#### 2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

#### 2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that the following preference point system is applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- Bidders are to note that if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFP must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to be below R1000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the **80/20** system shall be applicable.

When Transnet invites prospective suppliers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BREE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad page Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36925]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice Insued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 1 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After the first year of the implementation of the Revised Codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in terms of the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sector-specific Codes which measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transpet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transpet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transpet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Respondents are required to complete Annexure A [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

- 1.2 Failure on the part of a Bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form a submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the south African Accreditation System [SANAS] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Interpreted Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA] or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act [CCA] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- 1.3 Transnet reserves the right to regard of a Buder, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by Transnet.

#### 2. GENERAL DEFINITION

- 2.1 "ail applicable taxes" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies;
- 2.2 "B- BEE" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Page Pack Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.2 OF SEARCE status of contributor" means the 8-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.4 "Bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by Transnet for the provision of goods, works or services;
- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 [Act No. 53 of 2003];
- 2.6 "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;

- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined nones, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder.
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices:

- 2.15 "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of big invitation, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 **"subcontract**" means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.17 **'tetal ovenue"** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Nactice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.18 "trust" means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.19 "trustee" means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

#### 3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The Bidder obtaining the highest number of total points for the evaluation criteria as enumerated in Section 2 of the RFP will be awarded the contract, unless objective criteria justifies the award to another bidder.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.

- 3.3 Points scored will be rounded off to 2 (two) decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.



#### 4. POINTS AWARDED FOR B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION

4.1 In terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011, preference points shall be awarded to a Bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Begistered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.4 Bidders who qualify as tw-5 in terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of government Gazette No. 36928 are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis of grirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R10 million or less and the entity's level of Brack ownership.
- In terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice, Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- In terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928, Bidders who qualify as QSEs are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R50 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership. Large enterprises must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 4.7 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for its B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits its B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 4.8 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.

- 4.9 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialised scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 4.10 A person will not be awarded points for 8-88EE status level if it is indicated in the Bid documents that such a Bidder intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the same number of points that such a Bidder qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- 4.11 A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- 4.12 Bidders are to note that in terms of paragraph 2.6 of Statement 000 of the revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gizette No. 36928, any representation made by an entity about its B-BBEE compliance must be supported by suitable evidence or documentation. As such, Transnet reserves the right to request such evidence or **f**gnition claimed. documentation from Bidders in order to verify any B-BBEL

#### 1.0 CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS

A:

1.1 This project specification covers Transnet freight rail's requirements for the installation of gabions on and as and when basic in the Bethlehem region "UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE DEPOT ENGINEER, BLOEMFONTEIN".

<u>B:</u>

- 1.1 The Contractor shall not make use of any sub-Contractor to perform the works or parts thereof without prior permission from the Project Manager.
- 1.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a san tyrepresentative is at site at all times.
- 1.3 The Contractor shall comply with a applicable legislation and Transnet safety requirements adopted from time to time and instructed by the Project Manager / Supervisor. Such compliance shall be entirely at his/her own cost and shall be deemed to have been allowed for in the rates and prices in the contract.
- 1.4 The Contractor shall, it particular, comply with the following Acts and Transnet Specifications:-
  - 1.4.1 The Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act, No. 130 of 1993. The Contractor shall produce proof of his registration and good standing with the Compensation Commissioner in terms of the Act.
  - 1.4.2 The Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act 85 of 1993).
  - 1.4.3 The explosive Act No. 26 of 1956 (as amended). The Contractor shall, when applicable, furnish the Project Manager / Supervisor with copies of the permits authorising him or his employees, to establish an explosives magazine on or near the site and to undertake blasting operations in compliance with the Act.
  - 1.4.4 The Contractor shall comply with the current Transnet Specification E.4E, Safety Arrangements and Procedural Compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 and Regulations and shall before commencement with the execution of the contract, which shall include site establishment and delivery of plant, equipment or materials, submit to the Project Manager / Supervisor.
  - 1.4.5 The Contractor shall comply with the current Specification for Works On, Over, Under or Adjacent to Railway Lines and near High Voltage Equipment E7/1, if applicable, and shall take particular care of the safety of his employees on or in close proximity to a railway line during track occupations as well as under normal operational conditions.
- 1.5 The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be subject to agreement by the Project Manager / Supervisor, who may, in consultation with the Contractor, order supplementary and/or additional safety arrangements and/or different safe working methods to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act.
- 1.6 In addition to compliance with clause 1.4 hereof, the Contractor shall report all incidents in writing to the Project Manager / Supervisor. Any incident resulting in the death of or injury to any person

- on the works shall be reported within 24 hours of its occurrence and any other incident shall be reported within 48 hours of its occurrence.
- 1.7 The Contractor shall make necessary arrangements for <u>sanitation, water</u> and electricity at these relevant sites during the installation of the equipments.
- 1.8 A penalty charge of **R1**, **000.00** per day will be levied for late completion.
- 1.9 The Contractor shall supply a **site diary** (with triplicate pages). This book shall be used to record any unusual events during the period of the work. Any delays to the work shall also be recorded such as delays caused by poor weather conditions, delays caused by permits being cancelled etc. The appointed Project Manager or Supervisor must countersign such delays. Other delays such as non-availability of equipment from 3<sup>rd</sup> party suppliers must be communicated to the Project Manager or Supervisor in writing.
- 1.10 The Contractor shall supply a **site instruction book** (with triplicate pages). This book shall be used to record any instructions to the Contractor regarding problems e countered on site for example the quality of work or the placement of equipment. This book shall be filled in by the Project Manager or Supervisor and must be countersigned by the Centractor.
- 1.11 Both books mentioned in 1.9 and 1.10 shall be the property of Transnet Freight Rail and shall be handed over to the Project Manager or Supervisor on the day of entroping or handing over.
- 1.12 All processes or the manufacture and assembly of the product components must be subjected to a quality assurance system.
- 1.13 The Contractor will assume full responsibility for assuming that the products purchased meet the requirements of Transnet Freight Rail for function, performance, and reliability, including purchased products from 3<sup>rd</sup> part suppliers/Manufacture.
- 1.14 The Contractor shall prove to Transnet Greight Rail that his equipment or those supplied from 3<sup>rd</sup> party suppliers/manufacturers confirms to Transnet freight rail specifications.
- 1.15 The Contractor will remain liable for contractual delivery dates irrespective of deficiencies discovered during workshop inspections
- 1.16 The contractor must have a complete **Safety file** with all relevant documents before commencing with the work.

#### 2 DESCRIPTION OF WORK

The contractor is expected to pack gabions at the specified places as indicated by the Technical Officer in a way as to restore the desired formation profiles of the Railway lines. The formation for packing gabions has to be excavated by hand unless otherwise indicated by the Technical Officer (Transnet) before the gabions can be placed into position. The Contractor will not be allowed to communice with the excavations for the gabions before the Technical Officer (Transnet) has set out the position and level thereof on the site. The gabions must be placed on a leveled prepared foundation surface. The Contractor will be requested to use different types of gabion baskets which will be specified by the Technical Officer (See attached annexure B). The gabion boxes have to be filled with hand stone. The hand stone must be placed into the gabion boxes with the minimum percentage of voids between the stones in order to ensure proper alignment and a compact, square appearance. Gaps between the formation and gabions have to be backfilled and compacted after the completion of placing gabions. A geotextile fabric AG200 (or similar) is to be placed only on the back side of the basket to prevent losses of fines (ONLY if indicated to do so by the Technical Officer).

#### 3 DESCRIPTION AND ASSEMBLY OF GABIONS

### 3.1 Materials and Requirements before starting

#### 3.1.1 Gabions:

The gabions are double twisted hexagonal wire mesh baskets with different sizes. The gabion basket is to be constructed from a 2,7mm mild steel wire, zinc coated by hot dip galvanising to SABS 675:1993.

#### 3.1.2 Binding, Bracing and Lacing wire:

All binding wire is to be Class A, zinc galvanised coated 2,2 mm binding wire to SABS 675:1993.

#### 3.1.3 Geotextiles:

An AG200 (or similar) geotextile must be placed at each soil-gabion interface for separation/filtration purposes. Unless otherwise stated AG200 is to be used for this purpose.

#### 3.1.4 Rock:

Rock used should be clean, sufficiently durable and should be obtained from a commercial crushing source or as per Technical Officer (Transnet) specification. For gabions, the rock should be well graded between **100mm and 250mm**, and should have a minimum Specific Gravity (12,3.

#### 3.1.5 Training

Gabions must be packed by qualified and trained personnel; if gabions are packed incorrectly the contractor will be instructed to repack until the Technical officer is satisfied with the quality, levels, and finishes.

#### 3.2 FOUNDATION PREPARATION

The formation of the base should be prepared by hand. It should be level and compacted to 93% MOD ASSHTO. Where required the contractor is expected to level the formation by adding suitable compacting material. This material will be supplied be the contractor.

#### 3.3 FLATTENING THE UNITS

Unfold the units on a flat, hard surface. Press out the creases and kinks in the mesh and selvage wires as they are not always indicative of the edges of the unit and may result in the loss of a few centimetres of mesh per crease.

#### 3.4 ASSEMBLING AND LACING THE INDIVIDUAL UNITS

Fold the side and end pinels to form a box ensuring that the tops of the different sides line up horizontally. Join the top corners with the thicker selvage wires that protrude from the corners.

Secure the locing wire at the top corners of the panels to be joined. Lace the edges using the single and double loop technique along the wire mesh openings. Allow for 100mm between loops.

A making eable length of binding wire is one complete turn from the coil (1,35-1,50m) of binding wire supplied, sufficient to lace one 1m edge.

All diaphragms are pre-attached to the base with a spiral. Lift the diaphragms into the vertical position and pull the spiral taut (250-300mm on either side), using the combination pliers. Use the extended spiral wire to secure the diaphragm to the bottom of the front and back panels of the gabion.

Finally, lace the diaphragm edges to the front and back panels with lacing wire as outlined above.

#### 3.5 PLACING GEOTEXTILE

Geotextiles prevent the loss of fines from the soil behind the gabion structure through the rock fill and simultaneously negate the build up of any water pressure behind the wall. The omission of the geotextile is detrimental to the integrity of the structure as a whole.

Cut sufficient geotextile to line the structure along the soil-gabion interface. Place the geotextile on the prepared foundation, with the remaining geotextile temporarily draped along the backfill.

Place the gabion on the geotextile lined foundation. Ensure that the geotextile is not torn or ripped during the placing and filling of the basket, or the placing and compacting of the backfill.

During construction, ensure contact between the geotextile and the back face of the gabion structure. If required, tie the geotextile to the top of the gabion structure to facilitate construction.

#### 3.6 PLACING THE UNITS

Place a number of individually laced units side by side in the required position. Care must be taken not to damage the geotextile. Lace adjacent units together as described in Section 3.4 at every adjacent edge to form a monolithic cage structure.

The gabions should remain under tension during the filling operation to allow for good alignment and finish. All gabion structures should be aligned and constructed accurately using standard engineering methods and procedures e.g. fish lines, dumpy levels or formwork. Alignment should be done BEFORE the units are filled, as the units are almost impossible to move afterwards.

#### 3.7 FILLING AND BRACING THE GABIONS

Only stone as specified in Section 3.1.4 of this document care be used for filling of gabions unless otherwise stipulated by the Technical Officer (Transnet).

Fill each gabion cell in 1/3 layers between which bracing wires are installed. A minimum of four bracing wires per square metre of gabion front face are recommended.

These should be fixed at one third and two thirds the total depth of a 1m deep gabion. For 0,5m high gabions, bracing wires should be fixed at a height 0.25m. Two complete turns from the coil of binding wire supplied (approximately 2,3-2,7m), is sufficient for each brace for a 1m wide gabion unit and approximately 3,3-3,7m for a 1,5m gabion init.

Thread the wire around two mesh openings in the front and rear faces of the basket and twist the ends together at the middle.

Tension the brace by wing assing with the pliers handle or a rock until the front face is in line. This procedure may be repeated cross the side panel and the diaphragm if the side panel is visible.

Fill each row of gabiens is stages when placing a number of gabion units next to each other. Fill the entire row, except the last cell to a third.

Thereafter brice the entire row and proceed with filling the row up to the two third mark. Again brace the entire row as the two third mark and then fill the remainder of the cells to the top. At no time should the difference in height of gabion rock between adjacent cells be more than a third of a metre. This is done so as to prevent bulging of the diaphragms. If more gabions are to be added to a row, the last cell in each low should be left empty to facilitate wiring. To ensure a good finished appearance, all visible faces should be hand-packed carefully.

Gabions should be overfilled by 25-50mm to allow for natural settlement of the rock fill whilst keeping the top edge of the diaphragm visible so as to lace it to the lid.

#### 3.8 BACKFILLING

Compaction of the backfill must be done simultaneously with every row of gabions laid. Care must be taken not to damage the geotextile when placing and compacting the backfill. Heavy compacting equipment must not come within 1.0m of the gabion basket. Small hand held compaction equipment may be used adjacent to the gabion basket.

#### 3.9 CLOSING

Fold the lid down, stretch into position with the aid of a suitable tool (Technical Officer will provide), lace the lid to the front, the ends and the top of the diaphragm as per Section 3.4.

#### 4 SITE ESTABLISHMENT AND TRAVELLING COST

Site establishment will be a once off payment per work site for the purpose of all requirements of doing the work for the agreed about period of time. The agreed about period of time will be noted in the site instruction book and failure to complete the work in this period of time will result in penalties. Traveling costs will be calculated from the Bethlehem depot to site one way and return. This cost is included for the contractor to eliminate the expense risk of sites being in different areas.

#### 5 THE SITE

Access to the sites will be via the Transnet service roads. The key for gates in the service road can be obtained from the Technical Officer, but it must be handed back on completion of the contract. Gates have to be kept closed at all times. No vehicle will be allowed to cross the railway line at any place except at level crossings.

No Transnet property like sleepers, rails, fencing, cables and ballast stone are to be removed from the site.

The repairs of any damages to the Transnet fencing/railway lines, Eckon power lines and Telkom will be for the Contractors account. The Contractor must arrange for the damage to be repaired within one day. Alternatively these costs will be deducted from the tendered amount, and Transnet will arrange for the repair of the damage.

#### 6 TO BE SUPPLIED BY TRANSNET:

Transnet will provide the **Gabion baskets** as described in section 3.1.1, **Binding and lacing wire** as described in section 3.1.2 and **Geotextiles** as described in section 3.1.3. Transnet will also supply to the Contractor, for the duration of the job, the tool reduined to properly close the gabion baskets.

The gabion baskets, binding wire, lating wire and geotextile material have to be collected at the **Bloemfontein Infra Depot** by the Contractor or a representative of the Contractor. After completion of the contract, all the materials provided will be measured against materials used. All materials unused should be returned to BLOEMFO V.E.N DEPOT as soon as the contractor completes the work, if not the cost of that material will be decirated from payments to the Contractor.

# 7 TO BE SUPPLIED BY THE CONTRACTOR

The Contractor is espansible to supply his own **equipment**, **transport and labour**. The **Contractor must also provide the rock** (as per section 3.1.4.) for filling the gabion baskets. The Contractor must provide appoint dipersons (equipped with a whistle and white flags) to warn people on the site against approaching trains by blowing a whistle. The contractor is responsible to use protective clothing and adhere to the safety rules and regulations of Act 85.

The Contractor is responsible for plastic sheeting or canvas to cover the ballast stone to keep it free from sand or pollution.

#### 8 PROGRAM FOR THE EXECUTION OF THE WORK

It is required of the successful Tenderer to commence work two weeks after the tender closing date. The ending date of contract will be either when the sum of **R500 000 or 26<sup>th</sup> March 2015** is reached. It will be expected of the Contractor to inform the Technical Officer about his daily activities. This information is required in order to inform the Train personnel of activities adjacent to railway lines and is important for the safety of the Contractor and his personnel.

#### 9 SAFETY

The Contractor is reminded that working adjacent to railway lines is hazardous and has to be treated as such. The Contractor must ensure that all employees are equipped with **reflector vests or jackets, boots, gloves and hard hats.** Open fires are not allowed on site. Any fires that may occur should be

extinguished immediately at own costs. Any claims due to fire caused by the Contractor will be for his account.

The Contractor is responsible to arrange for two sentinels with white flags who must be on the constant lookout for trains in both directions. When a train is approaching the sentinel must blow a whistle and make sure that no workers and/or equipment are on or within 3 metres of the railway line. (as per section 7)

All material, which exceeds 2 metres in length, shall be carried below head height near live high-voltage equipment and overhead wire. The utmost care must -be taken to ensure that no part of material comes within 3 metres of any live high-voltage equipment. No water shall be used in the form of a jet if it can make contact with any live high-voltage equipment.

The contractor is required to provide a safety plan before commencement of any work. The Contractor will adhere to this plan at all times. The workers must wear their PPE at all times while on site. Regular audits will be done to monitor contractor compliance.

The Contractor must on a daily base inform the Operations Office the time the shift starts and at the end of the day, the time the shift closes. **At Telephone number: 056 268 2266.** 

#### 10 PENALTY CLAUSE

In the event that the Contractor does not complete the work within the period agreed upon in the job order, a penalty of **R1000, 00** (VAT incl.) per day will be deducted from the contract payment.

#### 11 INSURANCE OF WORKS

The Contractor shall take every precaution to project the Works against damage of any kind and not to cause damage to property or injury to any person is a result of his execution of the works.

The Contractor shall, in his interests, o tair insurance of his own site establishment, materials, plant, equipment and tools, as well as in urance for his motor vehicles and the common law liabilities of the Contractor as an employer. Translat shall arrange insurance for public liability.

#### 12 FINAL INSPECTION OF THE WORK

Inspection of the work will be done within seven working days after the Contractor has notified the Technical Officer of Transfet in writing that the work has been completed. If the work is found to be satisfactory, the Contractor will be allowed to submit a tax invoice together with the job order.

### 13 MEASUR MINTS AND PAYMENT

Payment will be made as follows: After completion of each work site or as per completed gabion on assessment date.

#### 14 TEMPORARY CAMPS

No campsites or accommodation will be available to the Contractor on Transnet premises. The Contractor must arrange for all facilities needed and these costs must be included in the tender price.

#### 15 POLLUTION PREVENTION

According to the Environmental Management System of the Bloemfontein Infra Depot, pollution must be prevented as far as possible. Where pollution occurs due to the negligence of the Contractor, he/she will be responsible for corrective actions or he/she will be held liable for corrective actions required.

## 16 QUALITY AND INSPECTION

Transnet Freight Rail shall inspect the work completed according to the specification compiled by the Technical Officer.

#### 17 EXCEPTIONS

The contractor should note that **no exception** will be made for any contractor in failing to complete the work on time, the rocks will not be the reason for any delay, and contractor must ensure that he has an agreement with a specific quarry to supply him with rocks for the whole project before submitting his schedule of quantity with prices.

The contractor must know that the price quoted/submitted will be final and no additional requests will be granted.

#### SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE WITH THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

#### 1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and Transnet Limited (hereinafter referred to as "Transnet") are individual employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and obligations set but a the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Condition of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his encloy, other persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, or under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Safety Pau as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to compying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the omission of some on the rovisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 Transnet accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Technical Officer or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any disperancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precident.

#### 2. Definition

- 2.1 In this 2, diffication any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -
- 2.2 The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "Construction Work", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with: -
  - (a) the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
  - the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;
  - (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or
  - (d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work:
- 2.3 "competent person" in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed: Provided that where appropriate qualifications and training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;

- "contractor" means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the 2.4 Construction Regulations, 2003.
- "fall protection plan" means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated 2.5 position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 "health and safety file" means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;
- "Health and Safety Plan" means a documented plan which addresses the hazards identified and 2.7 include safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 "Risk Assessment" means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove reduce or control such hazard:
- 2.9 "the Act" means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993

#### 3. **Procedural Compliance**

and shall also notify the Provincial Director if writing when the construction work exceeds 30 days or will involve more than 300 person days of construction work and if the construction work:-

- includes excavation work deeper than 1m; or includes working at a hight greater than 3 metres above ground or a landing. (b)
- The notification to the Presencial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of the Construction 3.2 Regulations, 2003, also shown in Annexure 1 of this Specification. The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the consolited notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer or employee
- The Colltractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary 3.3 ments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver spies thereof to the Technical Officer. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety
- Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies 3.4 thereof to the Technical Officer.
- 3.5 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.
- 3.6 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.7 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Transnet's safety requirements and procedures.

#### 4, Special Permits

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hotwork, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Technical Officer or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

#### 5. Health and Safety Programme

- The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical 5.1 arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
  - The provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without (i)
  - risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act; the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act (ii) that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and salety;
  - ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, in terms of sectors of the Act that no employee or (iii) ct which would be an offence for the subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do Contractor to do or omit to do.
- The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and safety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated 5.2 with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and or ctical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a 5.3 competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessment shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:
  - the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to; (a) The identification
  - evaluation of the hazards identified; (b) the analysis an
  - a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or (c) control the risks identified;
  - onibring and review plan. (d)
- alth and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -5.4
  - The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
  - (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
  - the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his (c) employees;
  - the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented; (d)
  - the arrangements in respect of communication of health and safety related matters and (e) incidents between the Contractor, his employees, subcontractors and the Technical Officer with particular reference to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Administrative Regulation 8 of the Act and with the pertinent clause of the General Conditions of Contract forming part of the Contract and
  - the introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Safety Plan is maintained and (f) monitored for the duration of the Contract.

- 5.4 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Technical Officer's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, in the Technical Officer's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Technical Officer or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.
- 5.5 The Contractor shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken, shall include periodic audits at intervals mutually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.
- 5.6 The Contractor shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site of which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.
- 5.7 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer, agent, subcontractor, employee, registered ampleyee organisation, health and safety representative or any member of the health and safety committee.
- 5.8 The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.9 The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under the corneol are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined to the Risk Assessment.
- 5.10 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontinctors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work continences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.11 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards creatent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

## 6. Fall Protection Plan

- 6.1.1 In the event of the lisk and hazard identification, as required in terms of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the contractor shall cause the designation of a competer operion, responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.2 The Conflaction shall implement, maintain and monitor the fall protection plan for the duration of Contract.

  The duration shall also take such steps to ensure the continued adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.3 The fail protection plan shall include:-
  - (a) A Risk Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
  - (b) the procedures and methods to address all the identified risks per location;
  - (c) the evaluation of the employees physical and psychological fitness necessary to work at elevated positions;
  - (d) the training of employees working from elevated positions; and
  - (e) the procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall protection equipment.

#### 7. Hazards and Potential Hazardous Situations

The Contractor and the Technical Officer shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

#### 8. Health and Safety File

- 8.1 The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Technical Officer, or subcontractor upon request.
- 8.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Technical Officer.
- 8.3 The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Technical Officer upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.

## 1 <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

The following definitions shall apply:

<u>Authorised Person</u>. A person whether an employee of Transnet or not, who has been specially authorised to undertake specific duties in terms of Transnet's publication SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS: HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT, and who holds a certificate or letter of authority to that effect.

Barrier. Any device designed to restrict access to "live" high-voltage electrical equipment.

Bond. A short conductor installed to provide electrical continuity.

Contractor. Any person or organisation appointed by Transnet to carry qui work on its behalf.

Dead. Isolated and earthed.

<u>Electrical Officer (Contracts)</u>. The person appointed in writing by the responsible Electrical Engineer in Transnet as the person who shall be consulted by the Contractor in all electrical matters to ensure that adequate safety precautions are taken by the Contractor.

<u>Executive Officer</u>. The person appointed by Transnet from time to time as the Executive Officer to act according to the rights and powers held by anti-obligations placed upon him in terms of the Contract.

High-Voltage. A voltage normally exceeding 000 volts.

<u>Live</u>. A conductor is said to be "live" when it is at a potential different from that of the earth or any other conductor of the system of which it forms a part.

<u>Near</u>. To be in such a position that a per on's body or the tools he is using or any equipment he is handling may come within 3 metres of live exposed high-voltage electrical equipment.

Occupation. An authorisation granted by Transnet for work to be carried out under specified conditions on, over under or adjacent to railway lines.

Occupation Between Trails: An occupation during an interval between successive trains.

<u>Project Manager</u>, the person or juristic person appointed by Transnet from time to time as the Project Manager, to administer the Contract according to the powers and rights held by and obligations procedupon him in terms of the Contract.

Responsible Representative. The responsible person in charge, appointed by a contractor, who has un lengone specific training (and holds a certificate) to supervise staff under his control to work on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines and in the vicinity of high-voltage electrical equipment.

<u>Technical Officer</u>. The person or juristic person appointed by Transnet from time to time as the Technical Officer, to administer the Contractor's performance and execution of the Works according to the powers and rights held by and obligations placed upon the Technical Officer in terms of the Contract.

<u>Total Occupation</u>. An occupation for a period when trains are not to traverse the section of line covered by the occupation.

<u>Work on.</u> Work undertaken on or so close to the equipment that the specified working clearances to the live equipment cannot be maintained.

Work Permit. A combined written application and authority to proceed with work on or near dead electrical equipment.

# PART A - GENERAL SPECIFICATION

#### 2. AUTHORITY OF OFFICERS OF TRANSNET

- 2.1 The Contractor shall co-operate with the officers of Transnet and shall comply with all instructions issued and restrictions imposed with respect to the Works which bear on the existence and operation of Transnet's railway lines and high-voltage equipment.
- 2.2 Without limiting the generality of the provisions of 2.1, any duly authorised representative of Transnet, having identified himself, may stop the work if, in his opinion, the safe passage of trains or the safety of Transnet assets or any person is affected. CONSIDERATIONS OF SAFETY SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER ALL OTHER CONSIDERATIONS.

#### 3. CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIVES

- 3.1 The Contractor shall nominate Responsible Representative, or whom at least one shall be available at any hour for call-out in cases of emergency. The Contractor shall provide the Technical Officer with the names, addresses and telephone numbers of the representatives.
- 3.2 The Contractor guarantees that he has satisfied his self that the Responsible Representative is fully conversant with this specification and that he shall comply with all his obligations in respect thereof.

# 4. OCCUPATIONS AND WORK PERMITS

- 4.1 Work to be done during total occupation or during an occupation between trains or under a work permit shall be done in a manner decided by the Technical Officer and at times to suit Transnet requirements.
- 4.2 The Contractor shall on anise the Works in a manner, which will minimise the number and duration of occupations and work permits required.
- 4.3 Transnet will not be table for any financial or other loss suffered by the Contractor arising from his failure to contract any work scheduled during the period of an occupation or work permit.
- 4.4 The contactor shall submit to the Technical Officer, in writing, requests for occupations or work permits together with details of the work to be undertaken, at least 14 days before they are required. Transnet does not undertake to grant an occupation or work permit for any particular date, time or duration.
- 4.5 Transnet reserves the right to cancel any occupation or work permit at any time before or during the period of occupation or work permit. If, due to cancellation or change in date or time, the Contractor is not permitted to start work under conditions of total occupation or work permit at the time arranged, all costs caused by the cancellation shall be born by the Contractor except as provided for in clauses 4.6 to 4.8.

- 4.6 When the Contractor is notified less than 2 hours before the scheduled starting time that the occupation or work permit is cancelled, he may claim reimbursement of his direct financial losses caused by the loss of working time up to the time his labour and plant are employed on other work, but not exceeding the period of the cancelled occupation or work permit.
- 4.7 When the Contractor is notified less than 2 hours before the schedule starting time, or during an occupation or work permit, that the duration of the occupation or work permit is reduced, he may claim reimbursement of his direct financial losses caused by the loss of working time due to the reduced duration of the occupation or work permit.
- 4.8 Reimbursement the Contractor for any loss of working time in terms of 4.6 and 4.7, shall be subject to his claims being submitted within 14 days of the event with full details of labour and plant involved, and provided that the Technical Officer certifies that no other work on which the labour and plant could be employed was immediately available.
- 4.9 Before starting any work for which an occupation has been erranged, the Contractor shall obtain from the Technical Officer written confirmation of the date, time and suration of the occupation.
- 4.10 Before starting any work for which a work permit has been arranged, the Responsible Representative shall read and sign portion C of form No. T.1276 signifying that he is aware of the limits within which work may be undertaken. After the work for which the permit was granted has been completed, or when the work permit is due to be terminated, or if the permit is cancelled after the start, the same person who signed partion C shall sign portion D of the T.1276 form, thereby acknowledging that he is aware that the electrical equipment is to be made "live". The Contractor shall advise all his workman accordingly.

## 5. SPEED RESTRICTIONS AND PROTECTION

- 5.1 When speed restrictions are imposed by Transnet because of the Contractor's activities, the Contractor shall organize and arry out his work so as to permit the removal of the restrictions as soon as possible.
- 5.2 When the Technical Object considers protection to be necessary the Contractor shall, unless otherwise acreed, provide all protection including flagmen, other personnel and all equipment for the protection of Transnet's and the Contractor's personnel and assets, the public and including trains. Training will provide training free of charge of the Contractor's flagmen and other personnel performing protection duties. The Contractor shall consult with the Technical Officer, wherever he considers that protection will be necessary, taking into account the minimum permissible clearances set out in appendixes 1 to 4.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall appoint a Responsible Representative to receive and transmit any instruction, which may be given by Transnet personnel providing protection.

#### 6. ROADS ON TRANSNET PROPERTY

The provision of clause 25 of the E.5, General Conditions of Contract, or clause 23 of the E.5 (MW), General Conditions of Contract for Maintenance Works, shall apply to the use of existing roads on Transnet's property.

#### 7. CLEARANCES

7.1 No temporary works shall encroach on the appropriate minimum clearances set out in Annexure 1 BE97-01 Sheets 1.2. 3 and 5 of 5.

#### 8. STACKING OF MATERIAL

8.1 The Contractor shall not stack any material closer than 3 m from the centre line of any railway line without prior approval of the Technical Officer.

# 9. EXCAVATION, SHORING, DEWATERING AND DRAINAGE

9.1 Unless otherwise approved by the Technical Officer any excavation adjacent to a railway line shall not encroach on the hatched area shown in Figure 1.

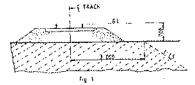


- 9.3 Where required by the Technical Officer, chawings of shoring for any excavation under or adjacent to a railway line shall be submitted and permission to proceed obtained, before the excavation is commenced.
- 9.4 The Contractor shall prevent incress of water to the excavation but where water does enter, he shall dispose of it as directed by the Technical Officer.
- 9.5 The Contractor shall not block, obstruct or damage any existing drains either above or below ground level unless to has made adequate prior arrangements to deal with drainage.

# 10. FALSE WORK FOR STRUCTURES

- 10.1 Drakings of falsework for the construction of any structure over, under or adjacent to any railway line shall be submitted to the Technical Officer and his permission to proceed obtained before the falsework is erected. Each drawing shall be given a title and a distinguishing number and shall be signed by a registered professional engineer certifying that he has checked the design of the falsework and that the drawings are correct and in accordance with the design.
- 10.2 After the falsework has been erected and before any load is applied, the Contractor shall submit to the Technical Officer a certificate signed by a registered professional engineer certifying that he has checked the falsework and that it has been erected in accordance with the drawings. Titles and numbers of the drawings shall be stated in the certificate. Notwithstanding permission given by the Technical Officer to proceed, the Contractor shall be entirely responsible for the safety and

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adequacy of the falsework.

#### 11. PILING

11.1 The Technical Officer will specify the conditions under which piles may be installed on Transnet property.

#### 12. UNDERGROUND SERVICES

- 12.1 No pegs or stakes shall be driven or any excavation made before the Contractor has established that there are no underground services, which may be damaged thereby.
- Any damage shall be reported immediately to the Technical Officer, or to the official in charge at the nearest station, or to the traffic controller in the case of centralised traffic control.

## 13. **BLASTING**

- 13.1 The provisions of clause 23 of the E.5, General Conditions of Contract or clause 21 of the E.5 (MW), General Conditions of Contract for Maintenance Work, shall apply to all blasting operations undertaken in terms of the Contract.
- The Contractor shall provide proof that he has complied with the provisions of clauses 10.17.1 to 10.17.4 of the Explosives Regulations (Apr 25 of 1956 as amended).
- Blasting within 500m of a railway line will only be permitted during intervals between trains. A person appointed by the Technical Officer, assisted by flagmen with the necessary protective equipment, will be in communication which the controlling railway station.

  Only this person will be authorised to give the Contractor permission to blast, and the Contractor shall obey his instructions implicitly egarding the time during which blasting may take place.
- The flagmen described to 13.8, where provided by Transnet, are for the protection of trains and Transnet property only and their presence does not relieve the Contractor in any manner of his responsibilities in terms of Explosives Act or Regulations, or any obligation in terms of this Contract.
- 13.5 The pe sor described in 13.3 will record in a book provided and retained by Transnet the dates and the
  - when each request is made by him to the controlling station for permission to blast;
  - (ii) when blasting may take place;
  - (iii) when blasting actually takes place; and
  - (iv) when he advises the controlling station that the line is safe for the passage of trains.
- 13.6 Before each blast the Contractor shall record in the same book, the details of the blast to be carried out. The person appointed by the Technical Officer and the person who will do the

blasting shall both sign the book whenever an entry described in 13.5 is made.

13.7 The terms of clause 27 hereof shall be strictly adhered to.

#### 14. RAIL TROLLEYS

- 14.1 The use of rail trolleys or trestle trolleys on a railway line for working on high voltage equipment will be permitted only if approved by the Technical Officer and under the conditions stipulated by him.
- All costs in connection with such trolley working requested by the Contractor shall, unless otherwise agreed, be borne by the Contractor, excluding the costs of any train protection services normally provided free of charge by Transnet.

#### 15. SIGNAL TRACK CIRCUITS

- Where signal track circuits are installed, the Contractor chair ensure that no material capable of conducting an electrical current makes contact between rain of a railway line/lines.
- 15.2 No signal connections on track-circuited tracks shall be severed without the Technical Officer's knowledge and consent.

## 16. PENALTY FOR DELAYS TO TRAINS

PENIK

16.1 If any trains are delayed by the Contra tor and the Technical Officer is satisfied that the delay was avoidable, a penalty will be imposed on the Contractor of R5 000 per hour or part thereof for the period of delay, irrespective or me number of trains delayed.

# PART B - ADDITIONAL SPECIFICATION FOR WORK NEAR HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

## 17. GENERAL

- 17.1 This specification is based on the contents of Transnet's publication SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS, HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT, as amended, a copy of which will be made available on loan to the Contractor for the duration of the contract. These instructions apply to all work near live high-voltage equipment maintained and/or operated by Transnet, and the onus rests on the Contractor to ensure that he obtains a copy.
- 17.2 The Contractor's attention is drawn in particular to the contents of Pan I, Sections 1 and 2 of the Safety Instructions: High-Voltage Electrical Equipment.
- 17.3 The Safety Instructions: High-Voltage Electrical Equipment cover the minimum safety precautions which must be taken to ensure safe working on or year high-voltage electrical equipment, and must be observed at all times. Should additional safety measures be considered necessary because of peculiar local conditions, these may be ordered by and at the discretion of the Electrical Officer (Contracts).
- 17.4 This specification must be read in conjunction with and not in lieu of the Safety Instructions : High-Voltage Electrical Equipment.
- 17.5 The Contractor shall obtain the approval of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) before any work is done which causes or could cause any notion of a person's body or the tools he is using or any equipment he is handling, to come within 3 metres of any live high-voltage equipment.
- 17.6 The Contractor shall regarify ligh-voltage equipment as live unless a work permit is in force.
- 17.7 Safety precautions taken or harriers erected shall comply with the requirements of the Electrical Officer (Contract), and shall be approved by him before the work to be protected is undertaken by the contractor. The Contractor shall, unless otherwise agreed, bear the cost of the provision of the barriers and other safety precautions required, including the attendance of Transnet staff while this is necessary.
- 17.8 No kerrier shall be removed unless authorised by the Electrical Officer (Contracts).

#### 18. NORK ON BUILDINGS OR FIXED STRUCTURES

Before any work is carried out or measurements are taken on any part of a building, fixed structure or earthworks of any kind above ground level situated within 3 metres of live high-voltage equipment, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted to ascertain the conditions under which the work may be carried out.

- 18.2 No barrier erected to comply with the requirements of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be used as temporary staging or shuttering for any part of the Works.
- 18.3 The shuttering for bridge piers, abutments, retaining walls or parapets adjacent to or over any

track may be permitted to serve as a barrier, provided that it extends at least 2,5 metres above any working level in the case of piers, abutments and retaining walls and 1,5 metres above any working level in the case of parapets.

# 19. WORK DONE ON OR OUTSIDE OF ROLLING STOCK, INCLUDING LOADING OR UNLOADING

- 19.1 No person shall stand, climb or work whilst on any platform, surface or foothold higher than the normal unrestricted places of access, namely -
  - (i) the floor level of trucks;
  - (ii) external walkways on diesel, steam and electric locomotives, steam heat vans, etc. and
  - (iii) walkways between coaches and locomotives.

When in these positions, no person may raise his hands or any equipment or material he is handling above his head.

- In cases where the Contractor operates his own rail mounted equipment, he shall arrange for the walkways on this plant to be inspected by the Electrical Officer (Contracts) and approved, before commencement of work.
- The handling of long lengths of material such as metal pipes, reinforcing bars, etc should be avoided, but if essential they share be sappled as nearly as possible in a horizontal position below head height.
- The Responsible Representative shall warn all persons under his control of the danger of being near live high-voltage equipment and shall ensure that the warning is fully understood.
- Where the conditions is 194 to 19.3 cannot be observed the Electrical Officer (Contracts), shall be notified. Helwin arrange for suitable Safety measures to be taken. The Electrical Officer (Contracts), may in his discretion and in appropriate circumstances, arrange for a suitable employee of the Contractor to be specially trained by Transnet and at its costs, as an Authorised Person to work closer than 3 metres from live overhead conductors and under such conditions as may be imposed by the Senior responsible Electrical Engineer in Transnet.

## 20. **OSF OF EQUIPMENT**

- 20.1 Measuring Tapes and Devices
- 20.1.1 Measuring tapes may be used near live high-voltage equipment provided that no part of any tape or a person's body comes within 3 metres of the live equipment.
- 20.1.2 In windy conditions the distance shall be increased to ensure that if the tape should fall it will not be blown nearer than 3 metres from the live high-voltage equipment.

- 20.1.3 Special measuring devices longer than 2 metres such as survey staves and rods may be used if these are of non-conducting material and approved by the responsible Electrical Engineer in Transnet, but these devices must not be used within 3 metres of live high-voltage equipment in rainy or wet conditions.
- 20.1.4 The assistance of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be requested when measurements within the limits defined in 20.1.1 to 20.1.3 are required.
- 20.1.5 The restrictions described in 20.1.1 to 20.1.3 do not apply on a bridge deck between permanent parapets nor in other situations where a barrier effectively prevents contact with the live high-voltage equipment.
- 20.2 Portable Ladders
- 20.2.1 Any type of portable ladder longer then 2 metres may only be used near live high-voltage equipment under the direct supervision of the Responsible Representative. He shall ensure that the ladder is always used in such a manner that the distance from the base of the ladder to any live high-voltage equipment is greater than the fully extended length of the ladder plus 3 metres. Where these conditions cannot be observed, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be advised, and he will arrange for suitable safety measures to be taken.

# 21. CARRYING AND HANDLING MATERIAL ALO EQUIPMENT

- 21.1 Pipes, scaffolding, iron sheets, renforcing bars and other material, which exceeds 2 metres in length, shall be carried completely below head height near live high-voltage equipment. For maximum safety two or more persons so as to maintain it as nearly as possible in a horizontal position should carry such paterial. The utmost care must be take to ensure that no part of the material comes within 3 metres of any live high-voltage equipment.
- 21.2 Long lengths of prime or cable shall never be run out in conditions where a part of a wire or cable can come within smetres of any live high-voltage equipment unless the Electrical Officer (Contracts) has been advised and has approved appropriate safety precautions.
- 21.3 The presence of overhead power lines shall always be taken account of especially when communications lines or cables or aerial cables, stay wires, etc. are being erected above grant ever.

# 22. PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN WHEN ERECTING OR REMOVING POLES, ANTENNAE, TREES ETC.

- A pole may be handled for the purpose of erection or removal near high-voltage equipment under the following conditions:
  - (i) If the distance between the point at which the pole is to be erected or removed and the nearest live high-voltage equipment is more than the length of the pole plus 3 metres, the work shall be supervised by the Responsible Representative.

- (ii) If the distance described in (i) is less than the length of the pole plus 3 metres, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted to arrange for an Authorised Person to supervise the work and to ensure that the pole is earthed where possible. The pole shall be kept in contact with the point of erection, and adequate precautions shall be taken to prevent contact with live high-voltage equipment.
- The cost of supervision by an Authorised Person and the provision of earthing shall, unless otherwise agreed, be borne by the Contractor.
- 22.3 The provisions of clauses 22.1 and 22.2 shall also apply to the erection or removal of columns, antennae, trees, posts, etc.

#### 23. USE OF WATER

23.1 No water shall be used in the form of a jet if it can make contact with any live high-voltage equipment or with any person working on such equipment

#### 24. USE OF CONSTRUCTION PLANT

- 24.1 "Construction plant" entails all types of plant including cranes, piling frames, boring machines, excavators, draglines, dewatering equipment and road vehicles with or without lifting equipment.
- When work is being undertaken in such a position that it is possible for construction plant or its load to come within 3 metres of the high-poltage equipment, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted. He will arrange for an Authorised Person to supervise the work and to ensure that the plant is adequately earthed. The Electrical Officer (Contracts) will decide whether further safety metrums are necessary.
- The cost of any supervision by an Authorised Person and the provision of earthing shall, unless otherwise agreed be come by the Contractor.
- 24.4 When loads are landed by cranes, non-metallic rope hand lines shall be used, affixed to such loads so as to revent their swinging and coming within 3 metres of live high-voltage equipment.
- 24.5 Clauses 24.1 to 24.4 shall apply mutatis mutandis to the use of maintenance machines of any

# 25. WORK PERFORMED UNDER DEAD CONDITIONS UNDER COVER OF A WORK PERMIT

- 25.1 If the Responsible Representative finds that the work cannot be done in safety with the high-voltage electrical equipment live, he shall consult the Electrical Officer (Contracts) who will decide on the action to be taken.
- 25.2 If a work permit is issued the Responsible Representative shall -
  - (i) before commencement of work ensure that the limits within which work may be carried out

- have been explained to him by the Authorised Person who issued the permit to him, and that he fully understands these limits.
- (ii) sign portion C of the permit before commencement of work;
- (iii) explain to all persons under his control the limits within which work may be carried out, and ensure that they fully understand these limits;
- (iv) care for the safety of all persons under his control whilst work is in progress; and
- (v) withdraw all personnel under his control from the equipment on completion of the work before he signs portion D of the work permit.

# 26. TRACTION RETURN CIRCUITS IN RAILS

- 26.1 DANGEROUS CONDITIONS CAN BE CREATED BY REMOVING OR SEVERING ANY BOND.
- Broken rails with an air gap between the ends, and joint, at which fishplates are removed under "broken bond" conditions, are potentially ethal. The rails on either side of an air gap between rail ends on electrified lines shall not be puched simultaneously until rendered safe by Transnet personnel.
- 26.3 The Contractor shall not break any termal ent bonds between rails or between rails and any structure. He shall give the Technical Officer at least 7 days written notice when removal of such bonds is necessary.
- No work on the track which involves interference with the traction return rail circuit either by cutting or removing the rails of by removal of bonds shall be done unless the Electrical Officer (Contracts) is consulted. Will take such precautions as may be necessary to ensure continuity of the rature circuit before permitting the work to be commenced.

# 27. BLASTING

- The Contractor shall obtain the permission of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) before blasting, and shall give at least 14 days notice of his intention to blast.
- 27.2 No clasting shall be done in the vicinity of electrified lines unless a member of Transnet's electrical personnel is present.
- 27.3 The terms of clause 13 hereof shall be strictly adhered to.

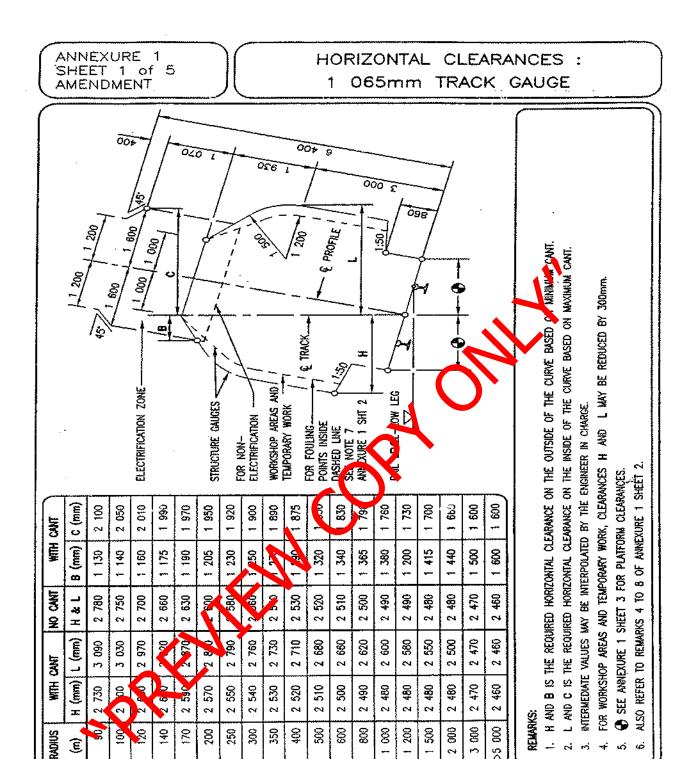
# 28. HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT NOT MAINTAINED AND/OR OPERATED BY TRANSNET

Where the work is undertaken on or near high-voltage electrical equipment which is not maintained and/or operated by Transnet, the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993, and Regulations and Instructions, or the Mines Health and Safety Act (Act 29 of 1996), shall apply.

Such equipment includes: -

- (i) Eskom and municipal equipment;
- (ii) the Contractor's own power supplies; and

(iii) electrical equipment being installed but not yet take over from the Contractor.
