- 1.4.15 The Contractor shall prove to Transnet Freight Rail that his equipment or those supplied from 3<sup>rd</sup> party suppliers/manufacturers confirms to Transnet freight rail specifications.
- 1.4.16 The Contractor will remain liable for contractual delivery dates irrespective of deficiencies discovered during workshop inspections.

#### 1.5 CIVIL REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

- 1.5.1 Specifications will be drafted depending on the type and nature of civil work concerned.
- 1.5.2 At least one artisan should be skilled in plumbing/ carpentry/ welding work
- 1.5.3 Guarantee the quality, authority and supervision of Transnet.



- 1.5.4 In the event of Transnet in its sole discretion, being dissatisfied for whatever reason with any or all off the work performed by the contractor, Transnet shall forthwith notify the contractor thereof. The Contractor shall then forthwith redo the complete work at his own cost to the satisfaction of Transnet.
- 1.5.5 Should the contractor be unable in general to adhere to the laid down bonus manual/schedule time or manufacture's standard time, Transnet may terminate the Agreement.
- 1.5.6 Both parties shall keep daily records, time sheets and such other records or documents as may be necessary to enable the parties to determine exactly how many hours per job card (including overtime) the contractor has been in Transnet's service.
- 1.5.7 The Contractor shall not assign his obligations under the contract, nor sublet the contract work or any part thereof without the consent of the Employer's Depart. Lead, of this condition will entitle Transnet to cancel the contract forthwith.
- 1.5.8 Reflector belts and safety shoes must be worn at all times or site.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

Lydenburg Terminal is located at Thaba Chweu Local Municipality in Mpumalanga Province at the following location; Latitude S: 25° 05′ 44.24″, Longitude E: 30° 27′ 59.27″.

- a) Lydenburg Terminal has 2 off 250m³ above ground, vertical diesel storage tanks which are in use and are constructed within a bund area.
- b) The calculated capacity of the bund area is 588.60m<sup>3</sup> and is big enough to contain 110% of the biggest tank (i.e. 275m<sup>3</sup>) within the bund in accordance with SANS 10089-1: 2008
- c) The beneficial diesel storage capacity at Lydenburg depot is 500m<sup>3</sup>.
- d) Bund has gravel stones (ballast stones) which shall be removed and the surface prepared so as to cast a 25mPa reinforced concrete slab graded to direct bund contents to a sun, that shall allow controlled outflow to an oil separator.
- e) Bund dimension at Lydenburg tank farm is 40m long x 15m.

#### 2. PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORK

The following summarizes the fuel depot upgrade project scope of work:

#### 2.1 TANK FARM (BUNDS AND TANKS)

- a) Remove ballast/ gravel stones, Remove 100m and situ material and cart away from site.
- b) Construct valve chamber to control run ff.
- c) Construct a suitably sized drainage system that will channel the potential spillage to site oil separator.
- d) Compact natural ground to 93 Med AASHTO.
- e) Lay 250 micron polyethylatic sheeting in bund area surface bed 600m²
- f) Lay reinforcement (Ref 95)
- g) Cast concrete (25mpl) glided to fall to channel runoff to drainage system.
- h) Plaster bund walls I ten al and external facades.
- i) Construct two entry/ xit access stairwells to and from the bund area, and located in opposite ends to facilitate sace entry and exit from the area in case of emergency.

#### 2.2 RAIL DESAUTING AREA

- a) Remove the existing perished expansion joint sealant, approximately 50 linear meters.
- b) Apply new joint sealant on concrete expansion joints approximately 50 linear meters.
- c) Clean decanting slab surface and repair cracks, the surface area of the rail decanting area is approximately 133m².
- d) Apply the two component bonding agent, i.e. polymer-modified cement based slurry, formulated to bond to oil contaminated concrete (133m²).
- e) Rebuild the concrete kerbing around spill containment slab so as to channel potential spillage to an oil separator approximately 10 linear meters.

#### 2.3 LOCOMOTIVE REFUELLING AREA

- a) Remove perished concrete expansion joint sealer between concrete expansion joints in locomotive refuelling area surface bed approximately 180 linear meters.
- b) Apply new joint sealant on concrete expansion joints approximately 180 linear meters.
- c) Clean decanting slab surface and repair cracks, the surface area of the rail refuelling area is approximately 162m<sup>2</sup>.



- d) Rebuild missing concrete kerbing around the existing spill containment slab approximately 20meters.
- e) Apply the two component bonding agent, i.e. polymer-modified cement based slurry, formulated to bond to oil contaminated concrete (162m²).
- f) Construct open channel drainage (350mm wide x 300mm deep and approximately 10m long complete with mentis type grating and frame directing spillage to an oil separator.
- g) Construct new operator's shed at the refuelling area, not exceeding 1.5 x 2.5m complete with flame proof lighting.

#### 2.4 PUMP HOUSE

- a) Construct concrete valved chamber on the outside of the pump house and connected into the oil separator.
- b) Extend pump house drainage channel complete with mentis type grating or chequered plate and support angle,  $(350 \text{mm} \times 300 \text{mm} \text{ deep} \times 15 \text{m long})$ .
- c) Construct new concrete pump plinths to suit two new pump sets (Gorman Rupp Series 83B B and 15kw WEG motor).
- d) Paint pump house floor and demarcate walking real
- e) Paint pump house internal walls (105m<sup>2</sup>).
