2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B BBIE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do ousiness with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurenced transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its terms on, Respondents are to note the following:

- Proposals will be evaluated on price which will be allocated 80 points and preference which will be allocated 20 points, dependent on the value of the Services
- The 80/20 preference point system applies where the acquisition of the Services will be less than R1 000 000.00.
- If the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFP will be cancelled

In compliance with the Government Gazette No 34612, Notice No. 754 dated 23 September 2011, as from 1 October 2011 valid B-BBEE Verification Certificates must be issued by:



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1.0 SCOPE

1.1 This project specification covers Transnet's requirements for the design, supply, installation, testing and commissioning of Rectifiers, AC/DC control panels and associated equipment at Boughton traction substation under the control of Depot Engineer, Ladysmith.

2.0 STANDARDS

- 2.1 Unless otherwise specified all material and equipment supplied shall comply with the current edition of the relevant SANS, BS, IEC or Transnet publication where applicable.

- 2.2.3 Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993 (Available at depot for referral)
- 2.3 Any items offered in accordance with other standards will be considered at the sole discretion of Transnet. The Contractor shall supply the details stating where the item differs from these specifications as well as supply a copy (in English) of the recognised standard specification(s) with which it complies.

3.0 DESCRIPTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall perform the following:

- 3.1 Install all equipment in accordance with Transnet specification BBB 5452 version-1.
- 3.2 Boughton traction substation
 - 3.2.1 Design, supply, install, test and commission 1 x 6MW rectifier as per Transnet specification BBB 0496 Version 7 complete with diode monitoring devices and fan control circuits.

The new rectifier must match the following transformer details:

Make: Asea
Serial No: 27850
Year: 1882
Primary voltage: 8 000 V

Secondary voltage: 1220 V (6 phases)

kVA rating: 4950 kVA

Vector group: Yd with \pm 15 degrees phase shift

Primary impedance 4.09% at tap 3

- 3.2.2 Supply and install electronic display/indication in the panel in accordance with Clause 8.1 of Transnet specification 23.6 2721 version 4. Contractor shall be responsible for the wiring of all circuitry to the control panel.
- 3.2.3 In addition to clause 8.4.7.1 of Transnet specification BBB 0496 version 7, do wiring such that, the failure of one diode shall give an indication to Electrical control via the tele-control system. The failure of any two diodes, irrespective of their positions in the rectifier, shall cause a substation lockout.
- 3.2.4 Supply and install XLPE 3kV armoured positive cables from the transformer secondary side to the rectifier.
- 3.2.5 Supply, install and commission separate AC primary circuit breaker control panel and an AC/DC distribution panel for 3kV DC traction in accordance with Transnet specification BBB 2721 version-4. The panel shall also cater for the following:
 - 3.2.5.1 2 x Protection relays for main and auxiliary transformer and AC earth leakage protection. The currently approved relay is FP 2005/2T.
 - 3.2.5.2 5-pin 60A male/female socket outlet for calibration.
 - 3.2.5.3 Contactors, mechanically and electrically interlocked for 380V supply change over.
 - 3.2.5.4 220V AC and 110V DC light.
- 3.2.6 Supply and install the following cables to and from the control panel:
 - 3.2.6.1 110V DC supply cable (16mm² x 2 Core) and control cable (2,5mm² x 12 Core) from control panel to 2 x high-speed circuit breakers.
 - 3.2.6.2 Control and protection cables to the control panel from the AC disconnects (2.5mm² x 4 Core), CTs (4mm² x 4 Core), PCB (2.5mm² x 19 Core and 2mm² x 2 Core for heater), transformer (2.5mm² x 4 Core).

- 3.2.6.3 Multi core cable (1,5mm² x 40 Core) from control panel to Tele-control. Transnet shall connect the Tele-control end of the cable.
- 3.2.7 Supply and install copper busbars from the wall bushings to the rectifier to the reactor coil to the wave filter to the positive isolator to the DC negative busbar. Barriers shall be provided to all exposed live busbars to prevent access. The Contractor shall cater for any support insulators required for the installation.
- 3.2.8 Supply and install a complete set of key type mechanical interlocking system
- 3.2.9 Redo earthing inside the substation building as per drawing CEE-TBD-7.
- 3.2.10 Patch up wall and floor where old equipment has been removed.
- 3.2.11 Supply and install the room fan on the wall behind the rectifier.
- 3.2.12 Supply paint and paint substation floor red oxide and paint substation walls inside white.
- 3.2.13 Strip and transport old equipment to Ladysmith Infra Depot.
- 3.3 All steelwork shall be galvanised in accordance with SANS 121 and where required, painted in accordance with specification CEE 0045. The manufacture of any steelwork shall not take place prior to the approval of the design drawings. Transpet shall inspect the steelwork at the manufacturer's works prior to dispatch. All fasteners (nuts a poles) shall be secured using flat or bevelled washers, where necessary, as well as lock washers.
- 3.4 Ensure that all concrete work (i.e. dasting of foundations, etc.) is in accordance with Transnet specification S420 (1999). Foundations and the bolt groups shall be certified by a Professional Engineer or Technologist registered with the Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA) in the relevant disciplines. These designs shall be submitted before the civil work is commenced. All foundation edges shall be levelled at 45°, and the surfaces must be float finished. All support foundations shall be at the same level. Equipment support foundations shall be finished off 200mm above the finished ground level of the yard. The design must be in such a way that standing water is prevented.
- Arrange for sampling and testing of all concrete used, and shall submit full records to the Manager. The method of sampling used shall comply with specification S420. No water shall be added to a mix after test cubes have been taken, as this reduces the strength of the concrete very significantly. The Contractor shall submit certificates confirming the strength of concrete to the Manager in the case where ready-mix concrete is used. Hand mixed concrete is not acceptable.
- 3.6 Ensure that no ballast stone is contaminated during digging and filling of cable trenches and that the soil is compacted to the same density as surrounding soil when trenches are filled.
- 3.7 On completion of the installation, it will be required from the Contractor to submit as built drawings and schematic diagrams of all new equipment as well as indicating interfaces with the existing equipment.

4.0 CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS

- 4.1 Over and above the conditions mentioned in the General Conditions of Contract, the Contractor shall also be responsible for the conditions mentioned hereunder.
- 4.2 The Contractor shall not make use of any subcontractor to perform the works or parts thereof without prior permission from the Manager or Technical Officer.

- 4.3 The Contractor shall ensure that a safety representative is at site at all times. All safety measures prescribed by Transnet Electrical Safety Instructions and the "Occupational Health and Safety Act 1993 (Act 85 of 1993)" associated with working on a project of this nature shall be adhered to.
- 4.4 The Contractor shall supply a **site diary** (with triplicate pages). This book shall be used to record any unusual events during the period of the work. Any delays to the work shall also be recorded such as delays caused by poor weather conditions, delays caused by permits being cancelled etc. The appointed Manager or Technical Officer must countersign such delays. Other delays such as non-availability of equipment from 3rd party suppliers must be communicated to the Manager or Technical Officer in writing.
- 4.5 The Contractor shall supply a **site instruction book** (with triplicate pages). This book shall be used to record any instructions to the Contractor regarding problems encountered on site for example the quality of work or the placement of equipment. This book shall be filled in by the Manager or Technical Officer and must be countersigned by the Contractor.
- 4.6 Both books mentioned in 4.4 and 4.5 shall be the property of Transnet and shall be handed over to the Manager or Technical Officer on the day of energising or handing over.
- 4.7 The penalty charge will be 0.15% per day of the total valve of the contract.
- 4.8 Notwithstanding what is stated in clause 27 of the 15 (MW) General Conditions of Contract, no surety will be required for this contract, only 10% retent on will be retained when payment is made.

5.0 INSTALLATION

- 5.1 The Contractor shall be responsible for the transport to site, off-loading, handling, storage and security of all material required for the construction/execution of the works.
- 5.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for all necessary (as decided by the Transnet Manager or Technical Officer) connections between the equipment supplied and other components in the substation including connections to the earth-mat.
- 5.3 All fasteners on seelwork, components and electrical connections (nuts and bolts) shall be secured using flat as well as lock washers.

6.0 INTERCONNECTION OF EQUIPMENT

- 6.1 All HT electrical equipment interconnections shall be done using conductors similar to that being used in the existing substation yard.
- 6.2 Conductors between separately mounted outdoor equipment shall incorporate a degree of flexibility to avoid any over-stressing of these connections due to the foundation movement or conductor expansion/contraction and to facilitate alignment of equipment.
- 6.3 High conductive silicon grease shall be liberally applied to all the connections.
- 6.4 All dissimilar metal connections (Cu to Al) shall be made using bi-metallic clamps that are specifically designed and manufactured to make that particular connection (ad hoc fabricated clamps are not acceptable).

7.0 WORK TO BE DONE BY TRANSNET

- 7.1 Transnet shall have an electrician available for isolation and the erection of barriers to live electrical equipment and issuing of work permits.
- 7.2 Upon successful completion of the works to the satisfaction of Transnet, Transnet shall perform necessary protection tests and commission the said equipment.
- 7.3 The depot staff will be responsible for reconnecting tele-control equipment in the substation.

8.0 TENDERING PROCEDURE

- 8.1 Contractors shall duly fill in the attached 'Schedule of quantities and prices'. Items not reflected in this Schedule, but covered in the project specification or agreed at site meetings, shall be added to the 'Schedule of quantities and prices' by the Contractor and quoted for accordingly.
- An addendum reflecting changes to the project specification and 'Schedule of quantities and prices' shall be forwarded to Contractors after the site meeting and Contractors should quote accordingly.
- 8.3 Contractors shall provide a provisional Gantt or a single chart showing when the substation will be done and energised, when submitting the tender. A final chart should be submitted to the Manager or Technical Officer within 14 days after the award has been made to the successful Contractor.
- 8.4 Contractors shall submit qualifications of the staff that will be performing the works. Qualified technical personnel shall perform the works on the electrical equipment or installations. During the duration of the contract, the successful Contractor will be required to inform the Technical Officer of any staff changes and provide the qualifications of the replacement staff for approval.
- 8.5 Contractors shall indicate clause-by-clause compliance with the specification. This shall take the form of a separate document listing all the specifications clause numbers indicating the individual statement of compliance or non-compliance. This document can be used by Contractors to elaborate on their clause.
- 8.6 Contractors shall with ate a statement of non-compliance.
- 8.7 Where equipment offered does not comply with standards or publications referred to in the specification, Contractors shall state which standards apply and submit a copy in English or certified translation.
- 8.8 Contractors shall submit descriptive literature consisting of detailed technical specifications, general constructional details and principal dimensions, together with clear illustrations of the equipment offered. During the duration of the contract period, the successful Contractor will be required to inform the Technical Officer of changes to equipment offered and submit detailed information on replacement equipment for approval prior to it being used on this contract.
- 8.9 Contractors shall submit equipment type test certificates as specified with the Tender. These shall be in English or certified translation.

9.0 DRAWINGS, INSTRUCTION MANUALS AND SPARE PART CATALOGUES

9.1 All as built drawings shall be supplied in electronic format (Microstation/Acad).

- 9.2 All drawings (paper prints) shall be submitted to the Manager or Technical Officer for approval. No construction or manufacturing activity will be allowed prior to the associated drawings having been approved by the Manager or Technical Officer.
- 9.3 All drawings, catalogues, instruction book and spares lists shall be in accordance with Transnet's specification CEE.0224.2002.
- 9.4 All final as built drawings shall be provided to Transnet within four weeks after commissioning.

10.0 SITE TESTS

- 10.1 The equipment shall be inspected/tested and approved by Transnet Quality Assurance at the Contractor's workshop prior to it being taken to site. Only once the approval has been granted in writing can the equipment be taken to site for installation. The approval should also be recorded on the site instruction book and countersigned by both parties.
- 10.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for carrying out of in-site tests and commissioning of all equipment supplied and installed in terms of this specification and the contractual agreement.
- 10.3 Functional on-site tests shall be conducted on all items of equipment and circuitry to prove the proper functioning and installation thereof.
- 10.4 The Contractor shall submit a detailed list of n-site tests for the approval of the Manager or Technical Officer.
- 10.5 The Contractor shall arrange for the Technical Officer or his representative to be present to witness the on-site tests.
- 10.6 The on-site tests and subscripe commissioning will not commence until ALL CONSTRUCTION work has been completed. Construction staff, material and equipment shall be removed from site prior to the commencement of testing. Testing and commissioning of the substation equipment will not be allowed to take place by construction site environment.
- 10.7 The on-site tests shall include the following:
 - Test for the functionality of all electrical circuitry.
 - Trip tests on relays.
 - Test on equipment as per manufacturer's instructions.
 - Insulation tests
- 10.8 At the completion of the on-site tests, the Manager or Technical Officer or his representative shall either sign the tests sheets (supplied by the Contractor) as having witnessed the satisfactory completion thereof, or hand to the Contractor a list of defects requiring rectification.
- 10.9 Upon rectification of defects, the Contractor shall arrange for the Manager or Technical Officer or his representative to certify satisfactory completion of on-site tests.
- 10.10 Acceptance by the Manager or Technical Officer of satisfactory completion of on-site tests in no way relieves the Contractor of his obligation to rectify defects which may have been overlooked or become evident at a later stage.

11.0 COMMISSIONING OF EQUIPMENT

- 11.1 Commissioning will only take place after all defects have been rectified to the satisfaction of the Manager or Technical Officer.
- 11.2 Commissioning will include energising of equipment from the primary isolator to the track feeder circuits. The Contractor must prove the satisfactory operation of all equipment under live conditions.
- 11.3 On completion of commissioning, the Contractor will hand the equipment over to the Manager or Technical Officer in terms of the relevant instruction.
- 11.4 The commissioning of protection equipment by Transnet will in no way absolve the Contractor from any of his responsibilities during the guarantee period. 12.0 GUARANTEE AND DEFECTS

- 12.2 The Contractor shall be issued with a completion certificate with the list of all defects to be repaired within 14 working days after commissioning.
- 12.3 The guarantee period for these substations shall expire after:
 - A period of 12 months commencing on the date of completion of the contract or the date the substation is handed over to Transnet whichever is the earliest.
- The specified guarantee period shall only apply to the new equipment installed and from the time of energising the equipment and the acceptance thereof.

Transnet does not accept any other conditions which the Supplier/Service Provider may specify, unless otherwise agreed to by Transnet in writing. In the event of any inconsistency between these Terms and any Order, these Perms shall take precedence.

20 CONFORMITY WITH ORDER

Products/Services shall conform strictly with the group. - 2.5 In the event that any Confidential Information shall be copied, disclosed or used otherwise than as permitted under this Agreement then, upon becoming aware of the same, without prejudice to

any rights or remedies of the Disclosing Party, the Receiving Party shall as soon as practicable notify the Disclosing Party of such event and if requested take such steps (including the institution of legal proceedings) as shall be necessary to remedy (if capable of remedy) the default and/or to prevent further unauthorised copying, disclosure or use.

All Confidential Information shall remain the property of the Disclosing Party and its disclosure 2.6 shall not confer on the Receiving Party any rights, including intellectual property rights over the Confidential Information whatsoever, beyond those contained in this Agreement.

3 **RECORDS AND RETURN OF INFORMATION**

- 3,3 The Company shall, within 7 (seven) days of receipt on written demand from Transnet:
 - return all written Confidential Information (moduling all copies); and a)
 - expunge or destroy any Confidential Information from any computer, word processor or b) other device whatsoever into which it was copied, read or programmed by the Company or on its behalf.
- 3.4 The Company shall on request supply a certificate signed by a director as to its full compliance with the requirements of class 2 3.3b) above.

ANNOUNCEMENTS 4

- Neither party when are or permit to be made any announcement or disclosure of its prospective 4.1 interest in the Bid without the prior written consent of the other party.
- Neither party shall make use of the other party's name or any information acquired through its 4.2 dealings with the other party for publicity or marketing purposes without the prior written consent of the other party.

5 **DURATION**

The obligations of each party and its Agents under this Agreement shall survive the termination of any discussions or negotiations between the parties regarding the Bid and continue thereafter for a period of 5 (five) years.

Each party confirms that it is acting as principal and not as nominee, agent or broker for any other person and that it will be responsible for any costs incurred by it or its advisers in considering or pursuing the Bid and in complying with the terms of this Agreement.

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1 INTRODUCTION

When an Agreement is entered into between Transnet SOC Ltd [Transnet] and the appointed supplier of Services to Transnet [the Service Provider], these Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract, the technical specifications for the Services, the General Bid Conditions, a Schedule of Requirements or Work Order including such special conditions as may be applicable, and any terms in the associated Bid Documents, exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet.

2 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in the Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 2.1 AFSA means the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa;
- 2.2 Agreement means the Agreement and its associated schedules and/or annexures and/or appendices, including the Work Order(s), specifications for the Services and such special conditions as shall apply to the Agreement, together with the General Tender Conditions and any additional provisions in the associated bid documents rendered by the Service Provider [as agreed in writing between the Parties], which collectively and exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet;
- 2.3 Background Intellectual Property of ans all Intellectual Property introduced and required by either Party to give effect to their obligations under the Agreement owned in whole or in part by or licensed to either Party or their affiliates prior to the Commencement Date or developed after the Commencement Date of therwise pursuant to the Agreement;
- 2.4 **Business Day(s)** means Yondays to Fridays between 07:30 and 16:00, excluding public holidays as proclaimed in South Africa;
- 2.5 **Commencement Date** means [•], notwithstanding the signature date of the Agreement;
- 2.6 Confidential Information means any information or other data, whether in written, oral, graphic or in any other form such as in documents, papers, memoranda, correspondence, notebooks, reports, drawings, diagrams, discs, articles, samples, test results, prototypes, designs, plans, formulae, patents, or inventor's certificates, which a Party discloses or provides to the other Party [intentionally or unintentionally, or as a result of one Party permitting the representative of the other Party to visit any of its premises], or which otherwise becomes known to a Party, and which is not in the public domain and includes, without limiting the generality of the term:
 - a) information relating to methods of operation, data and plans of the disclosing Party;
 - b) the contents of the Agreement;
 - private and personal details of employees or clients of the disclosing Party or any other person where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
 - any information disclosed by either Party and which is clearly marked as being confidential or secret;
 - information relating to the strategic objectives and planning of the disclosing Party relating to its existing and planned future business activities;

- f) information relating to the past, present and future research and development of the disclosing Party;
- g) information relating to the business activities, business relationships, products, services, customers, clients and Subcontractors of the disclosing Party where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
- h) information contained in the software and associated material and documentation belonging to the disclosing Party;
- technical and scientific information, Know-How and trade secrets of a disclosing Party including inventions, applications and processes;
- j) Copyright works;
- k) commercial, financial and marketing information;
- data concerning architecture, demonstrations, tools and techniques, processes, machinery and equipment of the disclosing Party;
- m) plans, designs, concepts, drawings, functional and technical requirements and specifications of the disclosing Party;
- n) information concerning faults or defects in goods, equipment, hardware or software or the incidence of such faults or defects; and
- o) information concerning the charges, Fees and / or costs of the disclosing Party or its authorised Subcontractors of their methods, practices or service performance levels actually achieved;
- 2.7 Copyright means the right expressions, procedures, methods of operations or mathematical concepts, computer program codes, compilations of data or other material, literary works, musical works, artistic works, ound recordings, broadcasts, program carrying signals, published editions, photographic works, or cinematographic works of the copyright owner to do or to authorise the doing of cevain acts specified in respect of the different categories of works;
- 2.8 **Default** means any breach of the obligations of either Party [including but not limited to fundamental breach or breach of a fundamental term] or any Default, act, omission, negligence or statement of either Party, its employees, agents or Subcontractors in connection with or in relation to the subject of the Agreement and in respect of which such Party is liable to the other;
- 2.9 Deliverable(s) means any and all works of authorship, products and materials developed, written, prepared, assembled, integrated, modified or provided by the Service Provider in relation to the Services;
- 2.10 Designs mean registered Designs and/or Design applications and will include the monopoly right granted for the protection of an independently created industrial design including designs dictated essentially by technical or functional considerations as well as topographies of integrated circuits and integrated circuits;
- 2.11 Fee(s) shall mean the agreed Fees for the Services to be purchased from the Service Provider by Transnet, as detailed in the Work Order(s), issued in accordance with the Agreement, as amended by mutual agreement between the Parties and in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement from time to time;

- 2.12 Foreground Intellectual Property means all Intellectual Property developed by either Party pursuant to the Agreement;
- 2.13 Intellectual Property means Patents, Designs, Know-How, Copyright and Trade Marks and all rights having equivalent or similar effect which may exist anywhere in the world and includes all future additions and improvements to the Intellectual Property;
- 2.14 Know-How means all Confidential Information of whatever nature relating to the Intellectual Property and its exploitation as well as all other Confidential Information generally relating to Transnet's field of technology, including technical information, processing or manufacturing techniques, Designs, specifications, formulae, systems, processes, information concerning materials and marketing and business information in general;
- 2.15 Materials means the Deliverables, the Service Provider Materials and the Third Party Materials;
- 2.16 **Parties** mean the Parties to the Agreement together with their subsidiaries, divisions, business units, successors-in-title and their assigns;
- 2.17 Party means either one of these Parties;
- 2.18 Patents mean registered Patents and Patent applications once the latter have proceeded to grant, and includes a right granted for any inventions, products or processes in all fields of technology;
- 2.19 Permitted Purpose means any activity or process to be undertaken or supervised by Personnel or employees of one Party during the term of the Agreement, for which purpose authorised disclosure of the other Party's Confidential Information or Intellectual Property is a prerequisite in order to enable such activity or process to be accomplished;
- 2.20 Personnel means any partner employee, agent, consultant, independent associate or supplier, Subcontractor and the suffer of such Subcontractor, or other authorised representative of either Party;
- 2.21 **Purchase Order(s)** means official orders issued by an operating division of Transnet to the Service Provider for the provision of Services;
- 2.22 **Service(s)** means [•], the Service(s) provided to Transnet by the Service Provider, pursuant to the Work Order(s) in terms of the Agreement;
- 2.23 Service Level Agreement or SLA means the processes, deliverables, key performance indicators and performance standards relating to the Services to be provided by the Service Provider;
- 2.24 Subcontract means any contract or agreement or proposed contract or agreement between the Service Provider and any third party whereby that third party agrees to provide to the Service Provider the Services or any part thereof;
- 2.25 **Subcontractor** means the third party with whom the Service Provider enters into a Subcontract;
- 2.26 Service Provider Materials means all works of authorship, products and materials [including, but not limited to, data, diagrams, charts, reports, specifications, studies, inventions, software, software development tools, methodologies, ideas, methods, processes, concepts and techniques] owned by, or licensed to, the Service Provider prior to the Commencement Date or independently developed by the Service Provider outside the scope of the Agreement at no expense to Transnet, and used by the Service Provider in the performance of the Services;

- 2.27 **Tax Invoice** means the document as required by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- 2.28 Third Party Material means software, software development tools, methodologies, ideas, methods, processes, concepts and techniques owned by, or licensed to a third party and used by the Service Provider in the performance of the Services;
- 2.29 Trade Marks mean registered Trade Marks and trade mark applications and includes any sign or logo, or combination of signs and/or logos capable of distinguishing the goods or services of one undertaking from those of another undertaking;
- 2.30 **VAT** means Value-Added Tax chargeable in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time; and
- 2.31 **Work Order(s)** means a detailed scope of work for a Service required by Transnet, including timeframes, Deliverable, Fees and costs for the supply of the Service to Transnet, which may be appended to the Agreement from time to time.

3 INTERPRETATION

- Clause headings in the Agreement are included for case of reference only and do not form part of the Agreement for the purposes of interpretation of for any other purpose. No provision shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of either Party hereto by reason of such Party having or being deemed to have structured or drafted such provision.
- 3.2 Any term, word, acronym or phrise used in the Agreement, other than those defined under the clause heading "Definitions" shall be given its plain English meaning, and those terms, words, acronyms, and phrases used to the Agreement will be interpreted in accordance with the generally accepted meanings accorded thereto.
- 3.3 A reference to the singular incorporates a reference to the plural and vice versa.
- 3.4 A reference to natural persons incorporates a reference to legal persons and *vice versa*.
- 3.5 A reference to a particular gender incorporates a reference to the other gender.

4 NATURE AND SCOPE

- 4.1 The Agreement is an agreement under the terms and conditions of which the Service Provider will arrange for the provision to Transnet of the Services which meet the requirements of Transnet, the delivery of which Services is controlled by means of Purchase Orders to be issued by Transnet and executed by the Service Provider, in accordance with the Agreement.
- 4.2 Such Purchase Orders shall be agreed between the Parties from time to time, subject to the terms of the relevant Work Order(s).
- 4.3 Each properly executed Purchase Order forms an inseparable part of the Agreement as if it were fully incorporated into the body of the Agreement.
- 4.4 During the period of the Agreement, both Parties can make written suggestions for amendments to the Work Order(s), in accordance with procedures set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control] below. A Party will advise the other Party within 14 [fourteen] Business Days, or such other period as mutually agreed, whether the amendment is acceptable.
- 4.5 Insofar as any term, provision or condition in the Work Order(s) conflicts with a like term, provision or condition in the Agreement and/or a Purchase Order, or where the Agreement is

- silent on the matter, the term, provision or condition in this Master Agreement shall prevail, unless such term or provision or condition in this Master Agreement has been specifically revoked or amended by mutual written agreement between the Parties.
- 4.6 Time will be of the essence and the Service Provider will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the timeframe(s) [if any] set out in the relevant schedule, save that the Service Provider will not be liable under this clause if it is unable to meet such obligation within the time required as a direct result of any act or omission by Transnet and it has used its best endeavours to advise Transnet of such act or omission. In the event of such delay, any time deadlines detailed in the relevant schedule shall be extended by a period equal to the period of that delay.

5 **AUTHORITY OF PARTIES**

- 5.1 Nothing in the Agreement will constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership between the Parties, or constitute or be deemed to constitute the Parties as agents or employees of one another for any purpose or in any form whatsoever.
- 5.2 Neither Party shall be entitled to, or have the power of a chority to enter into an agreement in the name of the other; or give any warranty, representation or undertaking on the other's behalf; or create any liability against the other or bind the other's credit in any way or for any purpose whatsoever.

6 WARRANTIES

- 6.1 The Service Provider warrants to Transnet that:
 - a) it has full capacity and authority to enter into and to perform the Agreement and that the Agreement executed by a duly authorised representatives of the Service Provider;
 - b) it will pischarge its obligations under the Agreement and any annexure, appendix or scientific between the scientific productions of the scientific between the scientific productions and the scientific productions of the scientific productions are scientifications.
 - it will be solely responsible for the payment of remuneration and associated benefits, if any, of its Personnel and for withholding and remitting income tax for its Personnel in conformance with any applicable laws and regulations;
 - d) it will procure licences for Transnet in respect of all Third Party Material detailed in the Work Order(s), and will procure the right for Transnet to take such copies [in whole or in part] of such Third Party Materials as it may reasonably require for the purposes of back-up for archiving and disaster recovery; and
 - e) the use or possession by Transnet of any Materials will not subject Transnet to any claim for infringement of any Intellectual Property Rights of any third party.
- 6.2 The Service Provider warrants that it will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the Service Levels as defined in the relevant schedule. Transnet may at its discretion audit compliance with the Service Levels, provided that any such audit is carried out with reasonable prior notice and in a reasonable way so as not to have an adverse effect on the performance of the Services. Without prejudice to clause 6.3 below, in the event that the Service Provider fails to meet the Service Levels, Transnet may claim appropriate service credits or invoke a retention of Fees as detailed in the relevant schedule and/or Work Order.

- 6.3 The Service Provider warrants that for a period of 90 [ninety] days from Acceptance of the Deliverables they will, if properly used, conform in all material respects with the requirements set out in the relevant schedule. The Service Provider will at its expense remedy any such non-conformance as soon as possible but in any event within 30 [thirty] days of notification by Transnet. In the event that the Service Provider fails or is unable to remedy such non-conformance within such time-scale, Transnet will be entitled to employ a third party to do so in place of the Service Provider and any excess charges or costs incurred by Transnet as a result shall be paid by the Service Provider.
- 6.4 The Service Provider will remedy any defect within 30 [thirty] days of being notified of that defect by Transnet in writing.
- 6.5 The Service Provider will not be liable to remedy any problem arising from or caused by any modification made by Transnet to the Deliverables, or any part thereof, without the prior approval of the Service Provider.
- 6.6 The Service Provider shall advise Transnet of the effects of any steps proposed by Transnet pursuant to clause 6.5 above, including but not limited to any cost implications or any disruption or delay in the performance of the Services. The Part is agree that any changes to the Services, including the charges for the Services or any timetables for delivery of the Services, will be agreed in accordance with the change control procedure, as set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control].
- 6.7 The Service Provider warrants that:
 - a) it has, using the most up-to-date software available, tested for [and deleted] all commonly known viruses in the Materials and for all viruses known by the Service Provider at the date of the relevant Work Order; and
 - b) at the time of delivery to Transnet, the Materials do not contain any trojan horse, worm, logic band, time bomb, back door, trap door, keys or other harmful components.

The Service Provider agrees that, in the event that a virus is found, it will at its own expense use its best endeavours to assist Transnet in reducing the effect of the virus and, particularly in the event that a virus causes loss of operational efficiency or loss of data, to assist Transnet to the same extent to mitigate such losses and to restore Transnet to its original operating efficiency.

- 6.8 The Service Provider undertakes to comply with South Africa's general privacy protection in terms of the Bill of Rights [Section 14] in connection with the Agreement and shall procure that its Personnel shall observe the provisions of Section 14 [as applicable] or any amendments and reenactments thereof and any regulations made pursuant thereto.
- 6.9 The Service Provider warrants that it has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure that, in the event of a disaster, the impact of such disaster on the ability of the Service Provider to comply with its obligations under the Agreement will be reduced to the greatest extent possible, and that the Service Provider shall ensure that it has appropriate, tested and documented recovery arrangements in place.
- 6.10 In compliance with the National Railway Safety Regulator Act, 16 of 2002, the Service Provider shall ensure that the Services, to be supplied to Transnet under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, comply fully with the specifications as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto, and shall thereby adhere [as applicable] to railway safety requirements and/or regulations. Permission for

the engagement of a Subcontractor by the Service Provider [as applicable] shall be subject to a review of the capability of the proposed Subcontractor to comply with the specified railway safety requirements and/or regulations. The Service Provider and/or its Subcontractor shall grant Transnet access, during the term of the Agreement, to review any safety-related activities, including the coordination of such activities across all parts of its organisation.

7 TRANSNET'S OBLIGATIONS

- 7.1 Transnet undertakes to promptly comply with any reasonable request by the Service Provider for information, including information concerning Transnet's operations and activities, that relates to the Services as may be necessary for the Service Provider to perform the Services, but for no other purpose. However, Transnet's compliance with any request for information is subject to any internal security rules and requirements and subject to the observance by the Service Provider of its confidentiality obligations under the Agreement.
- 7.2 The Service Provider shall give Transnet reasonable notice of any information it requires in accordance with clause 7.1 above.
- 7.3 Subject to clause 13 [Service Provider's Personnelli, Manshet agrees to provide the Service Provider or its Personnel such access to and use of its facilities as is necessary to allow the Service Provider to perform its obligations under the Agreement.

8 GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

- 8.1 The Service Provider shall:
 - a) respond promptly to all emplaints and enquiries from Transnet;
 - b) inform Transperimenediately of any dispute or complaint arising in relation to the provision of the Services
 - c) conduct its ousiness in a professional manner that will reflect positively upon the Service Provider's Services;
 - keep full records clearly indicating all transactions concluded by the Service Provider relating to the performance of the Services and keep such records for at least 5 [five] years from the date of each such transaction;
 - e) obtain, and at all times maintain in full force and effect, any and all licences, permits and the like required under applicable laws for the provision of the Services and the conduct of the business and activities of the Service Provider;
 - observe and ensure compliance with all requirements and obligations as set out in the labour and related legislation of South Africa, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 85 of 1993;
 - g) comply with all applicable environmental legislation and regulations, and demonstrate sound environmental policies, management and performance; and
 - h) ensure the validity of all renewable certifications, including but not limited to its Tax Clearance Certificate and B-BBEE Accreditation Certificate, for the duration of the Agreement. Should the Service Provider fail to present Transnet with such renewals as they become due, Transnet shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any

liability and without prejudice to any claims which Transnet may have for damages against the Service Provider.

- 8.2 The Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it shall at all times:
 - a) render the Services and perform all its duties with honesty and integrity;
 - communicate openly and honestly with Transnet and demonstrate a commitment to performing the Services timeously, efficiently and to the required standards;
 - endeavour to provide the highest possible standards of service and professionalism, with a reasonable degree of care and diligence;
 - d) use its best endeavours and make every diligent effort to meet agreed deadlines;
 - e) treat its own Personnel, as well as all Transnet's officers, employees, agents and consultants, with fairness and courtesy and respect for their human rights;
 - f) practice and promote its own internal policies aimed at prohibiting and preventing unfair discrimination [as further referred to in clause 22 — Auality and Diversity];
 - g) treat all enquiries from Transnet in connection with the Services with courtesy and respond to all enquiries promptly and efficiently. Where the Service Provider is unable to comply with the provisions of this clause, the Service Provider will advise Transnet of the delay and the reasons therefor and will keep Transnet informed of progress made regarding the enquiry;
 - h) when requested by Transfet, provide clear and accurate information regarding the Service Provider's own policies and procedures, excluding Know-How and other Confidential Information, except where a non-disclosure undertaking has been entered into between the Parties;
 - i) not allow a conflict of interest to develop between its own interests [or the interests of any of its other sustomers] and the interests of Transnet;
 - j) or ccept or offer, nor allow, induce or promote the acceptance or offering of any gratuity, enticement, incentive or gift that could reasonably be regarded as bribery or an attempt to otherwise exert undue influence over the recipient;
 - not mislead Transnet or its officers, employees and stakeholders, whether by act or omission;
 - not otherwise act in an unethical manner or do anything which could reasonably be expected to damage or tarnish Transnet's reputation or business image; and
 - m) immediately report to Transnet any unethical, fraudulent or otherwise unlawful conduct of which it becomes aware in connection with Transnet or the provision of Services.

9 FEES AND EXPENSES

- 9.1 In consideration of the provision of the Services, Transnet will pay to the Service Provider the Fees detailed in the relevant schedule or Work Order.
- 9.2 Transnet will not be invoiced for materials used in the provision of the Services save for those materials [if any] set out in the Work Order and accepted by Transnet or in any relevant Work Order [which will be invoiced to Transnet at cost].

- 9.3 Unless otherwise agreed in a schedule or Work Order, Transnet will reimburse to the Service Provider all reasonable and proper expenses incurred directly and solely in connection with the provision of the Services, provided that all such expenses:
 - a) are agreed by Transnet in advance;
 - b) are incurred in accordance with Transnet's standard travel and expenses policies;
 - c) are passed on to Transnet at cost with no administration fee; and
 - d) will only be reimbursed if supported by relevant receipts.
- 9.4 All Tax Invoices relating to Fees, out of pocket expenses and, if applicable, travel and accommodation costs, will provide the detail for each of the Personnel carrying out the Services and incurring the expenses, and the Tax Invoice will, where appropriate, include VAT as a separate item.

10 INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- 10.1 Transnet shall pay the Service Provider the amounts stipulated in the relevant schedule or Work Order, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- Transnet shall pay such amounts to the Service recorder, upon receipt of a correct and undisputed Tax Invoice together with the supporting documentation as specified in the Work Order appended hereto, once the undisputed Tax Invoices, or such portion of the Tax Invoices which are undisputed become due and payable to the Service Provider for the provision of the Services, in terms of clause 10.4 below.
- 10.3 All Fees and other sums payable under the Agreement are exclusive of VAT, which will be payable at the applicable rate.
- 10.4 Unless otherwise provided for in the Work Order(s) appended to the Agreement, Tax Invoices shall be submitted together with a month-end statement. Payment against such month-end statement shall be made by Transnet within 30 [thirty] days after date of receipt by Transnet of the statement together with all undisputed Tax Invoices and supporting documentation.
- 10.5 Where the payment of any Tax Invoice, or any part thereof which is not in dispute, is not made in accordance with this clause 10, the Service Provider shall be entitled to charge interest on the outstanding amount, at The Standard Bank of South Africa's prime rate of interest in force, for the period from the due date of payment until the outstanding amount is paid.

11 FEE ADJUSTMENTS

- 11.1 Fees for Services rendered in terms of the Agreement shall be subject to review as indicated in the Work Order(s) annexed hereto from time to time.
- 11.2 No less than 2 [two] months prior to any proposed Fee adjustment, the Parties shall commence negotiations for Fees for the next period or as otherwise indicated and appended hereto.
- 11.3 Should Transnet and the Service Provider fail to reach an agreement on Fees for the successive period, either Party shall be entitled to submit this matter to dispute resolution in accordance with clause 25 of this Master Agreement [Dispute Resolution].

12 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

12.1 Title to Confidential Information

- a) Transnet will retain all right, title and interest in and to its Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property that is proprietary to Transnet. For the avoidance of doubt, all the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property shall remain vested in the Service Provider.
- b) Transnet shall grant to the Service Provider an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property only for the Permitted Purpose. This license shall not permit the Service Provider to sub-license to other parties.
- c) The Service Provider shall grant to Transnet an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property for the Permitted Purpose. This licence shall not permit Transnet to sub-license to other parties.
- d) The Service Provider shall grant Transnet access to the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property on terms which shall be being fide negotiated between the Parties for the purpose of commercially exploiting the Poreground Intellectual Property, to the extent that such access is required.

12.2 Title to Intellectual Property

- a) All right, title and interest in and to Foreground Intellectual Property prepared, conceived or developed by the Service Provider, its researchers, agents and employees shall vest in Transnet and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Foreground Intellectual Property. The Service Provider shall not at any time during or after the technination or cancellation of the Agreement dispute the validity or enforceativity of such Foreground Intellectual Property, or cause to be done any act or anything contesting or in any way impairing or tending to impair any part of that right, title and interest to any of the Foreground Intellectual Property and shall not counsel or assist any person to do so.
- b) Transnet shall be entitled to seek protection in respect of the Foreground Intellectual Property anywhere in the world as it shall decide in its own absolute discretion and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining and maintaining protection of the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- c) Where the Foreground Intellectual Property was created by the Service Provider or its researchers, agents and employees and where Transnet elects not to exercise its option to seek protection or decides to discontinue the financial support of the prosecution or maintenance of any such protection, Transnet shall notify the Service Provider who shall have the right of first refusal to file or continue prosecution or maintain any such applications and to maintain any protection issuing on the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- d) No consideration shall be paid by Transnet to the Service Provider for the assignment of any Foreground Intellectual Property from the Service Provider to Transnet, over and above the sums payable in terms of the Agreement. The Service Provider undertakes to

- sign all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of the Foreground Intellectual Property to Transnet.
- Subject to anything contrary contained in the Agreement and/or the prior written consent e) of Transnet [which consent shall not be unreasonably be withheld or delayed], the Service Provider shall under no circumstances be entitled as of right, or to claim the right, to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Foreground Intellectual Property.

Title to Improvements 12.3

Any improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications to the Foreground Intellectual Property, and any and all new inventions or discoveries, based on or resulting from the use of Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Confidential Information shall be exclusively owned by Transnet. The Service Provider shall disclose promptly to Transnet all such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries. The Service Provider hereby undertakes to sign all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries to Transpet and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining, maintaining of socumenting ownership and/or protection of the improved Foreground Intellectual Property.

Unauthorised Use of Confidential Information 12.4

The Service Provider shall not authorise any party to act on or use in any way any Confidential Information belonging to Transfet whether or not such party is aware of such Confidential Information, and shall promptly heafy Transnet of the information if it becomes aware of any party so acting, and shall provide Transnet the information with such assistance as Transnet reasonably requires, at Napsnet's cost and expense, to prevent such third party from so acting.

Unauthorised Vise of Intellectual Property 12.5

- The Provider agrees to notify Transnet in writing of any conflicting uses of, and a) applications of registrations of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks or any act of infringement, unfair competition or passing off involving the Intellectual Property of Transnet of which the Service Provider acquires knowledge and Transnet shall have the right, as its own option, to proceed against any party infringing its Intellectual Property.
- It shall be within the sole and absolute discretion of Transnet to determine what steps shall b) be taken against the infringer and the Service Provider shall co-operate fully with Transnet, at Transnet's cost, in whatever measure including legal action to bring any infringement of illegal use to an end.
- The Service Provider shall cooperate to provide Transnet promptly with all relevant C) ascertainable facts.
- If proceedings are commenced by Transnet alone, Transnet shall be responsible for all d) expenses but shall be entitled to all damages or other award arising out of such proceedings. If proceedings are commenced by both Parties, both Parties will be responsible for the expenses and both Parties shall be entitled to damages or other award arising out of proceedings.

Date & Company Stamp

13 SERVICE PROVIDER'S PERSONNEL

- 13.1 The Service Provider's Personnel shall be regarded at all times as employees, agents or Subcontractors of the Service Provider and no relationship of employer and employee shall arise between Transnet and any Service Provider Personnel under any circumstances regardless of the degree of supervision that may be exercised over the Personnel by Transnet.
- 13.2 The Service Provider warrants that all its Personnel will be entitled to work in South Africa or any other country in which the Services are to be performed.
- 13.3 The Service Provider will ensure that its Personnel comply with all reasonable requirements made known to the Service Provider by Transnet concerning conduct at any Transnet premises or any other premises upon which the Services are to be performed [including but not limited to security regulations, policy standards and codes of practice and health and safety requirements]. The Service Provider will ensure that such Personnel at all times act in a lawful and proper manner in accordance with these requirements.
- 13.4 Transnet reserves the right to refuse to admit or to remove from any premises occupied by or on behalf of it, any Service Provider Personnel whose admission or presence would, in the reasonable opinion of Transnet, be undesirable or who represents a threat to confidentiality or security or whose presence would be in breach of any rules and regulations governing Transnet's Personnel, provided that Transnet notifies the Service Provider of any such refusal [with reasons why]. The reasonable exclusion of any such individual from such premises shall not relieve the Service Provider from the performance of its epigations under the Agreement.
- 13.5 The Service Provider agrees to use all reasonable endeavours to ensure the continuity of its Personnel assigned to perform the Services. If any re-assignment by the Service Provider of those Personnel is necessary, or in Transnet advises that any such Personnel assigned are in any respect unsatisfactory, including where any such Personnel are, or are expected to be or have been absent for any behod, then the Service Provider will promptly supply a replacement of equivalent calibre and experience, and any such replacement shall be approved by Transnet prior to commencing provision of the Services, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

14 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 14.1 Neither Party excludes or limits liability to the other Party for:
 - a) death or personal injury due to negligence; or
 - b) fraud.
- 14.2 The Service Provider shall indemnify and keep Transnet indemnified from and against liability for damage to any Transnet property [whether tangible or intangible] or any other loss, costs or damage suffered by Transnet to the extent that it results from any act of or omission by the Service Provider or its Personnel in connection with the Agreement. The Service Provider's liability arising out of this clause 14.2 shall be limited to a maximum amount payable in respect of any one occurrence or a series of related occurrences in a single calendar year, such amount to be agreed in writing by the Parties.
- 14.3 Subject always to clauses 14.1 and 14.2 above, the liability of either the Service Provider or Transnet under or in connection with the Agreement, whether for negligence, misrepresentation, breach of contract or otherwise, for direct loss or damage arising out of each Default or series of

- related Defaults shall not exceed 100% [one hundred per cent] of the Fees paid under the schedule or Work Order to which the Default(s) relates.
- 14.4 Subject to clause 14.1 above, and except as provided in clauses 14.2 and 14.3 above, in no event shall either Party be liable to the other for indirect or consequential loss or damage or including indirect or consequential loss of profits, business, revenue, goodwill or anticipated savings of an indirect nature or loss or damage incurred by the other Party as a result of third party claims.
- 14.5 If for any reason the exclusion of liability in clause 14.4 above is void or unenforceable, either Party's total liability for all loss or damage under the Agreement shall be as provided in clause 14.3 above.
- 14.6 Nothing in this clause 14 shall be taken as limiting the liability of the Service Provider in respect of clause 12 [Intellectual Property Rights] or clause 16 [Confidentiality].

15 INSURANCES

- 15.1 Without limiting the liability of the Service Provider under the Agreement, the Service Provider shall take out insurance in respect of all risks for which it is prudent for the Service Provider to insure against, including any liability it may have as a result of its activities under the Agreement for theft, destruction, death or injury to any person and damage to property. The level of insurance will be kept under review by Transnet, on an annual basis, to ensure its adequacy, provided that any variation to the level of such insurance shall be entirely at the discretion of the Service Provider.
- 15.2 The Service Provider shall arrange insurance with reputable insurers and will produce to Transnet evidence of the existence of the policies on an annual basis within 30 [thirty] days after date of policy renewals.

16 CONFIDENTIALITY

- 16.1 The Partic Pereby undertake the following, with regard to Confidential Information:
 - a) not to divulge or disclose to any person whomsoever in any form or manner whatsoever, either directly or indirectly, any Confidential Information of the other, without the prior written consent of such other Party, other than when called upon to do so in accordance with a statute, or by a court having jurisdiction, or by any other duly authorised and empowered authority or official, in which event the Party concerned shall do what is reasonably possible to inform the other of such a demand and each shall assist the other in seeking appropriate relief or the instituting of a defensive action to protect the Confidential Information concerned;
 - b) not to use, exploit, permit the use of, directly or indirectly, or in any other manner whatsoever apply the Confidential Information, disclosed to it as a result of the Agreement, for any purpose whatsoever other than for the purpose for which it is disclosed or otherwise than in strict compliance with the provisions in the Agreement;
 - c) not to make any notes, sketches, drawings, photographs or copies of any kind of any part of the disclosed Confidential Information, without the prior written consent of such other Party, except when reasonably necessary for the purpose of the Agreement, in which case such copies shall be regarded as Confidential Information;

- d) not to de-compile, disassemble or reverse engineer any composition, compilation, concept application, item, component de-compilation, including software or hardware disclosed and shall not analyse any sample provided by Transnet, or otherwise determine the composition or structure or cause to permit these tasks to be carried out except in the performance of its obligations pursuant to the Agreement;
- e) not to exercise less care to safeguard Transnet Confidential Information than the Party exercises in safeguarding its own competitive, sensitive or Confidential Information;
- f) Confidential Information disclosed by either Party to the other or by either Party to any other party used by such Party in the performance of the Agreement, shall be dealt with as "restricted" or shall be dealt with according to any other appropriate level of confidentiality relevant to the nature of the information concerned, agreed between the Parties concerned and stipulated in writing for such information in such cases;
- g) the Parties shall not make or permit to be made by any other person subject to their control, any public statements or issue press releases or disclose Confidential Information with regard to any matter related to the Agreement, unless written authorisation to do so has first been obtained from the Party first tracking such information;
- h) each Party shall be entitled to disclose such aspects of Confidential Information as may be relevant to one or more technically qualified employees or consultants of the Party who are required in the course of their futies to receive the Confidential Information for the Permitted Purpose provided that the employee or consultant concerned has a legitimate interest therein, and then only to the extent necessary for the Permitted Purpose, and is informed by the Party of the confidential nature of the Confidential Information and the obligations of the confidentiality to which such disclosure is subject and the Party shall ensure such exployees or consultants honour such obligations;
- each Party shall notify the other Party of the name of each person or entity to whom any consideratial Information has been disclosed as soon as practicable after such disclosure;
- j) each Party shall ensure that any person or entity to which it discloses Confidential Information shall observe and perform all of the covenants the Party has accepted in the Agreement as if such person or entity has signed the Agreement. The Party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be responsible for any breach of the provisions of the Agreement by the person or entity; and
- each Party may by written notice to the other Party specify which of the Party's employees,
 officers or agents are required to sign a non-disclosure undertaking.
- 16.2 The duties and obligations with regard to Confidential Information in this clause 16 shall not apply where:
 - a Party can demonstrate that such information is already in the public domain or becomes available to the public through no breach of the Agreement by that Party, or its Personnel;
 - was rightfully in a Party's possession prior to receipt from the other Party, as proven by the first-mentioned Party's written records, without an infringement of an obligation or duty of confidentiality; or

- c) can be proved to have been rightfully received by a Party from a third party without a breach of a duty or obligation of confidentiality; or
- d) is independently developed by a Party as proven by its written records.
- 16.3 This clause 16 shall survive termination for any reason of the Agreement and shall remain in force and effect from the Commencement Date of the Agreement and 5 [five] years after the termination of the Agreement. Upon termination of the Agreement, all documentation furnished to the Service Provider by Transnet pursuant to the Agreement shall be returned to Transnet including, without limitation all corporate identity equipment including dies, blocks, labels, advertising matter, printing matter and the like.

17 TOTAL OR PARTIAL FAILURE TO PERFORM THE SCOPE OF SERVICES

Should the Service Provider fail or neglect to execute the work or to deliver any portion of the Service, as required by the terms of the Agreement or Work Order, Transnet may cancel the Agreement or Work Order in so far as it relates to the unexecuted work or rejected portion of the Service, and, in such event, the provision of any remaining commitment shall remain subject it all respects to these conditions.

18 TERM AND TERMINATION

- 18.1 Notwithstanding the date of signature hereof, the Commencement Date if the Agreement is [•] and the duration shall be for a 12 [twelve] month period, expiring on [•], unless:
 - a) the Agreement is terminated by either Party in accordance with the provisions incorporated herein or in any schedules or annexures appended hereto, or otherwise in accordance with law or equity; or
 - b) the Agreement's extended at Transnet's option for a further period to be agreed by the Parties.
- 18.2 Either Party of terminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party where the other Party has committed a material Default and, where such Default is capable of remedy, has failed to remedy such Default within 30 [thirty] days of receiving notice specifying the Default and requiring its remedy.
- 18.3 Either Party may terminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party when the other Party is unable to pay its debts as they fall due or commits any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time], or if any action, application or proceeding is made with regard to it for:
 - a) a voluntary arrangement or composition or reconstruction of its debts;
 - b) its winding-up or dissolution;
 - the appointment of a liquidator, trustee, receiver, administrative receiver or similar officer;
 or
 - any similar action, application or proceeding in any jurisdiction to which it is subject.
- 18.4 Transnet may terminate the Agreement at any time within 2 [two] months of becoming aware of a change of control of the Service Provider by notice in writing to the Service Provider. For the purposes of this clause, "control" means the right to direct the affairs of a company whether by ownership of shares, membership of the board of directors, agreement or otherwise.

Respondent's Signature Date & Company Stamp

- 18.5 Transnet may cancel any schedule or Work Order hereto at any time on giving the Service Provider 30 [thirty] days' written notice.
- 18.6 Notwithstanding this clause 18, either Party may cancel the Agreement without cause by giving 30 [thirty] days prior written notice thereof to the other Party.

19 CONSEQUENCE OF TERMINATION

- 19.1 Termination in accordance with clause 18 [Term and Termination] shall not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which shall have accrued or shall thereafter accrue to either Party and all provisions which are to survive the Agreement or impliedly do so shall remain in force and in effect.
- 19.2 On termination of the Agreement or a Work Order, the Service Provider will immediately deliver up, and procure that its Personnel will immediately deliver up to Transnet, all Deliverables and property belonging to Transnet [or, in the event of termination of a Work Order, such as is relevant to that Work Order] which may be in the possession of, or under the control of the Service Provider, and certify to Transnet in writing that this has been done.
- 19.3 To the extent that any of the Deliverables and property referred to in clause 19.2 above are in electronic form and contained on non-detachable storage devices, the Service Provider will provide Transnet with unencrypted copies of the same on magnetic media and will irretrievably destroy and delete copies so held.
- 19.4 In the event that the Agreement is terminated by the Service Provider under clause 18.2 [Term and Termination], or in the event that a Work Order is terminated by Transnet under clause 18.5 [Term and Termination], transnet will pay to the Service Provider all outstanding Fees [apportioned on a provider basis] relating to the work undertaken by the Service Provider up until the date of such termination. Transnet will also pay the costs of any goods and materials ordered by the Service Provider in relation to the such work for which the Service Provider has paid or is legally obtained to pay, in which case, on delivery of such goods or materials, the Service Provider will promptly deliver such goods and materials to Transnet or as it may direct.
- 19.5 The provisions of clauses 0 [Definitions], 6 [Warranties], 12 [Intellectual Property Rights], 14 [Limitation of Liability], 16 [Confidentiality], 19 [Consequence of Termination], 25 [Dispute Resolution] and 29 [Governing Law] shall survive termination or expiry of the Agreement.
- 19.6 If either Party [the Defaulting Party] commits a material breach of the Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within 30 [thirty] Business Days of written notice thereof, the other Party [hereinafter the Aggrieved Party], shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which the Aggrieved Party may have for damages against the Defaulting Party.

19.7 Should:

- a) the Service Provider effect or attempt to effect a compromise or composition with its creditors; or
- b) either Party be provisionally or finally liquidated or placed under judicial management, whether provisionally or finally; or

 either Party cease or threaten to cease to carry on its normal line of business or default or threaten to default in the payment of its liabilities generally, or commit any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time];

then the other Party shall be entitled, but not obliged, to terminate the Agreement on written notice, in which event such termination shall be without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which either Party may have for damages against the other.

20 ASSIGNMENT

Neither Party may assign the benefit of the Agreement or any interest hereunder except with the prior written consent of the other. Further, in the event that Transnet wishes to assign or novate the Agreement to any third party, the Service Provider agrees that it shall not unreasonably withhold or delay its consent to such assignment or novation and that it shall only be entitled to recover from Transnet any reasonable legal costs incurred by it as a direct result of such assignment or novation.

21 FORCE MAJEURE

- 21.1 Neither Party shall have any claim against the other Party arising from any failure or delay in the performance of any obligation of either Party under the Agreement caused by an act of *force majeure* such as acts of God, fire, floot, war, strike, lockout, industrial dispute, government action, laws or regulations, riots, terrorism or civil disturbance, defaults, delays or discontinuance on the part of independent contractors, suppliers, or other circumstances or factors beyond the reasonable control of either Party, and to the extent that the performance of obligations of either Party hereunder is delayed by virtue of the aforegoing, any period stipulated for any such performance shall be reasonably extended.
- 21.2 Each Party will take an reasonable steps by whatever lawful means that are available, to resume full performance as soon as practicable and will seek agreement to modification of the relevant provisions of the Agreement in order to accommodate the new circumstances caused by the act of force majeure. If a Party fails to agree to such modifications proposed by the other Party within 90 [ninety] days of the act of force majeure first occurring, either Party may thereafter terminate the Agreement with immediate notice.

22 EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY

- 22.1 The Service Provider will not victimise, harass or discriminate against any employee of either Party to the Agreement or any applicant for employment with either Party to the Agreement due to their gender, race, disability, age, religious belief, sexual orientation or part-time status. This provision applies, but is not limited to employment, upgrading, work environment, demotion, transfer, recruitment, recruitment advertising, termination of employment, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training.
- 22.2 Both Parties to the Agreement undertake that they will not, and shall procure that its employees, agents and Subcontractors will not breach any applicable discrimination legislation and any amendments and re-enactments thereof.

23 NON-WAIVER

23.1 Failure or neglect by either Party, at any time, to enforce any of the provisions of the Agreement, shall not, in any manner, be construed to be a waiver of any of that Party's rights in that regard and in terms of the Agreement.

23.2 Such failure or neglect shall not, in any manner, affect the continued, unaltered validity of the Agreement, or prejudice the right of that Party to institute subsequent action.

24 PARTIAL INVALIDITY

If any provision of the Agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, or shall be required to be modified, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected thereby.

25 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

25.1 Should any dispute of whatsoever nature arise between the Parties concerning the Agreement, the Parties shall try to resolve the dispute by negotiation within 10 [ten] Business Days of such dispute arising.

25.2 If the dispute has not been resolved by such negotiation, either of the Parties may refer the dispute to AFSA and notify the other Party accordingly, which proceedings shall be held in Johannesburg.

25.3 Such dispute shall be finally resolved in accordance with the rules of AFSA by an arbitrator or arbitrators appointed by AFSA.

25.4 This clause constitutes an irrevocable consent by the Parties to any proceedings in terms hereof, and neither of the Parties shall be entitled to withdraw from the provisions of this clause or claim at any such proceedings that it is not bound by this clause 25.

25.5 This clause 75 is severable from the rest of the Agreement and shall remain in effect even if the Agreement's terminated for any reason.

25.6 This clause 25 shall not preclude either Party from seeking urgent relief in a court of appropriate jurisdiction, where grounds for urgency exist.

26 ADDRESSES FOR NOTICES

26.1 The Parties to the Agreement select the physical addresses and facsimile numbers, as detailed hereafter, as their respective addresses for giving or sending any notice provided for or required in terms of the Agreement, provided that either Party shall be entitled to substitute such other address or facsimile number, as may be, by written notice to the other:

27 WHOLE AND ONLY ATREEMENT

- 27.1 The Parties hereby confirm that the Agreement constitutes the whole and only agreement between them with regard to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 27.2 The Parties hereby confirm that the Agreement replaces all other agreements which exist or may have existed in any form whatever between them, with regard to the subject matter dealt with in the Agreement, including any annexures, appendices, schedules or Work Order(s) appended hereto.

28 AMENDMENT AND CHANGE CONTROL

- 28.1 Any requirement for an amendment or change to the Agreement or to a Work Order shall only be valid if it is in writing, signed by both Parties and added to the Agreement as an addendum hereto.
- 28.2 In the event the Parties cannot agree upon changes, the Parties shall in good faith seek to agree any proposed changes using the dispute resolution procedures in clause 25 [Dispute Resolution].

29 GOVERNING LAW

The Agreement is exclusively governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa and is subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa.

29.1 Change of Law

In the Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires, references to a statutory provision include references to that statutory provision as from time to time amended, extended or reenacted and any regulations made under it, provided that in the event that the amendment, extension or re-enactment of any statutory provision or introduction of any new statutory provision has a material impact on the obligations of either Party, the Parties will negotiate in good faith to agree such amendments to the Agreement as may be appropriate in the circumstances. If, within a reasonable period of time, the Service Provider and Transnet cannot reach agreement on the nature of the changes required or on modification of Fees, Deliverables, warranties, or other terms and conditions, either Party may seek to have the matter determined in accordance with clause 25 [Dispute Resolution] above.

30 COUNTERPARTS



Transnet aims to achieve the best value for money when buying or selling goods and obtaining services. This, however, must be done in an open and fair manner that supports and drives a competitive economy. Underpinning our process are several acts and policies that any supplier dealing with Transnet must understand and support.

These are:

- Section 217 of the Constitution the five pillars of Public PSCM (Procurement and Supply Chain Management): fair, equitable, transparent, competitive and cost effective;
- >> The Public Finance Management Act (PFMA).

- >> The Anti-Corruption Act.


This code of conduct has been compled to formally apprise Transnet Suppliers of Transnet expectations regarding behaviour and conduct of its suppliers.


Prohibition of Bribes, Kickbacks, Unlawful Payments, and Other Corrupt Practices

Transnet is in the process of transforming itself into a self-sustaining State Owned Enterprise, actively competing in the logistics industry. Our aim is to become a world class, profitable, logistics organisation. Assuch, our transformation is focused on adopting a performance culture and to adopt behaviours that will enable this transformation.

Transnet will not participate in corrupt practices. Therefore, it expects its suppliers to act in a similar manner.

>> Transnet and its employees will follow the laws of this country and keep accurate business records that reflect actual transactions with, and payments to, our suppliers.





Employees must not accept or request money or anything of value, directly or indirectly, from suppliers.

Employees may not recieve anything that is calculated to:


- Illegally influence their judgement or conduct or to influence the outcome of a sourcing activity;
- Win or retain business or to influence any act or decision of any person involved in sourcing decisions; gain an improper advantage.

Transnet is firmly committed there and competitive enterprise.


- » Suppliers are expected to comply with all applicable laws and regulations regarding fair competition and antitrust practices
- >> Transnet does not engage non-value adding agents or representatives solely for the purpose of increasing BBBEE spend (fronting).

Transnet's relationship with suppliers requires us to clearly define requirements, to exchange information and share mutual benefits.

>> Generally, suppliers have their own business standards and regulations. Although Transnet cannot control the actions of our suppliers, we will not tolerate any illegal activities.










These include, but are not limited to:

- Misrepresentation of their product (origin of manufacture, specifications, intellectual property rights, etc);
- Collusion:
- Failure to disclose accurate information required during the sourcing activity (ownership financial situation, BBBEE status, etc.);
- Corrupt activities listed above; and harassment, intimidation or other aggressive actions towards
 Transnet employees.
- Suppliers must be evaluated and approved before any materials, components, products or services are purchased from them. Rigorous due diligence must be conducted and the supplier is expected to participate in an honest and straight forward manner.
- » Suppliers must record and report facts accorded to honestly and objectively. Financial records must be accurate in all material respects.








Conflict of Interest
