be borne by, and will be recovered from the Contractor.
- Authority granted by the Contract Supervisor and the presence of an authorised representative of the network operator in terms hereof, shall not relieve the Contractor of his duty to comply with this specification.

# 23.0 ACCESS, RIGHTS-OF-WAY AND CAMPSITES

- 23.1 Where entry onto the network operator's property is restricted, permission to enter will be given only for the purpose of carrying out the Works and will be subject to the terms and conditions laid down by the network operator.
- 23.2 The Contractor shall arrange for campsites, workplaces and access thereto as well as for any right-of-

way over private property to the site of the Works, and for access within the boundaries of the network operator's property. The owners of private property to be traversed shall be approached and treated with tact and courtesy by the Contractor, who shall, if necessary, obtain a letter of introduction to such property owners from the Contract Supervisor.

The Contractor shall be responsible for the closing of all gates on roads and tracks used by him or his employees. Except with the prior approval of the Contract Supervisor and the owner or occupier of any private land to be traversed, the Contractor shall not cut, lower, damage, remove or otherwise interfere with any fence or gate which is either on the network operator's property or on private property and which restricts access to the Works. Where such approval has been given, the Contractor shall prevent entry of animals or unauthorised persons onto the network operator's or private property, and shall make the fences safe against trespass at the close of each day's work.

- 23.3 The Contractor shall take all reasonable steps to confine the movement of verticles and plant to the approved right-of-way to minimise damage to property, crops and natural vegetatio.
- When access is no longer required, and before completion of the Works the Contractor shall repair, restore or replace any fence or gate damaged during execution of the Works to the satisfaction of the Contract Supervisor and shall furnish the Contract Supervisor with a satisfaction of the Contract Supervisor and shall furnish the Contract Supervisor with a satisfaction of the occupier of land over which he has gained access to a campsite workplace and the Works, certifying that the owner and occupier have no claim against the Contractor of the network operator arising from the Contractor's use of the land. Should the Contractor be unable to obtain the required certificate, he shall report the circumstances to the Contract Supervisor.

#### 24.0 SUPERVISION

- 24.1 The Contract Supervisor will provide overall technical superintendence of the Works, and may direct the Contractor in terms of the provisions of the Contractor in respect of any measures which the Contract Supervisor may require for the operations of the etwork operator, the safety of trains, property and workmen of the network operator, and for the safety of other property and persons. The Contractor shall carry out the directions of the Contract Supervisor. The superintendence exercised by the Contract Supervisor, including any agreement, a provid, refusal or withdrawal of any approval given, shall not relieve the Contractor of any of his duties and liabilities under the Contract, and shall not imply any assumption by the network operator of by the Contract Supervisor of the legal and other responsibilities of the Contractor in carrying out the works.
- 24.2 The Contract Supervise cm/y delegate to any deputy or other person, any of his duties or functions under the Contract. On receiving notice in writing of such delegation, the Contractor shall recognise and obey the deputy or person to whom any such duties or functions have been delegated as if he were the Contract Supervisor
- 24.3 The Contractorshair exercise supervision over the Works at all times when work is performed or shall be represented by an agent having full power and authority to act on behalf of the Contractor. Such agent shall be comparent and responsible, and have adequate experience in carrying out work of a similar nature to use Works, and shall exercise personal supervision on behalf of the Contractor. The Contract Supervisor shall be notified in writing of such appointment which will be subject to his approval.
- 24. The Contractor or his duly authorised agent shall be available on the site at all times while the Works are in progress to receive the orders and directions of the Contract Supervisor.

# 25.0 HOUSING OF EMPLOYEES

- 25.1 The Contractor shall, where necessary, make his own arrangements for suitable housing of his employees. Where temporary housing is permitted by the Contract Supervisor on any part of the site, the Contractor shall provide suitable sanitation, lighting and potable water supplies in terms of the requirements of the local authority or the current network operator's specification; Minimum Communal Health Requirements in Areas outside the Jurisdiction of a Local Authority E.4B, as applicable.
- 25.2 Fouling the area inside or outside the network operator's boundaries shall be prevented. The Contractor will be called upon by the Contract Supervisor to dispose of any foul or waste matter generated by the Contractor.

# 26.0 OPTICAL FIBRE CABLE ROUTES

- 26.1 The Contractor shall not handle, impact, move or deviate any optical fibre cable without prior approval.
- 26.2 Works that in any way affect the optical fibre cable requires prior approval from the Contract Supervisor

who will determine the work method and procedures to be followed.

#### PART B - SPECIFICATION FOR WORK NEAR HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

#### 27.0 GENERAL

- 27.1 This specification is based on the contents of Transnet's publication ELECTRICAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS, as amended, a copy of which will be made available on loan to the Contractor for the duration of the contract
  - These instructions apply to all work near "live" high-voltage equipment maintained and/or operated by the network operator, and the onus rests on the Contractor to ensure that he obtains a copy.
- 27.2 This specification must be read in conjunction with and not in lieu of the Electrical Safety Instructions.
- 27.3 The Contractor's attention is drawn in particular to the contents of Part I, Sections 1 and 2 of the Electrical Safety Instructions.
- 27.4 The Electrical Safety Instructions cover the minimum safety precautions which must be taken to ensure safe working on or near high-voltage electrical equipment, and must be observed at all times. Should additional safety measures be considered necessary because of peculiar local conditions these may be ordered by and at the discretion of the Electrical Officer (Contracts).
- 27.5 The Contractor shall obtain the approval of the Electrical Officer Contracts, before any work is done which causes or could cause any portion of a person's body or the pols has been using or any equipment he is handling, to come within 3 metres of any "live" high-voltage equipment.
- 27.6 The Contractor shall regard all high-voltage equipment as "unless a work permit is in force.
- 27.7 Safety precautions taken or barriers erected shall correly with the requirements of the Electrical Officer (Contracts), and shall be approved by him before the York to be protected is undertaken by the Contractor. The Contractor shall unless otherwise agreed bear the cost of the provision of the barriers and other safety precautions required, including the attendance of the network operator's staff where this is necessary.
- 27.8 No barrier shall be removed unless authorised by the Electrical Officer (Contracts).

# 28.0 WORK ON BUILDINGS OR FIXED STRUCTURES

- 28.1 Before any work is carried out or it asurements are taken on any part of a building, fixed structure or earthworks of any kind above sound level situated within 3 metres of "live" high-voltage equipment, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted to ascertain the conditions under which the work may be carried out.
- 28.2 No barrier erected to couldly with the requirements of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be used as temporary staging or shuttering for any part of the Works.
- 28.3 The shuttering for bridge piers, abutments, retaining walls or parapets adjacent to or over any track may be permitted to time as a barrier, provided that it extends at least 2,5 metres above any working level in the case of parapets.

# 29 W RK DONE ON OR OUTSIDE OF ROLLING STOCK, INCLUDING LOADING OR UNLOADING

- 29.1 No person may stand, climb or work, whilst on any platform, surface or foothold:
- 29.1.1 higher than the normal unrestricted access way, namely -
- 29.1.1.1 external walkways on diesel, steam and electric locomotives, steam heat vans, etc. and
- 29.1.1.2 walkways between coaches and locomotives.
- 29.1.2 of restricted access ways in terms of the Electrical Safety Instructions namely -
- 29.1.2.1 the floor level of open wagons
- 29.1.2.2 external walkways or decks of road-rail vehicles, on-track maintenance machines and material trains.
- 29.1.3 Unauthorised staff working on these platforms must be directly supervised by duly authorised persons in terms of clause 607.1.3 of the Electrical Safety Instructions. These persons must attend the relevant electrical safety module training. A letter of training must then be issued by an accredited training authority. A Category C Certificate of Authority must be obtained from the

local depot examining officer.

- 29.2 When in the above positions no person may raise his hands or any equipment he is handling above his head.
- 29.3 In cases where the Contractor operates his own rail mounted equipment, he shall arrange for the walkways on this plant to be inspected by the Electrical Officer (Contracts) and approved, before commencement of work.
- 29.4 The handling of long lengths of material such as metal pipes, reinforcing bars, etc should be avoided, but if essential they shall be handled as nearly as possible in a horizontal position below head height.
- 29.5 The Responsible Representative shall warn all persons under his control of the danger of being near "live" high-voltage equipment, and shall ensure that the warning is fully understood.
- 29.6 Where the conditions in clauses 30.1 to 30.4 cannot be observed the Electrical Officer (Contracts), shall be notified. He will arrange for suitable Safety measures to be taken. The Electrical Officer (Contracts), may in his discretion and in appropriate circumstances, arrange for a suitable employee of the Contractor to be specially trained by the network operator and at the Contractor's cost, as an Authorised Person to work closer than 3 metres from "live" overhead conductors and under such one that is as may be imposed by the senior responsible electrical engineer of the network operator.

#### 30.0 USE OF EQUIPMENT

- 30.1 Measuring Tapes and Devices
- 30.1.1 Measuring tapes may be used near "live" high-voltage equipment provided that no part of any tape or a person's body comes within 3 metres of the "live" equipment.
- 30.1.2 In windy conditions the distance shall be increased to insure that if the tape should fall it will not be blown nearer than 3 metres from the "live" high-yalta releguement.
- 30.1.3 Special measuring devices longer than a metres such as survey sticks and rods may be used if these are of non-conducting material and approved by the responsible Electrical Engineer of the network operator, but these devices must not be used within 3 metres of "live" high-voltage equipment in rainy or wet conditions.
- 30.1.4 The assistance of the Electrical Din 4 (Contracts) shall be requested when measurements within the limits defined in clauses 31.1.1 to 31. Are required.
- 30.1.5 The restrictions describe in 31.1.1 to 31.1.3 do not apply on a bridge deck between permanent parapets nor in other situations, there a barrier effectively prevents contact with the "live" high-voltage equipment.
- 30.2 Portable Ladors
- 30.2.1 Any type of partable ladder longer then 2 metres may only be used near "live" high-voltage equipment under the direct schery from of the Responsible Representative. He shall ensure that the ladder is always used in such an annew that the distance from the base of the ladder to any "live" high-voltage equipment is greater that to fully extended length of the ladder plus 3 metres. Where these conditions cannot be observed, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be advised, and he will arrange for suitable safety measures to be taken.

# 31.0 CANRYING AND HANDLING MATERIAL AND EQUIPMENT

- 31.1 Pipes, scaffolding, iron sheets, reinforcing bars and other material which exceeds 2 metres in length shall be carried completely below head height near "live" high-voltage equipment. For maximum safety such material should be carried by two or more persons so as to maintain it as nearly as possible in a horizontal position. The utmost care must be taken to ensure that no part of the material comes within 3 metres of any "live" high-voltage equipment.
- 31.2 Long lengths of wire or cable shall never be run out in conditions where a part of a wire or cable can come within 3 metres of any "live" high-voltage equipment unless the Electrical Officer (Contracts) has been advised and has approved appropriate safety precautions.
- 31.3 The presence of overhead power lines shall always be taken account of especially when communications lines or cables or aerial cables, stay wires, etc. are being erected above ground level.
- 32.0 PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN WHEN ERECTING OR REMOVING POLES, ANTENNAE, TREES ETC.
- 32.1 A pole may be handled for the purpose of erection or removal near high-voltage equipment under the following conditions:

- (i) If the distance between the point at which the pole is to be erected or removed and the nearest "live" high-voltage equipment is more than the length of the pole plus 3 metres, the work shall be supervised by the Responsible Representative.
- (ii) If the distance described in (i) is less than the length of the pole plus 3 metres, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted to arrange for an Authorised Person to supervise the work and to ensure that the pole is earthed where possible. The pole shall be kept in contact with the point of erection, and adequate precautions shall be taken to prevent contact with "live" high-voltage equipment.
- 32.2 The cost of supervision by an Authorised Person and the provision of earthing shall, unless otherwise agreed, be borne by the Contractor.
- 32.3 The provisions of clauses 33.1 and 33.2 shall also apply to the erection or removal occlumns, antennae, trees, posts, etc.

#### 33.0 USE OF WATER

33.1 No water shall be used in the form of a jet if it can make contact with any vive" high-voltage equipment or with any person working on such equipment.

#### 34.0 USE OF CONSTRUCTION PLANT

- 34.1 "Construction plant" entails all types of plant including cranes, Iling frames, boring machines, excavators, draglines, dewatering equipment and road vehicles with or without lifting equipment.
- When work is being undertaken in such a position that it is possible for construction plant or its load to come within 3 metres of "live" high-voltage equipment, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted. He will arrange for an Authorised Person to supervise the work and to ensure that the plant is adequately earthed. The Electrical Officer (Contracts) will decide whether the safety measures are necessary.
- 34.3 The cost of any supervision by an Authorise Perso and the provision of earthing shall, unless otherwise agreed, be borne by the Contractor.
- When loads are handled by cranes, nor metal? rope hand lines shall be used, affixed to such loads so as to prevent their swinging and coming within 5 metres of "live" high-voltage equipment.
- 34.5 Clauses 35.1 to 35.4 shall apply in the is mutandis to the use of maintenance machines of any nature.

# 35.0 WORK PERFORMED UNDER WAD CONDITIONS UNDER COVER OF A WORK PERMIT

- 35.1 If the Responsible Representative finds that the work cannot be done in safety with the high-voltage electrical equipment "line", he shall consult the Electrical Officer (Contracts) who will decide on the action to be taken.
- 35.2 If a work permit is issued the Responsible Representative shall-
  - (i) before commencement of work ensure that the limits within which work may be carried out have been explained to him by the Authorised Person who issued the permit to him, and that he fully understands may haits.
  - (Mark) ign portion C of the permit before commencement of work;
  - (iii) explain to all persons under his control the limits within which work may be carried out, and ensure that they fully understand these limits;
  - (iv) care for the safety of all persons under his control whilst work is in progress; and
  - (v) withdraw all personnel under his control from the equipment on completion of the work before he signs portion D of the work permit.

#### 36.0 TRACTION RETURN CIRCUITS IN RAILS

- 36.1 DANGEROUS CONDITIONS CAN BE CREATED BY REMOVING OR SEVERING ANY BOND.
- Broken rails with an air gap between the ends, and joints at which fishplates are removed under "broken bond" conditions, are potentially lethal. The rails on either side of an air gap between rail ends on electrified lines shall not be touched simultaneously until rendered safe by the network operator personnel.
- 36.3 The Contractor shall not break any permanent bonds between rails or between rails and any structure. He shall give the Contract Supervisor at least 7 days written notice when removal of such bonds is necessary.

No work on the track which involves interference with the traction return rail circuit either by cutting or removing the rails, or by removal of bonds shall be done unless the Electrical Officer (Contracts) is consulted. He will take such precautions as may be necessary to ensure continuity of the return circuit before permitting the work to be commenced.

# 37.0 HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT NOT MAINTAINED AND/OR OPERATED BY THE NETWORK OPERATOR

Where the work is undertaken on or near high-voltage electrical equipment which is not maintained and/or operated by the network operator, the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993, and Regulations and Instructions, or the Mines Health and Safety Act (Act 29 of 1996), shall apply.

Such equipment includes:-

- (i) Eskom and municipal equipment;
- (ii) The Contractor's own power supplies; and

(iii) Electrical equipment being installed but not yet taken over from the Contractor.
