1 Responses to RFQ

Responses to this RFQ [Quotations] must not include documents or reference relating to any other quotation or proposal. Any additional conditions must be emploied in an accompanying letter.

2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowermen [B-BB-E]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore platfer to as business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Raking

As preceded a texas of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note the following:

- Functionality is included at a pre-qualification stage with a prescribed percentage threshold of 100%
- Proposals will be evaluated on price which will be allocated 80 or 90 points and preference which will be allocated 20 or 10 points, dependent on the value of the Goods or Services.
- The 80/20 preference point system applies where the acquisition of the Services will be less than R1 000 000.00.
- If the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFQ will be cancelled.
- The 80/20 preference point system applies where acquisition of the Services will exceed R1 000
- If the 90/10 preference point system is stipulated and all Bids received are equal to or below R1 000 000.00, the RFQ will be cancelled.
- In this RFQ, Transnet will apply 80/20 preference point system prescribed in the PPPFA.





In compliance with the Government Gazette No 34612, Notice No. 754 dated 23 September 2011, as from 1 October 2011 valid B-BBEE Verification Certificates must be issued by:

- (i) Verification Agencies accredited by the South African National Accreditation System [SANAS]; or
- (ii) Registered Auditors approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA], in accordance with the approval granted by the Department of Trade and Industry.

Enterprises will be rated by such agencies based on the following:

- a) Large Enterprises [i.e. annual turnover greater than R35 million]:
- Rating level based on all seven elements of the B-BBEE scorecard
- b) Qualifying Small Enterprises QSE [i.e. annual turnover between R5 million and R35 million]:
- Rating based on any four of the elements of the B-BBEE scorecard
- c) Exempted Micro Enterprises EME [i.e. annual turnover less than 5 million]:

In accordance with B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice [Statement 000, Section 1], any enterprise with annual total revenue of R 5 million or less qualifies as an EME.

- Automatic rating of B-BBEE Level 4 irrespective of race or owner-cap
- Black ownership greater than 50% or Black voteen twnership greater than 50% automatically qualify as B-BBEE Level 3

Sufficient evidence to qualify as an EME-would be a certificate (which may be in the form of a letter) from an auditor or accounting officer or a certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS. The certificate must confirm the complexity turnover, black ownership / black female ownership, B-BBEE status level and validity tests.

Respondents are recaired to proish proof of the above to Transnet. [i.e. a valid detailed scorecard as stipulated above in respect of Large Enterprises and QSEs, or a valid certificate in respect of EMEs].

Transnet will a coron gly allocate a maximum of **20 [twenty] points** in accordance with the **80/20** preference points system prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 20 10 and its Regulations to the Respondent's final score based on an entity's B-BBEE scorecard thing. N.B. Failure to submit a B-BBEE certificate, which is valid as at the Closing Date of this RFP, will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

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PROJECT SPECIFICATION FOR:

CONTROL OF VEGETATION AT LEVEL CROSSINGS

1. SCOPE OF WORK

- 1.1 This contract covers the control of vegetation at level crossings, including noxious weeds, trees, bushes, shrubs etc., by Mechanical methods.
 - 1.2 The essence of the contract is that Transnet freight rail requires clear visibility at level crossings through the control of living vegetation and the management or dead remains, to the extent that areas treated in terms of the contract are free from any form of vegetation (dead or otherwise) which may obscure, binds or interfere with operational activities, or have the potential to damage equipment.
 - 1.3 The ways and means by which the above-mentioned results are obtained are the responsibility of the Contractor. Transnet freight rail, however, shall have the right to monitor the materials and activities of the Contractor to ascertain that all procedures and herbicidal applications are in accordance with his tender.
 - 1.4 The Contractor must obtain his own information legarding the extent, occurrence and the species of the vegetation over the work sea. He must also determine the best method to control the vegetation.
 - 1.5 The use of sub-contractors call not be permitted for the duration of this contract.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

2.1 CONTROL

Control is achieved when all existing or potential growth of vegetation is cut to a

- The constituent parts of all plants occurring within the area of treatment cease to exceed 150mm in height.
- The constituent parts of all plants (dead or alive) cease to exceed 150mm in height for the total duration of the contract.
- There are not dead or dry remains of any vegetation within the treated area, which
 may constitute a hazard, danger, or hindrance to Transnet personnel, equipment

- 14.3 The Technical Officer will inform the Contractor in advance of the schedule of payment inspections and will arrange the transport such that adequate space and time is available for the purpose of the inspection.



 - a)is publicly available at the time of its disclosure or becomes publicly available (other than as a result of disclosure by the Receiving Party or any of its Agents contrary to the terms of this Agreement); or
 - b) was lawfully in the possession of the Receiving Party or its Agents (as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence) free of any restriction as to its use or disclosure prior to its being so disclosed; or



- c) following such disclosure, becomes available to the Receiving Party or its

2. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- 2.6 All Confidential Information shall remain the property of the Disclosing Party and its disclosure shall not confer on the Receiving Party any rights, including intellectual property rights over the Confidential Information whatsoever, beyond those contained in this Agreement.

- **3.1** The Receiving Party agrees to ensure proper and secure storage of all Information and any copies thereof.
- **3.2** The Receiving Party shall keep a written record, to be supplied to the Disclosing Party upon request, of the Confidential Information provided and any copies made thereof and, so far as is reasonably practicable, of the location of such Confidential Information and any copies thereof.
- 3.3 The Company shall, within 7 (seven) days of receipt of a written demand from Transnet: return all written Confidential Information (including all copies); and expunge or destroy any Confidential Information from any computer, word processor or other device whatsoever into which it was copied, read or programmed by the Company or on its behalf.
- **3.4** The Company shall on request supply a certificate signed by a director as to its full compliance with the requirements of clause 0 above.

4. ANNOUNCEMENTS

- **4.1** Neither party will make or permit to be made any announcement of disclosure of its prospective interest in the Bid without the prior written consent of the other party.
- **4.2** Neither party shall make use of the other party sname or any information acquired through its dealings with the other party for publicity or marketing purposes without the prior written consent of the other party.

5. DURATION

- 2.6 **"comparative price"** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 **"consortium or joint venture"** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual





increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor

- and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.12 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;

Registered auditors to he need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and is using EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.

- b) Bid Document(s) shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- Day shall mean any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday;
- d) Respondent(s) shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Bid Document;
- e) RFP shall mean Request for Proposal;
- f) RFQ shall mean Request for Quotation;
- g) RFX shall mean RFP or RFQ, as the case may be;
- h) Services shall mean the services required by Transnet as specified in its Bid Decument;
- i) Service Provider shall mean the successful Respondent;
- j) **Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as required by Section 0 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- k) Transnet shall mean Transnet SOC Ltd, a State Owned to pany; and
- !) **VAT** shall mean Value-Added Tax in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

2) GENERAL

All Bid Documents and substquent contracts and orders shall be subject to the following general conditions as laid down by replaced and are to be strictly adhered to by any Respondent to this RFX.

3) SUBMISSION OF BIND CUTENTS

- x) has been included as a company or person prohibited from doing business with the public sector on National Treasury's database of Restricted Suppliers or Register of Bid Defaulters; then a Bid from any such Respondent shall be disqualified and the person, enterprise or company [including any directors] shall, subject to clause c) below, be disqualified from bidding for any Transnet business through its "blacklisting" process.
- c) Any person or enterprise or company against whom a decision to blacklist has been taken, may make representations to the Chief Financial Officer of Transnet SOC Ltd, whose decision shall be final.
- d) Any disqualification [**Blacklisting**] imposed upon any person or enterprise or company may also apply to any other enterprise under the same or different names of disqualified persons or enterprise or company [or associates thereof] and may also be applied to any agent or employee of the person or enterprise or company concerned.

13) CURRENCY

All monetary amounts referred to in a Bid response must be in Rand, the currency of the Republic of South Africa [ZAR], save to the extent specifically permitted in the RFX.

14) PRICES SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION

- a) Prices which are quoted subject to confirmation will ot be considered.
- b) Firm prices quoted for the duration of any resulting order and/or contract will receive precedence over prices which are subject to fluctuation if this is in Transnet's best interests.

15) ALTERATIONS MADE BY THE REPONDENT TO BID PRICES

All such alterations must be initialled by the person who signs the Bid Documents. 16) EXCHANGE AND REMITTANCE

- a) The Respondent should note that where the whole or a portion of the contract or order value is to be remitted overseas, Transnet shall, if requested to do so by the Service Provider, effect payment overseas directly to the foreign principal of such percentage of the contract or order value as may be stipulated by the Respondent in its Bid Documents.
- b) It is Transnet's preference to enter into Rand-based agreements. Unsuccessful Respondents shall be indvised in writing that their Bids have not been accepted as soon as possible after the closing cate of the Bid. On award of business to the successful Respondent all unsuccessful Respondent shall be informed of the name of the successful Respondent and of the reason as to why their Eds layer at been successful.

19) TERMS ND CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- a) The Service Provider shall adhere to the Terms and Conditions of Contract issued with the Bid Documents, together with any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.
- Should the Respondent find any conditions unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer amendments/ alternatives by written submission on its company letterhead. Any such submission shall be subject to review by Transnet's Legal Counsel who shall determine whether the proposed amendments/ alternative(s) are acceptable or otherwise, as the case may be.

20) CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

ANNEXURE 1

SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE WITH THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and Transnet Limited (hereinafter referred to as "han net") are individual employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and churations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and all plicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all peace is in his employ, other persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the york to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall applement and maintain a Health and Safety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to complying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the disission of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 Transnet accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees workington of associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Technical Officer or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1. If the event of any discrepancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 In this Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -
- 2.2 The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "**Construction Work**", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with: -
 - the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
 - (b) the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;

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- (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or
- (a)(d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work;
- 2.3 "competent person" in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed: Provided that where appropriate qualifications and training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;
- 2.4 **"contractor"** means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **"fall protection plan"** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting at the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 **"health and safety file"** means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;
- 2.7 **"Health and Safety Plan"** means a distributed plan which addresses the hazards identified and include safe work producties to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 **"Risk Assessment"** means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard.
- 2.9"the Act" means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993.


3. Procedur Compliance

- 3.1 Contractor who intends to carry out any construction work shall, before carrying out work, notify the Provincial Director in writing if the construction work:-
 - (a) includes the demolition of a structure exceeding a height of 3 metres; or
 - (b) includes the use of explosives to perform construction work; or
 - (c)includes the dismantling of fixed plant at a height greater than 3m,

and shall also notify the Provincial Director in writing when the construction work exceeds 30 days or will involve more than 300 person days of construction work and if the construction work:-

- (d) includes excavation work deeper than 1m; or
- (e) includes working at a height greater than 3 metres above ground or a landing.
- 3.2 The notification to the Provincial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of the Construction Regulations, 2003, also shown in Annexure 1 of this Specification. The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the completed notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer or employee.

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- 3.4 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer.
- 3.5 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.
- 3.6 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any Subtractors under his control.
- 3.7 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Protekon's safety requirements and procedures.

4. Special Permits

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hotwork, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Technical Officer or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

5. Health and Safe v Programme

- 5.1 The Tenderen shall with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Acc and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
 - The provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act;
 - the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9
 of the Act that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be
 directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their
 health and safety;
 - (iii) ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do or omit to do.
- 5.2 The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and safety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.




- 5.3 The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:
 - (a) The identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
 - (b) the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
 - a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
 - (d) a monitoring and review plan.

Respondent's Signature

- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of:
 - (a) The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and numbers of safety committees where applicable;
 - (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Pegu ations;
 - (c) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
 - (d) the site access control measures peraining to health and safety to be implemented;
 - the arrangements in respect of communication of health and safety related matters and incidents between the Contractor, his employees, subcontractors and the Technical Office with particular reference to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Administrative Regulation 8 of the Act and with the pertinent clause of the General Conditions of Contract forming part of the Contract and
 - (f) the introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Safety Plan is maintained an monitored for the duration of the Contract.
- Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Technical Officer's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, in the Technical Officer's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Technical Officer or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.
- 5.5The Contractor shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken, shall include periodic audits at intervals mutually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.
- 5.6The Contractor shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.

- 5.8The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.9The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.10 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.11 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site in detail be provided with the induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

6. Fall Protection Plan

- 6.1In the event of the risk and hazard identification, is required in terms of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the contractor shall cause the designation of a competent p rson, responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.2The Contractor shall implement, maintain and monitor the fall protection plan for the duration of Contract. The Contractor shall also take such steps to ensure the continued adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.3The fall protection plan shall include:-
 - (a) A Nick Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
 - (b) the procedures and methods to address all the identified risks per location;
 - the evaluation of the employees physical and psychological fitness necessary to work at elevated positions;
 - the training of employees working from elevated positions; and
 - (e) the procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall protection equipment.

7. Hazards and Potential Hazardous Situations

The Contractor and the Technical Officer shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

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8. Health and Safety File

- 8.1The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Technical Officer, or subcontractor upon request.
- 8.2The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Technical Officer.
- 8.3The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Technical Officer upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.


