Responses to this RFQ [**Quotations**] must not include documents or reference relating to any other quotation or proposal. Any additional conditions must be embodied in an ecompanying letter.

2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BB E]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Righting

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Resulations. Respondents are to note that the following preference point system is applicable to all bids:

- 11 80,22 system for requirements with a Rand value of UP R1 000 000 (all applicable axes included).
- Bidders are to note that if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids received are ABOVE R1 000 000.00, the RFP must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to be Above R1000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the **80/20** system shall be applicable.

When Transnet invites prospective suppliers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 11 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After the first year of the implementation of the Revised Codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in

terms of the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sector-specific Codes will be measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transnet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transnet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transnet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Respondents are required to complete Annexure A [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

The commitments made by the successful Respondents will be incorporated as a term of the contract and monitored for compliance.

ANNEXURE B: B-BBEE PREFERENCE POINTS CLAIM FORM

This preference form contains general information and serves as a claim for preference points for Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [**B-BBEE**] Status Level of Contribution

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 A total of **20** preference points shall be awarded for BBBEE status Level of Contribution.
- Failure on the part of a Bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System [SANAS] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Totalependent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA] or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act [CCA] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference point for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- 1.3 Transnet reserves the right to require of a Bidder, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by Transnet.

2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 "all applicable taxes" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment instrance rund contributions and skills development levies;
- B-B-E" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 3 "B-BBEE status of contributor" means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.4 **"Bid"** means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by Transnet for the provision of goods, works or services;
- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 [Act No. 53 of 2003];
- 2.6 **"comparative price"** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 **"consortium or joint venture"** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a

contract;

- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any surplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 **"functionality"** means the measurement according to predecrmined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is design at to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juris c person;
- 2.14 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue between R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928
- 2.15 "**rand value**" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bod invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 "subcontrac" means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.18 **"trust"** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.19 **"trustee"** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The Bidder obtaining the highest number of total points for the evaluation criteria as enumerated in Section 2 of the RFP will be awarded the contract, unless objective criteria justifies the award to another bidder.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.

- 3.3 Points scored will be rounded off to 2 [two] decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.



Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of tensucting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928 are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R10 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownershap.
- In terms of the 200 Version of the Codes of Good Practice, Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and value B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating them B-BBEF rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by ANNAS.
- 4.5 In terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928, Bidders who qualify as QSEs are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R50 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership. Large enterprises must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 4.6 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for its B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits its B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 4.7 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 4.8 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialised scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.



- 4.10 A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- 4.11 Bidders are to note that in terms of paragraph 2.6 of Statement 000 of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 26928, any representation made by an entity about its B-BBEE compliance must be supported by suitable evidence or documentation. As such, Transnet reserves the right to request are evidence or documentation from Bidders in order to verify any B-BBEE recognition claimed

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1. DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in this Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 1.1 Bid shall mean a Respondent's tendered response / proposal to a Transnet RFP or RFQ;
- 1.2. Bid Document(s) shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- 1.3 Day shall mean any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday;
- 1.4 Respondent(s) shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Bid Document;
- 1.5 RFP shall mean Request for Proposal;
- 1.6 RFQ shall mean Request for Quotation;
- 1.7 RFX shall mean RFP or RFQ, as the case may be;
- 1.8 Services shall mean the services required by Transnet as specified in its Bid Document;
- 1.9 Service Provider shall mean the successful Respondent;
- **1.10 Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as require by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to title;
- 1.11 Transnet shall mean Transnet SOC Ltd, a Sate Owned Company; and
- **1.12 VAT** shall mean Value-Added ax in error of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

2. GENERAL

All Bid Documents and subsequent contracts and orders shall be subject to the following general conditions as laid down by Train net not are to be strictly adhered to by any Respondent to this RFX.

3. SUBMISSION OF BIS DOCUMENTS

A Bid which shall hereinafter include reference to an RFP or RFQ, shall be submitted to Transnet no later than the closing date and time specified in accordance with the directions issued in the Bid Decuments. Late Bids will not be considered.

Bids shall be delivered in a sealed envelope in accordance with the instructions indicated in the Bid Documents with the Bid number and subject marked on the front of the envelope.

The Respondent's return address must be stated on the reverse side of the sealed envelope.

4.USE OF BID FORMS

Where special forms are issued by Transnet for the submission of Bids, Respondents are required to submit their Bids by completion of the appropriate sections on such official forms and not in other forms or documents bearing their own terms and conditions of contract. Non-compliance with this condition may result in the rejection of a Bid.

Respondents must note that the original Bid forms must be completed for submission and not a reprocessed copy thereof.

Only if insufficient space has been allocated for a particular response may a Respondent submit additional information under separate cover using its company's letterhead. This must be duly cross-referenced in the RFX.

5. BID FEES

A non-refundable fee may be charged for Bid Documents, depending on the administrative cost of preparing and issuing such Bid Documents.

Only Respondents that have paid the Bid fee and provided proof of payment when submitting their Bid will be considered.

6. VALIDITY PERIOD

Respondents must hold their Bid valid for acceptance by Transnet at any time within the requested validity period after the closing date of the RFX.

Respondents may be requested to extend their validity period for a specified additional period. In such instances, Respondents will not be allowed to change any aspect on their Bid, unless they are able to demonstrate that the proposed change(s) is as a direct and unconsequence of Transnet's extension of the validity period.

7. SITE VISIT / BRIEFING SESSION

Respondents may be requested to attend (i) a me visit where it is considered necessary to view the site prior to the preparation of Bids, or (ii) an REX briefle g session when Transnet deems it necessary to provide Respondents with additional information relevant to the compilation of their Bids. When such visits or sessions are indicated as compulsor in the Bid Document, Respondents are obliged to attend these meetings as failure to do so will result in their disqualification.

8. CLARIFICATION BEFORE THE CLOSE IG DATE

Should clarification be required on any aspect of the RFX before the closing date, the Respondent must direct such queries to the contact person identified in the Bid Document.

9. COMMUNICATION AN ER THE CLOSING DATE

After an closing date of a Bid [i.e. during the evaluation period] the Respondent may only communicate with the Secretary of the relevant Acquisition Council.

10. UNAUTHORISED COMMUNICATION ABOUT BIDS

Where Bids are submitted to the Secretary of an Acquisition Council, Respondents may at any time communicate with the Secretary on any matter relating to its Bid but, in the absence of written authority from the Secretary, no communication on a question affecting the subject of a Bid shall take place between Respondents or other potential service providers or any member of the Acquisition Council or official of Transnet during the period between the closing date for the receipt of the Bid and the date of the notification of the successful Respondent(s). A Bid, in respect of which any such unauthorised communication has occurred, could be disqualified.

11. RETURNABLE DOCUMENTS

All returnable documents listed in the RFX Documents must be submitted with Respondent's Bid. Failure to submit mandatory returnable schedules / documents will result in disqualification. Failure to submit other schedules / documents may result in disqualification.

12. DEFAULTS BY RESPONDENTS

If the Respondent, after it has been notified of the acceptance of its Bid fails to:

enter into a formal contract when called upon to do so within such period as Transnet may specify; or accept an order in terms of the Bid;

furnish satisfactory security when called upon to do so for the fulfilment of the contract; or comply with any condition imposed by Transnet,

Transnet may, in any such case, without prejudice to any other legal remedy which it may have, proceed to accept any other Bid or, if it is necessary to do so, call for Pids afresh, and may recover from the defaulting Respondent any additional expense incurred by Transnet in calling for new offers or in accepting a less favourable offer.

If any Respondent, who has submitted a Bid and/or concluded a contract with Transnet [hereinafter referred to as the **Service Provider**], or in the capacity of agent as a bcontractor who has been associated with such Bid or contract:

Has withdrawn such Bid after the advertised date and hour for the receipt of Bids; or

has, after having been notified of the acceptance on its Bid, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the Bid Documents; or

has carried out any contract resulting from uch Bid in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of such contract; or

has offered, promised or given a bribe in relation to the obtaining or the execution of such contract; or

Has acted in a cauculent or improper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any government department or lowerds any public body, company or person; or

Has made any mideading or incorrect statement either

in the affidavit or certificate referred to in clause 0 [Notice to Unsuccessful Respondents]; or any other document submitted as part of its Bid submission

and is unable to prove to the satisfaction of Transnet that

it made the statement in good faith honestly believing it to be correct; and

before making such statement, it took all reasonable steps to satisfy itself of its correctness; or

Caused Transnet damage, or to incur costs in order to meet the Service Provider's requirements which could not be recovered from the Service Provider;

Has litigated against Transnet in bad faith;

Has been found guilty by a court of law, tribunal or other administrative body of a serious breach of any law, during the preceding 5 [five] years;

Has been included as a company or person prohibited from doing business with the public sector on National Treasury's database of Restricted Suppliers or Register of Bid Defaulters;

then a Bid from any such Respondent shall be disqualified and the person, enterprise or company [including any directors] shall, subject to clause 0 below, be disqualified from bidding for any Transnet business through its "blacklisting" process.

- Any person or enterprise or company against whom a decision to blacklist has been taken, may make representations to the Chief Financial Officer of Transnet SOC Ltd, whose decision shall be final.
- Any disqualification [**Blacklisting**] imposed upon any person or enterprise or company, may also apply to any other enterprise under the same or different names of disqualified persons or enterprise or company [or associates thereof] and may also be applied to any agent or employee of the person or enterprise or company concerned.

13. CURRENCY

All monetary amounts referred to in a Bid response must be in Rand, the currency of the Republic of South Africa [ZAR], save to the extent specifically permitted in the RFX.

14. PRICES SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION

Prices which are quoted subject to confirmation will not be considered

Firm prices quoted for the duration of any resulting order and or con ract will receive precedence over prices which are subject to fluctuation if this is in Transiet's best interests.

15. ALTERATIONS MADE BY THE RESPONDENT TO BI PRICES

All alterations made by the Respondent to its Bid price(s) prior to the submission of its Bid Documents must be done by deleting the incorrect figures and words where required and by inserting the correct figures and words against the items concerned. At such alterations must be initialled by the person who signs the Bid Documents. Failure to observe this requirement may result in the particular item(s) concerned being excluded in the matter of the award of the business.

16. EXCHANGE AND REMITMINCS

- The Respondent Spoule note that where the whole or a portion of the contract or order value is to be remitted conseas, Transnet shall, if requested to do so by the Service Provider, effect payment over eas directly to the foreign principal of such percentage of the contract or order value as may be shoulated by the Respondent in its Bid Documents.
- ransnet's preference to enter into Rand-based agreements. Where the Respondent has been informed by Transnet per fax message or email of the acceptance of its Bid, the acknowledgement of receipt transmitted shall be regarded as proof of the Respondent.

18. NOTICE TO UNSUCCESSFUL RESPONDENTS

Unsuccessful Respondents shall be advised in writing that their Bids have not been accepted as soon as possible after the closing date of the Bid. On award of business to the successful Respondent all unsuccessful Respondents shall be informed of the name of the successful Respondent and of the reason as to why their Bids have not been successful.

19. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

The Service Provider shall adhere to the Terms and Conditions of Contract issued with the Bid Documents, together with any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.

Should the Respondent find any conditions unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer aneudments/ alternatives by written submission on its company letterhead. Any such submission Shall be subject to review by Transnet's Legal Counsel who shall determine whether the groph sed amendments/ alternative(s) are acceptable or otherwise, as the case may be.

20. CONTRACT DOLUMENTS

23. CONTRACTUAL SECURITIES

The successful Respondent, when called upon to do so, shall provide security to the satisfaction of Transnet for the due fulfilment of a contract or order. Such security shall be in the form of an advanced payment guarantee [APG] and/or a performance bond [Performance cond], as the case may be, to be furnished by an approved bank, building society, insurance or guarantee corporation carrying on business in South Africa.

The security may be applied in whole or part at the discretion of hanset to make good any loss or damage which Transnet may incur in consequence of a breach of the contract or any part thereof.

26. IMPORTANT NOTICE TO RESPONDENTS REGARDING PAYMENT

Method of Payment

The attention of the Respondent is directed to the Terms and Conditions of Contract which set out the conditions of payment on which Bid price(s) shall be based.

However, in addition to the a foregoing the Respondent is invited to submit offers based on alternative methods of payment and/or financing proposals.

The Respondent is required to give full particulars of the terms that will be applicable to its alternative offer(s) and the financial merits thereof will be evaluated and taken into consideration when the Bid is adjudicated.

The Respondent must, therefore, in the first instance, tender strictly in accordance with clause 00 above. Failure to comply with clause 00 above may preclude a Bid from further consideration.

NOTE: The successful Respondent [the **Service Provider**], where applicable, shall be required to furnish a guarantee covering any advance payments, as set out in clause 0 above *[Contractual Securities]*.

Conditional Discount

Respondents offering prices which are subject to a conditional discount applicable for payment within a specific period are to note that the conditional period will be calculated from the date of receipt by Transnet of the Service Provider's month-end statement reflecting the relevant Tax Invoice(s) for payment purposes, provided the conditions of the order or contract have been fulfilled and the Tax Invoice is correct in all respects in terms of the contract or order. 28. SPECIFICATIONS AND COPYRIGHT

Specifications

Copyright

Copyright in plans, drawings, diagrams, specifications and documents compiled by the Service Provider for the purpose of contract work shall be governed by the *Intellectual Property Rights* section in the Terms and Conditions of Contract.

29.BIDS BY OR ON BEHALF OF FOREIGN RESPONDENTS

- Bids submitted by foreign principals may be forwarded directly by the principals or by its South African representative or agent to the Secretary of the Acquisition Council or to a designated official of Transnet according to whichever officer is specified in the Bid Documents.
- In the case of a representative or agent, written proof must be submitted to the effect that such representative or agent has been duly authorised to act in that capacity by the principal. Failure to submit such authorisation by the representative or agent shall distualify the Bid.
- When legally authorised to prepare and submit Bids on behalf of their principals not domiciled in the Republic of South Africa, representatives or agents must compile the Bids in the names of such principals and sign them on behalf of the latter.
- South African representatives or agents of a successful fureign Respondent must when so required enter into a formal contract in the name of their principals and must sign such contract on behalf of the latter.

- Suppliers must be evaluated and approved before any materials, components, products or services are purchased from them. Rigorous due diligente must be conducted and the supplier is expected to participate in an honest and straight for ward manner.
- Suppliers must record and report facts as unately, honestly and objectively. Financial records must be accurate in all material respects.
