- 4.3 If responses are not delivered as stipulated herein, such responses will not be considered.
- 4.4 No email or faxed responses will be considered, unless otherwise stated herein.
- 4.5 The responses to this RFP will be opened as soon as possible after the closing date and time.
- 4.6 Transnet shall not, at the opening of responses, disclose to any other company any confidential details pertaining to the Proposals / information received, i.e. pricing, delivery, etc. The names and locations of the Respondents will be divulged to other Respondents upon request.
- 4.7 Envelopes must not contain documents relating to any RFP other than that shown on the envelope.

5 BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OBLIGATIONS

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's objective of Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment and it is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past.

Transnet would therefore prefer to do business with enterprises who share these same values and who are prepared to contribute to meaningful B-BBEE initiatives [including, but not limited to subcontracting and Joint Ventures] as part of their tendered responses. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

5.1 **B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating**

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that the following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- Bidders are to note that if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFP must be cancelled. Similarly, if the 90/10 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids received are equal to or below R1 000 000.00, the RFP must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to exceed R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and therefore the **90/10** system shall be applicable.

When Transnet invites prospective suppliers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013. [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 11 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After the first year of the implementation of the Revised Codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in terms of the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sector-specific Codes will be measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transnet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transnet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transnet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Respondents are required to complete Section 14 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

5.2 **B-BBEE Joint Ventures or Consortiums**

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If such a JV or consortium agreement is unavailable, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondents are to note the requirements for B-BBEE compliance of JVs or consortiums as required by Section 14 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate for the JV or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

5.3 Subcontracting

Transnet fully endorses Government's transformation and empowerment objectives and when contemplating subcontracting Respondents are requested to give preference to companies which are Black Owned, Black Women Owned, Black Youth Owned, owned by Black People with Disabilities, EMEs and QSEs including any companies designated as B-BBEE Facilitators¹.

If contemplating subcontracting, please note that a Respondent will not be awarded points for B-BBEE if it is indicated in its Proposal that such Respondent intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five percent] of the value of the contract to an entity/entities that do not qualify for at least the same points that the Respondent qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME with the capability to execute the contract.

A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% [twenty-five percent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than

¹ The Minister of the Department of Trade and Industry has the power to designate certain Organs of State or Public Entities as B-BBEE Facilitators. For example, the South African National Military Veterans' Association (SANMVA) has been designated as a B-BBEE Facilitator. As such they will be treated as having rights of ownership held 100% by Black People, 40% by Black Women and 20% by Black designated groups.

the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.

In terms of Section 14 of this RFP [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] Respondents are required to indicate the percentage of the contract that will be sub-contracted as well as the B-BBEE status of the sub-contractor/s.

Respondents must submit the agreement between the main contractor and the sub-contractor with their proposals to Transnet.

5.4 Supplier Development Initiatives

Historically in South Africa there has been a lack of investment in infrastructure, skills and capability development and inequality in the income distribution and wealth of a significant portion of the population. There have been a number of Government initiatives developed to address these challenges. In particular, the New Growth Path [NGP] and New Development Plan [NDP] aligns and builds on previous policies to ensure the achievement of Government's development objectives for South Africa.

Transnet fully endorses and supports Government's economic policies through its facilitation of Supplier Development [**SD**] initiatives. Hence Respondents are required to submit their commitments with regard to Supplier Development Initiatives over the duration of this contract.

Supplier Development Initiatives are a prerequisite for this RFP. Transnet requires Respondents to meet or exceed a threshold of 15% in respect of their SD commitments on this contract.

All Respondents must refer to **Section 18** for further instructions. Respondents are required to submit a Supplier Development Value Summary, <u>Annexure B</u> as this is a mandatory returnable document. In addition, Respondents are required to complete **Section_19** [**Declaration of Supplier Development Commitments**] and submit a Supplier Development Plan, <u>Annexure C</u> as these are required as essential returnable documents.

Note: Should a JV be envisaged the principal Respondent is required to submit the required responses as indicated above.

The commitments made by the successful Respondents will be incorporated as a term of the contract and monitored for compliance.

6 COMMUNICATION

6.1 For specific queries relating to this RFP, an RFP Clarification Request Form should be submitted to [Mulalo Mukwena] before **12:00 on 27 February 2014**, substantially in the form set out in Section 12 hereto. In the interest of fairness and transparency Transnet's response to such a query will then be made available to the other Respondents who have collected RFP documents. For this purpose Transnet will communicate with Respondents using the contact details provided to the Secretariat on issue of the bid documentation to the Respondent. Kindly ensure that you provide the Secretariat with the **correct** contact details, as Transnet will not accept responsibility for being unable to contact a bidder who provided incorrect contact details.

- 6.3 Respondents are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.

Respondents are warned that a Proposal will be liable to disqualification should any attempt be made by a Respondent either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer or employee of Transnet in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business. Furthermore, Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with Transnet in the future.

7 INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE RFP

- 7.1 Proposals must be submitted in duplicate hard copies [1 original and 1 copy] and must be bound.
- 7.2 Sign one set of original documents [sign, stamp and date the bottom of each page]. This set will serve as the legal and binding copy. A duplicate set of documents is required. This second set must be a copy of the original signed Proposal.
- 7.3 Both sets of documents are to be submitted to the address specified in paragraph 4 above.
- 7.4 A CD copy of the RFP Proposal must be submitted. Please provide files in MS Word / Excel format, not PDF versions, noting that the signed original set will be legally binding.
- 7.5 All returnable documents tabled in the Proposal Form [Section 4] must be returned with your Proposal.
- 7.6 Unless otherwise expressly stated, all Proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.
- 7.7 Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter. Subject only to clause 15 [Alterations made by the Respondent to Bid Prices] of the General Bid Conditions, alterations, additions or deletions must not be made by the Respondent to the actual RFP documents.

8 COMPLIANCE

The successful Respondent [hereinafter referred to as the **Supplier**] shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

9 DISCLAIMERS

Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- 9.1 disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [closing date];
- 9.2 modify the RFP's Goods and request Respondents to re-bid on any such changes;
- 9.3 reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and specifications detailed herein;
- 9.4 disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [closing date];

- 9.5 not necessarily accept the lowest priced Proposal or an alternative bid;
- 9.6 reject all Proposals, if it so decides;
- 9.7 withdraw the RFP on good cause shown;
- 9.8 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- 9.9 award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods reflected in the scope of this RFP;
- 9.10 reduce or increase the volumes indicated if it is so decided.
- 9.11 limit period of contract;
- 9.12 split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier;

Furthermore, Transnet reserves the right to visit the Respondent's place of manufacture and/or workshop and/or office premises during this RFP process.

Transnet reserves the right to undertake post-tender negotiations [PTN] with selected Respondents or any number of short-listed Respondents, such PTN to include, at Transnet's option, any evaluation criteria listed in this RFP document.

Transpet reserves the right to award the business to the highest scoring bidder/s unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder.

Transnet reserves the right to lower the threshold for SD by **5%** [**five** percent] if no Bidders pass the predetermined minimum threshold of 15% in respect of SD.

Kindly note that Transnet will not reimburse any Respondent for any preparatory costs or other work performed in connection with its Proposal, whether or not the Respondent is awarded a contract.

10 LEGAL REVIEW

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

Section 2: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1 BACKGROUND

A Rail Fastening System is a mechanism for fastening rails to sleepers (railroad ties) which forms part of the Perway materials. Currently, TFR are using two different types of Rail Fastening Systems which are the Pandrol type and the Fist type. The current Systems in use comprises of the following components;

Pandrol Type	Fist Type
• 2x Clips	• 1x Fist Clip
• 1x Pad	• 1x Pad
• 2x Insulator	• 1x Pin

Rail Fastening Systems are a strategic commodity to TFR business; they are also characterised by high technical sensitivity hence there is a requirement for all Rail Fastening Systems components or products to be technically approved before being used anywhere in TFR's Rail Network. Transnet Freight Rail Technology Management has developed a generic functional specification (BBF9273 VER1) to guide any potential suppliers as to the correct production of the Rail Fastening Systems. See APPENDIX (iii) for the functional Specification.

Unless the Fastening Systems have been approved through experience gained as a result of installation in TFR's Rail Network and/or approved through a testing process by TFR's Technology Management department, Systems that that are not approved will be subjected to a product approval process. The Product approval may take a minimum period of 18 Months.

Technology Management Testing process

- Submit Samples all components of the proposed fastening system (including Jigs for testing) will be delivered to TFR's Technology Management department at the bidders own cost.
- Laboratory approval to obtain conditional approval ~ 6 months
- In-Track testing as per specification.
- TFR may require to undertake physical audits of the manufacturing facility/s to validate bidders responses.

Points 2 and 3 above forms part a two-stage approval process as detailed below:

Conditional Approval Stage

Conditional approval involves Laboratory testing.

 Laboratory testing is conducted by Transnet Freight Rail Technology Management and the results are communicated to the applicant (respondent) to ensure transparency.

In - Track approval Stage

- In -track testing process will only commence if and when the product has passed the first stage and has been granted conditional Approval to install it.
- In –track testing process as per specifications.
- This is required to optimize the performance of the product under various climatic conditions.
- Suppliers must supply all material for each in-track test to the Transnet designated depot.
- Transnet will carry the costs of installation.

Due to the product approval process which takes a minimum period of 18 months, potential new suppliers bidders whose systems that are not yet approved will not be awarded any business from this procurement event. As indicated above, the bidders will, however be afforded an opportunity to submit their designs and samples for product testing by Transnet Freight Rail technology Management. Refer to the evaluation flow chart attached (*Appendix vi*).

2 EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Our objective as Transnet is to source all activity through a Preferred Supplier(s) capable of supplying the product to all locations around the country.

Other key considerations include the need for Transnet to grow a list of suppliers of the Rail fastening Systems and other strategic commodities. Also to be considered is the fact that Transnet is committed into supporting state's socio economic objectives. Procurement is one of the most effective platforms for advancing the state's socio economic objectives.

Whereas Transnet is seeking a partner(s) to provide solutions for its demand nationally, it also seeks to improve its current processes for providing these Goods to its end user community throughout its locations.

The selected Supplier(s) will share in the mission and business objectives of Transnet. These mutual goals will be met through contractual requirements and new challenges in an environment of teamwork, joint participation, flexibility, innovation and open communications. In this spirit of partnership, Transnet and its Supplier(s) will study the current ways they do business to enhance current practices and support processes and systems. Such a partnership will allow Transnet to reach higher levels of quality, service and profitability.

Specifically, Transnet seeks to benefit from this partnership in the following ways:

- 2.1 Transnet must receive reduced cost of acquisition and improved service benefits resulting from the Supplier's economies of scale and streamlined service processes.
- 2.2 Transnet must achieve appropriate availability that meets user needs while reducing costs for both Transnet and the chosen Supplier(s).
- 2.3 Transnet must receive proactive improvements from the Supplier with respect to supply of Goods and related processes.

- 2.4 Transnet's overall competitive advantage must be strengthened by the chosen Supplier's leading edge technology and service delivery systems.
- 2.5 Transnet end users must be able to rely on the chosen Supplier's personnel for service enquiries, recommendations and substitutions.
- 2.6 Transnet must reduce costs by streamlining its acquisition of Goods, including managed service processes on a Group basis.

3 SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1 This Tender is for the design, manufacture and supply of rail fastening systems to transnet freight rail (TFR) nationally for a period of two years on an "as and when required" basis. Through this procurement event, Transnet are seeking:
 - 3.1.1 suppliers who can supply approved Rail fastening systems approved through experience gained as a result of installation in TFR's network and/or approved through a testing process by TFR's technology management department

- 3.2 The proposed 'design, manufacture and supply of rail fastening systems to TFR nationally for a period of two years on an "as and when required" basis' contract will cover the national demand for standard, anti-vandal version, anti-sabotage version and special fasteners for use in turnouts. Refer to the appended functional specifications for more details on the product required.
- 3.3 With reference to the MDS and other projects (CAPEX and COPEX), a projection was made to estimate the quantity of Rail Fastening Systems to be required for the following two years. In the following two years, TFR is going to procure a forecasted quantity of approximately **1 419 889** units of Rail Fastening Systems.
- 3.4 A technical questionnaire (Annexure A) must be completed by all respondents to be evaluated for compliance with specifications.
 - Bidders proposing approved products (systems) must complete and comply with both Annexure A1 and A2 to be evaluated for the 100% Technical Threshold.
 - Bidders whose Fastening systems are not approved by TFR must complete and comply with Annexure A1 to be evaluated for the 100% Technical Threshold.
- 3.5 As prescribed in terms of the PPPFA and its Regulations, Respondents are to note the following:
 - Compliance to Specifications is included as a threshold with a prescribed percentage threshold of 100%.





- 2.6 **"comparative price"** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the

- 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juristic person;
- 2.14 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue between R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.15 "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 **"subcontract"** means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.17 **"total revenue"** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.18 "trust" means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The Bidder obtaining the highest number of total points for the evaluation criteria as enumerated in Section 2 of the RFP will be awarded the contract, unless objective criteria justifies the award to another bidder.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.
- 3.3 Points scored will be rounded off to 2 [two] decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest

- number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.
