The purpose of this RFI is to request interested persons, companies, close corporations or enterprises [hereinafter referred to as the **Respondent(s)**] to provide proposals / suggestions to Transnet with regard to potential Supplier Development Initiatives, for further consideration by Transnet in relation to its future sales of Scrap Metals.

2 TRANSNET SCRAP METAL SUMMIT

Transnet is planning a Scrap metal summit that will be held in the major centres nationally. This summit will introduce the scrap metal supply chain to new entrants to the scrap metal market and also indicate the opportunities that exist in the market. The Scrap Metal summit will be advertised in national and regional media, dates and venues will be in the advertisements. All participants in this RFI process are welcome to attend the summit. BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND FURTHER RECOGNITION CRITERIA

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past.

Transnet would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values and who are prepared to contribute to meaningful B-BBEE initiatives [including, but not limited to subcontracting and Joint Ventures] as part of their tendered responses to any subsequent RFP process.

Consequently Transnet urges Respondents [Large Enterprises and QSE's - see below] to have themselves accredited in compliance with the Government Gazette No 34612, Notice No. 754 dated 23 September 2011. As from 1 October 2011 valid B-BBEE Accreditation Certificates must be issued by:

- Verification Agencies accredited by the South African National Accreditation System
 [SANAS]; or
- b) Registered Auditors approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [**IRBA**], in accordance with the approval granted by the Department of Trade and Industry.

A Verification Certificate issued must reflect the weighted points attained by the measured entity for each element of the scorecard as well as the overall B-BBEE rating.

6.1 **B-BBEE Rating**

Enterprises will be rated by Verification Agencies or Registered Auditors based on the following:

- a) **Large Enterprises** [i.e. annual turnover greater than R35 million]:
 - Rating level based on all seven elements of the B-BBEE scorecard
- b) **Qualifying Small Enterprises QSE** [i.e. annual turnover between R5 million and R35 million]:
 - Rating based on any four of the elements of the B-BBEE scorecard
- c) **Exempted Micro Enterprises EME** [i.e. annual turnover less than R5 million]:
 - EMEs are exempted from B-BBEE accreditation
 - Automatic rating of Level 4 B-BBEE irrespective of race or ownership, i.e. 100% B-BBEE recognition
 - Black ownership / Black women ownership greater than 50% automatically qualify as
 Level 3 B-BBEE, i.e. 110% B-BBEE recognition
 - EME's should only provide documentary proof of annual turnover [i.e. audited financials or a letter issued by accounting officer] plus proof of Black ownership if Black ownership / Black women ownership is greater than 50%

Respondents to this Expression of Interest are required to furnish proof of the above to Transnet. [i.e. a detailed scorecard as stipulated above in respect of Large Enterprises and QSEs, or proof of turnover in respect of EMEs]. In addition:

- (ii) All Respondents are to submit their audited 3-year financials, or a signed letter of confirmation of 3-year annual turnover figures from the entity's accountant, if audited financial statements are not a legal requirement.
- (iii) If annual turnover is greater than R5m please attach an Accreditation Certificate issued by a Verification Agency or Registered Auditor, together with all the relevant score sheets pertaining thereto.

6.2 **Joint Ventures and Subcontractors**

Respondents may choose during the subsequent RFP process to enter into a Joint Venture with, or subcontract to, B-BBEE companies. A rating certificate in respect of such B-BBEE JV-partners and/or subcontractor(s) will be required with the subsequent RFP response to enable Transnet to evaluate and adjudicate all RFPs received on a fair basis.

6.3 Further Recognition Criteria [FRC]

Whereas Respondents to a subsequent RFP process will be allocated points in terms of the 10% preference system for its B-BBEE rating to be assessed as referred to in paragraph 6.1 above, in addition to such scoring, further points will be allocated to Respondents based on the following "Further Recognition Indicators" on an ascending scale calculated on the extent to which an RFP Respondent meets or exceeds the minimum compliance targets as indicated below.

In terms of this RFI/EOI, Transnet wishes to determine the current status of Respondents hereby submitting Expressions of Interest.

- 7.2 The person or persons signing the submission must be legally authorised by the Respondent to do so.

8 ADDITIONAL NOTES

- 8.1 Transnet's intentions in terms of its Sale and Disposal of its Scrap Metals are:
 - to have 3 year agreements for the sale of Ferrous Metals with more than one Contractor [a successful Respondent] if practical. Ideally one Contractor would be appointed per region, for each of the six designated scrap yards [Scrap Yards] providing support services for the regional sub-depots. However, it must be noted that the above does not limit Transnet to appointing the same Contractor for multiple sites should the evaluation results indicate such an award;
 - b) to have one national Contractor for Non Ferrous Metals for a period of 3 years; and
 - c) to direct business to potential Enterprise Development [ED] suppliers/service providers for a period of three [3] years for transportation of Scrap from the different sub-depots and the required value add to improve on the price that Transnet gets for its Scrap e.g.
 - Uplifting Scrap at selected depots/sub-depots or elsewhere as required by Transnet
 - Transporting Scrap either via rail or road to the nearest Scrap depot
 - Receiving and unloading at the Scrap depot
 - Sorting, cutting, weighing and presenting to the warehouse manager for stocking of the Scrap at the Scrap Yards
 - Devising a comprehensive auditable weekly reporting system that relates to all Scrap movements from point of origin to destination
 - Ensuring that there is segregation of duties with regards to the various steps involved with this and the resultant sale(s)of Scrap.



8.2 Some potential participants in this RFI/EOI process may believe that to undertake the Sale and Disposal of Transnet's Scrap Metals would be beyond current capacity and/or resources. However, Transnet would encourage such smaller businesses [QSEs and/or EMEs] to indicate whether they would have an interest in participating as a targeted beneficiary [an SD Beneficiary] in terms of future Supplier Development initiatives. [Refer Section 4 – EOI]



Section 2 : SUPPLIER DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES AND RFI/EOI SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

A critical objective of any subsequent RFP process will be to encourage and facilitate the introduction of new or smaller empowered entrants into the market, in order to aid in transformation of the South African economy and to create employment. This is broadly aligned to the Governments' stated New Growth Path [NGP] objectives.

It is therefore our intention, through this RFI/EOI process, to obtain a better insight into and understanding of Supplier Development [**SD**] opportunities in the Scrap Metals market and associated ancillary industries in South Africa.

1 GOVERNMENT'S NEW GROWTH PATH AND SUPPLIER DEVELOPMENT OBJECTIVES

1.1 Aim and Objectives

Historically in South Africa there has been a lack of investment in infrastructure, skills and capability development and an inequality in the income distribution and wealth of a significant portion of the population. There have been a number of Government initiatives developed to address these challenges. In particular, the New Growth Path [NGP] introduced in 2010 aligns and builds on previous policies to ensure the achievement of Government's developmental objectives for South Africa. Transnet fully endorses and supports Government's New Growth Path Policy.

The key focuses of the NGP include:

- increasing employment intensity of the economy
- addressing competitiveness
- balancing spatial development of rural areas and poorer provinces
- reducing the carbon intensity of the economy
- creating opportunities in improving regional and global cooperation
- enabling transformation that benefits a wider range of social actors in society e.g. workers,
 rural communities, youth and women

Transnet, as a State Owned Company [**SOC**], plays an important role to ensure these objectives are achieved. Therefore, the purchasing of goods and services needs to be aligned to Government's objectives for developing and transforming the local supply base. Transnet's mission is to transform its supplier base by engaging in targeted supplier development [**SD**]



initiatives to support localisation and industrialisation whilst providing meaningful opportunities for Black² South Africans with a particular emphasis on:

- Black Youth [16 to 35 year olds]
- Black women
- People with disabilities
- Small businesses
- Rural development and regional integration

1.2 Supplier Development Initiatives

To facilitate the implementation of Supplier Development initiatives, Transnet has adapted an existing framework from the Department of Public Enterprises [**DPE**]. This framework allows for a basic set of principles to be applied to appropriately targeted SD initiatives. Supplier development initiatives aim to build local suppliers who are competitive through building capability and capacity. Hence the framework has been termed the Increased Competitiveness, Capability and Capacity Supplier Development Classification Matrix [**IC3 Matrix**].

Currently there are four quadrants of SD initiatives which Transnet considers according to the IC³ Matrix. This RFI process and its subsequent RFP has been identified as "**Focused**" involving high value transactions with a focus on initiatives which will assist local suppliers to improve their performance, enhance their existing production and skills capabilities with emphasis being placed on benefiting previously disadvantaged individuals and rural development.

2 INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION OF THIS RFI/EOI

- 2.1 Transnet requests all Respondents to assist with the establishment of appropriate and feasible SD initiatives by submitting a Supplier Development Proposal providing your recommendations for innovative and practical initiatives which will demonstrate commitment and support for the New Growth Path Policy and its objectives.
- 2.2 For a detailed understanding of the IC³ Matrix, the respective SD initiatives and their objectives, please refer to the "Guidelines for the Completion of a Supplier Development Bid Document" appended hereto as <u>Annexure A</u>.
- 2.3 The following Supplier Development [**SD**] focus areas have been identified, in broad terms only, and should be used merely as a framework for your response to this RFI/EOI:

2.4 **A Supplier Development Proposal is to be submitted by all Respondents as a separate document**, developed in line with the criteria set out in Annexure B appended hereto [SD Value Summary]. The Supplier Development Proposal should be a detailed narrative document explaining the Respondent's recommended SD initiatives. However Respondents are at liberty to submit additional proposal/ information as the case might be. The SD Proposal should outline the type of activities recommended, an overview of how and with whom this might be enabled, and the mechanisms whereby proposed SD objectives might be achieved.

Whereas a Respondent need not complete or submit an Annexure B with its Returnable Documents, we strongly recommend that you use this Annexure B as a reference/support document for your SD Proposal.

It should be noted however, that Annexure B will be a compulsory Returnable Document during any subsequent RFP process.



Section 3 : TRANSNET'S FERROUS AND NON-FERROUS SCRAP METAL RESOURCES AND CONTRACTUAL REQUIREMENTS

Transnet Freight Rail [**TFR**] and Transnet Port Terminals [**TPT**] are Operating Divisions of Transnet and generate Scrap through maintenance and refurbishment operations as well as asset disposal programmes. The TFR Scrap is accumulated at Transnet's Supply Chain Services Scrap Yards and other specified and designated locations, at Transnet's option. At certain of the sites Scrap is generated from the workshops of other Transnet operating divisions, including Transnet Rail Engineering [**TRE**]

Transnet and the Company wish to exchange Information [as defined below] and it is envisaged that each party may from time to time receive Information relating to the other in respect thereof. In consideration of each party making available to the other such Information, the parties jointly agree that any dealings between them shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement which themselves will be subject to the parameters of the Bid Document.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED

1 INTERPRETATION

In this agreement:

- 1.1 **Agents** mean directors, officers, employees, agents, professional advisers, contractors or subcontractors, or any Group member;
- or **Bid** or **Bid Document** means Transnet's Request for Information [RFI] Request for Proposal [RFP] or Request for Quotation [RFQ], as the case may be;
- 1.3 Confidential Information means any information or other data relating to one party [the Disclosing Party] and/or the business carried on or proposed or intended to be carried on by that party and which is made available for the purposes of the Bid to the other party [the Receiving Party] or its Agents by the Disclosing Party or its Agents or recorded in agreed minutes following oral disclosure and any other information otherwise made available by the Disclosing Party or its Agents to the Receiving Party or its Agents, whether before, on or after the date of this Agreement, and whether in writing or otherwise, including any information, analysis or specifications derived from, containing or reflecting such information but excluding information which:

- is publicly available at the time of its disclosure or becomes publicly available [other than as
 a result of disclosure by the Receiving Party or any of its Agents contrary to the terms of this
 Agreement]; or
- b) was lawfully in the possession of the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] free of any restriction as to its use or disclosure prior to its being so disclosed; or
- c) following such disclosure, becomes available to the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] from a source other than the Disclosing Party or its Agents, which source is not bound by any duty of confidentiality owed, directly or indirectly, to the Disclosing Party in relation to such information;
- 1.4 **Group** means any subsidiary, any holding company and any subsidiary of any holding company of either party; and
- 1.5 Information means all information in whatever form including, without limitation, any information relating to systems, operations, plans, intentions, market opportunities, know-how, trade secrets and business affairs whether in writing, conveyed orally or by machine-readable medium.

2 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- 2.1 All Confidential Information given by one party to this Agreement [the Disclosing Party] to the other party [the Receiving Party] will be treated by the Receiving Party as secret and confidential and will not, without the Disclosing Party's written consent, directly or indirectly communicate or disclose [whether in writing or orally or in any other manner] Confidential Information to any other person other than in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 2.2 The Receiving Party will only use the Confidential Information for the sole purpose of technical and commercial discussions between the parties in relation to the Bid or for the subsequent performance of any contract between the parties in relation to the Bid.
- 2.3 Notwithstanding clause 2.1 above, the Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information:
 - a) to those of its Agents who strictly need to know the Confidential Information for the sole purpose set out in clause 2.2 above, provided that the Receiving Party shall ensure that such Agents are made aware prior to the disclosure of any part of the Confidential Information that the same is confidential and that they owe a duty of confidence to the Disclosing Party. The Receiving Party shall at all times remain liable for any actions of such Agents that would constitute a breach of this Agreement; or
 - b) to the extent required by law or the rules of any applicable regulatory authority, subject to clause 2.4 below.

- 2.5 In the event that any Confidential Information shall be copied, disclosed or used otherwise than as permitted under this Agreement then, upon becoming aware of the same, without prejudice to any rights or remedies of the Disclosing Party, the Receiving Party shall as soon as practicable notify the Disclosing Party of such event and if requested take such steps [including the institution of legal proceedings] as shall be necessary to remedy [if capable of remedy] the default and/or to prevent further unauthorised copying, disclosure or use.

BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND FURTHER RECOGNITION CRITERIA

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past.

Transnet would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values and who are prepared to contribute to meaningful B-BBEE initiatives [including, but not limited to subcontracting and Joint Ventures] as part of their tendered responses to any subsequent RFP process.

Ideally one Contractor would be appointed per region, for each of the six designated scrap yards [Scrap Yards] providing support services for the regional sub-depots. However, it must be noted that the above does not limit Transnet to appointing the same Contractor for multiple sites should the evaluation results indicate such an award;
 - b) to have one national Contractor for Non Ferrous Metals for a period of 3 years; and
 - c) to direct business to potential Enterprise Development [ED] suppliers/service providers for a period of three [3] years for transportation of Scrap from the different sub-depots and the required value add to improve on the price that Transnet gets for its Scrap e.g.
 - Uplifting Scrap at selected depots/sub-depots or elsewhere as required by Transnet
 - Transporting Scrap either via rail or road to the nearest Scrap depot
 - Receiving and unloading at the Scrap depot
 - Sorting, cutting, weighing and presenting to the warehouse manager for stocking of the Scrap at the Scrap Yards
 - Devising a comprehensive auditable weekly reporting system that relates to all Scrap movements from point of origin to destination



Section 2 : SUPPLIER DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES AND RFI/EOI SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

A critical objective of any subsequent RFP process will be to encourage and facilitate the introduction of new or smaller empowered entrants into the market, in order to aid in transformation of the South African economy and to create employment. This is broadly aligned to the Governments' stated New Growth Path [NGP] objectives.

It is therefore our intention, through this RFI/EOI process, to obtain a better insight into and understanding of Supplier Development [**SD**] opportunities in the Scrap Metals market and associated ancillary industries in South Africa.

1 GOVERNMENT'S NEW GROWTH PATH AND SUPPLIER DEVELOPMENT OBJECTIVES

1.1 Aim and Objectives

Historically in South Africa there has been a lack of investment in infrastructure, skills and capability development and an inequality in the income distribution and wealth of a significant portion of the population. There have been a number of Government initiatives developed to address these challenges. In particular, the New Growth Path [NGP] introduced in 2010 aligns and builds on previous policies to ensure the achievement of Government's developmental objectives for South Africa. Transnet fully endorses and supports Government's New Growth Path Policy.

The key focuses of the NGP include:

- increasing employment intensity of the economy
- addressing competitiveness
- balancing spatial development of rural areas and poorer provinces
- reducing the carbon intensity of the economy
- creating opportunities in improving regional and global cooperation
- enabling transformation that benefits a wider range of social actors in society e.g. workers,
 rural communities, youth and women

Transnet, as a State Owned Company [**SOC**], plays an important role to ensure these objectives are achieved. Therefore, the purchasing of goods and services needs to be aligned to Government's objectives for developing and transforming the local supply base. Transnet's mission is to transform its supplier base by engaging in targeted supplier development [**SD**]



initiatives to support localisation and industrialisation whilst providing meaningful opportunities for Black² South Africans with a particular emphasis on:

- Black Youth [16 to 35 year olds]
- Black women
- People with disabilities
- Small businesses
- Rural development and regional integration

1.2 Supplier Development Initiatives

To facilitate the implementation of Supplier Development initiatives, Transnet has adapted an existing framework from the Department of Public Enterprises [**DPE**]. This framework allows for a basic set of principles to be applied to appropriately targeted SD initiatives. Supplier development initiatives aim to build local suppliers who are competitive through building capability and capacity. Hence the framework has been termed the Increased Competitiveness, Capability and Capacity Supplier Development Classification Matrix [**IC3 Matrix**].

Currently there are four quadrants of SD initiatives which Transnet considers according to the IC³ Matrix. This RFI process and its subsequent RFP has been identified as "**Focused**" involving high value transactions with a focus on initiatives which will assist local suppliers to improve their performance, enhance their existing production and skills capabilities with emphasis being placed on benefiting previously disadvantaged individuals and rural development.

2 INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION OF THIS RFI/EOI

- 2.1 Transnet requests all Respondents to assist with the establishment of appropriate and feasible SD initiatives by submitting a Supplier Development Proposal providing your recommendations for innovative and practical initiatives which will demonstrate commitment and support for the New Growth Path Policy and its objectives.
- 2.2 For a detailed understanding of the IC³ Matrix, the respective SD initiatives and their objectives, please refer to the "Guidelines for the Completion of a Supplier Development Bid Document" appended hereto as <u>Annexure A</u>.

1 INTERPRETATION

In this agreement:

- or **Bid** or **Bid Document** means Transnet's Request for Information [RFI] Request for Proposal [RFP] or Request for Quotation [RFQ], as the case may be;
- 1.3 Confidential Information means any information or other data relating to one party [the Disclosing Party] and/or the business carried on or proposed or intended to be carried on by that party and which is made available for the purposes of the Bid to the other party [the Receiving Party] or its Agents by the Disclosing Party or its Agents or recorded in agreed minutes following oral disclosure and any other information otherwise made available by the Disclosing Party or its Agents to the Receiving Party or its Agents, whether before, on or after the date of this Agreement, and whether in writing or otherwise, including any information, analysis or specifications derived from, containing or reflecting such information but excluding information which:

- is publicly available at the time of its disclosure or becomes publicly available [other than as
 a result of disclosure by the Receiving Party or any of its Agents contrary to the terms of this
 Agreement]; or
- b) was lawfully in the possession of the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] free of any restriction as to its use or disclosure prior to its being so disclosed; or
- c) following such disclosure, becomes available to the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] from a source other than the Disclosing Party or its Agents, which source is not bound by any duty of confidentiality owed, directly or indirectly, to the Disclosing Party in relation to such information;
- 1.4 **Group** means any subsidiary, any holding company and any subsidiary of any holding company of either party; and

2 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- 2.1 All Confidential Information given by one party to this Agreement [the Disclosing Party] to the other party [the Receiving Party] will be treated by the Receiving Party as secret and confidential and will not, without the Disclosing Party's written consent, directly or indirectly communicate or disclose [whether in writing or orally or in any other manner] Confidential Information to any other person other than in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 2.2 The Receiving Party will only use the Confidential Information for the sole purpose of technical and commercial discussions between the parties in relation to the Bid or for the subsequent performance of any contract between the parties in relation to the Bid.
- 2.3 Notwithstanding clause 2.1 above, the Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information:
 - a) to those of its Agents who strictly need to know the Confidential Information for the sole purpose set out in clause 2.2 above, provided that the Receiving Party shall ensure that such Agents are made aware prior to the disclosure of any part of the Confidential Information that the same is confidential and that they owe a duty of confidence to the Disclosing Party. The Receiving Party shall at all times remain liable for any actions of such Agents that would constitute a breach of this Agreement; or

- 2.5 In the event that any Confidential Information shall be copied, disclosed or used otherwise than as permitted under this Agreement then, upon becoming aware of the same, without prejudice to any rights or remedies of the Disclosing Party, the Receiving Party shall as soon as practicable notify the Disclosing Party of such event and if requested take such steps [including the institution of legal proceedings] as shall be necessary to remedy [if capable of remedy] the default and/or to prevent further unauthorised copying, disclosure or use.
