2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-DEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Cove nment's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "prefere ce" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be available accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in term of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents reaconote the following:

- Functionally is included at a pre-qualification stage with a prescribed percentage threshold of **60** (**Sixty point**).
- Proposals will be evaluated on price which will be allocated 80 or 90 points and preference which will be allocated 20 or 10 points, dependent on the value of the Goods or Services.
- The 80/20 preference point system applies where the acquisition of the Goods or Services will be less than R1 000 000.00.
- If the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFQ will be cancelled.
- The 90/10 preference point system applies where acquisition of the Goods or Services will exceed R1 000 000.00
- If the 90/10 preference point system is stipulated and all Bids received are equal to or below R1 000 000.00, the RFQ will be cancelled.

In this RFQ, Transnet will use 80/20 preference point system prescribed in the PPPFA.

In compliance with the Government Gazette No 34612, Notice No. 754 dated 23 September 2011, as from 1 October 2011 valid B-BBEE Verification Certificates must be issued by:

- Verification Agencies accredited by the South African National Accreditation System [SANAS];
 or
- (ii) Registered Auditors approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA], in accordance with the approval granted by the Department of Trade and Industry.
- Enterprises will be rated by such agencies based on the following:

a) Large Enterprises [i.e. annual turnover greater than R35 million]:

Rating level based on all seven elements of the B-BBEE scorecard

b) Qualifying Small Enterprises — QSE [i.e. annual turnover between \$45 million and \$R35 million]:

Rating based on any four of the elements of the B-BBEE scorecard

c) Exempted Micro Enterprises – EME [i.e. annual turnover less man R5 million]:

In accordance with B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice [Statement of Section 4], any enterprise with annual total revenue of R 5 million or less qualifies as an EME.

- Automatic rating of B-BBEE Level 4 if respective of race or ownership
- Black ownership greater than 50% or shock Women ownership greater than 50% automatically qualify as B-BBEE Level 3

Sufficient evidence to qualify as an EME would be a certificate (which may be in the form of a letter) from an auditor or accounting officer or a certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS. The certificate must confirm the company's turnover, black ownership / black female ownership, B-BBEE status level and validity date.

Respondents are required to funish proof of the above to Transnet. [i.e. a valid detailed scorecard as stipulated above in respect of Large Enterprises and QSEs, or a valid certificate in respect of EMEs].

Transnet will accordingly allocate a maximum of **10/20** [ten/twenty] points in accordance with the **90/10** preference point system prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations to the Respondent's final score based on an entity's B-BBEE scorecard rating. [Refer <u>Annexure</u> <u>A-B-BBEE</u> reference Points Claim Form for further details].

N.B. Failure to submit a B-BBEE certificate, which is valid as at the Closing Date of this RFP, will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL & SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. Contract documents:

A formal contract will be entered with the successful tenderer.

2. This specification comprises parts with headings as indicated: -

The tenderers are required to check the number of pages and should any be found to be missing or in duplicate or the figures or writing to be indistinct or should there be any doubt or obscurity as to the meaning of any particular word or phrase or descriptions or should tendeders consider that any item is incorrectly or inadequately described they must inform the Manager, P.O. Box 36, Room 312, Cape Town at once in writing under reference and have the matter rectified or explained as the case may be as no liability whatsoever will be admitted by Transnet Freight Rail in respect of exposs in a tender due to the foregoing.

No alterations, erasures or additions of any kind shall be made by the tenderers in, from or to any part of this specification unless expressly required to be made by which notice and should any unauthorized alterations, erasures or additions be made they will not by recognized by Transnet Freight Rail.

3. Time to complete the work:

The following shall indicate in the Tender Form, the caration in calendar days that they will require to complete the works.

Failing completion of the work within the period as stipulated above or with any shorter period offered by the contenders and accepted by Transmit, the contractor shall pay to Transmet as penalty the sum as indicated in the specs every day or particle of during which the works remain incomplete.

The contractor shall be required to complete the works in this period, as stated in the E4 and approved. This period shall be inclusive of weekends, public holidays and statutory holiday periods.

4. <u>Manager:</u> Manager shall appoint a competent person as the Project Manager to undertake the Engineering duties.

5. Guarantee:

See specification

6 Inspection of works:

No work shall be covered up or put out of view without the approval of the Project Manager. The Contractor shall afford full opportunity for the Project Manager to examine and measure any work, which is about to be covered up or put out of view and to examine foundations before permanent work is placed thereon.

The Contractor shall give due notice to the Project Manager whenever any such work of formations is or are ready or about to be ready for examination. The Project Manager shall, without unreasonable delay, unless he considers it necessary and advises the Contractor accordingly, examine and or measuring such work as required.

The Contractor shall uncover any part or parts of the work or make openings in or through the same as the Project Manager may from time to time direct and shall reinstate and make good such part or parts to the satisfaction of the Project Manager. If any such part of parts have been covered up or put out of view after compliance with the requirements of Sub-Clause 9.1 of this Clause, and are found to be executed in accordance with the Contract, the expenses of uncovering, making openings in or through, reinstating and making good the same shall be borne by the Contractor.

7 Site records:

Site Diary

The Contractor shall provide a diary, in triplicate to record all day-to-day incidents that could occur during the contract period. This includes weather, name & number of workers on the site, material that has been delivered, material that has been loaded and disposed off, incidences that have occurred what work is to be done on that day, etc.

Site Instruction Book

The Contractor shall provide a site instruction book, in triplicate for the Project Manager to place all instructions that are needed to compliment the specifications and drawings and any other instruction that may affect the cost of the work.

No work will be recognized for additional payment unless it has been recorded and signed by the Project Manager in the aforesaid book.

Programmed & Planning of the work

The contractor shall provide to the Project Manager a detail plan of how he intends to do the work and this plan must be to the requirements of the operation of Transnet Freight Rail workshop with minor disruptions as no delays must be allowed in this regard.

The programme must be agreed to (in the site instruction book) before any work will be allowed to commence. The programme can be in a fort of a pert (bar) chart and will be used as a guide to measure progress of the work.

8 Water supply:

Water may be made available for the purpose of construction of the works only. The water shall be used conservatively and if not, this privilege shall be removed and the water shall be metered, and the cost of the metered water shall be bother of the Contractor as well as all charges as entertained by Transnet Freight Rail. The Contractor must supply all connections, hoses, etc., as necessary.

9. Electricity supply:

Electricity may be made available to the Contractor. The contractor must adhere to the safety standards as per the General Safety Recalations, Electrical Machine Regulations, Electrical Installation Regulations of the **Health and Safety Act**, (Act 85 of 1993) and SABS 0142.

10. Access to site:

The areas are restricted and the contractor must ensure he complies with the regulations of Transnet Freight Rail in every way. The Contractor and/or any sub-contractors shall be required to apply for permission to enter the restricted area in writing. A list of workmen shall be given to the Project Manager to arrange for the necessary permits. 48 Hours minimum notice is necessary for the processing these permits. This includes changes to staff during the contract period.

11. Materials found on site:

The Contractor shall not use on the works any materials found on the site without the prior written consent of the Project Manager. No material that is lying on the site (other then that from this contract) or on Transnet Freight Rail's property, may be removed (even if deemed as scrap) by the contractor.

12 Clearing of site:

The Contractor shall provide for cleaning up and sorting all rubbish and debris of whatever kind throughout the duration of the contract. Upon completion the Contractor shall clear away and remove all

rubbish, unused material, plant and debris and leave the site and the whole of the works clean and tidy to the satisfaction of the Project Manager.

13 Working outside normal working hours:

Normal working hours are between 07:30 and 16:00 Mondays to Fridays. If it is required to work outside the stated normal working hours the Contractor must obtain written permission at least 24 hours before such work needs to be undertaken. Transnet Freight Rail will not unreasonably withhold permission; however the Contractor may have to pay for Transnet Freight Rail's supervisory personnel.

Value Added Tax (VAT) shall be excluded in the Schedule of Rates and Prices Part C.

15. Escalation:

This contract does not make provision for compensation in respect of increased coats. The contenders must allow in his fixed price for any increased costs, which he may encounter during the contract period or such extended period as agreed upon by both parties.

16. Retention:

To protect Transnet Freight Rail in case of any defective work, Transnet Freight Rail reserves the right to retain up to ten (10) percent of the value of the contract, for a period of six months, (the maintenance period) or such further period beyond the maintenance period if defects have not yet been made good to the satisfaction of the Project Manager.

17 Payments:

Payments shall be made at an agreed date once a month only for work satisfactory completed, (minus retention money), and in accordance with the Schedule of Rates and Prices. This will be a part payment for the work completed on the date of measurement.

Suppliers shall be paid within 30 days of month encoatement. The Executive Manager, Procurement or his delegate shall approve any earn's settlement on condition that the settlement discount negotiated is better than the financing cost incurred by Transnet Freight Rail.

18. Safety precautions and Insurance

MINIMUM COMMUNAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS IN AREAS OUTSIDE THE JURISDICTION OF A LOCAL AUTHORITY: TEMPORARY FACILITIES FOR CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL

1. CAMPS

- 1.1 Prior to the erection of any camp, the Contractor shall submit to the echnical Officer, for his approval, details of his Quotations as to the site, water supply, sand tipe, and size and type of buildings. Where the site is on private land, the Contractor shall submit the witten approval for the use of the site of the relevant statutory authority and of the owner and occupier of the land (as applicable).
- 1.2 Camps must not be erected on land infested with field rodents.
- 1.3 Adequate drainage shall be provided to carry off storm and wass, water
- 1.4 Buildings shall be built to a neat and orderly pattern
- 1.5 All buildings shall have smooth, hard, impervious floors, graded to provide effective drainage and to permit washing.
- 1.6 Camps shall be maintained by the Contractor as his own expense in a clean and tidy condition. The Contractor shall take such steps as the Technical Officer and landowner/occupier may demand to prevent the creation of a nuisance.
- 1.7 When so instructed by the Technical Officer, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, erect suitable screens between the camp and any public road, thoroughfare or railway line.
- 1.8 After removal of a carre, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, restore the site to its original condition to the statisfaction of the Technical Officer and of the landowner and occupier where the site is on prival landom.

2. HOUSING

- 2.1 Every Ining from shall have cross ventilation, both constant and occasional. Where only one hind mic provided, it shall not be in the same wall as the door.
- 2.2 Imensions of living rooms shall be sufficient to allow 3.5 square metres of floor area and 11 cubic etres of air space for each person over the age of 10 years. The floor area of any living room shall not be less than 7,8 square metres.
- 2.3 Flat-roofed quarters shall have a minimum roof height of 3 metres above floor level. For quarters with pitched roofs, the wall height shall be not less than 2,6 metres above the floor with a minimum height above floor of 3 metres at the top of the pitch.
- 2.4 Doors shall not be less than $2m \times 0.75m$ and must be halved.
- 2.5 Windows of each living room shall have an area not less than one twelfth of the floor area and shall be capable of opening to at least half their full area.
- 2.6 In areas where malaria is prevalent, doors and windows must be fitted with gauze screens.

- 2.7 Cooking shelters shall comprise roofed structures, three sides of which shall be enclosed by a weatherproof material, approved by the Technical Officer to a height of at least 1m above ground level.
- 2.7.1 Sleeping quarters shall not accommodate more than 8 persons per room.
- 2.7.2 Pegboards shall be carried on metal or concrete supports and shall be separated by partitions not less than 0,4 metres high extending to within 150mm of the end of the bunk. Pegboards shall be removable for cleaning.

3. WATER SUPPLY AND ABLUTION FACILITIES

- 3.1 The Contractor shall ensure that an adequate and conveniently situated supply of potable water is provided.
- 3.2 Separate buildings for ablution facilities shall be provided. Where a sprewal has been obtained for the housing of males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportion shall be 1 cubicle for 20 persons.
- 3.3 Waste water shall be hygienically disposed of.

4. **SANITATION**

- 4.1 Separate buildings for latrine facilities shall be provided. Where housing is provided for males and females, separate facilities for each set shall be provided. The proportions shall be at least one squatting seat for every 15 persons or less in the case of pit latrines, or one for every 10 persons or less in case of pail latrines.
 - Latrines shall be fly proof and sted at least 10 metres from any other building, and shall not face on any public road, the objects e, railway line or residential property. Pits shall not be less than 2,5 metres deep and sted not less than 120 metres from nearest underground water source.
- 4.2 Latrines shall be a constructed, situated and maintained, and night soil so disposed of as to prevent access by animals, breeding of flies, pollution of streams and domestic water supplies, and other nuisances. Where a night soil removal service is operated by a competent authority, use of such services sall be obligatory, and the use of pit latrines and atria pits will not be permitted.
- 4.3 A least one refuse bin of adequate size with close fitting lid shall be provided for each building. efuse bins shall be emptied and cleaned out daily.
- bour shall be employed on camp sanitation duties on the following basis:-
 - 4.4.1 Where the number of persons living at the camp is 20 or less one unit.
 - 4.4.2 For additional numbers over 20 living at the camp one unit per 100 or part thereof.
- 4.5 Unless refuse is removed by a competent authority, it shall be disposed of in pits and covered over daily with a layer of earth or ash of sufficient thickness to prevent depredations by rodents and the breeding of flies.
- 4.6 Adequate measures shall be taken against all vermin and insects responsible for the spread of disease. Any instructions of a competent health authority shall be carried out promptly and implicitly.

- 4.7 Buildings and bedboards shall be treated whenever necessary with an approved insecticide.
- 4.8 The Contractor shall permit and facilitate inspection of the camp and structures on the site by the staff of Transnet or any other competent authority, and shall comply with any reasonable request by such staff or any other competent authority to eliminate any unsanitary condition.
- 4.9 Any outbreak of infectious disease shall immediately be reported telephonically and confirmed in writing to the Technical Officer.
- 4.10 The keeping of animals of any sort is not permitted.

4.11 The Contractor shall have on hand at the camp the necessary tools, distinctants and cleaning materials to maintain and clean the sanitary facilities.

5. **RATIONS**

Rations, where supplied by the Contractor, shall be stored in a subspice of building with sufficient shelving.

Section 18: E4E - SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and Transnet Limited (hereinafter referred to as "Transnet") are indicidual employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and obligations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and ender his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Safety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet, on the Site and place of work or the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to complying Jully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the omission of some of the provision on the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 Transnet accepts, in terms of the Act, its chigalions is an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the contractor and Technical Officer or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any discrepancies be ween any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 In this Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall note the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -
- 2.2 The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "Construction Work", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with: -
 - (a) the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
 - (b) the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;
 - (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or
 - (d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work;
- 2.3 **"competent person"** in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed: Provided that where appropriate

- qualifications and training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;
- 2,4 "Contractor" means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **"fall protection plan"** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 **"health and safety file"** means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;
- 2.7 **"Health and Safety Plan"** means a documented plan which addresses the hazard identified and include safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 "Risk Assessment" means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard;
- 2.9 "the Act" means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993

3. Procedural Compliance

- 3.1 The Contractor who intends to carry out any construction work shall, before carrying out such work, notify the Provincial Director in writing if the construction work:-
 - (a) includes the demolition of a structure xceeding a height of 3 metres; or
 - (b) includes the use of explosives to perform construction work; or
 - (c) includes the dismantling of fixed plant at a height greater than 3m,

and shall also notify the Provincial Director writing when the construction work exceeds 30 days or will involve more than 300 person days of construction work and if the construction work:-

- (a) includes excavition ork deeper than 1m; or
- (b) includes working at a height greater than 3 metres above ground or a landing.
- 3.2 The notification to the Provincial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of the Construction Regulations 2002, also shown in Annexure 1 of this Specification. The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the completed notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer or exployer.
- 3.3 The Contractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety file.
- 3.4 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer.
- In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.

- 3.6 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.7 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Transnet's safety requirements and procedures.

4. Special Permits

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hot work, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Technical office or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

5. Health and Safety Programme

- The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of:
 - (i) The provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act;
 - (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not the reby exposed to hazards to their health and safety;
 - (iii) ensuring, as far as is reconably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do domit to do.
- The Contractor's lead and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to be attended as affect of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:
 - (a) The identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
 - (b) the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
 - (c) a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;

- (d) a monitoring and review plan
- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -
 - (a) The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable:
 - (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
 - (c) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
 - (d) the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented;
 - the arrangements in respect of communication of health and raises, lated matters and incidents between the Contractor, his employees, subcontractors and he Sechnical Officer with particular reference to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Administrative Regulation 8 of the Act and with the pertinent clause of the General Conditions of Contract forming part of the Contract and
 - (f) the introduction of control measures for en uring that the Safety Plan is maintained and monitored for the duration of the Contract.
- 5.4.1 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Technical Officer's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and health need by the Contractor or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety closes be issued which, in the Technical Officer's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Technical Officer or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.
- 5.5 The Contractor analytical reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and pair ained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken, shall include periodic audits at interpolar autually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.
- 5.6 The contractor shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.
- 5.7 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer, agent, subcontractor, employee, registered employee organisation, health and safety representative or any member of the health and safety committee.
- 5.8 The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.

- 5.9 The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.10 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.11 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

6. Fall Protection Plan

- In the event of the risk and hazard identification, as required in terms of claus. 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the course stor shall cause the designation of a competent person, responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plat:
- The Contractor shall implement, maintain and monitor the fail protection plan for the duration of Contract.

 The Contractor shall also take such steps to ensure the contract adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.3 The fall protection plan shall include:-
 - (a) A Risk Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
 - (b) the procedures and methods to a dress all the identified risks per location;
 - (c) the evaluation of the employees bysica and psychological fitness necessary to work at elevated positions;
 - (d) the training of employees volving from elevated positions; and
 - (e) the procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall protection equipment.

7. Hazards and Potential Hazard us Situations

The Contractor and the Technical Officer shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous six tions which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

8. Heal in a d safety File

- 8.1 The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Technical Officer, or subcontractor upon request.
- 8.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Technical Officer.
- The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Technical Officer upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.

ANNEXURE A: B-BBEE PREFERENCE POINTS CLAIM FORM

This preference form contains general information and serves as a claim for preference points for Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [**B-BBEE**] Status Level of Contribution.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 A total of 20 preference points shall be awarded for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution.
- Failure on the part of a Bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System [SANAS] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA] or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Classical Contraction Act [CCA] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBE. Status Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- 1.3 Transnet reserves the right to require of a Bidder, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in cond to preferences, in any manner required by Transnet.

2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 "all applicable taxes" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and sixts development levies;
- 2.2 **"B-BBEE"** means bload-bleed black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.3 "B-BBEE states of contributor" means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its over all performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Encowerment Act;
- 2.4 **"Bid"** means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by Transnet for the provision of goods, works or services;
- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 [Act No. 53 of 2003];
- 2.6 **"comparative price"** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration:
- 2.7 **"consortium or joint venture"** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less;

- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 **"functionality"** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juristic person:
- 2.14 "**rand value**" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.15 "subcontract" means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor and execution of part of a project in terms of the contract:
- 2.16 "total revenue" bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in the Government of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.17 "trust" means the arrangement brough which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer subgroperty for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.18 **"trustee"** means any person including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be a ministered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The Bidder obtaining the highest number of total points for the evaluation criteria as enumerated in Section 2 of the NEW II be awarded the contract, unless objective criteria justifies the award to another bidder.
- 3.2 Preference joints shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account an factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.
- 3.3 Noine scored will be rounded off to 2 [two] decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION

4.1 In terms of Regulation 5(2) and 6(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011, preference points shall be awarded to a Bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below

- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CGA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.4 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy there of, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 4.5 A trust, consortium or join wenture will qualify for points for its B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits its B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 4.6 A trust, consocium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorpora ed exity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were agree structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 4.7 Fertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialised scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 4.8 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the Bid documents that such a Bidder intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the same number of points that such a Bidder qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- 4.9 A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.

1 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in this Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 1.1 Bid shall mean a Respondent's tendered response / proposal to a Transnet RFP or RFO;
- 1.2 Bid Document(s) shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- 1.3 Day shall mean any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday;
- 1.4 Respondent(s) shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Bid Document;
- 1.5 RFP shall mean Request for Proposal;
- 1.6 RFQ shall mean Request for Quotation;
- 1.7 RFX shall mean RFP or RFQ, as the case may be;
- 1.8 Services shall mean the services required by Transnet as speciment; its Bid Document;
- 1.9 Service Provider shall mean the successful Respondent
- **1.10 Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as required by **Section** 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time
- 1.11 Transnet shall mean Transnet SOC Ltd, a Star Owned Company; and
- **1.12 VAT** shall mean Value-Added Tax in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

2 GENERAL

All Bid Documents and subsequent contracts and orders shall be subject to the following general conditions as laid down by Translet and are to be strictly adhered to by any Respondent to this RFX.

3 SUBMISSION OF BILL OF CUMENTS

- A Bid, which shall be chosing date and time specified in accordance with the directions issued in the Bid Focuments. Late Bids will not be considered.
- 3.2 shall be delivered in a sealed envelope in accordance with the instructions indicated in the lid boccoments with the Bid number and subject marked on the front of the envelope.
- The Respondent's return address must be stated on the reverse side of the sealed envelope.

4 USE OF BID FORMS

- **4.1** Where special forms are issued by Transnet for the submission of Bids, Respondents are required to submit their Bids by completion of the appropriate sections on such official forms and not in other forms or documents bearing their own terms and conditions of contract. Non-compliance with this condition may result in the rejection of a Bid.
- **4.2** Respondents must note that the original Bid forms must be completed for submission and not a reprocessed copy thereof.
- 4.3 Only if insufficient space has been allocated for a particular response may a Respondent submit additional information under separate cover using its company's letterhead. This must be duly cross-referenced in the RFX.

5 BID FEES

- **5.1** A non-refundable fee may be charged for Bid Documents, depending on the administrative cost of preparing and issuing such Bid Documents.
- **5.2** Only Respondents that have paid the Bid fee and provided proof of payment when submitting their Bid will be considered.

6 VALIDITY PERIOD

- **6.1** Respondents must hold their Bid valid for acceptance by Transnet at any time within the requested validity period after the closing date of the RFX.
- Respondents may be requested to extend their validity period for a partified additional period.

 In such instances, Respondents will not be allowed to change any aspect of their Bid, unless they are able to demonstrate that the proposed change(s) is as a direct and unavoidable consequence of Transnet's extension of the validity period.

7 SITE VISIT / BRIEFING SESSION

Respondents may be requested to attend (i) a site visit where it is considered necessary to view the site prior to the preparation of Bids, or (ii) an RFX briefing session when Transnet deems it necessary to provide Respondents with additional information relevant to the compilation of their Bids. When such visits or sessions are indicated as compulsor in the bid Document, Respondents are obliged to attend these meetings as failure to do so will result in their disqualification.

8 CLARIFICATION BEFORE THE CLOSING ATE

Should clarification be required on any aspect of the RFX before the closing date, the Respondent must direct such queries to the contact person identified in the Bid Document.

9 COMMUNICATION AND R THE CLOSING DATE

After the closing data of a Bid [i.e. during the evaluation period] the Respondent may only communicate with the Secretary of the relevant Acquisition Council.

10 UNAUTHOR SEP COMMUNICATION ABOUT BIDS

Where Nick are submitted to the Secretary of an Acquisition Council, Respondents may at any time communication with the Secretary on any matter relating to its Bid but, in the absence of written authority from the Secretary, no communication on a question affecting the subject of a Bid shall take place between Respondents or other potential service providers or any member of the Acquisition Council or official of Transnet during the period between the closing date for the receipt of the Bid and the date of the notification of the successful Respondent(s). A Bid, in respect of which any such unauthorised communication has occurred, could be disqualified.

11 RETURNABLE DOCUMENTS

All returnable documents listed in the RFX Documents must be submitted with Respondent's Bid. Failure to submit mandatory returnable schedules / documents will result in disqualification. Failure to submit other schedules / documents may result in disqualification.

12 DEFAULTS BY RESPONDENTS

- **12.1** If the Respondent, after it has been notified of the acceptance of its Bid fails to:
 - a) enter into a formal contract when called upon to do so within such period as Transnet may specify; or
 - b) accept an order in terms of the Bid;
 - c) furnish satisfactory security when called upon to do so for the fulfilment of the contract; or
 - d) comply with any condition imposed by Transnet,

Transnet may, in any such case, without prejudice to any other legal remedy which it may have, proceed to accept any other Bid or, if it is necessary to do so, call for a sis afresh, and may recover from the defaulting Respondent any additional expense included by Transnet in calling for new offers or in accepting a less favourable offer.

- **12.2** If any Respondent, who has submitted a Bid and or canceded a contract with Transnet [hereinafter referred to as the **Service Provider**], or in the lapacity of agent or subcontractor who has been associated with such Bid or contract:
 - a) has withdrawn such Bid after the advertised late and hour for the receipt of Bids; or
 - b) has, after having been notified of the acceptance of its Bid, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the Bid Documents; or
 - c) has carried out any contract resulting from such Bid in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of such contract; or
 - d) has offered, provised or given a bribe in relation to the obtaining or the execution of such contract; or
 - e) has acced to a friudulent or improper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any government department or towards any public body, company or person; or
 - f) has made any misleading or incorrect statement either
 - in the affidavit or certificate referred to in clause 18 [Notice to Unsuccessful Respondents]; or
 - (ii) in any other document submitted as part of its Bid submission

and is unable to prove to the satisfaction of Transnet that

it made the statement in good faith honestly believing it to be correct; and before making such statement, it took all reasonable steps to satisfy itself of its correctness; or

- g) caused Transnet damage, or to incur costs in order to meet the Service Provider's requirements which could not be recovered from the Service Provider;
- h) has litigated against Transnet in bad faith;
- has been found guilty by a court of law, tribunal or other administrative body of a serious breach of any law, during the preceding 5 [five] years;

 j) has been included as a company or person prohibited from doing business with the public sector on National Treasury's database of Restricted Suppliers or Register of Bid Defaulters;

then a Bid from any such Respondent shall be disqualified and the person, enterprise or company [including any directors] shall, subject to clause 12.3 below, be disqualified from bidding for any Transnet business through its "blacklisting" process.

- **12.3** Any person or enterprise or company against whom a decision to blacklist has been taken, may make representations to the Chief Financial Officer of Transnet SOC Ltd, whose decision shall be final.
- **12.4** Any disqualification [**Blacklisting**] imposed upon any person or enterprise or company, may also apply to any other enterprise under the same or different names of disqualified persons or enterprise or company [or associates thereof] and may also be applied to any agent or employee of the person or enterprise or company concerned.

13 CURRENCY

All monetary amounts referred to in a Bid response must be in Rand, the currency of the Republic of South Africa [ZAR], save to the extent specifically permitted at the RFX.

14 PRICES SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION

- **14.1** Prices which are quoted subject tecco firmation will not be considered.
- **14.2** Firm prices quoted for the turation of any resulting order and/or contract will receive precedence over prices which are subject to fluctuation if this is in Transnet's best interests.

15 ALTERATIONS MADE BY THE RESPONDENT TO BID PRICES

All alterations made by the Pospondent to its Bid price(s) prior to the submission of its Bid Documents must be done by delating the incorrect figures and words where required and by inserting the correct figures and words against to items concerned. All such alterations must be initialled by the person who signs the Bid Documents. Failure to observe this requirement may result in the particular item(s) concerned before excluded in the matter of the award of the business.

16 EXCHANGE AND REMITTANCE

- The Respondent should note that where the whole or a portion of the contract or order value is to be remitted overseas, Transnet shall, if requested to do so by the Service Provider, effect payment overseas directly to the foreign principal of such percentage of the contract or order value as may be stipulated by the Respondent in its Bid Documents.
- 16.2 It is Transnet's preference to enter into Rand-based agreements. Transnet would request, therefore, that the Respondent give favourable consideration to obtaining forward exchange cover on the foreign currency portion of the Agreement at a cost that is acceptable to Transnet to protect itself against any currency rate fluctuation risks for the duration of any resulting contract or order.

- **16.3** The Respondent who desires to avail itself of the aforementioned facility must at the time of bidding furnish the information called for in the *Exchange and Remittance* section of the Bid Documents and also furnish full details of the principals to whom payment is to be made.
- **16.4** The South African Reserve Bank's approval is required before any foreign currency payments can be made to or on behalf of Respondents.
- **16.5** Transnet will not recognise any claim for adjustment of the order and/or contract price if the increase in price arises after the date on which agreement on an overall Rand contract has been reached.
- 16.6 Transnet reserves the right to request a pro-forma invoice/tax invoice in order to ensure compliance with the contract and Value-Added Tax Act no. 89 of 1991 [... Act].

17 ACCEPTANCE OF BID

- 17.1 Transnet does not bind itself to accept the lowest priced or any Bio.
- 17.2 Transnet reserves the right to accept any Bid in whole or in part.
- 17.3 Upon the acceptance of a Bid by Transnet, the parties shall be bound by these General Bid Conditions and any contractual terms and/or any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.
- **17.4** Where the Respondent has been inframed by Transnet per fax message or email of the acceptance of its Bid, the acknowled ement of receipt transmitted shall be regarded as proof of delivery to the Respondent.

18 NOTICE TO UNSUCCESSFUL RESPONDENTS

Unsuccessful Respondents shall be a local in writing that their Bids have not been accepted as soon as possible after the closing date with Bid. On award of business to the successful Respondent all unsuccessful Respondents shall be informed of the name of the successful Respondent and of the reason as to why their Bids have not been successful.

19 TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- 19.1 The Sovice rovider shall adhere to the Terms and Conditions of Contract issued with the Bid Documents, together with any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the 3id Documents.
- Should the Respondent find any conditions unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer amendments/ alternatives by written submission on its company letterhead. Any such submission shall be subject to review by Transnet's Legal Counsel who shall determine whether the proposed amendments/ alternative(s) are acceptable or otherwise, as the case may be.

20 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- **20.1** The contract documents will comprise these General Bid Conditions, the Terms and Conditions of Contract and any schedule of "Special Conditions" which form part of the Bid Documents.
- **20.2** The abovementioned documents together with the Respondent's Bid response will constitute the contract between the parties upon receipt by the Respondent of Transnet's letter of award /

- intent, subject to all additional amendments and/or special conditions thereto as agreed to by the parties.
- **20.3** Should Transnet inform the Respondent that a formal contract will be signed, the abovementioned documents together with the Respondent's Bid response [and, if any, its covering letter and any subsequent exchange of correspondence] as well as Transnet's Letter of Acceptance/Intent, shall constitute a binding contract until the final contract is signed.

21 LAW GOVERNING CONTRACT

The law of the Republic of South Africa shall govern the contract created by the acceptance of a Bid. The domicilium citandi et executandi shall be a place in the Republic of South Africa to be specified by the Respondent in its Bid at which all legal documents may be served on the Respondent who shall agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa. A foleign Respondent shall, therefore, state in its Bid the name of its authorised representative of the Republic of South Africa who is empowered to sign any contract which may be entered into in the crem of its Bid being accepted and to act on its behalf in all matters relating to the contract.

22 IDENTIFICATION

If the Respondent is a company, the full names of the directors shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a close corporation, the full names is the members shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a partnership or an individual trading under a trade name, the full names of the partners or of such individual, as the case may be shall be tarnished.

23 CONTRACTUAL SECURITIES

- 23.1 The successful Responding, when called upon to do so, shall provide security to the satisfaction of Transnet for the due of the ment of a contract or order. Such security shall be in the form of an advanced payment guarantee [APG] and/or a performance bond [Performance Bond], as the case may ke, to be ternished by an approved bank, building society, insurance or guarantee corporation carrying on business in South Africa.
- 23.2 The secretity may be applied in whole or part at the discretion of Transnet to make good any or tag age which Transnet may incur in consequence of a breach of the contract or any archive of.
- Such security, if required, shall be an amount which will be stipulated in the Bid Documents.
- 23.4 The successful Respondent shall be required to submit to Transnet or Transnet's designated official the specified security document(s) within 30 [thirty] Days from the date of signature of the contract. Failure to return the securities within the prescribed time shall, save where prior extension has been granted, entitle Transnet without notice to the Service Provider to cancel the contract with immediate effect.
- 23.5 Additional costs incurred by Transnet necessitated by reason of default on the part of the Service Provider in relation to the conditions of this clause 23 will be for the account of the Service Provider.

24 DELETION OF ITEMS TO BE EXCLUDED FROM BID

The Respondent must delete items for which it does not wish to tender.

25 VALUE-ADDED TAX

25.1 In respect of local Services, i.e. Services to be rendered in the Republic of South Africa, the prices quoted by the Respondent are to be exclusive of VAT which must be shown separately at the standard rate on the Tax Invoice.

25.2 In respect of foreign Services rendered:

- a) the invoicing by a South African Service Provider on behalf of its foreign principal rendering such Service represents a Service rendered by the principal; and
- b) the Service Provider's Tax Invoice(s) for the local portion only [i.e. he "commission" for the Services rendered locally] must show the VAT separately.

26 IMPORTANT NOTICE TO RESPONDENTS REGARDING PAYMENT

26.1 Method of Payment

- a) The attention of the Respondent is directed to the forms and Conditions of Contract which set out the conditions of payment on which Bid price(s) shall be based.
- b) However, in addition to the aforegoing the Respondent is invited to submit offers based on alternative methods of payment and/or mancing proposals.

Incomplete and/or incorrect Tax Invoices shall be returned and the conditional discount period will be recalculated from the date of receipt of the correct documentation.

27 DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

27.1 Period Contracts

It will be a condition of any resulting contract/order that the delivery period embodied therein will be governed by the provisions of the Terms and Conditions of Contract.

27.2 Progress Reports

If it is unable to meet the desired critical delivery period, Transnet reserves the right to purchase such services as may be required to meet the emergency outside the contract if immediate delivery can be offered from any other source. The "Total or Partial Failure to Perform the Scope of Services" section in the Terms and Conditions of Contract will not be applicable in these circumstances.

28 SPECIFICATIONS AND COPYRIGHT

28.1 Specifications

The Respondent should note that, unless notified to the contieve by Tansnet or a designated official by means of an official amendment to the Bid Documers, the required to tender for the Services strictly in accordance with the specifications supplied by Pansnet.

29 BIDS BY OR ON BEHALF OF FOREIGN RESPONDENTS

- **29.1** Bids submitted by foreign principals may be forwarded directly by the principals or by its South African representative or agent to the Secretary of the Acquisition Council or to a designated official of Transnet accessing to whichever officer is specified in the Bid Documents.

When an Agreement is entered into between Transnet SOC Ltd [**Transnet**] and the appointed supplier of Services to Transnet [**the Service Provider**], these Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract, the technical specifications for the Services, a Work Order including such special conditions as may be applicable, and any terms in the associated Bid Documents, exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet.

2 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in the Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clean, require otherwise:

- 2.1 AFSA means the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa;
- **2.2 Agreement** means the Agreement and its associated scredules and/or annexures and/or appendices, including the Work Order(s), specification. For the Services and such special conditions as shall apply to the Agreement, together with the General Tender Conditions and any additional provisions in the associated bid documents undered by the Service Provider [as agreed in writing between the Parties], which collectively and exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet;
- **2.3 Background Intellectual P opers**, means all Intellectual Property introduced and required by either Party to give effect to their obligations under the Agreement owned in whole or in part by or licensed to either Party or their affiliates prior to the Commencement Date or developed after the Commencement Vate therwise pursuant to the Agreement;
- **2.4 Business Day** (s) meets Mondays to Fridays between 07:30 and 16:00, excluding public holidays as proclaimed in South Africa;
- **2.5 Commenter** emeats **Date** means [●], notwithstanding the signature date of the Agreement;
- **2.6 Copyridencia: Information** means any information or other data, whether in written, oral, graphic or in any other form such as in documents, papers, memoranda, correspondence, potebooks, eports, drawings, diagrams, discs, articles, samples, test results, prototypes, designs, Mana formulae, patents, or inventor's certificates, which a Party discloses or provides to the other carty [intentionally or unintentionally, or as a result of one Party permitting the representative of the other Party to visit any of its premises], or which otherwise becomes known to a Party, and which is not in the public domain and includes, without limiting the generality of the term:
- a) information relating to methods of operation, data and plans of the disclosing Party;
- b) the contents of the Agreement;

c)private and personal details of employees or clients of the disclosing Party or any other person where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;

- d) any information disclosed by either Party and which is clearly marked as being confidential or secret;
- e) information relating to the strategic objectives and planning of the disclosing Party relating to its existing and planned future business activities;

- f) information relating to the past, present and future research and development of the disclosing Party;
- g) information relating to the business activities, business relationships, products, services, customers, clients and Subcontractors of the disclosing Party where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
- h) information contained in the software and associated material and documentation belonging to the disclosing Party;
- i) technical and scientific information, Know-How and trade secrets of a disclosing Party including inventions, applications and processes;
- j) Copyright works;
- k) commercial, financial and marketing information;
- I) data concerning architecture, demonstrations, tools and techniques, processes, machinery and equipment of the disclosing Party;
- m) plans, designs, concepts, drawings, functional and teannist requirements and specifications of the disclosing Party;
- n) information concerning faults or defects in goods, equipment, hardware or software or the incidence of such faults or defects; and
- o) information concerning the charges, her and / or costs of the disclosing Party or its authorised Subcontractors, or their methods, fractions or service performance levels actually achieved;
 - **2.7 Copyright** means the right in expressions, procedures, methods of operations or mathematical concepts, computer program codes, compilations of data or other material, literary works, musical works, artistic works, sound recordings, broadcasts, program carrying signals, published editions, photographs works, or cinematographic works of the copyright owner to do or to authorise the doing or religin acts specified in respect of the different categories of works;
 - **2.8 Default** means any breach of the obligations of either Party [including but not limited to fundamental creach or breach of a fundamental term] or any Default, act, omission, negligence or statement of either Party, its employees, agents or Subcontractors in connection with or in relation to the Subject of the Agreement and in respect of which such Party is liable to the other;
 - 2. Celiverable(s) means any and all works of authorship, products and materials developed, within, prepared, assembled, integrated, modified or provided by the Service Provider in relation to the Services;
 - **Designs** mean registered Designs and/or Design applications and will include the monopoly right granted for the protection of an independently created industrial design including designs dictated essentially by technical or functional considerations as well as topographies of integrated circuits and integrated circuits;
 - **2.11 Fee(s)** shall mean the agreed Fees for the Services to be purchased from the Service Provider by Transnet, as detailed in the Work Order(s), issued in accordance with the Agreement, as amended by mutual agreement between the Parties and in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement from time to time;
 - **2.12 Foreground Intellectual Property** means all Intellectual Property developed by either Party pursuant to the Agreement;

- **2.13 Intellectual Property** means Patents, Designs, Know-How, Copyright and Trade Marks and all rights having equivalent or similar effect which may exist anywhere in the world and includes all future additions and improvements to the Intellectual Property;
- **2.14 Know-How** means all Confidential Information of whatever nature relating to the Intellectual Property and its exploitation as well as all other Confidential Information generally relating to Transnet's field of technology, including technical information, processing or manufacturing techniques, Designs, specifications, formulae, systems, processes, information concerning materials and marketing and business information in general;
- **2.15 Materials** means the Deliverables, the Service Provider Materials and the Third Party Materials;
- **2.16 Parties** mean the Parties to the Agreement together with their subsidiaries, divisions, business units, successors-in-title and their assigns;
- **2.17** Party means either one of these Parties;
- 2.18 Patents mean registered Patents and Pitent a plications, once the latter have proceeded to grant, and includes a right granted for any inventions, products or processes in all fields of technology;
- **2.19 Permitted Purpose** means any altivity or process to be undertaken or supervised by Personnel or employees of one Part, Turner the term of the Agreement, for which purpose authorised disclosure of the other Party's Confidential Information or Intellectual Property is a prerequisite in order to enable such activity or process to be accomplished;
- **2.20 Personnel** means any macher, employee, agent, consultant, independent associate or supplier, Subcontractor and the staff of such Subcontractor, or other authorised representative of either Party;
- **2.21 Purc (as) Order(s)** means official orders issued by an operating division of Transnet to the Service Provider for the provision of Services;
- **2.22 Service (s)** means [•], the Service(s) provided to Transnet by the Service Provider, pursuant to the work Order(s) in terms of the Agreement;
- 2.33 **Service Level Agreement** or **SLA** means the processes, deliverables, key before the indicators and performance standards relating to the Services to be provided by the Service Provider;
- Subcontract means any contract or agreement or proposed contract or agreement between the Service Provider and any third party whereby that third party agrees to provide to the Service Provider the Services or any part thereof;
- **2.25 Subcontractor** means the third party with whom the Service Provider enters into a Subcontract;
- **2.26 Service Provider Materials** means all works of authorship, products and materials [including, but not limited to, data, diagrams, charts, reports, specifications, studies, inventions, software, software development tools, methodologies, ideas, methods, processes, concepts and techniques] owned by, or licensed to, the Service Provider prior to the Commencement Date or independently developed by the Service Provider outside the scope of the Agreement at no expense to Transnet, and used by the Service Provider in the performance of the Services;

- **2.27 Tax Invoice** means the document as required by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- **2.28 Third Party Material** means software, software development tools, methodologies, ideas, methods, processes, concepts and techniques owned by, or licensed to a third party and used by the Service Provider in the performance of the Services;
- **2.29 Trade Marks** mean registered Trade Marks and trade mark applications and includes any sign or logo, or combination of signs and/or logos capable of distinguishing the goods or services of one undertaking from those of another undertaking;
- **2.30 VAT** means Value-Added Tax chargeable in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time; and
- **2.31 Work Order(s)** means a detailed scope of work for Service required by Transnet, including timeframes, Deliverable, Fees and costs for the supply of the Lervice to Transnet, which may be appended to the Agreement from time to time.

3 INTERPRETATION

- **3.1** Clause headings in the Agreement are included for ease of reference only and do not form part of the Agreement for the purposes of incrpretation or for any other purpose. No provision shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of either Party hereto by reason of such Party having or being deemed to have a succured or drafted such provision.
- **3.2** Any term, word, acronym or onrase used in the Agreement, other than those defined under the clause heading "Definitions" shall be given its plain English meaning, and those terms, words, acronyms, and phrases used in the Agreement will be interpreted in accordance with the generally accepted meanings accorded to reto.
- 3.3 A reference to the sing incorporates a reference to the plural and vice versa.
- 3.4A reference to he ural persons incorporates a reference to legal persons and vice versa.
- **3.5** A reference to a particular gender incorporates a reference to the other gender.

4 NATURE IND SCOPE

- The Appelment is an agreement under the terms and conditions of which the Service Provider was arrange for the provision to Transnet of the Services which meet the requirements of Transnet, the delivery of which Services is controlled by means of Purchase Orders to be issued by Lansnet and executed by the Service Provider, in accordance with the Agreement.
- **4.2** Such Purchase Orders shall be agreed between the Parties from time to time, subject to the terms of the relevant Work Order(s).
- **4.3** Each properly executed Purchase Order forms an inseparable part of the Agreement as if it were fully incorporated into the body of the Agreement.
- **4.4** During the period of the Agreement, both Parties can make written suggestions for amendments to the Work Order(s), in accordance with procedures set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control] below. A Party will advise the other Party within 14 [fourteen] Business Days, or such other period as mutually agreed, whether the amendment is acceptable.

- **4.5** Insofar as any term, provision or condition in the Work Order(s) conflicts with a like term, provision or condition in the Agreement and/or a Purchase Order, or where the Agreement is silent on the matter, the term, provision or condition in this Master Agreement shall prevail, unless such term or provision or condition in this Master Agreement has been specifically revoked or amended by mutual written agreement between the Parties.
- **4.6** Time will be of the essence and the Service Provider will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the timeframe(s) [if any] set out in the relevant schedule, save that the Service Provider will not be liable under this clause if it is unable to meet such obligation within the time required as a direct result of any act or omission by Translet and it has used its best endeavours to advise Transnet of such act or omission. In the event of such delay, any time deadlines detailed in the relevant schedule shall be extended by a period equal to the period of that delay.

5 AUTHORITY OF PARTIES

- **5.1** Nothing in the Agreement will constitute or be decimed to constitute a partnership between the Parties, or constitute or be deemed to constitute the Parties as agents or employees of one another for any purpose or in any form whatsocraph
- **5.2** Neither Party shall be entitled to, or have the power or authority to enter into an agreement in the name of the other; or give any war and representation or undertaking on the other's behalf; or create any liability against the other or bird the other's credit in any way or for any purpose whatsoever.

6 WARRANTIES

- **6.1** The Service Provider warrant to Transnet that:
- a) it has full capacity and authority to enter into and to perform the Agreement and that the Agreement is executed by a sulvauthorised representatives of the Service Provider;
- b) it will discharge of obligations under the Agreement and any annexure, appendix or schedule hereto with all due still care and diligence;
- c)it will be so y responsible for the payment of remuneration and associated benefits, if any, of its Personnel and for withholding and remitting income tax for its Personnel in conformance with any applicable was and regulations;
- it will procure licences for Transnet in respect of all Third Party Material detailed in the Work Order(s), and will procure the right for Transnet to take such copies [in whole or in part] of such Third Party Materials as it may reasonably require for the purposes of back-up for archiving and disaster recovery; and
- e) the use or possession by Transnet of any Materials will not subject Transnet to any claim for infringement of any Intellectual Property Rights of any third party.
 - **6.2**The Service Provider warrants that it will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the Service Levels as defined in the relevant schedule. Transnet may at its discretion audit compliance with the Service Levels, provided that any such audit is carried out with reasonable prior notice and in a reasonable way so as not to have an adverse effect on the performance of the Services. Without prejudice to clause 6.3 below, in the event that the Service

Provider fails to meet the Service Levels, Transnet may claim appropriate service credits or invoke a retention of Fees as detailed in the relevant schedule and/or Work Order.

- **6.3** The Service Provider warrants that for a period of 90 [ninety] days from Acceptance of the Deliverables they will, if properly used, conform in all material respects with the requirements set out in the relevant schedule. The Service Provider will at its expense remedy any such non-conformance as soon as possible but in any event within 30 [thirty] days of notification by Transnet. In the event that the Service Provider fails or is unable to remedy such non-conformance within such time-scale, Transnet will be entitled to employ a third party to do so in place of the Service Provider and any excess charges or costs incurred to transnet as a result shall be paid by the Service Provider.
- **6.4**The Service Provider will remedy any defect within 30 [thirty] days of being notified of that defect by Transnet in writing.
- **6.5** The Service Provider will not be liable to remedy any protein along from or caused by any modification made by Transnet to the Deliverables, or any pain the eof, without the prior approval of the Service Provider.
- **6.6** The Service Provider shall advise Transnet of the effects of any steps proposed by Transnet pursuant to clause 6.5 above, including but and limited to any cost implications or any disruption or delay in the performance of the Services. The Parties agree that any changes to the Services, including the charges for the Services or any limitables for delivery of the Services, will be agreed in accordance with the change control projector, as set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control].
- 6.7 The Service Provider wal ants that:
- a) it has, using the most up to date software available, tested for [and deleted] all commonly known viruses in the Matirials are for all viruses known by the Service Provider at the date of the relevant Work Order; and
- b) at the time of selivery to Transnet, the Materials do not contain any trojan horse, worm, logic bomb, time borgs back door, trap door, keys or other harmful components.

The Service Provider agrees that, in the event that a virus is found, it will at its own expense use its test endeavours to assist Transnet in reducing the effect of the virus and, particularly in the event that a virus causes loss of operational efficiency or loss of data, to assist Transnet to the same extent to mitigate such losses and to restore Transnet to its original operating efficiency.

- The Service Provider undertakes to comply with South Africa's general privacy protection in terms of Section 14 of the Bill of Rights in connection with the Agreement and shall procure that its Personnel shall observe the provisions of Section 14 [as applicable] or any amendments and reenactments thereof and any regulations made pursuant thereto.
- **6.9** The Service Provider warrants that it has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure that, in the event of a disaster, the impact of such disaster on the ability of the Service Provider to comply with its obligations under the Agreement will be reduced to the greatest extent possible, and that the Service Provider shall ensure that it has appropriate, tested and documented recovery arrangements in place.

6.10 In compliance with the National Railway Safety Regulator Act, 16 of 2002, the Service Provider shall ensure that the Services, to be supplied to Transnet under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, comply fully with the specifications as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto, and shall thereby adhere [as applicable] to railway safety requirements and/or regulations. Permission for the engagement of a Subcontractor by the Service Provider [as applicable] shall be subject to a review of the capability of the proposed Subcontractor to comply with the specified railway safety requirements and/or regulations. The Service Provider and/or its Subcontractor shall grant Transnet access, during the term of the Agreement, to review any safety-related activities, including the coordination of such activities across all parts of its organisation.

7 TRANSNET'S OBLIGATIONS

- **7.1** Transnet undertakes to promptly comply with any reasonable request by the Service Provider for information, including information concerning Transnet's appealings and activities, that relates to the Services as may be necessary for the Service Provider to perform the Services, but for no other purpose. However, Transnet's compliance with any request for information is subject to any internal security rules and requirements and subject to the observance by the Service Provider of its confidentiality obligations under the Agreement
- **7.2**The Service Provider shall give Transp t re sonable notice of any information it requires in accordance with clause 7.1 above.
- **7.3** Subject to clause 13 [Service Provider's ersonnel], Transnet agrees to provide the Service Provider or its Personnel such access to and use of its facilities as is necessary to allow the Service Provider to perform its obligations up to the Agreement.

8 GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE ERVICE PROVIDER

- 8.1 The Service Provider share
- a) respond property of complaints and enquiries from Transnet;
- b) inform Training in mediately of any dispute or complaint arising in relation to the provision of the Services;
- c)conduct its be fines in a professional manner that will reflect positively upon the Service Provider and the Service Provider's Services;
- d) keep full records clearly indicating all transactions concluded by the Service Provider relating to the surformance of the Services and keep such records for at least 5 [five] years from the date of each such transaction;
- e) obtain, and at all times maintain in full force and effect, any and all licences, permits and the like required under applicable laws for the provision of the Services and the conduct of the business and activities of the Service Provider;
- f) observe and ensure compliance with all requirements and obligations as set out in the labour and related legislation of South Africa, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 85 of 1993;
- g) comply with all applicable environmental legislation and regulations, and demonstrate sound environmental policies, management and performance; and

- h) ensure the validity of all renewable certifications, including but not limited to its Tax Clearance Certificate and B-BBEE Verification Certificate, for the duration of the Agreement. Should the Service Provider fail to present Transnet with such renewals as they become due, Transnet shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which Transnet may have for damages against the Service Provider.
 - 8.2 The Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it shall at all times:
- a) render the Services and perform all its duties with honesty and integrity;
- b) communicate openly and honestly with Transnet and demonstrate a commitment to performing the Services timeously, efficiently and to the required standards;

c)endeavour to provide the highest possible standards of service and provissionalism, with a reasonable degree of care and diligence;

- d) use its best endeavours and make every diligent effort agreed deadlines;
- e) treat its own Personnel, as well as all Transnet's officers, employees, agents and consultants, with fairness and courtesy and respect for their human rights;

f) practice and promote its own internal policies aimed at prohibiting and preventing unfair discrimination [as further referred to in clause 22 – *Equality and Siver lity*];

- g) treat all enquiries from Transnet ir connection with the Services with courtesy and respond to all enquiries promptly and efficiently. Where the Service Provider is unable to comply with the provisions of this clause, the Service Provider will advise Transnet of the delay and the reasons therefor and will keep Transnet informed of progress made regarding the enquiry;
- h) when requested by reastlet, provide clear and accurate information regarding the Service Provider's own policies and procedures, excluding Know-How and other Confidential Information, except where a non-disclosure order caking has been entered into between the Parties;
- i) not allow a conflict of a teres, to develop between its own interests [or the interests of any of its other customers] and the interests of Transnet;
- j) not accept or offer, nor allow, induce or promote the acceptance or offering of any gratuity, enticement, incentive or gift that could reasonably be regarded as bribery or an attempt to otherwise exert units a missence over the recipient;
- not mislead Transnet or its officers, employees and stakeholders, whether by act or omission; not otherwise act in an unethical manner or do anything which could reasonably be expected to damage or tarnish Transnet's reputation or business image; and
- m) immediately report to Transnet any unethical, fraudulent or otherwise unlawful conduct of which it becomes aware in connection with Transnet or the provision of Services.

9 FEES AND EXPENSES

9.1In consideration of the provision of the Services, Transnet will pay to the Service Provider the Fees detailed in the relevant schedule or Work Order.

- **9.2** Transnet will not be invoiced for materials used in the provision of the Services save for those materials [if any] set out in the Work Order and accepted by Transnet or in any relevant Work Order [which will be invoiced to Transnet at cost].
- **9.3** Unless otherwise agreed in a schedule or Work Order, Transnet will reimburse to the Service Provider all reasonable and proper expenses incurred directly and solely in connection with the provision of the Services, provided that all such expenses:
- a) are agreed by Transnet in advance;
- b) are incurred in accordance with Transnet's standard travel and expenses policies; c)are passed on to Transnet at cost with no administration fee; and
- d) will only be reimbursed if supported by relevant receipts.
 - **9.4** All Tax Invoices relating to Fees, out of pocket expenses and, if applicable, travel and accommodation costs, will provide the detail for each of the corrected carrying out the Services and incurring the expenses, and the Tax Invoice will, where appropriate, include VAT as a separate item.

10 INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- Transnet shall pay the Service Povider the amounts stipulated in the relevant schedule or Work Order, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- Transnet shall pay such amounts to the Service Provider, upon receipt of a valid and undisputed Tax Invoice together with the supporting documentation as specified in the Work Order appended hereto, once the Nichard undisputed Tax Invoices, or such portion of the Tax Invoices which are valid and undisputed become due and payable to the Service Provider for the provision of the Services, in terms of clause 10.4 below.
- 10.3 All Files and other sums payable under the Agreement are exclusive of VAT, which will be payable at the applicable rate.
- 10.4 Unless Enerwise provided for in the Work Order(s) appended to the Agreement, Tax Invoices shall be submitted together with a month-end statement. Payment against such monthend statement shall be made by Transnet within 30 [thirty] days after date of receipt by Transnet of the statement together with all valid and undisputed Tax Invoices and supporting locumentation.
- 0.5 Where the payment of any Tax Invoice, or any part thereof which is not in dispute, is not made in accordance with this clause 10, the Service Provider shall be entitled to charge interest on the outstanding amount, at The Standard Bank of South Africa's prime rate of interest in force, for the period from the due date of payment until the outstanding amount is paid.

11 FEE ADJUSTMENTS

- **11.1** Fees for Services rendered in terms of the Agreement shall be subject to review as indicated in the Work Order(s) annexed hereto from time to time.
- 11.2 No less than 2 [two] months prior to any proposed Fee adjustment, the Parties shall commence negotiations for Fees for the next period or as otherwise indicated and appended hereto.

12 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

12.1 Title to Confidential Information

- a) Transnet will retain all right, title and interest in and to its Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property that is proprietary to Transnet. For the avoidance of doubt, all the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property shall remain vested in the Service Provider.
- b) Transnet shall grant to the Service Provider an irrevocable, It valls, frie, non-exclusive licence to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property only for the Perintited Property pose. This license shall not permit the Service Provider to sub-license to other parties.
- c)The Service Provider shall grant to Transnet an irrevocable, Nally free, non-exclusive licence to use the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property for the Permitted Purpose. This licence shall not permit Transnet to sub-license to other parties.
- d) The Service Provider shall grant Training access to the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property on terms which shall be bona he're negotiated between the Parties for the purpose of commercially exploiting the Foreground Intellectual Property, to the extent that such access is required.

12.2 Title to Intellectual Property

- a) All right, title and interest in and to Foreground Intellectual Property prepared, conceived or developed by the Service Provider its assearchers, agents and employees shall vest in Transnet and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Foreground Intellectual Property. The Service Provider shall not at any time during or after the termination or cancellation of the Agreement dispute the validity or enforceability of such Foreground Intellectual Property, or cause to be done any act or mything contesting or in any way impairing or tending to impair any part of that right, title and interest to any of the Foreground Intellectual Property and shall not counsel or assist any person to do so.
- b) Transnet shall be entitled to seek protection in respect of the Foreground Intellectual Property anywhere in the world as it shall decide in its own absolute discretion and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining and maintaining protection of the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- c)Where the Foreground Intellectual Property was created by the Service Provider or its researchers, agents and employees and where Transnet elects not to exercise its option to seek protection or decides to discontinue the financial support of the prosecution or maintenance of any such protection, Transnet shall notify the Service Provider who shall have the right of first refusal to file or continue prosecution or maintain any such applications and to maintain any protection issuing on the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- d) No consideration shall be paid by Transnet to the Service Provider for the assignment of any Foreground Intellectual Property from the Service Provider to Transnet, over and above the sums payable in terms of the Agreement. The Service Provider undertakes to sign all documents and do all things as

may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of the Foreground Intellectual Property to Transnet.

e) Subject to anything contrary contained in the Agreement and/or the prior written consent of Transnet [which consent shall not be unreasonably be withheld or delayed], the Service Provider shall under no circumstances be entitled as of right, or to claim the right, to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Foreground Intellectual Property.

12.3 Title to Improvements

Any improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications to the Foreground Intellectual Property, and any and all new inventions or discoveries, based on or resulting from the use of Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Confidential Information shall be exclusively owned by Transnet. The Service Provider shall disclose promptly to Transnet all such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries. The Service Provider hereby undertakes to sign all documents and too and hings as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries to Transnet and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining, maintaining or documenting ownership and/or protection of the improved Foreground Intellectual Property.

12.4 Unauthorised Use of Confidential Information

The Service Provider shall not author se any party to act on or use in any way any Confidential Information belonging to Transnet whether or not such party is aware of such Confidential Information, and shall promptly notify Transnet of the information if it becomes aware of any party so acting, and shall provide transnet the information with such assistance as Transnet reasonably requires, at Transnet's cost and expense, to prevent such third party from so acting.

12.5 Unauthorised Use of Intellectual Property

- a) The Service Provider agrees to notify Transnet in writing of any conflicting uses of, and applications of registrations of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks or any act of infringement, unfair competition or passing off involving the Intellectual Property of Transnet of which the Service Provider acquires knowledge and Transnet shall have the right, as its own option, to proceed against any party infringing its Intellectual Property.
- b) It shall be within the sole and absolute discretion of Transnet to determine what steps shall be talk in a ainse the infringer and the Service Provider shall co-operate fully with Transnet, at Transnet's cost, in whatever measure including legal action to bring any infringement of illegal use to an end.
- c)The Service Provider shall cooperate to provide Transnet promptly with all relevant ascertainable facts.
- d) If proceedings are commenced by Transnet alone, Transnet shall be responsible for all expenses but shall be entitled to all damages or other awards arising out of such proceedings. If proceedings are commenced by both Parties, both Parties will be responsible for the expenses and both Parties shall be entitled to damages or other awards arising out of proceedings.

13 SERVICE PROVIDER'S PERSONNEL

13.1 The Service Provider's Personnel shall be regarded at all times as employees, agents or Subcontractors of the Service Provider and no relationship of employer and employee shall

arise between Transnet and any Service Provider Personnel under any circumstances regardless of the degree of supervision that may be exercised over the Personnel by Transnet.

- **13.2** The Service Provider warrants that all its Personnel will be entitled to work in South Africa or any other country in which the Services are to be performed.
- 13.3 The Service Provider will ensure that its Personnel comply with all reasonable requirements made known to the Service Provider by Transnet concerning conduct at any Transnet premises or any other premises upon which the Services are to be performed [including but not limited to security regulations, policy standards and codes of practice and health and safety requirements]. The Service Provider will ensure that such Personner at all times act in a lawful and proper manner in accordance with these requirements.
- Transnet reserves the right to refuse to admit or to remove from any premises occupied by or on behalf of it, any Service Provider Personner where admission or presence would, in the reasonable opinion of Transnet, be undesirable or who represents a threat to confidentiality or security or whose presence would be in breach of any rules and regulations governing Transnet's Personnel, provided that Transnet restifics the Service Provider of any such refusal [with reasons why]. The reasonable exclusion of any such individual from such premises shall not relieve the Service Provider from the performance of its obligations under the Agreement.
- The Service Provider a frees in use all reasonable endeavours to ensure the continuity of its Personnel assigned to perform the Services. If any re-assignment by the Service Provider of those Personnel is necessary or if Transnet advises that any such Personnel assigned are in any respect unsatisfactory, including where any such Personnel are, or are expected to be or have been absent for any period, then the Service Provider will promptly supply a replacement of equivalent calibrations experience, and any such replacement shall be approved by Transnet prior to commencing provision of the Services, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

14 LIMITANO OF LIABILITY

- **14.1** Weither Party excludes or limits liability to the other Party for:
- a) dath or personal injury due to negligence; or
- h) frond
 - The Service Provider shall indemnify and keep Transnet indemnified from and against liability for damage to any Transnet property [whether tangible or intangible] or any other loss, costs or damage suffered by Transnet to the extent that it results from any act of or omission by the Service Provider or its Personnel in connection with the Agreement. The Service Provider's liability arising out of this clause 14.2 shall be limited to a maximum amount payable in respect of any one occurrence or a series of related occurrences in a single calendar year, such amount to be agreed in writing by the Parties.
 - Subject always to clauses 14.1 and 14.2 above, the liability of either the Service Provider or Transnet under or in connection with the Agreement, whether for negligence, misrepresentation, breach of contract or otherwise, for direct loss or damage arising out of each

Default or series of related Defaults shall not exceed 100% [one hundred per cent] of the Fees paid under the schedule or Work Order to which the Default(s) relates.

- Subject to clause 14.1 above, and except as provided in clauses 14.2 and 14.3 above, in no event shall either Party be liable to the other for indirect or consequential loss or damage or including indirect or consequential loss of profits, business, revenue, goodwill or anticipated savings of an indirect nature or loss or damage incurred by the other Party as a result of third party claims.
- 14.5 If for any reason the exclusion of liability in clause 1444 above is void or unenforceable, either Party's total liability for all loss or damage under the Agreement shall be as provided in clause 14.3 above.
- Nothing in this clause 14 shall be taken as limiting the liability of the Service Provider in respect of clause 12 [Intellectual Property Rights] or clause 16 [Some Intiality].

15 INSURANCES

- 15.1 Without limiting the liability of the Service Provider under the Agreement, the Service Provider shall take out insurance in respect of all risks for which it is prudent for the Service Provider to insure against, including any liability it may have as a result of its activities under the Agreement for theft, destruction, death or injury to any person and damage to property. The level of insurance will be kept under review by hansaet, on an annual basis, to ensure its adequacy, provided that any variation to the level of sure insurance shall be entirely at the discretion of the Service Provider.
- The Service Provider shall arrange insurance with reputable insurers and will produce to Transnet evidence of the existence of the policies on an annual basis within 30 [thirty] days after date of policy principles.
- 15.3 Subject to clause 15.4 below, if the Service Provider fails to effect adequate insurance under this clause 15, it shall notify Transnet in writing as soon as it becomes aware of the reduction or inadequate cover and Transnet may arrange or purchase such insurance. The Service Provider shall promptly reimburse Transnet for any premiums paid provided such insurance protects the Service Provider's liability. Transnet assumes no responsibility for such insurance being adequate to protect all of the Service Provider's liability.
- In the event that the Service Provider receives written notice from its insurers divising of the termination of its insurance cover referred to in clause 15.1 above or if the insurance ceases to be available upon commercially reasonable terms, the Service Provider shall immediately notify Transnet in writing of such termination and/or unavailability, whereafter either the Service Provider or Transnet may terminate the Agreement on giving the other Party not less than 30 [thirty] days prior written notice to that effect.

16 CONFIDENTIALITY

- **16.1** The Parties hereby undertake the following, with regard to Confidential Information:
- a) not to divulge or disclose to any person whomsoever in any form or manner whatsoever, either directly or indirectly, any Confidential Information of the other, without the prior written consent of such other Party, other than when called upon to do so in accordance with a statute, or by a court having

jurisdiction, or by any other duly authorised and empowered authority or official, in which event the Party concerned shall do what is reasonably possible to inform the other of such a demand and each shall assist the other in seeking appropriate relief or the instituting of a defensive action to protect the Confidential Information concerned;

- b) not to use, exploit, permit the use of, directly or indirectly, or in any other manner whatsoever apply the Confidential Information, disclosed to it as a result of the Agreement, for any purpose whatsoever other than for the purpose for which it is disclosed or otherwise than in strict compliance with the provisions in the Agreement;
- c)not to make any notes, sketches, drawings, photographs or copies of any kind of any part of the disclosed Confidential Information, without the prior written consent of such other Party, except when reasonably necessary for the purpose of the Agreement, in which case such copies shall be regarded as Confidential Information;
- d) not to de-compile, disassemble or reverse engineer any composition, compilation, concept application, item, component de-compilation, including software or hardware disclosed and shall not analyse any sample provided by Transnet, or otherwise determine the composition or structure or cause to permit these tasks to be carried out except in the performance of its obligations pursuant to the Agreement;
- e) not to exercise less care to safeguaro Transnet Confidential Information than the Party exercises in safeguarding its own competitive sensitive or Confidential Information;
- f) Confidential Information disclosed by either and to the other or by either Party to any other party used by such Party in the performance of the "greement, shall be dealt with as "restricted" or shall be dealt with according to any other appropriate level of confidentiality relevant to the nature of the information concerned, agreed between the Parties concerned and stipulated in writing for such information in such cases;
- g) the Parties than not make or permit to be made by any other person subject to their control, any public statements on issue press releases or disclose Confidential Information with regard to any matter related to the Agreement, unless written authorisation to do so has first been obtained from the Party first disclosing such information;
- h) such that y shall be entitled to disclose such aspects of Confidential Information as may be relevant to one or more technically qualified employees or consultants of the Party who are required in the rou se of their duties to receive the Confidential Information for the Permitted Purpose provided that the employee or consultant concerned has a legitimate interest therein, and then only to the extent necessary for the Permitted Purpose, and is informed by the Party of the confidential nature of the Confidential Information and the obligations of the confidentiality to which such disclosure is subject and the Party shall ensure such employees or consultants honour such obligations;
- i) each Party shall notify the other Party of the name of each person or entity to whom any Confidential Information has been disclosed as soon as practicable after such disclosure;
- j) each Party shall ensure that any person or entity to which it discloses Confidential Information shall observe and perform all of the covenants the Party has accepted in the Agreement as if such person or entity has signed the Agreement. The Party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be responsible for any breach of the provisions of the Agreement by the person or entity; and

- k) each Party may by written notice to the other Party specify which of the Party's employees, officers or agents are required to sign a non-disclosure undertaking.
 - **16.2** The duties and obligations with regard to Confidential Information in this clause 16 shall not apply where:
- a) a Party can demonstrate that such information is already in the public domain or becomes available to the public through no breach of the Agreement by that Party, or its Personnel; or
- b) was rightfully in a Party's possession prior to receipt from the other Party, as proven by the first-mentioned Party's written records, without an infringement of an obligation or the other party, as proven by the first-mentioned Party's written records, without an infringement of an obligation or the other party, as proven by the

17 TOTAL OR PARTIAL FAILURE TO SEP ORM THE SCOPE OF SERVICES

Should the Service Provider fail or neglecto exact the work or to deliver any portion of the Service, as required by the terms of the Agreement or Work Order, Transnet may cancel the Agreement or Work Order in so far as it relates to the case cuted work or rejected portion of the Service, and, in such event, the provision of any remaining a small remain subject in all respects to these conditions.

18 TERM AND TERMINATION

 - **18.3** Either Party may terminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party when the other Party is unable to pay its debts as they fall due or commits any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may

be amended from time to time], or if any action, application or proceeding is made with regard to it for:

- a) a voluntary arrangement or composition or reconstruction of its debts;
- b) its winding-up or dissolution;
- c)the appointment of a liquidator, trustee, receiver, administrative receiver or similar officer; or
- d) any similar action, application or proceeding in any jurisdiction to which it is subject.
 - Transnet may terminate the Agreement at any time within 2 [two] months of becoming aware of a change of control of the Service Provider by notice a writing to the Service Provider. For the purposes of this clause, "control" means the right to direct the affairs of a company whether by ownership of shares, membership of the board of directors, agreement or otherwise.
 - **18.5** Transnet may cancel any schedule or Work Or a belong at any time on giving the Service Provider 30 [thirty] days' written notice.
 - 18.6 Notwithstanding this clause 18, either Party may of neel the Agreement without cause by giving 30 [thirty] days prior written notice there if to the other Party.

19 CONSEQUENCE OF TERMINATION

- 19.1 Termination in accordance wis clause 18 [Term and Termination] shall not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which shall have accrued or shall thereafter accrue to either Party and all provisions which are to survive the Agreement or impliedly do so shall remain in force and in effect.
- 19.2 On termination of the Agreement or a Work Order, the Service Provider will immediately deliver up and produce that its Personnel will immediately deliver up to Transnet, all Deliverables and property beronging to Transnet [or, in the event of termination of a Work Order, such as is relevant to that Work Order] which may be in the possession of, or under the control of the Service Provider, and certify to Transnet in writing that this has been done.
- 19.3 The extent that any of the Deliverables and property referred to in clause 19.2 above take in electronic form and contained on non-detachable storage devices, the Service Provider was provide Transnet with unencrypted copies of the same on magnetic media and will tre devably destroy and delete copies so held.
- In the event that the Agreement is terminated by the Service Provider under clause 18.2 [Term and Termination], or in the event that a Work Order is terminated by Transnet under clause 18.5 [Term and Termination], Transnet will pay to the Service Provider all outstanding Fees [apportioned on a pro rata basis] relating to the work undertaken by the Service Provider up until the date of such termination. Transnet will also pay the costs of any goods and materials ordered by the Service Provider in relation to the such work for which the Service Provider has paid or is legally obliged to pay, in which case, on delivery of such goods or materials, the Service Provider will promptly deliver such goods and materials to Transnet or as it may direct.
- 19.5 The provisions of clauses 1 [Definitions], 6 [Warranties], 12 [Intellectual Property Rights], 14 [Limitation of Liability], 16 [Confidentiality], 19 [Consequence of Termination], 25 [Dispute Resolution] and 29 [Governing Law] shall survive termination or expiry of the Agreement.

If either Party [the Defaulting Party] commits a material breach of the Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within 30 [thirty] Business Days of written notice thereof, the other Party [hereinafter the Aggrieved Party], shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which the Aggrieved Party may have for damages against the Defaulting Party.

19.7 Should:

- a) the Service Provider effect or attempt to effect a compromise or composition with its creditors; or
- b) either Party be provisionally or finally liquidated or placed under junctul management, whether provisionally or finally; or

c)either Party cease or threaten to cease to carry on its normal line of busines, or default or threaten to default in the payment of its liabilities generally, or commit any act or mission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time];

then the other Party shall be entitled, but not obliged, a terminate the Agreement on written notice, in which event such termination shall be without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which either Party may have for damp get against the other.

20 ASSIGNMENT

Neither Party may assign the benefit of the Pareement or any interest hereunder except with the prior written consent of the other. Further, in the event that Transnet wishes to assign or novate the Agreement to any third party, the Service Provider agrees that it shall not unreasonably withhold or delay its consent to such assignment a novation and that it shall only be entitled to recover from Transnet any reasonable legal costs incurred by it as a direct result of such assignment or novation.

21 FORCE MALEUR

- 21.1 Neither Party shall have any claim against the other Party arising from any failure or delay in the performance of any obligation of either Party under the Agreement caused by an act of *force majeure* such as acts of God, fire, flood, war, strike, lockout, industrial dispute, gove nmeritaction, laws or regulations, riots, terrorism or civil disturbance, defaults, delays or discentinuance on the part of independent contractors, suppliers, or other circumstances or actors beyond the reasonable control of either Party, and to the extent that the performance of obligations of either Party hereunder is delayed by virtue of the aforegoing, any period stipulated for any such performance shall be reasonably extended.
- 21.2 Each Party will take all reasonable steps by whatever lawful means that are available, to resume full performance as soon as practicable and will seek agreement to modification of the relevant provisions of the Agreement in order to accommodate the new circumstances caused by the act of *force majeure*. If a Party fails to agree to such modifications proposed by the other Party within 90 [ninety] days of the act of *force majeure* first occurring, either Party may thereafter terminate the Agreement with immediate notice.

22 EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY

- The Service Provider will not victimise, harass or discriminate against any employee of either Party to the Agreement or any applicant for employment with either Party to the Agreement due to their gender, race, disability, age, religious belief, sexual orientation or part-time status. This provision applies, but is not limited to employment, upgrading, work environment, demotion, transfer, recruitment, recruitment advertising, termination of employment, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training.
- 22.2 Both Parties to the Agreement undertake that they will not, and shall procure that its employees, agents and Subcontractors will not breach any applicable discrimination legislation and any amendments and re-enactments thereof.

23 NON-WAIVER

- Failure or neglect by either Party, at any time, to enter any of the provisions of the Agreement, shall not, in any manner, be construed to be a wrive of any of that Party's rights in that regard and in terms of the Agreement.
- 23.2 Such failure or neglect shall not, in any manner, affect the continued, unaltered validity of the Agreement, or prejudice the right of that Party to institute subsequent action.

24 PARTIAL INVALIDITY


If any provision of the Agreement shall be held to be hvalid, illegal or unenforceable, or shall be required to be modified, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected thereby.

25 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- Should any on the of whatsoever nature arise between the Parties concerning the Agreement, the Parties shall try to resolve the dispute by negotiation within 10 [ten] Business Days of such Lispute arising.

- This clause constitutes an irrevocable consent by the Parties to any proceedings in terms hereof, and neither of the Parties shall be entitled to withdraw from the provisions of this clause or claim at any such proceedings that it is not bound by this clause 25.
- **25.5** This clause 25 is severable from the rest of the Agreement and shall remain in effect even if the Agreement is terminated for any reason.
- **25.6** This clause 25 shall not preclude either Party from seeking urgent relief in a court of appropriate jurisdiction, where grounds for urgency exist.

26.1 The Parties to the Agreement select the physical addresses and facsimile numbers, as detailed hereafter, as their respective addresses for giving or sending any notice provided for or required in terms of the Agreement, provided that either Party shall be entitled to substitute such other address or facsimile number, as may be, by written notice to the other:

c)if faxes on the date and time of sending of such fax, as evidenced by a fax confirmation printout, provider that such notice shall be confirmed by prepaid registered post on the date of dispatch of such tax, or, should no postal facilities be available on that date, on the next Business Day.

27 WHOLE AND ONLY AGREEMENT

- **27.1** The Parties hereby confirm that the Agreement constitutes the whole and only agreement between them with regard to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 27.2 The Parties hereby confirm that the Agreement replaces all other agreements which exist or may have existed in any form whatever between them, with regard to the subject matter dealt with in the Agreement, including any annexures, appendices, schedules or Work Order(s) appended hereto.

28 AMENDMENT AND CHANGE CONTROL

- **28.1** Any requirement for an amendment or change to the Agreement or to a Work Order shall only be valid if it is in writing, signed by both Parties and added to the Agreement as an addendum hereto.
- **28.2** In the event the Parties cannot agree upon changes, the Parties shall in good faith seek to agree any proposed changes using the dispute resolution procedures in clause 25 [Dispute Resolution].

29 GOVERNING LAW

The Agreement is exclusively governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa and is subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa.

29.1 Change of Law

In the Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires, Neren s to a statutory provision include references to that statutory provision as from time time amended, extended or rehat ir enacted and any regulations made under it, provided the event that the amendment, extension or re-enactment of any statutory provision or introduction of any new statutory provision has a material impact on the obligations of either Party, the Parties will negotiate in good faith to agree such amendments ne Agreement as may be appropriate in the circumstances. If, within a reasonable period on time, the Service Provider and Transnet cannot reach agreement on the nature of the changes required or on modification of Fees, Deliverables, warranties, or other terms and conditions either Party may seek to have the matter determined in *Dispute Resolution]* above. accordance with clause 25 /

30 COUNTERPARTS

The Agreement may be signed in an number of counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instruction. Either Party may enter into the Agreement by signing any such counterpart.

HEALTH MINIMUM COMMUNAL REQUIREMENTS IN **AREAS** OUTSIDE THE **FOR** JURISDICTION OF Α LOCAL **AUTHORITY: TEMPORARY FACILITIES** CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL

1. CAMPS

- 1.1 Prior to the erection of any camp, the Contractor shall setuping the Employer's Deputy, for his approval, details of his proposals as to the site, water supply, sanitation, and size and type of buildings. Where the site is on private and, the Contractor shall submit the written approval for the use of the site of the relevant statutory authority and of the owner and occupier of the land (as applicable).
- 1.2 Camps must not be erected on land infestor with field rodents.
- 1.3 Adequate drainage shall be provided to carry off storm and waste water.
- 1.4 Buildings shall be built to a neat and orderly pattern.
- 1.5 All buildings shall have smooth, hard, impervious floors, graded to provide effective drainage and to permit was time.
- 1.6 Camps shall be mantained by the Contractor at his own expense in a clean and tidy condition. The Contractor shall take such steps as the Employer's Deputy and landowner/occunier may demand to prevent the creation of a nuisance.
- 1.7 When so instructed by the Employer's Deputy, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, erect suitable screens between the camp and any public road, thoroughfare or railway line.
- 1.8 After emeval of a camp, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, restore the site to its right all condition to the satisfaction of the Employer's Deputy and of the landowner and occupier where the site is on private land.

HOUSING

- 2.1 Every living room shall have cross ventilation, both constant and occasional. Where only one window is provided, it shall not be in the same wall as the door.
- 2.2 Dimensions of living rooms shall be sufficient to allow 3.5 square metres of floor area and 11 cubic metres of air space for each person over the age of 10 years. The floor area of any living room shall not be less than 7,8 square metres.

- 2.3 Flat-roofed quarters shall have a minimum roof height of 3 metres above floor level. For quarters with pitched roofs, the wall height shall be not less than 2,6 metres above the floor with a minimum height above floor of 3 metres at the top of the pitch.
- 2.4 Doors shall not be less than 2m x 0.75m and must be halved.
- 2.5 Windows of each living room shall have an area not less than one twelfth of the floor area and shall be capable of opening to at least half their full area.
- 2.6 In areas where malaria is prevalent, doors and windows must be fitted with gauze screens.
- 2.7 Cooking shelters shall comprise roofed structures, three sides of which shall be enclosed by a weatherproof material, approved by the Employer's Deputy to a height of at least 1m above ground level.
 - 2.7.1 Sleeping quarters shall not accommodate more than 8 persons per room.
 - 2.7.2 Pegboards shall be carried on metal or concrete supports and shall be separated by partitions not less than 0,4 metres high extending to within 150mm of the end of the bunk. Pegboards shall be removable for cleaning.

3. WATER SUPPLY AND ABLUTION FACILINES

- 3.1 The Contractor shall ensure that an adequate and conveniently situated supply of potable water is provided.
- 3.2 Separate buildings for abouting facilities shall be provided. Where approval has been obtained for the housing of both males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportion shall be 1 cubicle for 20 persons.
- 3.3 Waste water shall be hygienically disposed of.

4. **SANITATION**


- 4.1 Separate buildings for latrine facilities shall be provided. Where housing are provided for both males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportions shall be at least one squatting seat for every 15 persons or less in the case of pit atrines, or one for every 10 persons or less in case of pail latrines.
 - Latrines shall be fly proof and sited at least 10 metres from any other building, and shall not face on any public road, thoroughfare, railway line or residential property. Pits shall not be less than 2,5 metres deep and sited not less than 120 metres from nearest underground water source.
- 4.2 Latrines shall be so constructed, situated and maintained, and night soil so disposed of as to prevent access by animals, breeding of flies, pollution of streams and domestic water supplies, and other nuisances. Where a night soil removal service is operated by a competent authority, use of such service shall be obligatory, and the use of pit latrines and atria pits will not be permitted.

- 4.3 At least one refuse bin of adequate size with close fitting lid shall be provided for each building. Refuse bins shall be emptied and cleaned out daily.
- 4.4 Labour shall be employed on camp sanitation duties on the following basis:-
 - 4.4.1 Where the number of persons living at the camp is 20 or less one unit.
 - 4.4.2 For additional numbers over 20 living at the camp one unit per 100 or part thereof.
- 4.5 Unless refuse is removed by a competent authority, it shall be disposed of in pits and covered over daily with a layer of earth or ash of sufficient trickness to prevent depredations by rodents and the breeding of flies.
- Adequate measures shall be taken against all vermining the ects responsible for the spread of disease. Any instructions of a competent health authority shall be carried out promptly and implicitly.
- 4.7 Buildings and bedboards shall be treated whenever necessary with an approved insecticide.
- 4.8 The Contractor shall permit and facilitate in pection of the camp and structures on the site by the staff of Transnet or any other competent authority, and shall comply with any reasonable request by such staff of any other competent authority to eliminate any unsanitary condition.
- 4.9 Any outbreak of infectious disease shall immediately be reported telephonically and confirmed in writing to the small ver's Deputy.
- 4.10 The keeping of animals of any sort is not permitted.
- 4.11 The Contractor chair have on hand at the camp the necessary tools, disinfectants and cleaning materials to maintain and clean the sanitary facilities.

RATIONS

Rations, there supplied by the Contractor, shall be stored in a suitable and rodent proof building with sufficient shelving.

Transnet is firmly committed to free and competitive enterprise.

- Suppliers are expected to comply with all applicable laws and regulations regarding fair competition and intite st practices
- >> Transnet does not engage non-value adding agents or endesentatives solely for the purpose of increasing BBBEE spend (fronting).

Transpet's elationship with suppliers requires us to charty define requirements, to exchange information and share mutual benefits.

>> Generally, suppliers have their own business standards and regulations. Although Transnet cannot control the actions of our suppliers, we will not tolerate any illegal activities.







These include, but are not limited to:

- Misrepresentation of their product (origin of manufacture, specifications, intellectual property rights, etc);
- Collusion:
- Failure to disclose accurate information required during the sourcing activity (ownership financial situation, BBBEE status, etc.);
- Corrupt activities listed above; and harassment, intimidation or other aggressive actions towards Transnet employees.
- Suppliers must be evaluated and approved before any materials, components, products or services are purchased from them. Rigorous due diligence must be conducted and the supplier is expected to participate in an honest and straight forward manner.
- » Suppliers must record and report facts accurately, honestly and objectively. Financial records must be accurate in all material respects.
