# 2 Broad-Based Black Economic Enpowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and apports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Centagore. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

### 2.1 B-BREE corecard and Rating

#### 1.0 SCOPE

This document describes the procedures to be followed by the Signalling Contractor when testing indoor and outdoor signature, pork prior to handing over to Transnet. It aims to ensure the safety and a liability of operation of the signalling equipment and to assist Transnet Test Officer to commission the project in the shortest possible time.

# 2.0 GENERAL

- 2.1 The Contractor must, prior to the commencement of the installation, provide a completely unincered book of circuits to the site.
- 2.2 The Contractor must provide the requisite number of test personnel per contract to a rist a Transnet test officer. This test officer must be permanently on site during final testing.
- 2.3 The contractor's test personnel must be under the direct control of the raiser test ornicer.
- A recontractor's test officer must record daily any modifications by updating all the plans, circults and records etc. He must satisfy himself that all the alterations and modifications are submitted to his headquarters timeously.

# INDOOR TEST PROCEDURE

- 3.1 After the termination of the indoor cables but before the insertion of any units or relays and before any ODF or IDF jumpering is done, these cables must be tested to verify the following:
  - 3.1.1 The correct cable termination in accordance with the indoor cable plan.
  - 3.1.2 The sequential cable core termination is correct.
  - 3.1.3 The cable cores are continuous.

- 3.1.4 The insulation between cores, as well as dire to earth, in accordance with SABS specification 1507.
- 3.2 After the completion of all ODF, IDF and unit programmer to the rackhead jumpering, but before the insertion of any units or islays, the relay room wiring/cabling must be buzzed and a wire court sone to prove that the circuits conform with the book of circuits.
- 3.3 After the insertion of all the unit and relays all circuits must be functionally tested to ensure conformance with the control tables.
- 3.4 All the signalling equipment must be clearly marked and labelled by an approved means, acceptable to the Transnet test officer in charge.
- 3.5 Prior to handing over to Transnet for commissioning, a complete "as installed and tested" took of circuits, without any colour pencil marks and certified by the contractor's test officer, must be handed over to the Transnet by officer in charge
- 3.6 All charges to the plans must be approved by Transnet before implementation.

# 4.0 POWER TEST PROCEDURE

- The Contractors test officer must energise, test and commission the relay room power equipment ensuring that:
  - 4.1.1 The power circultry is in accordance with specification CSE 1163-014 Category N98.
  - 4.1.2 The correct filling and charging procedures of battery banks, in accordance with the manufacturers instructions.
  - 4.1.3 Prior to handing over, the manufacturers handbooks for each component of the power supply equipment, must be available in the power room.

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- 4.2 Prior to handing over to Transnet a minimum of 4 weeks braking time" for the power equipment is of prime importance, and must be discussed and agreed to with Transnet test officer in charge.
- 4.3 All the power indications must be reliable and structly in accordance with the relevant Transnet specification.
- 4.4 All the power circuits must be individually proved and the completed installation functionally tested to closus, that it is wired according to the book of circuits.
- 4.5 All the power equipment must be clearly marked and labelled by an approved means, acceptable to the Transnet test officer in charge.
- 4.6 Prior to handing over to Transnet for commissioning, a complete "as installed and tested" book of power circuits, without any colour pencil marks and certificity the Contractor's test officer, must be handed over to Translet by Lafficer in charge.

# 5.0 PERIPHETAL COMPMENT TEST PROCEDURE

- 5.1 The Contractors test officer must energise, test and commission all superisory equipment in the office and fields ensuring that:
  - .1.1 The performance of the power regulators or packs is within the suppliers specified limits under full load conditions.
  - 5.1.2 The LED indications on the cards, modules and motherboards are reliable as well as being adequate for diagnostic purposes.
  - 5.1.3 The control and indication functions between the office and fields are in correspondence.
  - 5.1.4 The immediate access facility for all the control bits is functioning correctly.

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- 5.1.5 The engineering of address spacings between the control and the indication addresses is correct, hereby ensuring minimum interlocking and TN response times can
- 5.1.6 The line power levels are correctly an and recorded in accordance with the manufacturers requirements.
- 5.1.7 Lightning protection in accordance with relevant specification, in close proximity to me temperation of the incoming line, is provided.
- 5.2 Prior to handing over to Transnet, a minimum of 4 weeks "soaking time" is of prime importance; and must be discussed and agreed to with Transnet test officer in charge.
- 5.3 The manufactures handbooks and circuits must be available for distribution to Translat maintenance personnel 4 weeks prior to final commissioning.
- Prior to handing over to Transnet for commission, a complete "as installed and toted" book of circuits, without any colour pencil marks and certified by Contractor's test officer, must be handed over to Transnet test officer by charge, for the office as well as the fields.
- The Contractors test officer must energise, test and commission the train number system ensuring that:
  - 5.5.1 The performance of power regulators is within the system tolerances under full load conditions.
  - 5.5.2 All LED indications provided on the cards, modules and motherboards are reliable as well as being adequate for diagnostic purposes.
  - 5.5.3 Correspondence between the equipment, control desk and illuminated diagram is proved.
  - 5.5.4 The manual stepping and set-up facilities are operating correctly.



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- 5.5.5 All the automatic TN stepping is in the dragging mode and the pushing of TN is only permitted over a set route with set of points in it.
- 5.5.6 With the correct sequence of track eccurancy the TN is cancelled automatically after the passage of a track.
- 5.5.7 Automatic TN stepping is tested by simulating long and short trains (light locomotives).
- 5.5.8 Phantom lights do not appear in displays when routes are set or TN stepping occurred close proximity of a display.
- 5.6 Prior to handing over to Transnet, a minimum of 4 weeks "soaking time" of the system is of prime importance, to prove the reliability of the system.
- Prior to handmoover to Transnet for commission, a complete "as installed and to be book of The circuits, without any colour pencil marks and certained by the Contractor's test officer, must be handed over to Transnet test officer in charge.
- 5.8 Manufacturers handbooks and circuits must be available for distribution to Transnet maintenance personnel 4 weeks prior to final commissioning.
- The Contractor's test officer must energise and commission all micro processor interface equipment to the train time printer or plotter, which have been programmed and engineered strictly in accordance with the relevant Transnet specifications.
- 5.10 The Contractor's test officer must energise, test and commission the train routing equipment (for example ATR, ARC, SARC and route storage) strictly in accordance with the relevant Transnet specification.

# 6.0 OUTDOOR TEST PROCEDURES

#### 1) DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in this Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- a) Bid shall mean a Respondent's tendered response / proposal to a Transnet RFP or RFQ;
- b) Bid Document(s) shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- c) Day shall mean any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holida
- d) Respondent(s) shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Bid Document
- e) RFP shall mean Request for Proposal;
- f) RFQ shall mean Request for Quotation;
- g) RFX shall mean RFP or RFQ, as the case may be;
- h) Services shall mean the services required by Transet as specified in its Bid Document;
- i) Service Provider shall mean the successful Respondent;
- j) Tax Invoice shall mean the document as required by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to the

#### 2) GENERAL

A foreign Respondent shall, therefore, state in its Bid the name of its authorised representative in the Republic of South Africa who is empowered to sign any contract which may be entered into a the event of its Bid being accepted and to act on its behalf in all matters relating to the contract.

#### 22) IDENTIFICATION

If the Respondent is a company, the full names of the directors shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a close corporation, the full names of the members shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a partnership of an individual trading under a trade name, the full names of the partners or of such individual, as the case may be, shall be furnished.

#### 23) CONTRACTUAL SECURITIES

- a) The successful Respondent, when called upon to do so, shall provide security to the satisfaction of Transnet for the due fulfilment of a contract or order. SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE WITH THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

#### 1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and Transnet Limited (hereinafter referred to as "Transnet") are individual employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and obligations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 or 1.93 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the Cone al Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in espect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Safety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to complying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the onission of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 Transnet accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working or or associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Technical officer of his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any discrepancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

#### 2. Definitions

- 2.1 In this Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise Indicates: -
- 2.2 The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "Construction Work", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with: -
  - (a) the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
  - (b) the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;



- (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or
- (d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work;
- 2.3 "competent person" in relation to construction work, means and person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed: Provided that where appropriate qualifications and training are registered per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;
- 2.4 "contractor" means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **"fall protection plan"** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk:
- 2.6 **"health and safety file"** means file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;
- 2.7 **"Health and Safety Plat"** means a documented plan which addresses the hazards identified and include late work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 "Risk Assessment" neans a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such bezard;
- 2.9"the Act 7 mays the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993.

#### 3. Procedural Compliance

- 3.1 The Contractor who intends to carry out any construction work shall, before carrying out such work, notify the Provincial Director in writing if the construction work:-
  - (a)includes the demolition of a structure exceeding a height of 3 metres; or
  - (b) includes the use of explosives to perform construction work; or
  - (c)includes the dismantling of fixed plant at a height greater than 3m,

and shall also notify the Provincial Director in writing when the construction work exceeds 30 days or will involve more than 300 person days of construction work and if the construction work:-

- (d) includes excavation work deeper than 1m; or
- (e) includes working at a height greater than 3 metres above ground or a landing.
- 3.2 The notification to the Provincial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of the Construction Regulations, 2003, also shown in Annexure 1 of this Specification. The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the completed notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer or employee.
- 3.3 The Contractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the



necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety file.

- 3.4 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer.
- 3.5 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor with has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 with not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration as in Amexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.
- 3.6 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, of tain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.7 Procedural compliance with Act and Recordings, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Protekon's salety requirements and procedures.

#### 4. Special Permits

Where special parmits the required before work may be carried out such as for hotwork, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Technical Officer or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

#### 5. Health and Safety Programme

- 5.1 The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
  - (i) The provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act;
  - (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and safety;
  - (iii) ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do or omit to do.
- 5.2 The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and safety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed

by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:

- (b) the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
- a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
- (d) a monitoring and review plan.
- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -
  - (a) The safety management structure to le instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
    - (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the act and Regulations;
  - (c) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
  - (d) the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented;

- 8.3The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Technical Officer upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to docume tation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure
