2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a preference to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, respondents are to note the following:

- Functionality is included at a pre-qualification stage with a prescribed percentage threshold of **60 (Sixty points)**.
- Proposals will be evaluated on price which will be allocated 80 or 90 points and preference which will be allocated 20 or 10 points, dependent on the value of the Goods or Services.
- The 80/20 preference point system applies where the acquisition of the Goods or Services will be less than R1 000 000.00.
- If the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFQ will be cancelled.
- The 90/10 preference point system applies where acquisition of the Goods or Services will exceed R1 000 000.00
- If the 90/10 preference point system is stipulated and all Bids received are equal to or below R1 000 000.00, the RFQ will be cancelled.

- **In this RFQ, Transnet will use 80/20 preference point system prescribed in the PPPFA.**

In compliance with the Government Gazette No 34612, Notice No. 754 dated 23 September 2011, as from 1 October 2011 valid B-BBEE Verification Certificates must be issued by:

- (i) Verification Agencies accredited by the South African National Accreditation System [SANAS];
or
 - (ii) Registered Auditors approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA], in accordance with the approval granted by the Department of Trade and Industry.
- Enterprises will be rated by such agencies based on the following:

a) Large Enterprises [i.e. annual turnover greater than R35 million]:

Rating level based on all seven elements of the B-BBEE scorecard

b) Qualifying Small Enterprises – QSE [i.e. annual turnover between R5 million and R35 million]:

Rating based on any four of the elements of the B-BBEE scorecard

c) Exempted Micro Enterprises – EME [i.e. annual turnover less than R5 million]:

In accordance with B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice [Statement 000, Section 4], any enterprise with annual total revenue of R 5 million or less qualifies as an EME.

- Automatic rating of B-BBEE Level 4 irrespective of race or ownership
- Black ownership greater than 50% or Black Women ownership greater than 50% automatically qualify as B-BBEE Level 3

Sufficient evidence to qualify as an EME would be a certificate (which may be in the form of a letter) from an auditor or accounting officer or a certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS. The certificate must confirm the company's turnover, black ownership / black female ownership, B-BBEE status level and validity date.

Respondents are required to furnish proof of the above to Transnet. [i.e. a valid detailed scorecard as stipulated above in respect of Large Enterprises and QSEs, or a valid certificate in respect of EMEs].

Transnet will accordingly allocate a maximum of **10/20 [ten/twenty] points** in accordance with the **80/20** preference point system prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations to the Respondent's final score based on an entity's B-BBEE scorecard rating. [*Refer **Annexure A- B-BBEE Preference Points Claim Form** for further details*].

N.B. Failure to submit a B-BBEE certificate, which is valid as at the Closing Date of this RFP, will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

13 Evaluation Criteria

Transnet will utilise the following criteria [not necessarily in this order] in choosing a Supplier/Service Provider, if so required:

- **Administrative responsiveness (Phase 1)** - Completeness of response and returnable documents
- **Substantive responsiveness (Phase 2)** – Prequalification criteria, if any, must be met
- **Technical threshold of 60 % (Phase 2):** Compliance to specification / quality, previous performance, delivery lead-time

Weighted evaluation based on 80/20 preference point system (Phase 3)

The evaluation will have a 3 Phases approach.

Phase 1 will be an **Administrative Responsiveness** determining phase to proceed to phase 2 and those that comply, will progress to be competitively evaluated in phase 3.

Minimum criteria for progressing from phase 1 to phase 2 are detailed below: (Transnet will apply the following criteria; not necessarily in this order, phase 1 of the evaluation)

Pricing

- Pricing will be calculated using the lowest price quoted as the baseline, thus the lowest price quoted will achieve full marks, while all other quotes will achieve a weighted average mark based on the lowest price.
- Pricing and price basis [firm] - whilst not the sole factor for consideration, competitive pricing and overall level of unconditional discounts¹ will be critical

Transnet will utilise the following formula in its evaluation of Price:

$$PS = 80 \left(1 - \frac{Pt - Pmin}{Pmin} \right)$$

Where:

- Ps* = Score for the Bid under consideration
- Pt* = Price of Bid under consideration
- Pmin* = Price of lowest acceptable Bid

1. SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. SCOPE

The scope of work required by Ermelo Depot (Train Authorisation Systems) is the update and reprinting of station plans (books of circuits) for Blinkpan, Ogies-Saaiwater, Broodsneersplaas A, Broodsneersplaas B, Geluksplaas & Overvaal.

2. SPECIFICATIONS, STANDARDS & DRAWINGS

The TFR Project Supervisor or his appointed deputy will oversee all the work to ensure compliance to specifications and standards.

The contractor shall have the required certification for the updating and reprint of station plans.

3. DELIVERY DATE

The delivery date for the final batch of station plans (books of circuits) shall be no later than the 31st of March 2014.

4. BREAKDOWN STRUCTURE OF WORK

The following work needs to be done at places as indicated below:

The Contractor shall prepare separate schedules for the following material:

- 2 X A2 size books of circuits with hard and durable covers, per station.
- 1 X A3 size book of circuits, per station.
- Clearly mark the station name, in full on the printed book of circuits.
- 1 X DVD with updated book of circuits' information, per station.
- Upload the updated book of circuits' information to Project Wise.
- Unit rates and suppliers shall be stated for all material

7. KEY PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS

- The Contractor must confirm that a Signal Engineer, fully conversant with the current Signalling Engineering practices in South Africa is in on the Contractor's establishment and will be involved in the contract when required. The name and qualifications of the Signal Engineer at the date of submission of the tender must be stated by the Contractor.

- The Contractor's project manager for the project shall have experience in railway signalling and shall be fully conversant with the current Signalling Engineering practices in South Africa. The names and qualifications of the project manager, together with full details of his experience in this field of work, must be furnished.
- The Contractor shall have suitably qualified supervisors in charge of this project. The names and qualifications of the supervisors, together with full details of their experience in this field of work, must be furnished. All supervisory staff shall be in direct employment of either the Contractor or his sub-contractor, subject to the Contractor accepting full responsibility for the actions and neglect of the sub-contractor.
- The Contractor shall not change the project team as detailed in the organogram submitted by the Contractor and approved by the Project Manager without the prior written approval of the Project manager, which approval will not unreasonably be withheld.
- Failure to comply with clauses above will automatically disqualify the tenderer.
- The Contractor must note that any member of TFR's personnel associated with this project is responsible for inspection only and will not render any assistance, except at the instruction of the Supervisor.
- If a portion of the contract work covered by the specifications will be done on existing signalling assets, personnel of TFR will supervise such work. The prevention of faults on signalling and other circuits is essential.

8. SAFETY AND ACCESS

I. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- The wearing of specified personal protective equipment is compulsory while moving on or near railway lines or service roads.
- PPE requirements for signalling personnel are as follows:
 - Reflective vests: Required for all personnel in the vicinity of a railway line or service road. Not required when working inside a relay room.
 - Sturdy boots: Required for all personnel in the field except in the relay room.
 - Safety boots: Required for all personnel directly involved in the handling and installation of heavy equipment.
 - Hard hats: Required only when working close to overhead work.
 - Overalls: Required for all personnel directly involved in the handling and installation of heavy equipment and liquid, trenching and cable laying. Recommended for all installation personnel.

II. USE OF VEHICLES

- Vehicles and drivers on service roads shall comply with the relevant national and provincial acts and ordinances.
- The Contractor shall observe and comply with all the traffic signs, speed limits, etc. while on service roads.
- Vehicles head lights and tail lights shall be switched on at all times when moving on service roads. Note that parking lights are not adequate, the main head light shall be used (dim or bright, depending on circumstances and traffic).

III. HIGH VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

All works shall be carried out in terms of the E7/1 Specification.

- The attention of the Contractor is drawn to the possibility of "live" electrical overhead wires or underground cables existing in the area covered by this contract and the danger of coming in contact with such wires or piercing underground electrical cable, during excavations.
- When doing installations or working on existing signalling equipment in the vicinity of high voltage equipment, the Contractor must take the necessary precautionary measures to safeguard his personnel against injury. The Contractor must consider all equipment as "live", notwithstanding any safety measures introduced into the system to reduce induced stray voltages to a safe level.
- All personnel under the control of the Contractor must be made aware of the danger of "live" electrical wires and cables as well as induced stray voltages from AC electrification into signalling cables and equipment before a commencement is made with the work.
- During installation all safety measures prescribed by the Machinery and Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 associated with working on a project of this nature shall be adhered to and particular attention shall be given to the storage of inflammable materials and the use of naked flames or other fire hazard operations.
- Special care shall be exercised when welding or flame cutting operations occur and tenderers are required to provide suitable fire fighting equipment at close hand to these operations.
- For the application of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 the site and works shall be deemed to be under the Contractor's control for the duration of the contract and any subsequent maintenance period during which work is taking place. The Contractor shall be regarded as the employer and shall be responsible for ensuring that the requirements of the Act and the regulations are implemented on the work site.
- Where referred to "Machinery and Occupational Safety Act 1983 (Act 6 of 1983)" in any specification or condition, forming part of this tender/contract, it must be replaced by "Occupational Health and Safety Act 1993 (Act 85 of 1993)".
- The Contractor shall provide the necessary number of suitable first aid outfits, one set in the camp and one set at each working team. He shall maintain these outfits fully equipped at all times.

IV. HIGH VOLTAGE SWITCH GEAR ROOMS

- The Contractor and each member of his personnel who may be required to enter high voltage switch rooms for the purpose of attending to equipment in terms of this contract must: -
 - o Observe the security regulations regarding the entry of maintenance personnel into all buildings, sub- and tie-stations, control rooms and equipment sites accommodating equipment to be attended to by him, as well as Transnet's Safety Instructions: High Voltage Electrical Equipment. Failure to comply with these requirements will render the Contractor liable for the payment of penalties and/or direct or indirect cost resulting from such negligence. The regulations and instructions having been made available to the Contractor, it will be the Contractor's responsibility to make sure that his personnel are in possession of these instructions.
 - o Ensure that they are in possession of proper documents authorising them to enter high voltage switch rooms of Transnet.

- By virtue of the indemnities furnished in the "Conditions of Contract", the Contractor shall be deemed to have complied with the indemnification requirements stipulated in Transnet's Safety Instructions: High Voltage Electrical Equipment, regarding personnel requiring access to sub- and tie-stations and electricity supply switching stations for the specific purpose of the work covered by this contract.
- Whenever the Contractor or any member of his personnel enters a high voltage switch room belonging to Transnet he must: -
 - Notify the Electrical Control Office concerned by means of the electrical control selector telephone of his presence in the switch room and the reason therefore.
 - Enter the details of his visit and the reason therefore in the switch room logbook and sign it.
- When the Contractor or any member of his maintenance personnel is about to leave the switch room on completion of his duty he must: -
 - Notify the Electrical Control Office concerned that he has completed his duties and is leaving the switch room. He must also inform the Electrical Control Office of his intended movements after leaving the switch room.
 - Complete the entry in the switch room logbook.

V. ELECTRICAL CONTROL OFFICE

- Whenever the Contractor or any member of his personnel enters the Electrical Control Office he shall:-
 - o Identify himself to an Electrical Control Officer on duty and state the purpose of his visit;
 - o Request permission to take occupation of any equipment or portion thereof if necessary for the purpose of the contract;
 - o Request an Electrical Control Officer on duty to carry out such operations on the control panel as are necessary in respect of remaining control functions vested in the panel after occupation of any equipment is taken;
 - o Enter the details of his visit and the reason therefore in the Electrical Control Office logbook and sign the entry.
- When the Contractor or any member of his personnel is about to leave the Electrical Control Office on completion of his duty he shall:-
 - o Certify, in the Electrical Control Office logbook, whether the equipment is or is not in good working order and sign the entry
 - o Advise an Electrical Control Officer on duty of his intended movements after he leaves the Electrical Control Office.

VI. CENTRAL TRAFFIC CONTROL OFFICE (CTC), INCLUDING THE COMPUTER ROOM

- Whenever the Contractor or any member of his personnel enters the Central Traffic Control office or local Traffic Control office he shall:-

- o Identify himself to the Traffic Control Officer in charge and state the purpose of his visit;
 - o Request permission to take occupation of any equipment or portion thereof if necessary for the purpose of the contract;
 - o Request the Traffic Control Officer in charge to carry out such operations on the control panel or workstation as are necessary in respect of remaining control functions vested in the panel or workstation after occupation of any equipment is taken;
 - o Enter the details of his visit and the reason therefore in the Traffic Control Office logbook and sign the entry.
- When the Contractor or any member of his personnel is about to leave the Central Traffic Control office or local Traffic Control office on completion of his duty he shall:-
 - o Certify, in the Traffic Control Office logbook, whether the equipment is or is not in good working order and sign the entry;
 - o Advise the Traffic Control Officer in charge of his intended movements after he leaves the Central Traffic Control office or local Traffic Control office.

9. GENERAL

- The Contractor shall comply with all applicable legislation, regulations issued in terms thereof and Transnet Freight Rail's safety rules which shall be entirely at the Contractor's cost, and which shall be deemed to have been allowed for in the tendered rates and prices.
- In accordance with the safety case between TFR and the contractor, the Contractor shall, in particular, comply with the following Acts: -
 - o The Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act, No. 130 of 1993. The Contractor shall produce proof of his registration and good standing with the Compensation Commissioner in terms of the Act.
 - o The Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) as amended and Regulations issued in terms thereof or un-repealed regulations issued in terms of the former Act no. 6 of 1983, in their entirety. The Contractor is, in terms of section 37(2) of Act no. 85, deemed to be an employer in his own right with duties as prescribed in the said Act, and agrees to ensure that all work will be performed, and machinery and plant used, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises or the site or place of the works or on the works to be executed by him and under his control in terms of the contract. According to section 37(2) (Act 85 of 1993) the agreements in this contract and all documents attached or referred to, form an integral part of the arrangements and procedures mentioned in the aforementioned section.
 - o The Explosives Act No. 26 of 1956 (as amended): The Contractor shall, when applicable, furnish the Supervisor with copies of the permits authorising him or his employee to establish an explosives magazine on or near the site, and to undertake blasting operations in compliance with the Act.
- o In addition to compliance with clause 8.7.2 hereof, the Contractor shall report all accidents in writing to the Supervisor. Any accident resulting in the death of or injury to any person on the Works shall be reported within 24 hours of its occurrence, and any other accident shall be reported within 48 hours of its occurrence.

- o For the purpose of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) as amended and Regulations issued in terms thereof or unrepealed regulations issued in terms of the former Act no. 6 of 1983, the site/s, to be demarcated as agreed to between the Contractor and the Supervisor before the works start, will be transferred to the control of the Contractor for the duration of the contract work at each station.

- o Registration of the site with the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) must be done by the Contractor in consultation with the Project Manager or his authorised delegate on behalf of TFR.
- o Should the contractor occupy a site under the control of TFR, he shall not be responsible for the safe working method of TFR. The representative appointed by TFR from the Project Management Team on behalf of the TFR shall nevertheless attend all site safety meetings called for in terms of this Act.
- o The representative must hand in copies of the minutes of these meetings to TFR Projects. These meetings will be monitored and should action be required the necessary steps will be taken to rectify the problems.
- o Copies of the agreement between the Contractor as Employer and his employees, as envisaged by Section 37(2) of the Occupational Health And Safety Act No. 85 of 1993. (Act 85 of 1993) must be supplied by the successful tenderer before work commences.
- o The Contractor must provide a safety case as an agreement or promise by one party using or operating on the assets of the other party.

- o All clauses in this contract pertaining to health and safety form an integral part of this contract and if not complied with, may be construed as breach of contract entitling the Employer to the appropriate remedies.
- o Refer to Specification E.4E: Safety Arrangements and Procedural Compliance with the Occupational Health & Safety Act No 85 of 1993 bound into the tender document. Tenderers must allow in their tender rates and prices for adherence to the laid down procedure. Non-compliance with the procedure will be construed as a breach of contract.
- o The Contractor shall comply with the specification for Works on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines and near high voltage equipment -E7/1 (April 1994), if included in the contract. He shall also comply with all other safety rules, regulations and guidelines of Transnet applicable to the nature of Works carried out under the contract, and shall obtain the particulars thereof from the Supervisor.

10.ACCESS TO SITES AND BUILDINGS

The contractor will be accompanied by TFR personnel whenever he needs to visit any of the sites where the update of station plans (books of circuits) will be done. He shall be granted access only to these sites.

A Supplier/Service Provider shall be obliged to adhere to the Standard Terms and Conditions for the Supply of Goods and Services to Transnet as expressed hereunder. Should the Respondent find any condition(s) unacceptable, it should indicate which condition(s) is/are unacceptable and offer an alternative(s). A Quotation submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

1 SOLE AGREEMENT

Unless otherwise agreed in writing, these terms [Terms and each Term] and Transnet's purchase order(s) [Order or Orders] represent the only conditions upon which Transnet SOC Ltd [Transnet] procures goods [the Goods] or services [the Services] specified in the Order from the person to whom the Order is addressed [the Supplier/Service Provider]. Transnet does not accept any other conditions which the Supplier/Service Provider may specify, unless otherwise agreed to by Transnet in writing. In the event of any inconsistency between these Terms and any Order, these Terms shall take precedence.

2 CONFORMITY WITH ORDER

Goods/Services shall conform strictly with the Order. The Supplier/Service Provider shall not vary the quantities specified and/or the specification, if any, stipulated in the Order, without the prior written consent of Transnet. The Supplier/Service Provider warrants that the Goods/Services shall be fit for their purpose and of satisfactory quality.

3 DELIVERY AND TITLE

3.1 The delivery dates and addresses are those in the Order. Time shall be of the essence in respect of the Supplier's/Service Provider's obligations under the Order.

3.2 The Supplier/Service Provider will not be excused for delay in delivery or performance except due to circumstances outside its control and then only subject to the Supplier/Service Provider having notified Transnet in writing on becoming aware of such circumstances. Transnet may terminate an Order, in whole or in part, without incurring any liability to the Supplier/Service Provider if such a delay becomes, in Transnet's absolute opinion, significant.

4 PRICE AND PAYMENT

4.1 Prices specified in an Order cannot be increased. Any amounts due in terms of these Terms shall be paid to the Supplier/Service Provider, taking into account any deduction or set-off and bank charges.

5 PROPRIETARY RIGHTS LIABILITY

If any allegations should be made or any claim asserted against Transnet that ownership of, or any act or omission by Transnet in relation to Goods/Services or any written material provided to Transnet relating to any Goods/Services or pursuant to an Order being a violation or infringement of any third party's contractual, industrial, commercial or intellectual property rights including but not limited to any patent, registered design, design right, trade mark, copyright or service mark on any application thereof, the Supplier/Service Provider hereby indemnifies Transnet against and hold it harmless from any and all losses, liabilities, costs, claims, damages and expenses [including any legal fees] arising directly or indirectly from such allegation or claim provided that this indemnity shall not apply where the allegation or claim arises solely as a result of the Supplier/Service Provider following a design or process originated and furnished by Transnet. The Supplier/Service Provider shall either

- a) procure for Transnet the right to continue using the infringing Goods; or
- b) modify or replace the Goods/Services so that they become non-infringing,

provided that in both cases the Goods/Services shall continue to meet Transnet's requirements and any specifications stipulated in the Order. Should neither option be possible, the Supplier/Service Provider may remove, with Transnet's prior written consent, such Goods/Services and will pay to Transnet a sum equivalent to the purchase price. If Transnet refuses to give such consent, the Supplier/Service Provider shall have no liability in respect of any continued use of the infringing Goods/Services after Supplier's/Service Provider's prior written request to remove the same.

6 PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

All information which Transnet has divulged or may divulge to the Supplier/Service Provider and any information relating to Transnet's business which may have come into the Supplier's/Service Provider's possession whilst carrying out an Order, and the existence of the Order, shall be treated by the Supplier/Service Provider as confidential information and shall not, without Transnet's prior written consent, be disclosed to any third party, or be used or copied for any purposes other than to perform the Order. This clause does not apply to information which is public knowledge or available from other sources other than by breach of this Term. Upon request by Transnet, the Supplier/Service Provider shall return all materials issued pursuant to the Order and, pending this, shall protect Transnet's rights in any such materials. Such confidential information shall at all material times be the property of Transnet.

7 PUBLICITY

The Supplier/Service Provider shall not name Transnet or use its trademarks, service marks [whether registered or not] or Goods in connection with any publicity without Transnet's prior written consent.

8 TERMINATION OF ORDER

8.1 Transnet may cancel an Order in whole or in part at any time upon at least 7 [seven] days' written notice to the Supplier/Service Provider, or when there is a change in control of the Supplier/Service Provider or the Supplier/Service Provider commits any serious breach or any repeated or continued material breach of its

obligations under these Terms and/or Order or shall have been guilty of conduct tending to bring itself into disrepute, on written notice to the Supplier/Service Provider when such work on the Order shall stop.

- 8.2 Transnet shall pay the Supplier/Service Provider a fair and reasonable price for justified work in progress, where such price reflects only those costs not otherwise recoverable by the Supplier/Service Provider, at the time of termination, and the Supplier/Service Provider shall give Transnet full assistance to check the extent of such work in progress. Payment of such price shall be in full and final satisfaction of any claims arising out of such termination and upon such payment the Supplier/Service Provider shall deliver to Transnet all work, including any materials, completed or in progress. The sum payable to the Supplier/Service Provider under this clause will not in any event exceed the total amount that would have been payable to the Supplier/Service Provider had the Order not been terminated.

9 ACCESS

The Supplier/Service Provider shall ensure that any such personnel or agents, whilst on Transnet's premises, shall comply with Transnet's health and safety, security and system security rules and procedures as and where required.

10 WARRANTY

The Supplier/Service Provider warrants that it is competent to supply the Goods/Services in accordance with these Terms to the reasonable satisfaction of Transnet and that all Goods/Services delivered under the Order: (a) conform and comply in all relevant legislation, standards, directives and orders related to *[inter alia]* the Goods/Services in force at the time of delivery, and to any specifications referred to in the Order; (b) will not cause any deterioration in the functionality of any Transnet equipment; and (c) do not infringe any third party rights of any kind. The Supplier/Service Provider hereby indemnifies Transnet against all losses, liabilities, costs, claims, damages, expenses and awards of any kinds incurred or made against Transnet in connection with any breach of this warranty.

11 INSOLVENCY

If the Supplier/Service Provider shall have a receiver, manager, administrator, liquidator or like person appointed over all or any part of its assets or if the Supplier/Service Provider compounds with its creditors or passes a resolution for the winding up or administration of the Supplier/Service Provider, Transnet is at liberty to terminate the Order or Orders forthwith, or at its option, to seek performance by any such appointed person.

12 ASSIGNMENT

The Supplier/Service Provider shall not assign its obligations under an Order without Transnet's prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

13 NOTICES

Notices under these Terms shall be delivered by hand to the relevant addresses of the parties in the Order or may be served by facsimile or by email, in which event notice shall be deemed served on acknowledgement of receipt by the recipient.

14 LAW

Orders shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with South African law and any disputes arising herein shall be subject to South African arbitration under the rules of the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa, which rules are deemed incorporated by reference in this clause. The reference to arbitration shall not prevent Transnet referring the matter to any South African courts, having jurisdiction, to which the Supplier/Service Provider hereby irrevocably submits but without prejudice to Transnet's right to take proceedings against the Supplier/Service Provider in other jurisdictions and/or obtaining interim relief on an urgent basis from a court of competent jurisdiction pending the decision in other courts or from instituting in any court of competent jurisdiction any proceedings for an interdict or any other injunctive relief. If the Supplier/Service Provider does not have a registered office in the South Africa it will at all times maintain an agent for service of process in South Africa and shall give Transnet the name and address of such agent as such may be amended, in writing, from time to time.

15 GENERAL

Section 17: E4B – MINIMUM COMMUNAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

MINIMUM COMMUNAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS IN AREAS OUTSIDE THE JURISDICTION OF A LOCAL AUTHORITY: TEMPORARY FACILITIES FOR CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL

1. CAMPS

- 1.1 Prior to the erection of any camp, the Contractor shall submit to the Technical Officer, for his approval, details of his Quotations as to the site, water supply, sanitation, and size and type of buildings. Where the site is on private land, the Contractor shall submit the written approval for the use of the site of the relevant statutory authority and of the owner and occupier of the land (as applicable).
- 1.2 Camps must not be erected on land infested with field rodents.
- 1.3 Adequate drainage shall be provided to carry off storm and waste water.
- 1.4 Buildings shall be built to a neat and orderly pattern.
- 1.5 All buildings shall have smooth, hard, impervious floors, graded to provide effective drainage and to permit washing.
- 1.6 Camps shall be maintained by the Contractor at his own expense in a clean and tidy condition. The Contractor shall take such steps as the Technical Officer and landowner/occupier may demand to prevent the creation of a nuisance.
- 1.7 When so instructed by the Technical Officer, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, erect suitable screens between the camp and any public road, thoroughfare or railway line.
- 1.8 After removal of a camp, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, restore the site to its original condition to the satisfaction of the Technical Officer and of the landowner and occupier where the site is on private land.

2. HOUSING

- 2.1 Every living room shall have cross ventilation, both constant and occasional. Where only one window is provided, it shall not be in the same wall as the door.
- 2.2 Dimensions of living rooms shall be sufficient to allow 3.5 square metres of floor area and 11 cubic metres of air space for each person over the age of 10 years. The floor area of any living room shall not be less than 7,8 square metres.
- 2.3 Flat-roofed quarters shall have a minimum roof height of 3 metres above floor level. For quarters with pitched roofs, the wall height shall be not less than 2,6 metres above the floor with a minimum height above floor of 3 metres at the top of the pitch.
- 2.4 Doors shall not be less than 2m x 0,75m and must be halved.
- 2.5 Windows of each living room shall have an area not less than one twelfth of the floor area and shall be capable of opening to at least half their full area.
- 2.6 In areas where malaria is prevalent, doors and windows must be fitted with gauze screens.

2.7 Cooking shelters shall comprise roofed structures, three sides of which shall be enclosed by a weatherproof material, approved by the Technical Officer to a height of at least **1m** above ground level.

2.7.1 Sleeping quarters shall not accommodate more than 8 persons per room.

2.7.2 Pegboards shall be carried on metal or concrete supports and shall be separated by partitions not less than 0,4 metres high extending to within 150mm of the end of the bunk. Pegboards shall be removable for cleaning.

3. **WATER SUPPLY AND ABLUTION FACILITIES**

3.1 The Contractor shall ensure that an adequate and conveniently situated supply of potable water is provided.

3.2 Separate buildings for ablution facilities shall be provided. Where approval has been obtained for the housing of males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportion shall be 1 cubicle for 20 persons.

3.3 Waste water shall be hygienically disposed of.

4. **SANITATION**

4.1 Separate buildings for latrine facilities shall be provided. Where housing is provided for males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportions shall be at least one squatting seat for every 15 persons or less in the case of pit latrines, or one for every 10 persons or less in case of pail latrines.

Latrines shall be fly proof and sited at least 10 metres from any other building, and shall not face on any public road, thoroughfare, railway line or residential property. Pits shall not be less than 2,5 metres deep and sited not less than 120 metres from nearest underground water source.

4.2 Latrines shall be so constructed, situated and maintained, and night soil so disposed of as to prevent access by animals, breeding of flies, pollution of streams and domestic water supplies, and other nuisances. Where a night soil removal service is operated by a competent authority, use of such service shall be obligatory, and the use of pit latrines and atria pits will not be permitted.

4.3 At least one refuse bin of adequate size with close fitting lid shall be provided for each building. Refuse bins shall be emptied and cleaned out daily.

4.4 Labour shall be employed on camp sanitation duties on the following basis:-

4.4.1 Where the number of persons living at the camp is 20 or less - one unit.

4.4.2 For additional numbers over 20 living at the camp - one unit per 100 or part thereof.

4.5 Unless refuse is removed by a competent authority, it shall be disposed of in pits and covered over daily with a layer of earth or ash of sufficient thickness to prevent depredations by rodents and the breeding of flies.

- 4.6 Adequate measures shall be taken against all vermin and insects responsible for the spread of disease. Any instructions of a competent health authority shall be carried out promptly and implicitly.
- 4.7 Buildings and bedboards shall be treated whenever necessary with an approved insecticide.
- 4.8 The Contractor shall permit and facilitate inspection of the camp and structures on the site by the staff of Transnet or any other competent authority, and shall comply with any reasonable request by such staff or any other competent authority to eliminate any unsanitary condition.
- 4.9 Any outbreak of infectious disease shall immediately be reported telephonically and confirmed in writing to the Technical Officer.
- 4.10 The keeping of animals of any sort is not permitted.
- 4.11 The Contractor shall have on hand at the camp the necessary tools, disinfectants and cleaning materials to maintain and clean the sanitary facilities.

5. **RATIONS**

Rations, where supplied by the Contractor, shall be stored in a suitable and rodent proof building with sufficient shelving.

**Section 18: E4E – SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE
(ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS**

1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and Transnet Limited (hereinafter referred to as "Transnet") are individual employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and obligations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Safety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to complying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the omission of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 Transnet accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Technical Officer or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any discrepancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 In this Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -
- 2.2 The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "**Construction Work**", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with: -
- (a) the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
 - (b) the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;
 - (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or

- (d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work;
- 2.3 **"competent person"** in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed: Provided that where appropriate qualifications and training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;
- 2.4 **"Contractor"** means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **"fall protection plan"** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 **"health and safety file"** means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;
- 2.7 **"Health and Safety Plan "** means a documented plan which addresses the hazards identified and include safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 **"Risk Assessment"** means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard;
- 2.9 **"the Act"** means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993.

3. Procedural Compliance

- 3.1 The Contractor who intends to carry out any construction work shall, before carrying out such work, notify the Provincial Director in writing if the construction work:-
- (a) includes the demolition of a structure exceeding a height of 3 metres; or
 - (b) includes the use of explosives to perform construction work; or
 - (c) includes the dismantling of fixed plant at a height greater than 3m,
- and shall also notify the Provincial Director in writing when the construction work exceeds 30 days or will involve more than 300 person days of construction work and if the construction work:-
- (a) includes excavation work deeper than 1m; or
 - (b) includes working at a height greater than 3 metres above ground or a landing.
- 3.2 The notification to the Provincial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of the Construction Regulations, 2003, also shown in Annexure 1 of this Specification. The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the completed notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer or employee.
- 3.3 The Contractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety file.
- 3.4 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer.

- 3.5 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.
- 3.6 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.7 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Transnet's safety requirements and procedures.

4. Special Permits

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hot work, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Technical Officer or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

5. Health and Safety Programme

- 5.1 The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
- (i) the provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act;
 - (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and safety;
 - (iii) ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do or omit to do.
- 5.2 The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and safety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be

applied on the site and shall include at least the following:

- (a) The identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
- (b) the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
- (c) a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
- (d) a monitoring and review plan.

5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -

- (a) The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
- (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
- (c) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
- (d) the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented;
- (e) the arrangements in respect of communication of health and safety related matters and incidents between the Contractor, his employees, subcontractors and the Technical Officer with particular reference to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Administrative Regulation 8 of the Act and with the pertinent clause of the General Conditions of Contract forming part of the Contract and
- (f) the introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Safety Plan is maintained and monitored for the duration of the Contract.

5.4.1 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Technical Officer's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, in the Technical Officer's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Technical Officer or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.

5.5 The Contractor shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken, shall include periodic audits at intervals mutually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.

5.6 The Contractor shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.

- 5.7 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer, agent, subcontractor, employee, registered employee organisation, health and safety representative or any member of the health and safety committee.
- 5.8 The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.9 The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.10 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.11 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

6. Fall Protection Plan

- 6.1 In the event of the risk and hazard identification, as required in terms of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the contractor shall cause the designation of a competent person responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.2 The Contractor shall implement, maintain and monitor the fall protection plan for the duration of Contract. The Contractor shall also take such steps to ensure the continued adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.3 The fall protection plan shall include:-
- (a) A Risk Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
 - (b) the procedures and methods to address all the identified risks per location;
 - (c) the evaluation of the employees physical and psychological fitness necessary to work at elevated positions;
 - (d) the training of employees working from elevated positions; and
 - (e) the procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall protection equipment.

7. Hazards and Potential Hazardous Situations

The Contractor and the Technical Officer shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

8. Health and Safety File

- 8.1 The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Technical Officer, or subcontractor upon request.
- 8.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Technical Officer.
- 8.3 The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Technical Officer upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.

2.8 **"contract"** means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;

2.9 **"EME"** means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less;

2.10 **"firm price"** means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;

2.11 **"functionality"** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;

2.12 **"non-firm prices"** means all prices other than "firm prices";

Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.

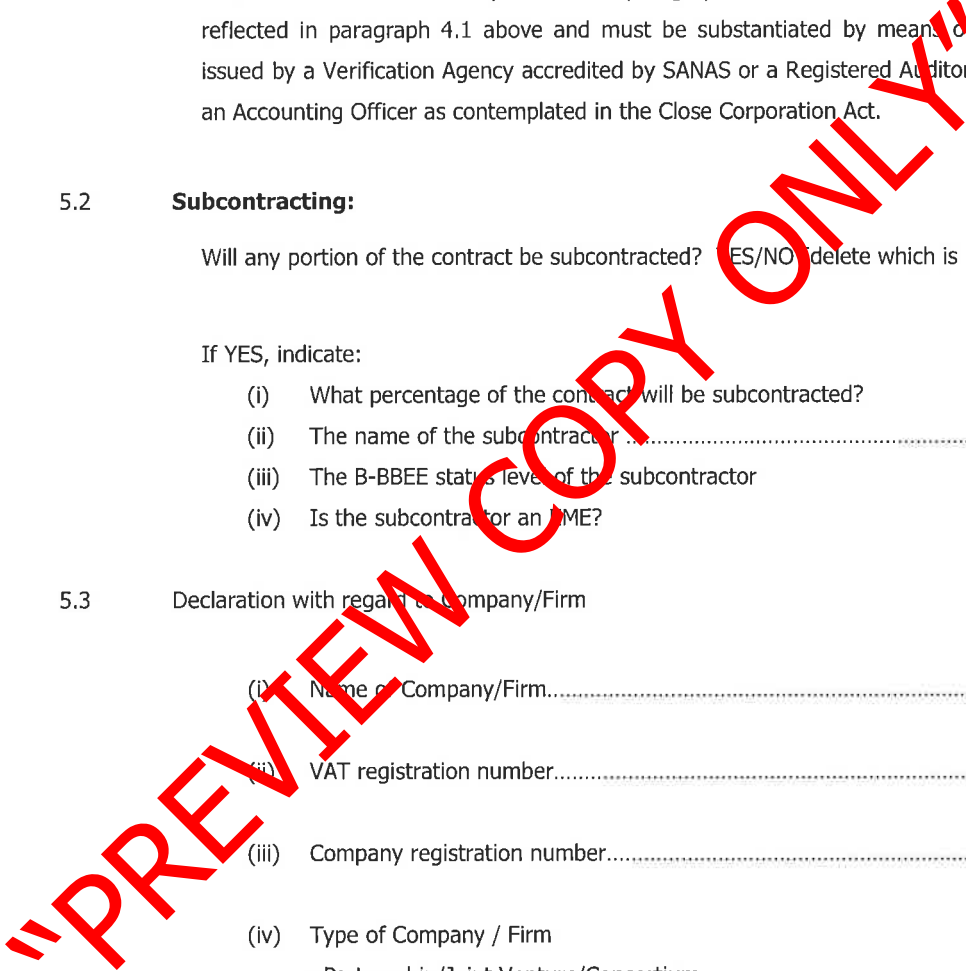

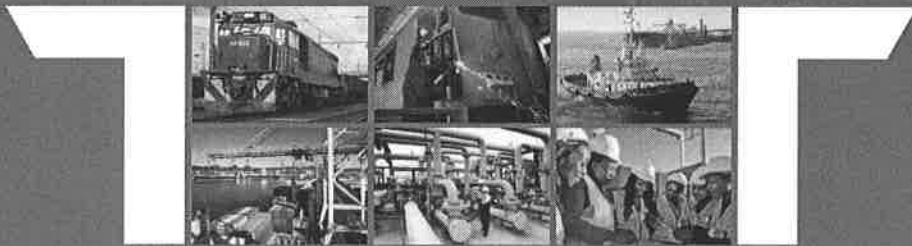

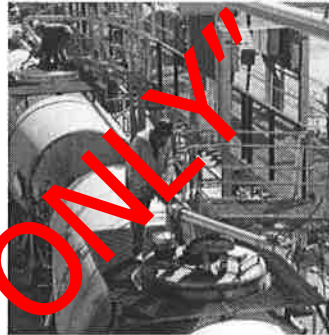
This code of conduct has been compiled to formally apprise Transnet Suppliers of Transnet's expectations regarding behaviour and conduct of its Suppliers.

Prohibition of Bribes, Kickbacks, Unlawful Payments, and Other Corrupt Practices

Transnet is in the process of transforming itself into a self-sustaining State Owned Enterprise, actively competing in the logistics industry. Our aim is to become a world class, profitable, logistics organisation. As such, our transformation is focused on adopting a performance culture and to adopt behaviours that will enable this transformation.

Transnet will not participate in corrupt practices. Therefore, it expects its suppliers to act in a similar manner.

- >> Transnet and its employees will follow the laws of this country and keep accurate business records that reflect actual transactions with, and payments to, our suppliers.



- >> Employees must not accept or request money or anything of value, directly or indirectly, from suppliers.

Employees may not receive anything that is calculated to:

- Illegally influence their judgement or conduct or to influence the outcome of a sourcing activity;
- Win or retain business or to influence any act or decision of any person involved in sourcing decisions; gain an improper advantage.

- >> Transnet does not engage non-value adding agents or representatives solely for the purpose of increasing BBBEE spend (fronting).

Transnet's relationship with suppliers requires us to clearly define requirements, to exchange information and share mutual benefits.

- >> Generally, suppliers have their own business standards and regulations. Although Transnet cannot control the actions of our suppliers, we will not tolerate any illegal activities.



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These include, but are not limited to:

- Misrepresentation of their product (origin of manufacture, specifications, intellectual property rights, etc);
 - Collusion;
 - Failure to disclose accurate information required during the sourcing activity (ownership financial situation, BBBEE status, etc.);
