## 3 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

## 3.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note the following:

- Functionality is included at a pre-qualification stage with a prescribed percentage threshold of **70** (Seventy points).
- Proposals will be evaluated on price which will be allocated 80 or 90 points and preference which will be allocated 20 or 10 points, dependent on the value of the Goods or Services.
- The 80/20 preference point system applies where the acquisition of the Goods or Services will be less than R1 000 000.00.
- If the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated and all Bids received exceed 1 000 000.00, the RFQ will be cancelled.
- The 90/10 preference point system applies where acquisition of the Goods of Strvices will exceed R1 000 000.00
- If the 90/10 preference point system is stipulated and alk cit's needed are equal to or below R1 000 000.00, the RFQ will be cancelled.

- Black ownership greater than 50% or Black Women ownership greater than 50% automatically qualify as B-BBEE Level 3

Sufficient evidence to qualify as an EME would be a certificate (which may be in the form of a letter) from an auditor or accounting officer or a certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS. The certificate must confirm the company's turnover, black ownership / black female ownership, B-BBEE status level and validity date.

Respondents are required to furnish proof of the above to Transnet. [i.e. a valid detailed scorecard as stipulated above in respect of Large Enterprises and QSEs, or a valid certificate in respect of EMEs].

Transnet will accordingly allocate a maximum of **10/20** [ten/twenty] points in accordance with the **80/20** / **90/10** preference point system prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations to the Respondent's final score based on an entity's B-BBEE scorecard rating. 

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## 1. INTRODUCTION

Ermelo Terminal is located at Msukaligwa Local Municipality in Mpumalanga Province at the following location; Latitude S: 26° 31′ 29.67″, Longitude E: 26° 59′ 59.32″ Main Site Activity: Locomotive movement facility

## Main Infrastructure:

- Rail Tank Car Decanting Area
- Spill Containment Area
- Tankage (Diesel Storage Tanks)
- Tank Bund
- Locomotive Refuelling Area
- Fuel Pump House
- Drainage System
- Oil Separator
- Workshop
- Offices

## Tankage:

• Two 942m³ boxe ground (A/G) diesel storage tanks within a bund area.

The tenderer is invited to tender for the external refurbishment of the two diesel storage tanks at Newcastle terminal, covering the removal of perished external coating, external surface preparation of the tanks façade, and apply rust inhibiting paint and, lastly paint the tanks with zinc aluminium coating paint.

The tenderer shall provide scaffolding, platforms and all safety harnesses that are required to execute this work, moreover observe all working at heights regulations and all safety regulations and guidelines concerning construction work.

Tanks refurbishment work shall be carried out in an operational environment, the tender shall plan and co-ordinate the tanks refurbishment works so that disruptions and delays to TFR operations are eliminated.

## 2. PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORK

The following section outlines the scope of work and serves as the basis and specifications to the works, it is expected that tenderers shall include any pertinent data that may be considered to systematically conduct the external ank refurbishment work as ascribed in API and any other related regulation/s.

## 2.1 SHELL

- Remove corrosion by wire brush.
- Remove all oil, grease and soluble saits by washing with Carboclean 250 and rinsing with potable water to a water break free surface. Remove all loose rust, rust scale and loose or flaking paint by scraping with flat scrapers followed by wire brushing of the rusty areas to St2 of the International Standard ISO 8501-1:1988 followed by stadpapering the existing paint with medium (80-grit) sandpaper to feather edge sharp edges remove chalking and provide a key. The use of small povertools fitted with medium to coarse grinding discs would combine wire brushing and sanding and speed up surface cleaning. Remove dust and prime.
- Apply stitchle rust inhibiting primer coating system, see paint specification in the table pelow;



## Section 17: E4B - MINIMUM COMMUNAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

## MINIMUM COMMUNAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS IN AREAS OUTSIDE THE JURISDICTION OF A LOCAL AUTHORITY: TEMPORARY FACILITIES FOR CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL

## 1. CAMPS

- Prior to the erection of any camp, the Contractor shall submit to the Technical Officer, for his approval, details of his Quotations as to the site, water supply, sanitation, and size and type of buildings. Where the site is on private land, the Contractor shall submit the writter approval for the use of the site of the relevant statutory authority and of the owner and occupier of the land (as applicable).
- 1.2 Camps must not be erected on land infested with field dents
- 1.3 Adequate drainage shall be provided to carry off storm and waste water.
- 1.4 Buildings shall be built to a neat and orderly pattern
- 1.5 All buildings shall have smooth, hard, impervious floors, graded to provide effective drainage and to permit washing.
- 1.6 Camps shall be maintained by the Contractor at his own expense in a clean and tidy condition. The Contractor shall take such steps as the Technical Officer and landowner/occupier may demand to prevent the creation of a nuisanter.
- 1.7 When so instructed by the Technical Officer, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, erect suitable screens between the tame and by public road, thoroughfare or railway line.
- 1.8 After reviscal of a camp, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, restore the site to its original condition to the stiss ction of the Technical Officer and of the landowner and occupier where the site is on private land.

## 2. **HOUSING**

- Every living room shall have cross ventilation, both constant and occasional. Where only one window is provided, it shall not be in the same wall as the door.
- 2.2 Dimensions of living rooms shall be sufficient to allow 3.5 square metres of floor area and 11 cubic metres of air space for each person over the age of 10 years. The floor area of any living room shall not be less than 7,8 square metres.
- 2.3 Flat-roofed quarters shall have a minimum roof height of 3 metres above floor level. For quarters with pitched roofs, the wall height shall be not less than 2,6 metres above the floor with a minimum height above floor of 3 metres at the top of the pitch.
- 2.4 Doors shall not be less than  $2m \times 0.75m$  and must be halved.
- 2.5 Windows of each living room shall have an area not less than one twelfth of the floor area and shall be capable of opening to at least half their full area.
- 2.6 In areas where malaria is prevalent, doors and windows must be fitted with gauze screens.

- 2.7 Cooking shelters shall comprise roofed structures, three sides of which shall be enclosed by a weatherproof material, approved by the Technical Officer to a height of at least **1m** above ground level.
- 2.7.1 Sleeping quarters shall not accommodate more than 8 persons per room.
- 2.7.2 Pegboards shall be carried on metal or concrete supports and shall be separated by partitions not less than 0,4 metres high extending to within 150mm of the end of the bunk. Pegboards shall be removable for EXTERNAL REFURBISHMENT.

## 3. WATER SUPPLY AND ABLUTION FACILITIES

- 3.1 The Contractor shall ensure that an adequate and conveniently situated supply totable water is provided.
- 3.2 Separate buildings for ablution facilities shall be provided. Where approval has been obtained for the housing of males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportion shall be 1 cubicle for 20 persons.
- 3.3 Waste water shall be hygienically disposed of.

#### 4. **SANITATION**

- 4.1 Separate buildings for latrine facilities shall be provided. Where housing is provided for males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportions shall be at least one squatting seat for every 15 persons or less in the case of pit latrines, or one for every 10 persons or less in case of pail latrines.

  Latrines shall be fly proof and sited at least 10 metres from any other building, and shall not face on any public road, thoroughfare, callway line or residential property. Pits shall not be less than 2,5 metres deep and sited not less than 12s matters from nearest underground water source.
- 4.2 Latrines shall be so senstructed, situated and maintained, and night soil so disposed of as to prevent access by animals, bleeding of ries, pollution of streams and domestic water supplies, and other nuisances. Where a night concern val service is operated by a competent authority, use of such service shall be obligatory, and the tage, pit latrines and atria pits will not be permitted.
- 4.3 At least one refuse bin of adequate size with close fitting lid shall be provided for each building. Refuse bins shall be emptied and cleaned out daily.
- Labour shall be employed on camp sanitation duties on the following basis:-
  - 4.4.1 Where the number of persons living at the camp is 20 or less one unit.
  - 4.4.2 For additional numbers over 20 living at the camp one unit per 100 or part thereof.
- 4.5 Unless refuse is removed by a competent authority, it shall be disposed of in pits and covered over daily with a layer of earth or ash of sufficient thickness to prevent depredations by rodents and the breeding of flies.
- 4.6 Adequate measures shall be taken against all vermin and insects responsible for the spread of disease. Any instructions of a competent health authority shall be carried out promptly and implicitly.
- 4.7 Buildings and bedboards shall be treated whenever necessary with an approved insecticide.
- 4.8 The Contractor shall permit and facilitate inspection of the camp and structures on the site by the staff of Transnet or any other competent authority, and shall comply with any reasonable request by such staff or any other competent authority to eliminate any unsanitary condition.

- 4.9 Any outbreak of infectious disease shall immediately be reported telephonically and confirmed in writing to the Technical Officer.
- 4.10 The keeping of animals of any sort is not permitted.
- 4.11 The Contractor shall have on hand at the camp the necessary tools, disinfectants and EXTERNAL REFURBISHMENT materials to maintain and clean the sanitary facilities.

## 5<sub>m</sub> RATIONS

Rations, where supplied by the Contractor, shall be stored in a suitable and rodent ploof building with sufficient shelving.

# Section 18: E4E - SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

## 1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and Transnet Limited (hereinafter referred to as "Transnet") are individed employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and obligations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the includes of the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Safety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to complying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the omission of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 Transnet accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Technical Officer or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety makagement of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any discrepances between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

## 2. Definitions

- 2.1 In this Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, sharp the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -
- 2.2 The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "Construction Work", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with:
  - (a) the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
  - (b) the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;
  - (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or
  - (d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work;
- 2.3 **"competent person"** in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed: Provided that where appropriate qualifications and

training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;

- 2.4 **"Contractor"** means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **"fall protection plan"** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 **"health and safety file"** means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;
- 2.7 **"Health and Safety Plan"** means a documented plan which addresses the hazards identified and include safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 "Risk Assessment" means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce a control such hazard;
- 2.9 "the Act" means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 8 of 1993.

#### 3. Procedural Compliance

- 3.1 The Contractor who intends to carry out approximation work shall, before carrying out such work, notify the Provincial Director in writing if the construction work:
  - (a) includes the demolition of a structure exceeding a height of 3 metres; or
  - (b) includes the use of explosives to perform construction work; or
  - (c) includes the dismartling of fixed plant at a height greater than 3m,

and shall also notify the Provincial Description with a construction work exceeds 30 days or will involve more than 300 person days of construction work and if the construction work:-

- (a) includes Acavation work deeper than 1m; or
- (b) ncludes working at a height greater than 3 metres above ground or a landing.
- 3.2 The totil taken to the Provincial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of the Construction Regulations, 2003, 4so shown in Annexure 1 of this Specification. The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the completed notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer or employee.
- 3.3 The Contractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety file.
- 3.4 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer.
- 3.5 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.

- 3.6 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.7 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Transnet's safety requirements and procedures.

## 4. Special Permits

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hours k, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Technical Officer or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and continue pertaining to the issue of such permits.

#### 5. Health and Safety Programme

- 5.1 The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and a fety regramme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
  - (i) The provision, as far as is reasonably practical, and working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act;
  - (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act that persons other than those in the contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and safety;
  - (iii) ensuring, as for as is casonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do or conit to do.
- The Contract r's North and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and afety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonabre and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:
  - (a) The identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
  - (b) the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
  - (c) a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
  - (d) a monitoring and review plan.

- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -
  - (a) The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
  - (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
  - (c) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
  - (d) the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented
  - (e) the arrangements in respect of communication of health and safety related matters and incidents between the Contractor, his employees, subcontractors and the Technical Officer With Particular reference to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Administrative Regulation 8 of the Act and with the pertinent clause of the General Conditions of Contract forming part of the Contract and
  - (f) the introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Szcety lands maintained and monitored for the duration of the Contract.
- 5.4.1 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the mechnical Officer's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor of that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, in the Technical Officer or point, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Technical Officer or his deputy shall be allowed to attend regetions of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.
- 5.5 The Contractor shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken, shall include periodic audits at intervals mutually agreed to better in the them, but at least once every month.
- The Contractor shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor, arti/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety or persing.
- 5.7 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site for inspection by an inspect of Technical Officer, agent, subcontractor, employee, registered employee organisation, health and safety representative or any member of the health and safety committee.
- The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.9 The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.10 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.11 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

#### 6. Fall Protection Plan

- In the event of the risk and hazard identification, as required in terms of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the contractor shall cause the designation of a competent person, responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.2 The Contractor shall implement, maintain and monitor the fall protection plan for the duration of Contract.

  The Contractor shall also take such steps to ensure the continued adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.3 The fall protection plan shall include:-
  - (a) A Risk Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
  - (b) the procedures and methods to address all the identified risks per location;
  - (c) the evaluation of the employees physical and psychological fitness ecestary to work at elevated positions;
  - (d) the training of employees working from elevated positions; and
  - (e) the procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall protection equipment.

## 7. Hazards and Potential Hazardous Situations

The Contractor and the Technical Officer shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be cause by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

## 8. Health and Safety File

- 8.1 The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Technical Officer, or subsontractor upon request.
- 8.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Technical Officer.
- 8.3 The Contrat or shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Technical Officer upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.



#### 2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS

- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 [Act No. 53 of 2003];
- 2.6 "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 **"consortium or joint venture"** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an

- influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;

- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the reconquisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE States Level certificates.
- 4.4 Bidders other than EME past submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.



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#### 2 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in this Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 2.1 Bid shall mean a Respondent's tendered response / proposal to a Transnet RFP or RFQ;
- 2.2 **Bid Document(s)** shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- 2.3 **Day** shall mean any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday;
- 2.4 **Respondent(s)** shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Bid Document;
- 2.5 **RFP** shall mean Request for Proposal;
- 2.6 **RFQ** shall mean Request for Quotation;
- **2.7 RFX** shall mean RFP or RFQ, as the case may be;
- 2.8 **Services** shall mean the services required by Transnet as specified its Bid Document;
- 2.9 **Service Provider** shall mean the successful Respondent;
- 2.10 **Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as required by Section 23 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- 2.11 **Transnet** shall mean Transnet SOC Ltd, a State O yned Company; and
- 2.12 **VAT** shall mean Value-Added Tax in teems of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

#### 3 GENERAL

All Bid Documents and subsequent control and orders shall be subject to the following general conditions as laid down by Transnet and tree to be strictly adhered to by any Respondent to this RFX.

## 4 SUBMISSION OF BYD DOCUMENTS

- 4.1 A Bid, which shall be einafter include reference to an RFP or RFQ, shall be submitted to Transnet no later than the desing date and time specified in accordance with the directions issued in the Bid Documents, cate Bids will not be considered.
- 4.2 Bids shall be delivered in a sealed envelope in accordance with the instructions indicated in the Bid pocuments with the Bid number and subject marked on the front of the envelope.

## 5 USE OF BID FORMS

#### 6 BID FEES

- 6.2 Only Respondents that have paid the Bid fee and provided proof of payment when submitting their Bid will be considered.

### 7 VALIDITY PERIOD

- 7.1 Respondents must hold their Bid valid for acceptance by Transnet at any time within the requested validity period after the closing date of the RFX.
- 7.2 Respondents may be requested to extend their validity period for a specified additional period. In such instances, Respondents will not be allowed to change any aspect of their Bid, unless they are able to demonstrate that the proposed change(s) is as a direct and unavoidable consequence of Transnet's extension of the validity period.

## 8 SITE VISIT / BRIEFING SESSION

Respondents may be requested to attend (i) a site visit where it is considered necessary to view the site prior to the preparation of Bids, or (ii) an RFX briefing session when Transnet deems it necessary to provide Respondents with additional information relevant to the compilation of their Bids. When such visits or sessions are indicated as compulsory in the bid locument, Respondents are obliged to attend these meetings as failure to do so will result in their discremination.

## 10 COMMUNICATION FER THE CLOSING DATE

After the closing date of a sid [i.e. during the evaluation period] the Respondent may only communicate with the Secretary of the relevant Acquisition Council.

## 11 UNINTHURISED COMMUNICATION ABOUT BIDS

Transnet during the period between the closing date for the receipt of the Bid and the date of the notification of the successful Respondent(s). A Bid, in respect of which any such unauthorised communication has occurred, could be disqualified.

#### 12 RETURNABLE DOCUMENTS

All returnable documents listed in the RFX Documents must be submitted with Respondent's Bid. Failure to submit mandatory returnable schedules / documents will result in disqualification. Failure to submit other schedules / documents may result in disqualification.

#### 13 DEFAULTS BY RESPONDENTS

- 13.1 If the Respondent, after it has been notified of the acceptance of its Bid fails to:
  - a) enter into a formal contract when called upon to do so within such period as Transnet may specify; or
  - b) accept an order in terms of the Bid;
  - c) furnish satisfactory security when called upon to do so for the fulfilment of the contract; or
  - d) comply with any condition imposed by Transnet,

Transnet may, in any such case, without prejudice to any other legal remedy which it may have, proceed to accept any other Bid or, if it is necessary to do so, call for Bids, a resh, and may recover from the defaulting Respondent any additional expense incurred by Transfet in calling for new offers or in accepting a less favourable offer.

- 13.2 If any Respondent, who has submitted a Bid and/or concluded a contract with Transnet [hereinafter referred to as the **Service Provider**], or in the capacity consequence of subcontractor who has been associated with such Bid or contract:
  - a) has withdrawn such Bid after the advertised date and hour for the receipt of Bids; or
  - b) has, after having been notified of the acceptance of its Bid, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the Bid Documents; or
  - c) has carried out any contract coult of from such Bid in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of such contract; or
  - d) has offered, promised r given a bribe in relation to the obtaining or the execution of such contract; or
  - e) has acted in a Nau ulent or improper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any government de attment or towards any public body, company or person; or
  - f) has daddiny pisleading or incorrect statement either

- h) has litigated against Transnet in bad faith;
- i) has been found guilty by a court of law, tribunal or other administrative body of a serious breach of any law, during the preceding 5 [five] years;
- j) has been included as a company or person prohibited from doing business with the public sector on National Treasury's database of Restricted Suppliers or Register of Bid Defaulters;

- 15.2 Firm prices quoted for the duration of any resulting order and/or contract will receive precedence over prices which are subject to fluctuation if this in a namet's best interests.

## 16 ALTERATIONS MADE BY THE RESPONDENT TO BID PRICES

All alterations made by the Responder, to it Bid price(s) prior to the submission of its Bid Documents must be done by deleting the incorrect figures and words where required and by inserting the correct figures and words against the items concerned. All such alterations must be initialled by the person who signs the Bid Documents. Failure to observe this requirement may result in the particular item(s) concerned being excluded in the matter of the ward of the business.

## 17 EXCHANGE AND REMILIANCE

- The k spondent should note that where the whole or a portion of the contract or order value is to be smilled overseas, Transnet shall, if requested to do so by the Service Provider, effect payment over each directly to the foreign principal of such percentage of the contract or order value as may be stipulated by the Respondent in its Bid Documents.
- 1.2 It is Transnet's preference to enter into Rand-based agreements. - 20.2 Should the Respondent has any conditions unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer mendments/ alternatives by written submission on its company letterhead. ## 21 CONTRICT DOCUMENTS

If the Respondent is a company, the full names of the directors shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a close corporation, the full names of the members shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a partnership or an individual trading under a trade name, the full names of the partners or of such individual, as the case may be, shall be furnished.

#### 24 CONTRACTUAL SECURITIES

- 24.1 The successful Respondent, when called upon to do so, shall provide security to the satisfaction of Transnet for the due fulfilment of a contract or order. Such security shall be in the form of an advanced payment guarantee [APG] and/or a performance bond [Pe.fo, mance Bond], as the case may be, to be furnished by an approved bank, building society, insurance or guarantee corporation carrying on business in South Africa.

- 24.5 Additional costs incurred by Transnet necessitated by reason of default on the part of the Service Provider jurislation to the conditions of this clause 24 will be for the account of the Service Provider.

Copyright in plans, drawings, diagrams, specifications and documents compiled by the Service Provider for the purpose of contract work shall be governed by the *Intellectual Property Rights* section in the Terms and Conditions of Contract.

#### 30 BIDS BY OR ON BEHALF OF FOREIGN RESPONDENTS

- 30.1 Bids submitted by foreign principals may be forwarded directly by the principals or by its South African representative or agent to the Secretary of the Acquisition Council or to a designated official of Transnet according to whichever officer is specified in the Bid Documents.
- 30.2 In the case of a representative or agent, written proof must be schmitted to the effect that such representative or agent has been duly authorised to act in the case of a representative by the principal. Failure to submit such authorisation by the representative or agent shall disqualify the Bid.
- 30.3 When legally authorised to prepare and submit Bids on shalf of their principals not domiciled in the Republic of South Africa, representatives or age to must compile the Bids in the names of such principals and sign them on behalf of the latter.

In consideration of each party making available to the other such Information, the parties ointly give that any dealings between them shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement which themselves will be subject to the parameters of the Bid Document.

#### IT IS HEREBY AGREED

#### 1. INTERPRETATION

In this Agreement:

- 1.1 **Agents** mean directors, officers, employees, agents, professional advisers, contractors or sub-contractors, or any tree member;
- 1.2 **Bid or Bid D current** eans Transnet's Request for Information [RFI] Request for Proposal [RFP] or Reguest for Oug ation [RFQ], as the case may be;
- 1.3 **Confidential afformation** means any information or other data relating to one party [the Disclosic Party] and/or the business carried on or proposed or intended to be carried on by that party and which is made available for the purposes of the Bid to the other party [the Receiving Party] or its Agents by the Disclosing Party or its Agents or recorded in agreed minutes following oral disclosure and any other information otherwise made available by the Disclosing Party or its Agents to the Receiving Party or its Agents, whether before, on or after the date of this Agreement, and whether in writing or otherwise, including any information, analysis or specifications derived from, containing or reflecting such information but excluding information which:
  - a) is publicly available at the time of its disclosure or becomes publicly available [other than
    as a result of disclosure by the Receiving Party or any of its Agents contrary to the terms of
    this Agreement]; or
  - was lawfully in the possession of the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] free of any restriction as to its use or disclosure prior to its being so disclosed; or
  - c) following such disclosure, becomes available to the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] from a source other than the Disclosing Party or its Agents, which source is not bound by any duty of

confidentiality owed, directly or indirectly, to the Disclosing Party in relation to such information;

- 1.4 **Group** means any subsidiary, any holding company and any subsidiary of any holding company of either party; and
- 1.5 **Information** means all information in whatever form including, without limitation, any information relating to systems, operations, plans, intentions, market opportunities, know-how, trade secrets and business affairs whether in writing, conveyed orally or by machine-readable medium.

#### 2. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- 2.1 All Confidential Information given by one party to this Agreement [the Disclosing Party] to the other party [the Receiving Party] will be treated by the Receiving Party as secret and confidential and will not, without the Disclosing Party's written consent, directly or indirectly communicate or disclose [whether in writing or orally or in any other manner] confidential Information to any other person other than in accordance with the terms of the Agreement.
- 2.2 The Receiving Party will only use the Confidential Information for the sole purpose of technical and commercial discussions between the parties in relation to the Bid or for the subsequent performance of any contract between the parties in relation to the Bid.
- 2.3 Notwithstanding clause 2.1 above, the Releasing Party may disclose Confidential Information:
  - a) to those of its Agents who strictly need to know the Confidential Information for the sole purpose set out in vause 1.2 above, provided that the Receiving Party shall ensure that such Agents are made aware prior to the disclosure of any part of the Confidential Information that the same is confidential and that they owe a duty of confidence to the Disclosing Party. The Receiving Party shall at all times remain liable for any actions of such generate that would constitute a breach of this Agreement; or
  - b) to the extent required by law or the rules of any applicable regulatory authority, subject to cause 2.4 below.
